BIG 12 FOOTBALL QUICK HITS

- The Big 12 opens the 2013 campaign with 60 percent of its teams ranked or receiving votes, and against four opponents who played in bowl games a year ago.
- The August 30 start date for the league is the earliest since Baylor and Iowa State opened on August 28, 2008. It's the 12th season in Conference history for opening games in the eighth month. The Big 12 is 38-18 in August non-conference games since 1996.
- Nine of 10 teams in the Big 12 played in bowl games last season, showcasing the top-to-bottom strength of the league. No other conference in NCAA history has sent 90 percent of its teams to bowl games in the same season.
- There are no rounder weekends in the Big 12 once conference play begins. With round-robin football scheduling, everyone plays everyone every season! And with 10 teams, half the league plays FIVE conference road games each year.
- The Big 12 is one of two FBS leagues to play a nine-game conference schedule.
- All losses suffered by Big 12 teams last season were to squads that played in bowls.
- The Big 12 has produced five Heisman Trophy winners since its inception and has been home to 12 Heisman finalists over the last 17 seasons. No other conference has had more finalists since 1996, and the Big 12's five winners ties for the lead during that span.
- The Big 12 ranks second with seven appearances in the BCS National Championship Game and has had 14 teams finish the regular season ranked in the top four of the final BCS Standings.
- The Big 12 has ranked in the top eight nationally in scoring offense every season; with a team in the top five 14 of 17 years.
- Defensively, the Conference has had a team finish among the top eight in the NCAA in scoring defense 12 of 17 seasons.
- The Big 12 is one of two conferences nationally with all schools ranked in the top 75 of the final NACDA Cup standings for all sports each of the past three years.

Big 12 Players of the Week

A Big 12 offensive, defensive and special teams player of the week will be announced each Monday during the regular season. Nominees are forwarded by each institution's media relations department and selected by a panel of media voters who cover the league on a regular basis.

Postseason Awards

Big 12 postseason football awards will be announced at the conclusion of regular season play.

BCS Sightings

The Big 12 has made 20 appearances in a BCS game in the 15-year history of the structure. The Conference has placed at least one team in the top four of the final BCS Standings in 11 of 15 years. The Big 12 is 9-11 all-time in BCS games and has advanced two teams in the same season five times (2001, '03, '04, '07, '08). The Conference ranks second with seven appearances in the BCS national championship game.

Heisman Trophy Winners

The Big 12 has produced five Heisman Trophy winners since the inception of the league in 1996, which ties for the lead during this time span. The Big 12 has had a Heisman finalist (top four in the final voting) 12 out of 17 seasons - no other conference has had more.

In a compilation of Heisman voting since 1996 (based on the top four finishers assigning four points for first, three for second, etc.), the Big 12 has had the most Heisman success with 47 points, outdistancing the SEC in second with 41 points and the Pac-12 in third with 33 points.

Consensus All-America

The Big 12 is second in the country with 96 football consensus All-America selections since 1996.

Television Selections

Television selections will be announced on either a 12-day or six-day advance by the Conference office. The 12-day advances will be released on Mondays while the six-day will be available on Sunday's prior to that week's games.

2013 Non-Conference Opponents

Thirteen of the 30 non-conference games in 2013 will feature opponents that played in 2012 bowl games. Oklahoma State and TCU both open the season against bowl teams at neutral sites. OSU faces Mississippi State in Houston's Reliant Stadium while TCU takes on LSU in Cowboys Stadium in Arlington. Among other notable non-conference matchups, Oklahoma travels to Notre Dame, a participant in this past season's BCS national championship game while Texas travels to BYU and hosts Mississippi - both 2012 bowl winners. Notre Dame ended the season at No. 3 in the coaches poll. Iowa State will play its third contest in two seasons against Tulsa. ISU won the 2012 regular season matchup before losing in the Liberty Bowl. Tulsa was ranked No. 25 in the final rankings.

Non-Conference Success

The Big 12 led the nation in regular season non-conference win percentage (.866) for the second consecutive season in 2012. The Big 12 also had the fewest regular season non-conference losses (26-4). Since last season, the league is 53-7 in regular season non-conference games (.883). The Big 12 is 52-5 in non-league games in the month of September in 2011 and 2012 combined.

Packing the House

Fifty percent of Big 12 teams averaged over-capacity in home attendance for 2012. Eighty percent were over 93 percent of capacity. Five teams anticipate record-breaking numbers in season ticket sales in 2013.

BAYLOR (0-0, 0-0)

Baylor's 25 wins over the last three seasons are the most over a three-year span in program history.

Big 12 Preseason Offensive Player of the Year Lache Seastrunk averaged 138.5 yards during the final six games of last season. He totaled 1,012 yards and seven touchdowns in 2012 while earning Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year and Holiday Bowl MVP.



IOWA STATE (0-0, 0-0)

Iowa State has set an all-time high with over 43,000 season tickets sold, and has gone over the 40,000-mark for the second consecutive season.

ISU is one of two teams (Ohio State) in the nation to beat a ranked team on the road in each of the last three seasons.

Kansas averaged 212 yards rushing per game in 2012, which ranked 22nd nationally.

HB James Sims led the Big 12 in rushing last season and ranked 17th nationally with 112.6 yards. He was one of two Conference backs to average over 100 rushing yards.

The Wildcats have won 20-straight season openers under Bill Snyder with the only loss coming in his inaugural campaign in 1989.

Junior receiver Tyler Lockett led the Big 12 in kickoff returns last year with an average of 32.8 yards to rank third nationally.



OKLAHOMA (0-0, 0-0)

Oklahoma leads the nation with 20 seasons of 11-plus wins and 34 seasons of 10 victories, including the 2012 campaign.

The Sooners have gone undefeated at home 10 times under Bob Stoops and open 2013 with three straight home outings.

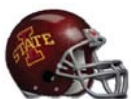
