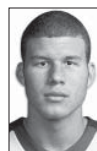

HEAD COACH JEFF CAPEL

Jeff Capel was named the 13th men's basketball head coach at Oklahoma on April 11, 2006. Capel, 33, is 39-27 in his third year at OU and led the Sooners to a 23-12 record and second-round NCAA Tournament appearance last year.



Capel compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His VCU squads posted a 50-22 (.694) record in Colonial Athletic Association play and a 47-11 overall home record for a staunch .811 winning percentage.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03 as Capel tied a school record for wins by a first-year head coach. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 10th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have a daughter, Cameron, who was born in April 2007.

GAME PREVIEW

Preseason Big 12 coaches favorite Oklahoma will play its second and final exhibition game of the season when it hosts the Division II Cameron Aggies Saturday at noon at Lloyd Noble Center. The contest can be heard on the Internet at SoonerSports.com with **Brian Brinkley** and **Mike Houck** announcing. A free, live video webcast of the game will also be available for viewing on the Web site.

TICKET INFORMATION

- ▶ OU students who present a valid school I.D. will be admitted to Saturday's game free of charge (north entrance).
- ▶ Upper-level reserved seats are available for \$10 (north and south) and \$15 (east and west) at the OU Athletics Ticket Office. Lloyd Noble Center ticket windows will open at 10 a.m. on Saturday.

FIRST EXHIBITION RECAP

Ranked No. 12 in the preseason AP poll and No. 14 in the ESPN/USA Today version, Oklahoma shot .508 from the field and posted a 45-27 rebounding advantage in a 90-43 exhibition win over Division II Oklahoma Panhandle State Wednesday in Norman. The Sooners scored the game's first nine points and went up 14-2 as the Aggies missed seven of their first eight shots. An 11-2 first-half-ending spurt gave OU a comfortable 49-19 lead at intermission, and Jeff Capel's squad outscored OPSU 42-24 after the break.

AP preseason first-team All-American **Blake Griffin** was the game's star, registering 22 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and three blocked shots in 28 minutes of action. The sophomore forward was 10-for-10 from the floor with four of his field goals coming on dunks. Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year **Willie Warren** scored an efficient 15 points in 23 minutes on 4-for-8 field goal and 6-for-6 free throw shooting. The combo guard added three rebounds and a game-high three steals.

Three more significant offensive contributors came from the backcourt. Sophomore guard **Cade Davis** drained four of his seven 3-point attempts (his season high last year was three makes) to finish with 12 points, senior guard **Omar Leary** was 3-for-4 from long distance en route to a nine-point effort and fellow senior guard **Austin Johnson** handed out seven assists without a turnover.

WEDNESDAY LEFTOVERS

- ▶ Playing primarily against a zone defense, Oklahoma shot .321 from 3-point range (9-for-28) and .649 from inside the arc (24-for-37). It was 7-for-18 from long distance in the first half but attempted only 10 (made two) in the second.
- ▶ Putting into perspective **Blake Griffin's** 10-for-10 field goal performance, the OU individual single-game record for field goal makes without a miss is 11 (**Alvan Adams** vs. San Diego State, Jan. 5, 1974).
- ▶ UCLA transfer **Ryan Wright** logged six points, seven boards, two blocks and two steals in 19 minutes in his first action in an OU uniform. The junior forward made four three throws on a game-high eight attempts.
- ▶ Sophomore forward **Kyle Cannon**, a junior college transfer, did not play due to a team rules violation.

PREVIEWING CAMERON

Cameron University, located in Lawton, Okla., competes in NCAA Division II for men's basketball as a member of the Lone Star Conference. The Aggies are coming off a 6-21 season in which they tied for fifth in the Lone Star's North Division with a 4-8 record. They are under the direction of first-year head coach **Wade Alexander**, a 2001 East Central University graduate.

Losing just two letterwinners from last season's roster, Cameron returns seven players from 2007-08, including leading scorer **Greg Morgan**. Morgan is a 5-10 junior guard who averaged 15.4 points, 5.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.3 steals per contest. He shot .405 from the field and got to the free throw line for a team-high 125 attempts (shot .720). Senior guard **Dave Smith**, the team's third-leading scorer last season who also stands 5-10, returns after averaging 10.9 points, 3.4 boards and 3.4. Smith was one of the squad's better 3-point shooters a year ago, going 51-for-142 (.359).

Other Cameron returnees are senior guard **Roosevelt Lovett** (7.0 ppg, .345 3-point field goal percentage), junior forward **Kallan Glasgow** (6.0 ppg, 3.8 rpg, .553 field goal percentage), senior guard **Chad Allan** (5.7 ppg, 2.6 rpg) and senior forward **Terrance Welch** (3.9 ppg). Freshman guard **Emmett Blount** is also back after redshirting last season.

The Aggies averaged 77.4 points last year and shot .437 from the field, .364 from 3-point range and .624 from the free throw line.

"NOTE" WORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma is 40-2 (.952) in exhibition games over the past 20 seasons.
- ▶ Half of Oklahoma's 14 players did not play for the Sooners last year. Six players are in their first year at OU while **Ryan Wright** (a transfer from UCLA) practiced with the team last season but did not play in games.
- ▶ Out of its 31 regular season games this year, OU will play at least 19 against teams that made the 2008 postseason (13 against NCAA Tournament teams, four against NIT squads and two against CBI teams). It could play three more NCAA Tournament teams beyond the first round of the NIT Season Tip-Off (Davidson, Arizona and Purdue).
- ▶ Oklahoma has recorded 27 consecutive winning seasons, second nationally to Syracuse (38). Big 12 programs Kansas (25) and Oklahoma State (20) also boast lengthy streaks.
- ▶ OU's 34-member 1,000-point club could have two new inductees by season's end in junior **Tony Crocker** and sophomore **Blake Griffin**. Crocker needs 338 points to reach 1,000 (he scored 394 last year) while Griffin needs 516 (he totaled 484 last season while missing two games and all but five minutes of another).
- ▶ The Sooners' Nov. 22 game against Gardner-Webb will mark their 500th at Lloyd Noble Center (they are 424-72 for a .855 mark).

OU-CAMERON SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma met one previous time, in an exhibition game on Nov. 10, 2004. The Sooners won 91-56 in Norman behind 19 points from **Kevin Bookout** and 18 from **Drew Lavender**.

SOONERS NO. 1 ACCORDING TO BIG 12 COACHES

For the first time in the 13-year history of the Big 12 Conference, the Sooners have been picked to win the league in a vote of head coaches. OU received three first-place votes and a total of 109 points in the conference's annual preseason poll to edge second-place Texas. The Longhorns captured four first-place votes and 107 total points. Baylor and Kansas tied for third place with 103 points. The complete poll can be found on page 4 of these game notes.

GRIFFIN NAMED AP PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Sophomore **Blake Griffin**, became the first Sooner in 13 years to be named an AP preseason first-team All-American on Monday. The last OU player to receive the honor was forward **Ryan Minor** prior to the 1995-96 season. Griffin was joined on the five-man team by North Carolina forward **Tyler Hansbrough** (reigning national player of the year), Davidson guard **Stephen Curry**, Notre Dame forward **Luke Harangody** and UCLA guard **Darren Collison**. Griffin and Curry could meet in a second-round NIT Season Tip-Off contest Nov. 18 in Norman.

UNANIMOUS PICKS

Blake Griffin and **Willie Warren** were unanimous selections as Big 12 Preseason Player and Freshman of the Year, respectively, the conference office announced Oct. 14. The players were selected by the league's head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for members of their own teams. Griffin is OU's third Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year (**Hollis Price** in 2002-03 and **Taj Gray** in 2005-06 were the others), while Warren is the second OU player to be named Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year (**Drew Lavender** was recognized prior to the 2003-04 season).

COMBO NO. 1

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed McDonald's All-Americans in back-to-back years in sophomore forward **Blake Griffin** and freshman guard **Willie Warren**. This season marks the first in history that multiple McDonald's All-Americans appear on an Oklahoma roster. Last March, Warren became the seventh OU signee to play in the McDonald's All-American Game. Others were **Wayman Tisdale** (1982), **Jeff Webster** (1989), **Ryan Humphrey** (1997), **Drew Lavender** (2003), **Scottie Reynolds** (2006) and Griffin (2007).

CAPTAINS NAMED

In a September players vote, senior **Taylor Griffin**, junior **Tony Crocker** and sophomore **Blake Griffin** were named captains for the 2008-09 season. This marks the first year that any of the three have served as an OU team captain.

EXHIBITING SUCCESS

With their Wednesday night win over Oklahoma Panhandle State, the Sooners have compiled an impressive 40-2 exhibition record over the last 20 years. Last season, OU beat Rockhurst College, 93-58, and Fayetteville State, 91-50, in Norman.

NIT SEASON TIP-OFF ON THE HORIZON

OU is the No. 2 seed in the 16-team 2008 Dick's Sporting Goods NIT Season Tip-Off and will host the four-team South Regional Nov. 17-18. The Sooners will play No. 16 seed Mississippi Valley State in first-round action Nov. 17 at 8 p.m. CST on ESPN2. An NCAA Tournament team last year, Mississippi Valley State finished 17-16 and went 12-6 in the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

If OU beats the Delta Devils, it will play the winner of the Nov. 17 game between No. 5 seed Davidson and No. 12 seed James Madison on Nov. 18 on ESPN2. Davidson, which lost to eventual national champion Kansas by two points in last year's NCAA Elite Eight, posted a 29-7 overall record in 2007-08 and went 20-0 in Southern Conference play. The Wildcats return preseason first-team All-American Stephen Curry. James Madison finished with a 13-17 record last season.

If the Sooners win the South Regional, they'll advance to New York City for games during the week of Thanksgiving (Nov. 26 and Nov. 28) on ESPN2. Those contests will be played at Madison Square Garden.

Other NIT Season Tip-Off regional hosts are No. 1 seed Purdue, No. 3 seed Arizona and No. 4 seed Boston College.

2007-08 REVISITED

After a 16-15 season in 2006-07 that saw Oklahoma's streak of 25 consecutive NCAA Tournament or NIT appearances come to an end, the 2007-08 Sooners rebounded with a 23-12 campaign and earned a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament East Regional. OU, which finished tied for fourth place in the Big 12 Conference with a 9-7 record and advanced to the semifinals of the league tourney, beat Saint Joseph's in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before losing to No. 3 seed Louisville.

Following is a list of notes and accomplishments from the 2007-08 season:

- ▶ Oklahoma posted its 27th consecutive winning season, good for the longest streak among Big 12 schools (Kansas ranks second with 25, Oklahoma State ranks third with 20 and Texas is fourth with 10).
- ▶ OU advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 12th time in the last 14 years and for the 21st time in the last 26 seasons. Only Arizona (24), Duke (24), Kansas (24), North Carolina (24), Indiana (23) and Kentucky (22) have participated in more NCAA Tournaments over the last 26 years.
- ▶ The team's NCAA Tournament win over Saint Joseph's was the first in the career of head coach Jeff Capel.
- ▶ The Sooners' 23 wins gave the program at least 20 victories for the 10th time in the last 11 campaigns. OU has averaged 24 wins over the last 11 years.

OU BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 102nd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,468-936 (.611) all-time record, ranking it 30th in NCAA Division I in wins and 39th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 25 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 21 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 26 years rank as the seventh most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 26 years than Oklahoma's 25.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and enter this season with the 12th best winning percentage (.726) since 2000.
- ▶ Nineteen different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 29 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim eight times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 72 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
