## BIG 12 NOTEBOOK

- The 2008 Big 12 season kicks off with two games on Thursday, Aug. 28 and continues through Sunday, Aug. 31 with all league teams in action on opening weekend. Nine teams will play in the friendly confines of their home stadium while the other three are at neutral sites.
- Eight Big 12 games will be telecast during opening weekend, including those selected for pay-per-view.
- The Big 12 had five teams ranked in the top 14 of both the USA Today/American Football Coaches Association and Associated Press preseason polls. Oklahoma was ranked fourth in both and received three No. 1 votes by the coaches and four by the media. Other rankings were Missouri (7/6), Texas (10/11), Kansas (13/14) and Texas Tech (14/12). No other league had as many teams in the top 15.
- The 2008 poll marks the first time since 2002, fourth time overall, that the Big 12 has placed five schools in the preseason rankings. Nine of the 12 conference squads are ranked or received votes in one of the polls.
- Ten Big 12 teams return their starting quarterback from last season (BU, CU, KU, KSU, MU, OU, OSU, UT, TAMU, TTU). In addition Nebraska returns Joe Ganz who started the final three games of 2007.
- The Big 12 passing statistics of 2007 rank as the best since 2000 among all conferences. Big 12 QBs threw for a combined 38,112 yards for an average of 3,176 yards a game. The Big 12's seven 3,000-yard passers were also a national conference-high.
- The league brings back a total of 167 full-time starters from 2007 squads for a 59.0 return percentage.
- The Big 12 welcomes three new head coaches in 2008: Art Briles (Baylor), Bo Pelini (Nebraska) and Mike Sherman (Texas A&M).

### Big 12 Launches Redesigned Web Site

The site features numerous enhancements, including a broadband video channel along with new interactive and e-commerce opportunities. Video highlights from many Big 12 contests will be featured, with various games and championships streamed live via the site each season.

### CollegePressBox.com

The official media site for Big 12 football will provide one-stop access to updated contact information, media guides, game notes, game books, quotes, links and more for each of the conference's 12 schools and the conference office. ### 13th Annual Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championship

For the fifth time in league history the Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championship game will be held in Kansas City. The 2008 game takes place on Saturday, December 6, at Arrowhead Stadium. Previous Big 12 Championship games staged in Kansas City were in 2000 (79,665), 2003 (79,451), 2004 (62,130) and 2006 (80,031).

In 2008, the South representative will be the home team and utilize the sideline on the press box side of the field.

General public tickets are priced at \$85, \$75, \$65 and \$55, plus handling fees. Tickets are available through Ticketmaster outlets, [ticketmaster.com](http://ticketmaster.com) or (800) 676-5488 in addition to in-person at Arrowhead Stadium.

### Dr Pepper Big 12 Championship Winners

In the 12-year history of the event, there have been six different winners. All-time titlists include Texas (1996, 2005), Nebraska (1997, 1999), Texas A&M (1998), Oklahoma (2000, 2002, 2004, 2007), Colorado (2001) and Kansas State (2003).

### Attendance

Attendance in the Big 12 surpassed 4.6 million fans the past two seasons, including 4,652,267 in 2007. Stadiums in the Big 12 were filled to 96.6 percent of capacity last year, the ninth straight year over 90 percent. Average attendance in 2007 was 60,419, the highest in league history and first time to average over 60,000.

### Non-Conference Schedule

The non-conference portion of the 2008 Big 12 schedule features five tilts against teams that are ranked in the preseason Top 25 polls (Coaches, AP): #23/23 Wake Forest at Baylor (8/28), #7/6 Missouri vs. #19/20 Illinois (8/30), #13/14 Kansas at #21/19 South Florida (9/12), #8/8 West Virginia at Colorado (9/18), #15/17 Virginia Tech at Nebraska (9/27). Fourteen of the 48 non-conference games are against teams that played in a bowl game last season. The league has compiled a 407-170 (.705) non-conference record since 1996.

### Home Win Streaks

Oklahoma, Kansas and Missouri are among the nation's leaders in longest active home winning streaks entering the 2008 season. The Sooners top the country with 17 consecutive wins at home while Kansas is fifth with nine and Missouri is tied for seventh with seven.

### Television Partners

ABC begins its 13th season as the conference's national network television partner. The Big 12 also continues its long-standing relationship with FSN for its cable rights. FSN has sublicensed select television games in 2008 to ESPN and Versus.

### Big 12 Media Preseason Poll

Media covering the conference have correctly predicted the division champions in four of the last six seasons (OU/NU-06, UT/CU-05; OU/KSU-03, CU/OU-02). Overall, the top spot in each division has been accurately picked by the league's media corps 14-of-24 times.

**BAYLOR (3-9, 0-8)**

**This Week:** Wake Forest (Aug. 28)  
**Next Week:** Northwestern State

Art Briles begins his first season as the 25th head football coach in Baylor history. Briles was 34-28 in five previous years as head coach at Houston.

Junior quarterback Blake Szymanski started 10 games under center a year ago when he established school single-season records for passing attempts (461), completions (264), yards (2,844) and touchdown passes (22).

Baylor returns its top two tacklers in free safety Jordan Lake (120, 67 solo) and linebacker Joe Pawelek (99, 40 solo).

The Bears open the season with three consecutive home games for the first time since 1992 and feature a seven-game home slate for just the sixth time since 1950.



**COLORADO (6-7, 4-4)**

**This Week:** vs. Colorado State (Aug. 31)  
**Next Week:** Eastern Washington

CU has scored in 235 straight games, the fourth-longest active streak in the NCAA and the ninth-longest all-time. The Buffs have scored in 150 consecutive league contests.

Cody Hawkins set freshman school records in passing yards (2,693), completions (239), attempts (424) and touchdown passes (19) in 2007. He had nine 200-yard passing games, tying the school record with six in a row at one point.

The Buffaloes return 14 starters in 2008, six on offense and eight on defense.

Seven of the top eight tacklers return to CU this year, led by Brad Jones with 81.



**IOWA STATE (3-9, 2-6)**

**This Week:** South Dakota State (Aug. 28)  
**Next Week:** Kent State

Senior R.J. Sumrall enters 2008 in ninth place on the Iowa State career chart with 99 receptions.

ISU returns a trio of running backs who all had 100-yard rushing games last season, a first for the program since 1982.

On defense, the Cyclones improved from 102nd nationally and 11th in the Big 12 in 2006 to 65th nationally and seventh in the league in 2007.

Defensive end Kurtis Taylor finished second in the Big 12 with 6½ sacks last season. His 41 tackles included eight stops behind the line of scrimmage.



**KANSAS (12-1, 7-1)**

**This Week:** Florida International  
**Next Week:** Louisiana Tech

Kansas has won 15 of its last 17 games and four of its last five bowl games, including the 2008 FedEx Orange Bowl.

The Jayhawks will meet five teams ranked in the preseason polls: #4/4 Oklahoma, #7/6 Missouri, #10/11 Texas, #14/12 Texas Tech and #21/19 South Florida.

Todd Reesing is the all-time school leader in touchdown passes with 36 entering his junior campaign. His 3,486 passing yards in 2007 set a KU single-season record.

Mark Mangino signed a contract extension over the summer that continues through December 31, 2012.



**KANSAS STATE (5-7, 3-5)**

**This Week:** North Texas  
**Next Week:** Montana State

DE Ian Campbell is the Big 12's only returning two-time All-Big 12 First Team selection.

Ron Prince has agreed to a new five-year contract through the 2012 season.

Josh Freeman finished his sophomore campaign with a K-State single-season record 3,353 passing yards. Freeman's 5,133 career passing yards are fourth in school history. He is one of five KSU quarterbacks to top the 5,000-yard passing mark in a career.

Kansas State has scored in 140 consecutive games.

The Wildcats return 44 lettermen, including 13 regular starters, from last season's squad and 28 total players who made at least one start.



**MISSOURI (12-2, 7-1)**

**This Week:** vs. Illinois  
**Next Week:** Southeast Missouri

Missouri is ranked No. 6 in the preseason Associated Press Poll, its highest preseason rating in program history.

Chase Daniel set school records for total offense (4,559 yards), passing yards (4,306) and touchdown passes (33) in a season in 2007.

Daniel finished second in the Big 12 and seventh nationally, averaging 325.6 yards of total offense as a junior.

Mizzou was fifth nationally in total offense (490.3 ypg), ninth in passing offense (314.1 ypg) and eighth in scoring offense (39.9 ppg) a year ago.

The Tigers return 10 of 11 players who started on defense in last year's Cotton Bowl win.



**NEBRASKA (5-7, 2-6)**  
**This Week:** Western Michigan  
**Next Week:** San Jose State

Bo Pelini begins his first season as NU's 28th head football coach. He previously served as the Huskers' defensive coordinator in 2003 before stops at Oklahoma and LSU.

In his three career starts in 2007, quarterback Joe Ganz produced three of the top five single-game passing efforts in school history and three of the four 400-yard passing games in school annals.

I-back Marlon Lucky enters his senior campaign as the only player in Nebraska history to surpass 1,000 career rushing (1,876) and receiving (1,091) yards.

NU returns its top two players at all four defensive line positions.



**OKLAHOMA (11-3, 6-2)**  
**This Week:** Chattanooga  
**Next Week:** Cincinnati

Oklahoma owns the nation's longest active home winning streak at 18 games.

OU is ranked No. 4 in both the Associated Press and coaches' preseason polls. The Sooners have been ranked in the top five of the AP Poll a nation-leading 353 times.

The Sooners lead all Football Bowl Division schools with 90 wins since 2000.

Sam Bradford established an NCAA freshman record for touchdown passes with 36 in 2007. Bradford finished first nationally in passing efficiency with a 176.5 rating.



**OKLAHOMA STATE (7-6, 4-4)**  
**This Week:** vs. Washington State  
**Next Week:** Houston

Zac Robinson finished the 2007 season with a school-record 3,671 yards of total offense. He ranks ninth on OSU's career total offense list with 4,160 yards.

In 2007, OSU faced the nation's fifth most difficult schedule. Three of the Cowboys' six losses were to teams in the final Associated Press top 10. Overall, seven bowl teams were on Oklahoma State's schedule last season.

The Cowboys have led the Big 12 in rushing the last two seasons. In 2007, they increased their mark to 243 yards per game from a conference-leading 208 yards per game in 2006.

Junior Perrish Cox has two of the top three single-season kickoff return yardage totals in school history.



**TEXAS (10-3, 5-3)**  
**This Week:** Florida Atlantic  
**Next Week:** at UTEP

Colt McCoy was the fourth quarterback in Texas history to throw for 3,000 yards in a season (3,303). He stands in second place on UT's single-season passing list.

The Longhorns played in a bowl game for a school-record 10th straight season in 2007. UT has won six of its last seven bowl games, including four straight, and has a 7-3 record in bowl contests under Mack Brown.

Mack Brown is the only active coach in the NCAA Bowl Division who has led his teams to at least nine wins in each of the last 12 years.

The Longhorns' return 10 players with starting experience to a defense that finished sixth nationally and first in the Big 12 in rushing defense (93.4 ypg) last season.



**TEXAS A&M (7-6, 4-4)**  
**This Week:** Arkansas State  
**Next Week:** at New Mexico

Mike Sherman took over as football coach at Texas A&M after serving on the staff of the Houston Texans since 2006. In his previous two stints at Texas A&M (1989-93, 1995-96), Sherman was a part of three conference championships.

Texas A&M ended the 2007 season second in the Big 12 and 13th nationally in rushing yards with 211.6 per game.

Quarterback Stephen McGee led the Aggies and all Big 12 signal-callers in rushing last year with 899 yards.

Running back Jorvorskie Lane enters his senior season as the nation's No. 2 active touchdown producer (45) behind Boise State's Ian Johnson (46).



**TEXAS TECH (9-4, 4-4)**  
**This Week:** Eastern Washington  
**Next Week:** at Nevada

For the second time in program history, Texas Tech has passed the 40,000 mark in season tickets. A school-record of over 41,000 have been purchased.

Tech received its highest preseason rankings since 1977 at No. 12 (AP) and No. 14 (coaches). TTU has been ranked in three of the last four preseasons (2005, 2006, 2008) in the coaches and/or Associated Press polls.

Michael Crabtree led the country in receptions (10.3) and receiving yards (150.9), and was seventh in scoring (10.15 ppg) last season as a redshirt freshman. He earned consensus All-America honors.

Graham Harrell became the second quarterback in Tech history to throw for 5,000-plus yards in a single season, ending 2007 with 5,705 yards. Only six quarterbacks in NCAA history have reached the 5,000-yard plateau in a single season.
