GAMEDAY INFORMATION

BEARCATS HEAD SOUTH TO TAKE ON OKLAHOMA FOR THE FIRST TIME

The University of Cincinnati football team, coming off a 40-7 opening night win against Eastern Kentucky, hits the road for the first time in 2008 to face the No. 4/4 Oklahoma Sooners, Saturday at 3:30 p.m. EST in a nationally-televised game at Memorial Stadium. The game can be seen on ABC, WCPO Channel 9 in Cincinnati. UC got a workman-like performance from quarterback Dustin Grutza, going 21-of-28 for 296 yards and three touchdowns. He also added a rushing touchdown in the game and was named BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week Monday. Connor Barwin finished with five tackles and two sacks in his first game at defensive end.

THE SERIES

Cincinnati and Oklahoma have never met on the gridiron.

THE COACHES

BRIAN KELLY, the 2007 BIG EAST Coach of the Year, is in his second full season at the helm of the Cincinnati football program with an 12-3 record and a 18-year career mark of 149-54-2. Kelly led the Bearcats to a school-record-tying 10 wins in 2007 and a victory in the Papajohns.com Bowl. He won two NCAA Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State and led Central Michigan to the 2006 Mid-American Conference Championship. He is the leader in victories among active BIG EAST coaches and would be the only current BIG EAST coach with 150 career wins.

BOB STOOPS is 98-22 in his 10th season with the Sooners. He is 33-9 vs. non-conference opponents, 54-2 at home, and is a native of Youngstown, Ohio.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- ▶ Cincinnati returns 16 starters, including all-Americans Mike Mickens, Terrill Byrd, and Kevin Huber.
- ▶ UC paced the country with 26 interceptions and shared the national lead with 42 takeaways in 2007.
- ▶ Head coach Brian Kelly is seeking career win No. 150. He would be the only current BIG EAST coach with 150 or more career victories. He 149 victories rank 11th among active NCAA FBS head coaches.
- ▶ Dominick Goodman and Mardy Gilyard both tallied over 100-yards receiving against Eastern Kentucky on Aug. 28, the first time a pair of UC teammates had achieved that feat since Albert Sweet and Sean Stewart did it on Oct. 16, 1993.
- ▶ Brandon Yingling will start at placekicker for the Bearcats while Jake Rogers will handle kickoffs.
- ▶ UC has never beaten a team ranked in the Top 5.

SERIES NOTES

- Cincinnati and Oklahoma will meet for the first time on Sept. 6.
- UC is 7-7-1 all-time versus Big 12 squads.
- The Bearcats have not faced a Big 12 school since playing Kansas on Sept. 20, 1997 at Nippert, a 34-7 UC victory.
- UC is 14-18-2 against teams from Oklahoma.
- The Bearcats last win in the Sooner State was a 24-5 victory over Tulsa on Nov. 18, 1995.

SERIES BUSINESS

- Saturday marks UC's first meeting against Oklahoma.

AGAINST RANKED FOES

- UC is 3-1 against ranked teams during the Brian Kelly era. The Bearcats lone loss came at the hands of No. 5 West Virginia (28-23) on Nov. 17, 2007.
- UC's three wins over ranked teams in 2007 was the most ever for a Bearcats squad.
- The Bearcats are 8-60 all-time against ranked squads, 2-30 vs. the Top 10 and 0-14 vs. the Top 5.
- UC has never beaten a team ranked in the Top 5.
- The Bearcats last win over a Top 10 team came by a 30-11 win over No. 7 Rutgers on Nov. 18, 2006 in Nippert Stadium.
- The Scarlet Knights are the highest-ranked team UC has defeated.
- No. 4/4 Oklahoma is the highest ranked team UC played since a Sept. 16, 2006 matchup at No. 1 Ohio State, a 37-7 Cincinnati loss.

A BRIEF LOOK BACK AT 2007 ...

- The 2007 season proved to be one of the most successful in the history of University of Cincinnati football.
- For the first time in school history, Cincinnati earned an appearance in the final Associated Press Poll, ending the season ranked No. 17.
- The Bearcats capped off the season with a 31-21 victory in the 2007 Papajohns.com Bowl, giving them 10 wins on the year – equaling the school record for single-season wins – and their third consecutive bowl championship.

TEAM NOTES FROM THE OPENER ...

- UC held Eastern Kentucky scoreless in the first half, a feat not achieved by UC in 2007.
- UC moved to 8-0 vs. Ohio Valley Conference schools and earned its fourth-straight season opening win.
- UC now owns a 335-63 scoring margin vs. OVC schools.
- The Bearcats four touchdown passes tied for second place in the UC single-game record book.
- UC recorded an interception for the 13th time in 15 games of the Brian Kelly era.
- UC had two receivers (Gilyard/Goodman) tally 100-yards receiving apiece for the first time since Oct. 16, 1993.

GOODMAN HAS A STRONG OPENING NIGHT ...

- Dominick Goodman had 10 catches for a career-high 144 receiving yards and two TDs against Eastern Kentucky.
- His career totals moved to 1,628 yards (8th in the UC record book) and 17 receiving touchdowns (tied for second with Deno Foster, 1981-84).
- Goodman's 10 receptions pushed his career total to 130, moving to third on UC's career reception list. His 130 career catches rank third all-time in the UC record book behind LaDaris Vann (204) and Tye Keith (135).
- He now has four career two-touchdown reception games and four 100-yard plus receiving games.

GOODMAN BRINGS CONSISTENCY ...

- Senior wideout Dominick Goodman has placed himself near some elite company.
- Goodman has caught a pass in 21-straight games, dating back to the Oct. 14, 2006 matchup with Louisville.
- The school record for consecutive games with a reception is 46, set by LaDaris Vann from 1999-2002.
- Goodman led UC in receiving in both 2006 and 2007.

DEFENSIVE ROCK RETURNS SATURDAY ...

- Senior All-American defensive tackle Terrill Byrd is scheduled to make his 2008 debut against Oklahoma after missing the opener due to a violation of team rules.
- Byrd, one of three returning UC All-Americans, had 17 tackles for a loss and eight sacks in 2007.
- He has 11 career sacks and needs two more to move into UC's Top 10 all-time. Antwan Peek, now with the Cleveland Browns, holds the all-time mark with 27.
- Byrd was recently named to the Lombardi Trophy watch list, an award for the top lineman in college football.

DROUGHTS IN THE RETURN GAME ...

- ▶ Almost 13 years and 145 games have passed since the Bearcats have run a kickoff back for a touchdown, the third-longest streak nationally behind.
- ▶ Robert Tate was the last UC player to achieve the feat, on Nov. 18, 1995 at Tulsa, UC's last visit to Oklahoma.
- ▶ UC has also had 111 games pass since its last punt return touchdown, the fourth-longest streak nationally.
- ▶ The last UC player to run a punt back for a score was Tinker Keck, who ran punts of 44 and 78 yards back for touchdowns against Louisville on Nov. 8, 1997.

GRUTZA NAMED BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK ...

- ▶ Senior quarterback Dustin Grutza earned BIG EAST Player of the Week honors for his performance against EKU.
- ▶ He has earned four-career weekly BIG EAST honors. He also earned league honors on Sept. 17, 2007, Oct. 30, 2006 and Sept. 3, 2005.

GRUTZA TURNS IN WORKMAN-LIKE PERFORMANCE ...

- ▶ Senior quarterback Dustin Grutza turned in a strong performance in three quarters of work against EKU.
- ▶ Grutza was 21-for-28 for a career-best 296 yards and along with a career-high three touchdowns.
- ▶ His efficiency rating of 199.16 ranks first in the BIG EAST and eighth nationally. Grutza also leads the league in total offense (329.0 ypg).
- ▶ He became the eighth signal-caller in UC history to eclipse the 4,000-yard mark for his career. His 4,159 passing yards rank seventh all-time and he needs 45 completions to surpass the 400-career completion mark.
- ▶ He also added his third-career rushing touchdowns on a two-yard scamper in the third quarter. It was his first rushing TD since the 2005 season.
- ▶ Grutza's 27 career passing TDs are tied for ninth all-time.
- ▶ Grutza made two starts last season in relief of Ben Mauk.
- ▶ He was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week early in 2007 when he completed 25-of-35 passes for a career-high 290 yards and two touchdowns against Miami (OH) to help UC retain the Victory Bell.

- ▶ *ESPN.com* BIG EAST blogger Brian Bennett will present helmet stickers to the top league performers each week during the 2008 season.
- ▶ For week one, UC wide receiver Dominick Goodman and quarterback Dustin Grutza both earned stickers.

SHOWING THE OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER ...

- ▶ Under the guidance of 2007 BIG EAST Coach of the Year Brian Kelly, the 2007 UC offense set team records for scoring (472 points), touchdowns (63), and passing touchdowns (36).

TRUE FRESHMAN TAKE TO THE FIELD ...

- ▶ Six true freshmen were among 20 Bearcats making their first appearance for UC in the season opener against EKU.
- ▶ D.J. Woods (WR), Dominique Battle (DB), J.K. Schafer (LB), Nick Truesdell (WR), Derek Wolfe (DL) and Evan Davis (OL) were the first-year players who took the field against the Colonels.

WOODS MAKES AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT ...

- ▶ D.J. Woods, who was held out of contact during fall camp due to a blood disorder, made an immediate impact in his UC debut against EKU.
- ▶ He is expected to see time at both wide receiver and punt returner this season.
- ▶ Woods returned his first punt for 25 yards in the second quarter.
- ▶ He made his first career reception in the third quarter.
- ▶ Woods was an *Associated Press* Second-Team All-Ohio selection in 2007 at Strongsville HS despite missing the final five games of the season.

RUNNING NUMBERS ...

- ▶ The Bearcats return 44 letterwinners for 2008, including 20 on offense and 21 on defense.
- ▶ The offense and defense returns six starters apiece.

BEARCATS RECEIVING VOTES IN BOTH POLLS ...

- ▶ After closing out the 2007 season ranked No. 17 in the final *Associated Press* poll, UC is again on the minds of the voters at the start of the '08 campaign.
- ▶ UC, while not yet ranked, is receiving 44 votes in the *AP* Top-25 and 13 votes in the *USA TODAY* poll.

ALL-AMERICAN TRIO ...

- ▶ UC will not be short on nationally recognized talent this season as it returns three all-Americans.
- ▶ Individually, punter Kevin Huber earned consensus All-America honors, while cornerback Mike Mickens received FWAA All-America accolades.
- ▶ Defensive tackle Terrill Byrd garnered third-team *AP* All-America status.

BARNETT RETURNS FOR YEAR TWO ...

- ▶ Marcus Barnett, the No. 2 freshman wideout in the nation last year, is back for his sophomore season after snaring a program-record 13 touchdown passes in 2007.

GOEBEL AND JOHNSON ...

- ▶ Running backs John Goebel and Scott Johnson combined to rush 18 times for 141 yards and a touchdown against Eastern Kentucky on Aug. 28.
- ▶ Goebel had 62 yards on nine carries with a touchdown.
- ▶ Johnson finished with 79 yards on nine carries, including a career-best scamper of 50 yards.

RAMSEY LOOKS FOR TIME AT RB ...

- ▶ Junior Jacob Ramsey, who started the final three games of the 2007 season, earned the starting nod at running back entering 2008.
- ▶ Ramsey rushed for 362 yards on 96 carries with three

touchdowns in 2007.

- ▶ He carried the ball nine times for 34 yards in the opener against Eastern Kentucky.

EXPERIENCE ON THE FRONT LINES ...

- ▶ The offensive line boasts four returners with a combined 35 starts in 2007.
- ▶ Two-year starters Trevor Canfield (right guard) and Jeff Linkenbach (left tackle) lead the group.
- ▶ Khalil El-Amin started 11 games at right tackle last season and Chris Jurek is back after starting nine games at center. El-Amin is out for 2-4 weeks while he recovers from a bout with mono.

GETTING OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSIVELY ...

- ▶ UC shared the national lead in 2007 with 42 takeaways and led the country with 26 interceptions.
- ▶ The Bearcats also were ranked No. 13 nationally in scoring defense (18.8 ppg).

THE BOUNTY HUNTERS ...

- ▶ Cincinnati's defensive backfield may be one of the most fearsome combinations in the nation.
- ▶ The foursome is led by preseason *Playboy* all-America selection Mike Mickens and 2007's co-NCAA leader in interceptions DeAngelo Smith.
- ▶ Mickens, who picked off six passes last season, will occupy one of the starting cornerback roles while Smith, who grabbed eight picks moves to free safety.
- ▶ Transfer Brandon Underwood is penciled in to start opposite Mickens, while Cedric Tolbert, who made 46 tackles a year ago, is slotted to start at strong safety.

BARWIN A MAN OF MANY HATS ...

- ▶ Connor Barwin has five career touchdown catches and 23 appearances as a member of the UC basketball team to his credit.
- ▶ For his next challenge, the 6-4 senior will make the move from tight end to defensive end.
- ▶ Barwin totaled 31 receptions at tight end last season and will likely see time in UC's short-yardage package offensively.
- ▶ In his first game at defensive end, Barwin tied for the team high with five tackles and also had a pair of sacks.

SHIFTING FROM OFFENSE TO DEFENSE ...

- ▶ Defensive end Craig Carey also makes the change from offense to defense this season.
- ▶ Carey, who was a quarterback until this spring, was a special teams standout a year ago.
- ▶ He had three tackles and a half-tackle for a loss against Eastern Kentucky in his defensive debut.

UNSUNG HEROES ...

- ▶ Special teams begins with long snapper Mike Windt, who was nearly flawless last season.
- ▶ Windt never failed on his field goal or punt snaps.

HUBER ON THE RAY GUY WATCH LIST ...

- ▶ Senior punter Kevin Huber heads up the 2008 Ray Guy Award watch list.
- ▶ Huber, a 2007 finalist, was named to the list along with

Keenyn Crier (Arizona), Chris Miller (Ball State), Louie Sakoda (Utah), and A.J. Trapasso (Ohio State).

- ▶ Former Georgia Tech punter Durant Brooks won the award in 2007.

HE'S A PRETTY GOOD PUNTER ...

- ▶ The Bearcats entered 2007 unproven in the kicking game, but Kevin Huber, a consensus All-American, led the nation in gross punting.
- ▶ UC finished as the NCAA team champion in net punting.
- ▶ The holder on place kicks, Huber was a finalist for the Ray Guy Award and set a UC single-season record with a 46.9 yards per punt average.
- ▶ He punted four times in the season opener for an average of 45.8 yards, a mark that ranks 11th nationally.

NOTABLE RULES CHANGES ...

- ▶ The 40-second play clock begins when the ball is dead from the previous play.
- ▶ The first two sideline penalties are five yards. Subsequent penalties for the offense are 15 yards.
- ▶ A horse-collar tackle now results in a 15-yard unnecessary roughness penalty.
- ▶ If a coach's challenge is upheld, the coach retains the challenge.
- ▶ Kickoffs that go out of bounds are penalized 30 yards from the spot of the kick.
- ▶ Grasping or twisting of the facemask is a 15-yard penalty. Incidental contact is no longer penalized.

NOTING THE SCHEDULE ...

- ▶ One of only three schools nationally with three games against teams that played in the 2008 BCS, the Bearcats are the lone school in college football meeting two BCS representatives in non-league tilts.
- ▶ Five of the Bearcats 13 opponents (Connecticut, Eastern Kentucky, Hawai'i, Oklahoma, and West Virginia) either won outright or shared their respective league titles in 2007 and three finished in the final AP Top 25 Poll.

COBB AILING ...

- ▶ Redshirt sophomore OL C.J. Cobb will miss extensive time after suffering a leg injury in preseason camp.
- ▶ Cobb has had surgery already and will embark on a 4-5 month rehabilitation program in the near future.

NEW THREADS FOR UC ...

- ▶ The Bearcats unveiled new adidas uniforms for the home opener against Eastern Kentucky on Aug. 28.
- ▶ The most noticeable addition to the uniforms will be the new "cat scratch" logo that was specially designed by the adidas design team in Portland, Ore.
- ▶ The four scratch marks coincide with UC's nationally recognized "C-Paw" logo which features four claws atop the "C"
- ▶ Beginning this fall, all 18 UC teams will be outfitted exclusively in adidas footwear, uniforms, training apparel, and accessories.
- ▶ There are six possible uniform combinations - black jersey/black pants - white jersey/white pants - white jersey/black pants - black jersey/white pants - red jersey/white pants - red jersey/black pants.

18th season overall | second at Cincinnati

Named the University of Cincinnati's head football coach on Dec. 4, 2006, Kelly has established a reputation for building winning teams. Entering his 18th season, he is listed 12th among active Football Bowl Subdivision head coaches with a record of 148-54-2.

Kelly did not inherit a program in need of a turnaround. He has taken a program worthy of six bowl games in eight years to new heights, matching its highest victory output in a season with a 10-3 record in his first year at Cincinnati.

During a whirlwind first month on the job at UC, Kelly proved that he was up to the challenge. While preparing his new team for the inaugural International Bowl, he also managed to complete his coaching staff and fill out a talent-rich recruiting class. The Bearcats' 27-24 bowl victory over Western Michigan, just 34 days after his hiring, was the icing on the cake for a coach who never missed a beat.

In his first full season at the helm, Kelly put the Bearcats on the national radar by jumping out to a 6-0 start and earning the Bearcats their first appearance in the Top 25 in more than 30 years. Winning 10 games for the first time since 1951, the Bearcats earned their 10th bowl appearance in program history and sixth

bowl appearance in eight years. UC finished at No. 17 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll, earning its first appearance in a final poll.

Along the way to the 2007 Papajohns.com Bowl victory, UC's third straight bowl win, Kelly earned BIG EAST Coach of the Year honors. Cincinnati listed seven individuals on the all-BIG EAST teams, including Special Teams Player of the Year and consensus all-American punter Kevin Huber. The national leader in punting, Huber was one of three Bearcats to be named to an all-America team.

While many coaches lecture on the virtue of possession time, Kelly stresses up-tempo play on both sides of the ball, using each practice to make his point. Armed with his no-huddle offense and the philosophy of a defense that must play 60 minutes, the Bearcats' mentor brings a different attitude to each workout.

Kelly's formula for success starts with an imaginative offense. His 2007 UC team ranked 16th nationally in scoring offense (36.3), 20th in passing (286.2) and 30th in total offense (434.0). At the same time, UC's defense was listed 13th in scoring defense (18.8) and shared the national lead with 42 takeaways.

CINCINNATI (AP) - Dustin Grutza made Cincinnati's quarterback transition go smoothly, throwing for three touchdowns and running for another in a 40-7 victory over Eastern Kentucky that eased the Bearcats' biggest concern, at least for now.

Grutza set a career high with his three touchdown passes in the first half, helping Cincinnati (1-0) get off to a fast start.

The senior threw touchdown passes 15 and 47 yards to Mardy Gilyard, who had never caught more than one in a game. The last one came off the same type of play that Mauk ran so well last year, a play-action rollout that let Gilyard get behind the coverage.

Eastern Kentucky (0-1), the defending Ohio Valley Conference champs, had trouble against a defense that was one of the nation's best last season. The Bearcats were missing tackle Terrill Byrd, suspended for the opener for a violation of team rules.

Allan Holland, the OVC's offensive player of the year last season, was 12-of-17 for 141 yards, including a 61-yard touchdown pass to Cody Watts after the Colonels trailed 40-0. Sophomore running back Aaron Bradley hurt his right knee in the first half and didn't return.

Grutza was the starting quarterback in 2006, but lost his job late that season and never got it back. He led the Bearcats to touchdowns on their first three drives. He left the game after directing a 20-play drive that culminated in his 2-yard touchdown run, making it 33-0 late in the third quarter. Grutza was 21-of-28 for a career-high 296 yards.

The game drew 26,913 fans to a 35,000-seat stadium. The Bearcats drew 20,223 for their opener last season, a 59-3 win over Southeast Missouri State.

There was a momentary fright when the Bearcat mascot parachuted into the stadium before the kickoff. The parachute got tangled in the wire that holds up the net behind the goal post, leaving the costumed man dangling. The parachute slid loose after a few seconds, and the mascot landed feet-first, fell to his back and jumped up.
