## PLAYER TO WATCH

WR **Quentin Chaney**, had been impressive in Oklahoma's last two bowl appearances, but is using his senior season as the real breakout campaign. The Tulsa product entered 2008 with 15 career receptions for 263 yards and four touchdowns. Already in 2008, he boasts 19 grabs for 360 yards and two scores. In the last three games, he has 13 catches for 288 yards. Last Saturday against Nebraska, he posted five receptions for 128 yards and one TD. The yardage figure was one below his career best in last season's Fiesta Bowl.



## THE GAME

With three weeks of play against Big 12 North teams completed, Oklahoma plays the first of three straight against the South at Texas A&M. Both the Sooners and Aggies are coming off home victories. OU rolled over Nebraska, 62-28, while A&M topped Colorado, 24-17.

## THE SERIES

Oklahoma leads it 16-10, although the Aggies own a 5-3 advantage at College Station. The Sooners have won the last five games in the series including a 42-14 triumph at Norman last season.

## THE COACHES

**Oklahoma:** Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is 105-23 in his 10th season with the Sooners. He is 69-14 vs. the Big 12, 36-10 vs. the Big 12 South, 31-4 vs. the Big 12 North, 5-1 in the Big 12 title game, 36-9 vs. non-conference opponents, 60-2 at home, 30-11 on the road, 16-10 on neutral fields, 30-12 vs. ranked opponents, 4-5 in bowls, 3-4 in January Bowls and 2-4 in BCS games. He is 8-1 against Texas A&M.  
**Texas A&M:** Mike Sherman (Central Connecticut State '77) is 4-5 in his first season with the Aggies.

## THE PROGRAM

Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 787-296-53. The Sooners own seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000). OU has 41 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 24 victories (No. 4 nationally). Oklahoma has won 41 conference titles. Since WWII, OU is the most successful program with 552 victories. The school has produced 144 All-Americans and four Heisman Trophy winners. With 30, 10-win seasons, OU leads the nation. Oklahoma's best decade for total victories was the 1970's when the Sooners were 102-13-3 (.877). In the 2000's, OU is 98-18-0 (.845).

**CREDENTIALS**

**MORE ON THE TEXAS A&M SERIES**

■ By winning the last five meetings in the series, Oklahoma has won two straight on Kyle Field. That's a first. The 2006 victory was a 17-16 heart-stopper. The Sooners were faced with a fourth-and-one at their own 29 with 1:29 to play, but Bob Stoops bypassed the punt. QB Paul Thompson leaned forward for the first down to ice the game. Allen Patrick, subbing for the injured Adrian Peterson, ran for 173 yards in the game. In 2004, Jason White hurled five TD strikes as OU out-gunned the Aggies, 42-35. The last time Oklahoma lost in College Station was in 2002, 30-26, the only time a No. 1-ranked Sooner team has lost to an unranked opponent.

**TIES WITH THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT**

■ Oklahoma QB Sam Bradford and Texas A&M DB Kenny Brown were classmates at Putnam City North HS in Oklahoma City. Bradford quarterbacked that team and Brown was a receiver. The only other Oklahoman on the Aggie roster is TE K.J. Williams, from Norman North HS.

■ A&M defensive coordinator Joe Kines has coached against Bob Stoops-coached Oklahoma teams in his career. He was defensive coordinator at Alabama in 2003 when the Sooners won at Tuscaloosa, 20-13. He also was Florida State's linebackers coach from 2000-02, and was on the Seminoles' sideline when OU captured the 2000 national title. In all, there are five Aggie assistants who have coached against OU in previous coaching stops.

■ Aggie offensive coordinator Nolan Cromwell engineered one of the greatest upsets in OU history when he quarterbacked Kansas to a 23-3 win in Norman in 1975. The Sooners rebounded to win the national championship.

**OKLAHOMA'S MOST RECENT GAME**

Oklahoma sprinted to a 35-0 lead and coasted to a 62-28 win over Nebraska in Norman ...

■ OU forced Nebraska turnovers on three of the Huskers' first five plays, including an INT that Dominique Franks returned 18 yards for a TD on NU's first snap of the game. Oklahoma led 21-0 with 10:31 left in the first quarter.

■ Oklahoma tied its own record for points in a quarter against a Big 12 foe with 35 in the first.

■ Sam Bradford completed 19-of-27 passes for 311 yards and five touchdowns (two to TE Jermaine Gresham) with one interception. He did not play in the fourth quarter.

■ DeMarco Murray piled up 202 all purpose yards and three touchdowns. He had 14 rushes for 57 yards and a pair of TDs, one reception for a 25-yard score and two kickoff returns for 119 yards.

■ Redshirt freshman LB Travis Lewis was OU's top tackler for the fifth time in nine game with nine stops.

■ The 62 points represented the most ever by a Sooner team against Nebraska. The 35 points in the first quarter equaled the most ever scored by the Sooners in one period in a Big 12 Conference game.

**VICTORY AT WASHINGTON WAS NO. 100 FOR STOOPS**

Oklahoma's 55-14 victory at Washington on Sept. 13, represented an historic milestone of 100 victories for Sooner head coach Bob Stoops ...

■ Stoops became the eighth-fastest coach to 100 victories in NCAA history by doing so in 122 games, the same number it took for former OU head coach Barry Switzer to hit the mark. Another OU great, Bud Wilkinson, picked up his 100th victory in game 111. He is No. 3 on the list.

■ Oklahoma is the only school in NCAA history to produce four, 100-win coaches. The others are Bennie Owen (122-54-165 from 1905-26), Wilkinson (145-29-4 from 1947-63) and Switzer (157-29-4 from 1973-88).

■ Stoops is only the second coach in NCAA history, and the first in the modern era, to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons. His victory total, regardless of what it is at season's end, will rank No. 2 in NCAA history for 10 seasons. Penn's George Woodruff holds the mark at 124 wins. His 10th season was 1901. Switzer is third on that list at 98.

■ Stoops is one of three coaches with an average of 10 victories per season with at least 10 seasons of coaching. The others were Tom Osborne (255 in 25 seasons at Nebraska) and George Woodruff (142 in 12 seasons, mostly at Penn).

■ Stoops' teams are 105-23 with one national title and five league crowns in 10 seasons (9+). In the 10 years before he arrived in Norman, the OU football fortunes had taken a rare dip. The program was 61-50-3 with no championships and only three bowl trips.

**THE SOONERS BRIEFLY**

- OU was No. 4 in both of preseason polls. It marked the 10th straight season that was ranked in the first AP poll.
- Oklahoma was tabbed for a first-place finish in the Big 12's South Division in a preseason polling of league media. Defensive end Auston English was named the league's preseason defensive player of the year.
- There are 27 players on this team with previous starting experience. There were 34 in 2007, 10 in 2006.
- Last season, Oklahoma was 11-3 overall, 6-2 in the Big 12. The Sooners won their fifth Big 12 crown (second straight) and 41st league title overall before advancing to the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.
- Three players from the '07 team left early for the NFL: WR Malcolm Kelly (Redskins), LB Curtis Lofton (Falcons) and DB Reggie Smith (49ers).

**OKLAHOMA AND THE BIG 12**

- Oklahoma's all-time Big 12 regular season record is 71-29, 76-30 if counting title games. Stoops is 63-13 in the regular season, 68-14 counting all. Before he arrived, OU's Big 12 mark was 8-16.
- Oklahoma has won five Big 12 titles. That's more than double any other league member. Texas and Nebraska both have two. No other school has more than one.

**MARQUEE MATCH-UPS AWAIT OKLAHOMA ON FUTURE SCHEDULES**

Oklahoma has a number of high-profile opponents already contracted for in the seasons ahead. Non-conference games on future schedules include at Miami (Fla.) in 2009, at Florida State (2011), Notre Dame (2012), at Notre Dame (2013), Tennessee (2014), at Tennessee (2015), Ohio State (2016), at Ohio State (2017) and LSU in 2018 and 2019. Under current head coach Bob Stoops, Oklahoma already played Louisville, Notre Dame, North Carolina, Alabama (twice), UCLA (twice), Oregon (twice), Washington (twice), South Florida and Miami (Fla.) in regular season contests.

**NEW VIDEO BOARD IN DEBUT SEASON AT NORMAN**

- The board measures 113.5 feet wide by 32.5 feet tall (3,689 square feet). The previous video board space on the south end board was 36 X 21 (756 square feet). It is thought that the new board is the fourth-largest in the nation.
- The 16mm High Definition board was purchased at a cost \$4.5 million.
- The project included a new sound system, the extension of the ribbon boards on the upper decks and a new Sooner Vision high definition control room, which carried a price tag of \$2 million.

**STOOPS ERA YIELDING RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE NUMBERS**

- Oklahoma has drawn 4,838,595 fans for Bob Stoops' 61 home games (started in 1999) ...
- All 61 have been sold out and the Sooners have prevailed 57 times.
- Last year's average home attendance of 84,858 was the largest in school history. The top eight seasons for OU home attendance have come on Stoops' watch.
- The crowd of 85,357 for the '07 Miami game was the largest to see a sporting event in the state of Oklahoma.
- OU has exceeded its listed capacity of 82,112 in 34 consecutive games.
- Oklahoma has played before sellout crowds in 105 of Stoops' 128 games. A total of 9,367,500, or an average of 73,184, has seen those games.

### ABOUT THE OFFENSE

- Under Stoops, OU produced its career leader in passing and receiving, while turning out the No. 3 and No. 4 career rushers and the school record holder for single-season rushing, passing and receiving yards.
- Of 81 basic offensive records at OU, 52 have been set under Stoops.
- OU scored at least one TD in every game dating to Nov. 7, 1998.
- OU rushed for 200 yards 38 times under Stoops, 32 in the last five years.
- Also under Stoops, OU has 132 touchdowns of 25+ yards and 264 scoring drives that took less than two minutes.
- OU is the highest scoring program in college football history. In 1,135 games, the Sooners scored 30,167 points, or 26.6 per game. Michigan has 29,496 points in 1,201 games and Nebraska 29,330 in 1,197.

### ABOUT THE OFFENSE IN 2008

- The Sooners have been over 500 yards of total offense six times. The best total was 674 yards against Kansas, the most total yardage by an OU team since 829 against Kansas State in 1988.
- Oklahoma set a school record for points scored in a first half when it tallied 55 at Kansas State. The previous best was 52 against Rice in 1978. The 55 points tied the OU record for points in any half. Oklahoma also had 55 against KSU in 1942.
- OU has scored 50 first-half points twice. The Sooners also did it with 50 vs. Tennessee-Chattanooga. In the modern era (since 1937), the Sooners have scored 50 or more first-half points four times -- twice this season.
- Oklahoma ran 97 plays against Kansas, the most by a Sooner team since 102 against Oregon in 1975.
- OU has 12 scoring drives of 60 seconds or less.
- Oklahoma scored on its first drive in eight games this season with seven touchdowns and one field goal. The one time OU failed to score on its first possession (Kansas), it scored on its second.
- The Sooners scored 35 first-quarter points against Nebraska to equal their one-period best against Big 12 foes. For the first time in its history, OU has scored 28 or more points in a quarter this season (all in the first quarter).
- Oklahoma had 36 first downs against Kansas, 30 against Cincinnati.
- With 55 points at Washington and 58 at Kansas State, Oklahoma has eclipsed 50 points on the road twice this season. That has not happened since 2003 with 53 at Iowa State and 56 at Texas Tech. That same year, the Sooners scored 65 on a neutral field when they defeated Texas, 65-13, at Dallas.
- Two more rushers went over 1,000 yards for their career this season. Chris Brown was the 66th player at OU to do so, DeMarco Murray the 67th.
- OU got 438 total yards against a TCU defense that hasn't surrendered more than 297 to any other foe.

### SAM SUMMATION

- Sam Bradford threw for 3,121 yards, 36 touchdowns and eight interceptions in 14 games last season. Through nine games this season, he has 3,086 yards with 34 touchdowns and six picks.
- Against Kansas, he set an OU record for passing yards in a game with 468. The previous mark of 429 was set by Bradford's position coach, Josh Heupel, in a 1999 game against Louisville.
- He has set an NCAA record for touchdown passes during the freshman/sophomore seasons (70). Florida's Rex Grossman held the mark (55).
- OU quarterbacks have thrown a school record five touchdowns in 11 games. Bradford has six of those.
- Bradford has an OU record 31 career completions of 40 or more yards. That tops Jason White's 29.
- In '08, he averages one TD pass every 8.7 attempts; one INT every 49.5 attempts (less than one/game).
- Bradford has seven completions that exceeded 50 yards. All seven went for touchdowns.
- The OU QB threw two picks each against Cincinnati and Texas. He also threw five TDs in each of those games.

## SINCE SAM

OU has played 23 games since Sam Bradford was named the starting QB, although he missed nearly all of the '07 Texas Tech game due to injury. Here is a look at OU's production in the other 22 games, in which the team has a record of 19-3, a Big 12 title and BCS Bowl appearance ...

- OU averaged 40.3 points per game and eclipsed 50 points nine times.
- He averaged 3.4 touchdown passes/game, while completing 426-of-606 passes (.703) with 70 TDs and 14 INT.
- Oklahoma averaged 434.0 yards total yards per game.
- He threw for 300+ yards nine times and 400+ twice in an offense that also averaged 184.2 rushing yards.
- Threw multiple TDs in 19 games with five each vs. Miami (Fla.), Texas A&M, Cincinnati, Washington, Texas and Nebraska.

## SENIOR RECEIVERS PUTTING UP BIG NUMBERS

- Manuel Johnson had seven touchdown receptions over the TCU, Baylor and Texas games with at least one in each. Malcolm Kelly was the only other OU player to accomplish that feat.
- Juaquin Iglesias has a career total of 3,775 all purpose yards, which ranks No. 10 on the career list at Oklahoma.
- Iglesias has catches in 41 straight games (third-longest in nation, Jarrett Dillard, Rice, 45; Casey Flair, UNLV, 44).
- Iglesias' string of six straight games with a TD catch was snapped vs. Texas. Mark Clayton holds the OU best (8).
- Quentin Chaney has emerged with more than 100 receiving yards in two of the last three games (105 vs. Kansas, 128 vs. Nebraska).

## GRESHAM, MURRY IN THE "ZONE"

- Jermaine Gresham has more TD catches than any tight end in OU history. He has 21, including nine in '08.
- Gresham is striking from longer distance in 2008. Last season, he averaged 13.8 yards per touchdown catch, but that figure has ballooned to 25.0 this season.
- Demarco Murray has 29 TDs to tie Adrian Peterson's mark for the most in the first two years of an OU career.

## THE LINE ON THE LINE

This offensive line two-deep averages 6-5 (77.1 inches) and 302.8 pounds. During the Stoops era this is the third-heaviest and third-tallest line. This line (two-deep) has combined for 180 starts, 256 games played.

## GOOD HANDLES

Oklahoma lost its first fumble of the season in game eight at Kansas State. Chris Brown lost the handle with 5:08 remaining in the fourth quarter on a rushing play. That means the Sooners rushed 341 times before losing a fumble. Including receptions and kickoff, punt, interception and fumble returns, OU handed the ball 571 times before losing a fumble. There have been 777 touches.

## OFFENSIVE MISCELLANY

- OU is No. 1 in the nation in Red Zone Scoring (49-51) with 47 TD.
- Oklahoma's first half scoring average of 35.2 would rank No. 23 nationally for all teams for entire games.
- Sam Bradford is completing 64% of his passes on third down with 28 first downs and 10 touchdowns.
- Four different receivers have at least six third-down receptions.
- OU has now gone two full games and 91 pass attempts (dating back to Texas game) since surrendering a sack.
- Oklahoma's 35 TD passes have gone to nine different receivers.
- OU has completed passes to 17 receivers, which ranks No. 4 nationally.
- Matt Clapp's seven rushing attempts rank No. 2 for a FB under Stoops.
- DeMarco Murray, the starter at RB, has 139 carries for 681 yards and 11 TDs. Back-ups Chris Brown and Mossis Madu have a combined 199 tries for 930 yards and 12 TDs.

**ABOUT THE SOONER DEFENSE**

■ OU forced at least one turnover in 112 of Bob Stoops' 128 games and has at least one interception in 82 of the last 111; multiple picks in 36 of the last 82 outings.

■ Oklahoma has nine shutouts under its current head coach. Opponents scored less than seven points 30 times and less than 14 in 58 games.

**NO EASY ROAD FOR THIS DEFENSE**

Oklahoma has or will play six teams that are currently ranked among the top 20 nationally in total offense. Similarly, OU has or will play six teams that are currently ranked among the top 25 nationally in scoring offense.

**DEFENSIVE MISCELLANY**

■ Three of the 27 touchdowns scored against the OU defense were scored inside the last minute of comfortable victories (last play of game by Cincinnati, :58 by Kansas, :21 by Nebraska).

■ Over the last two seasons, OU has 57 sacks (2.5/game) while allowing 21 (1.0/game). In '08, the ratio is 30:8.

■ While giving up more yards and points than normal, it should be noted that over the last three games, Oklahoma's defense has forced 11 turnovers while logging nine sacks.

■ OU ranks No. 10 nationally in third-down defense. Opponents have converted just 39-of-130.

■ Oklahoma has 73 tackles for 300 yards in losses compared with just 42 for 125 by the opponents.

**WEAK FREAK**

Travis Lewis is having a banner season at weak side linebacker. The redshirt freshman leads the team with 93 tackles (ranks No. 8 nationally with 10.3/game), 19 of which came against Texas when he tied the freshman single-game set by Brian Bosworth in the 1984 Nebraska game.

■ Bosworth also has the freshman season tackle record at 133 followed by Lewis, Darrell Reed with 90 and Kevin Murphy with 87. Reed and Murphy were defensive ends.

■ Among linebackers, Lewis already has the No. 2 season by tackles for an OU freshman. Bosworth had 133 followed by Lewis then Rocky Calmus with 55, Chris Justice with 47 and then Dante Jones and Lewis with 41. Both Bosworth (twice) and Calmus won the Butkus Award as the nation's top linebacker.

**SOONERS LOSE REYNOLDS TO INJURY**

MLB Ryan Reynolds will miss the remainder of the season after incurring a right knee injury against Texas (game six). The junior concluded the campaign with 46 total tackles, five for loss with two pass deflections and one fumble forced. Reynolds was the only player on OU's team that came into the season with a previous Sooner starting assignment at linebacker.

**TAKEAWAYS A GROUP PROJECT**

Oklahoma ranks No. 5 nationally in turnover margin (+1.33) with eight turnovers and 20 takeaways ...

■ Over the last three games, OU has two turnovers against 11 takeaways. The Sooners had a season-high five takeaways at Kansas State then four more against Nebraska.

■ Seven different players have forced a fumble.

■ Six players have fumble recoveries, although FS Lendy Holmes, CB Brian Jackson and DT DeMarcus Granger each have two.

■ The 11 INTs thus far have been made by four different players.

**HE'S NEW, SORTA**

First-year Sooner Mike Balogun was born Sept. 28, 1983, and is 24 years old. Former OU players C.J. Ah You (2006) and Billy Sims (1979) were 24 during their senior seasons. Players of that age were typical after WWII. Since that time, the oldest Sooner football player was DL Dick Passo, who was 26 when he played in 1968. Balogun started at Kansas State.

**MORE THAN RUN STOPPERS**

Defensive ends and blitzers tend to be associated with the sack, but the Sooner interior has played a role in that statistic too. OU's four-man defensive tackle rotation has a combined career total of 20.5 career sacks, and a DT has been credited with a full or have sack in seven games this season.

- There have been 26 special teams touchdowns, including 20 in the last 69 regular season games. Those 20 came via five different kinds of plays -- 11 punt returns, two faked field goals, two blocked punts, four kickoff returns and a faked punt. Special teams also own one safety in that span.
- Oklahoma has returned eight kickoffs and 15 punts for touchdowns.
- The Sooners have blocked 21 kicks.

**THE SEASON'S RETURNS ARE GOOD**

- Oklahoma ranks No. 6 nationally at 26.55 per kickoff return. That figure leads the Big 12. The Sooners led the nation in kickoff returns last season.
- DeMarco Murray ranks No. 11 nationally at 28.94 yards per return. He had 119 kickoff return yards against Nebraska last Saturday for the fifth-best one-game total in school history. He accomplished that feat on just two returns (one of 62 yards and another of 57).
- Ryan Broyles ranks No. 21 nationally in punt returns with 15 tries for 11.7 yards and one touchdown, a 68-yarder at Kansas State.

**KNALL EMERGES AS PUNTER**

Mike Knall won the starting job in the 10th game (vs. Baylor) of the 2007 season and held it for the remainder of the campaign. Prior to that time he had been used mostly in short-yardage situations as the pooch punter ...

- True to his pooch-punting past, Knall has put 12 of his 42 kicks this season inside the 20. He has only four touchbacks this season. For his career, 21 of 75 boots have been downed inside the 20.
- Knall got off his third 50-yard kick of the season last Saturday against Nebraska when he booted a 51-yarder.

**THE KICKING GAME**

Redshirt freshman Jimmy Stevens is the placekicker. He is the first freshman to tackle that chore since Garrett Hartley did so in the Baylor game of 2004 (Nov. 20). Stevens has been called upon for only four field goals this season. He is 2-of-4 with one that was partially blocked and a 47-yarder that missed wide. The record for fewest field goals in a season at Oklahoma is zero on multiple occasions, most recently in 1962. There have been 10 seasons with single digit attempts, most recently eight in 1988.

- Kicker Matthew Moreland, who handles kickoffs only, has 13 touchbacks in 74 attempts. Six of those touchbacks came in the last three games, including a season-high-equaling three against Kansas. He has at least one touchback in each of the last five games.

**HOLD IT**

WR Carter Whitson, a walk-on, is the team's holder for placements this season. The sophomore played most of his high school career at Shawnee, Okla., before spending his senior season at Broken Arrow High School. He was a quarterback during his prep days. Whitson was the holder at Shawnee during his sophomore season.

History is one tough customer at Oklahoma. The tradition, so rich and so long-standing, is as daunting as it is impressive. To be among the best at Oklahoma is to be among the best in college football.

Such dramatics are lost on Bob Stoops. The Sooner head coach befriended the would-be albatross of OU's successful past from his first day on campus and remains steadfastly focused on tomorrow and the championship it holds.

It falls then to the observers and experts of the game to define Stoops' impact. Rarely have the pundits had it so easy.

Under Stoops, Oklahoma has won 105 games (105-23), nine bowl games, six of the BCS variety, had one string of 88 consecutive appearances in the AP poll and captured five Big 12 crowns (the next highest total in the league is two). His 2000 team won the national championship. On a playing field leveled by scholarship limits and parity, this era stares down the Oklahoma standard and does not blink.

The achievement dulls the memory of what Stoops inherited. When he arrived in Norman, the proud Sooner program was five years removed from a winning record, four from bowl play. Those atypical days of angst are so forgotten now that they might as well be mentioned with the land rush and dust bowl.

Stoop, born Sept. 9, 1960, has been characterized as a grounded family man, brilliant big-game coach, relentless recruiter, disciplined leader and a person with uncommon perspective.

His success emanates from a disciplined style true to his roots in the Steel Valley of Ohio, but he is far from inflexible. The principles to which he holds are the tried and true axioms of the sport . . . mixed with cutting edge strategy and an appreciation for the calculated risk.

During his time, OU has produced record-setting passers and receivers, five 1,000-yard rushers,

suffocating defense and special teams units that rank among the most dynamic in the land. Every facet has been impacted.

His players have snagged 16 national awards, including the 2003 Heisman Trophy won by Jason White. There have been more than 60 academic honorees, 62 All-Big 12 players, 24 All-Americans and 36 NFL draft choices.

Stoops has won a total of 10 national coach of the year awards and has been Big 12 Coach of the year three times.

This is one of the finest coaches in the history of one of college football's most storied traditions.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry. He worked through the ranks until he became co-defensive



coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95) during Bill Snyder's rein.

With the Wildcats, he played a key role in an impressive turnaround. During his final four seasons there, K-State was 35-12 with three bowl appearances. Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. In 1996, he was part of a national championship team. It was with the Gators that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.

Stoops, who is widely known for countless hours of charitable work, most of which is directed towards children, graduated from Iowa in 1983 with a degree in marketing. He and his wife, Carol, have three children: daughter, Mackenzie, and twin sons, Drake and Isaac.

The Oklahoma defense was equally dominant, shutting out the Huskies until the 5:37 mark of the third period. Prior to that play, OU had amassed a 41-0 lead.

CB Brian Jackson led the defensive unit with two fumble recoveries, one fumble forced and five tackles.

At the end of the day, Oklahoma had 591 total yards with 274 on the ground and 317 through the air. UW finished with 336 yards, 95 in the fourth quarter.

NORMAN, Okla. -- Sam Bradford threw for a career-high 411 yards and Manuel Johnson set an Oklahoma record with 206 receiving yards as the No. 2-ranked Sooners sprinted past TCU, 35-10.

The Horned Frogs loaded up against the run, and limited OU to just 25 yards on 36 attempts, but opened themselves up to a flurry of big passing plays.

After finding Juaquin Iglesias for a 24-yard touchdown on OU's first possession, Bradford threw three straight TDs to Johnson on plays covering 76, 55 and 63 yards. Johnson became just the second player in school history to record three scoring plays of 55+ yards in one game (tying Antonio Perkins).

Oklahoma shredded the nation's No. 1-ranked defense for 436 total yards and Bradford threw at least four touchdown passes in a third consecutive game.

Meanwhile, the Sooner defense stymied a TCU team that was averaging 43.0 points per game by forcing four turnovers, two fumbles and two interceptions. The Horned Frogs did not get a touchdown until the fourth quarter.

The victory extended Oklahoma's home winning streak to 21 games, a figure that tied the second longest home streak in school history.
