THE GAME . . .

√ The **TULSA GOLDEN HURRICANE (1-0, 1-0 C-USA)** is on the road for the third straight week, but this time stays in the state of Oklahoma as the Hurricane plays the **OKLAHOMA SOONERS (1-1, 0-0 Big 12)** in a non-conference match-up on Saturday, September 19, 2009 . . . the game will kickoff at 2:30 pm (CT) at Oklahoma Memorial Stadium (82,112) in Norman, Oklahoma . . . FOX SportsNet will televise the contest.

THE SERIES . . .

√ This is the 24th meeting between Tulsa and Oklahoma . . . the Sooners lead the series 15-7-1 . . . Oklahoma has won the last four games . . . the last time the two teams played in Norman, OU came away with a 31-15 victory . . . OU has won nine of the last 10 meetings . . . Tulsa's last win in the series came in the 1996 campaign when Tulsa stunned the Sooners 31-24 in Norman . . . the first meeting in the series came in 1914 . . . there was a large gap between 1944 and 1978 that the two teams did not play each other, before the series was renewed in 1979 . . . including that game, this is the 11th meeting between Tulsa and Oklahoma since 1979.

TULSA RANKS 19th FOR WINS OVER PAST SEVEN YEARS . . .

√ Tulsa Golden Hurricane football teams have posted a 52-29 record in the last seven seasons (since 2003) . . . the 52 wins is good for a 19th place tie in the NCAA for Most Wins Over the Last Seven-Year Period . . . it is also the most wins for any Conference USA school over the past seven seasons . . . Tulsa is tied with Hawaii, Navy and Missouri with 52 wins since 2003 . . . USC leads the country with 73 wins, followed by Boise State (70), Oklahoma (67), Texas (66) and LSU (65) rounding out the top five.

DAMARIS JOHNSON TOPS C-USA, NCAA IN ALL-PURPOSE YARDAGE . . .

√ Last year, Damaris Johnson led the Hurricane and Conference USA in all-purpose yardage with 2,475 yards and a 176.8 average as a true freshman . . . after two games, he not only leads C-USA but also the nation with an average of 240 yards per game.

In Tulsa's season opener, he picked up where he left off a year ago when he totaled 252 all-purpose yards, tallying 31 rush yards, 60 receiving yards, 76 kick-off return yards and 85 punt return yards . . . Johnson had his first punt return for a TD when he returned a 66-yarder to give Tulsa a 30-10 victory.

Last week, Johnson totaled 228 all-purpose yards with 101 receiving, 64 on kick-off returns and 35 punt return yards.

TULSA COMING OFF MOST WINS EVER . . .

√ Last year, Tulsa finished the season with an 11-3 record, setting a school record with 11 wins . . . Tulsa has had six seasons with at least 10 wins, but last year's 11 victories was a first in school history . . . the 2008 campaign was also the second straight year that Tulsa won at least 10 games, making it the first back-to-back 10 win seasons in school history . . . Tulsa's 10-win seasons have come in 1916, 1920, 1942, 1982, 1991 and 2007.

THE LAST TULSA-OKLAHOMA MEETING . . .

√ Oklahoma came away with a 62-21 victory as the Sooners visited H.A. Chapman Stadium on Sept. 21, 2007.

Tulsa cut into Oklahoma's lead when Paul Smith connected with Brennan Marion on a 48-yard touchdown pass, making it 21-14 with 9:57 left in the first half . . . OU put up two scores before intermission to take a 35-14 halftime lead . . . the Hurricane took the second half possession 81 yards in 11 plays cutting into the lead at 35-21.

OU's DeMarco Murray responded on the ensuing kickoff with an 81-yard TD return . . . the Sooners added three more scores in the second half.

OU's Sam Bradford completed 16-of-22 passes for 244 yards and three touchdowns, while Tulsa's Smith threw for 350 yards and two TDs, completing 22-of-32 passes . . . OU's Allen Patrick rushed for 145 yards and two TDs.

THE HEAD COACHES . . .

√ Tulsa's **TODD GRAHAM (East Central '87)** is his third season as head coach of the Golden Hurricane . . . Graham has a 23-7 record with the Hurricane . . . his 21-7 mark in his first two seasons is the best record for any Tulsa coach in their first two seasons . . . Graham has an overall coaching mark of 30-13 in three seasons as a college head coach.

He has led Tulsa to two straight C-USA West Division titles, appearances in the C-USA Championship Game and two GMAC Bowl Championships.

Never before has a Tulsa head coach led a team to back-to-back 10+ win seasons . . . Graham led the Hurricane to a 10-4 record in 2007 and an 11-3 mark in the 2008 campaign. In each of the last two years, Tulsa has led the nation in total offense by gaining 543.9 yards in 2007 and 569.9 in the 2008 season.

The Hurricane defeated No. 22-ranked Ball State in the GMAC Bowl last year by a score of 45-13 . . . In 2007, Tulsa posted a 63-7 win over Bowling Green in the GMAC Bowl, the largest margin of victory in NCAA Bowl history. Tulsa set 29 school records, 15 C-USA marks and four NCAA records that season.

Graham was the head coach at Rice in 2006, where he led the Owls to a 7-6 record, second-place in the C-USA West Division and the school's first bowl berth in 45 years.

Before his stint at Rice, Graham spent three years as the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Tulsa . . . he helped Tulsa post a 21-17 record and win the 2005 C-USA Championship and 2005 Liberty Bowl titles.

Prior to coming to Tulsa as defensive coordinator, he spent two years at West Virginia . . . Graham coached in the prep ranks in Texas and Oklahoma before moving to the college level.

√ Oklahoma's **BOB STOOPS (Iowa '83)** is in his 11th year at the helm of the Oklahoma football program . . . he has compiled a 110-25 record with the Sooners . . . Oklahoma won the 2000 national championship and played for three more, won six Big 12 South crowns and six Big 12 titles . . . Oklahoma has spent 24 weeks at No. 1 under Stoops . . . he has led the Sooners to 10 bowl games and has coached two Heisman Trophy winners along with 29 All-Americans.

Before coming to Oklahoma, Stoops was the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Florida for three years (1996-98) . . . he also spent assistant coaching stints at Kansas State, Kent State and Iowa.

ONE OF ONLY 11 SCHOOLS . . .

√ Tulsa became one of just 11 schools to post back-to-back 10 win seasons in each of the last two years . . . Tulsa had 10 wins in 2007 and 11 wins last year . . . the other schools with consecutive 10+ win seasons over the last two years are: USC, Oklahoma, Boise State, Texas, Ohio State, Virginia Tech, Georgia, BYU, Missouri and Cincinnati.

TULSA FACES NO. 2 AND NO. 3 TEAMS ON SEVEN-YEAR WINS LIST . . .

√ This year's schedule has the Hurricane playing two teams that are among the top-3 teams in the nation for wins over the past six seasons . . . Boise State is ranked second with 70 victories since the 2003 season, while Oklahoma is third with 67 wins . . . BSU entered this season ranked 14th in the *Associated Press* poll, while Oklahoma was the *AP's* preseason third-ranked team.

TULSA GETS OFF TO 1-0 START IN C-USA . . .

√ The Hurricane won its season opener and jumped out to a 1-0 start in the Conference USA West Division . . . Tulsa defeated fellow West Division foe, Tulane, by a 37-13 score on Sept. 4th.

G.J. PICKS UP WHERE TULSA QBS LEFT OFF . . .

√ Sophomore quarterback G.J. Kinne in his first collegiate start and his first game experience since his prep senior season of 2006 turned in a solid performance in the season opener against Tulane . . . Kinne passed for 211 yards and one TD while completing 75-percent of his passes (10-of-15) . . . he also had a team-best 77 rushing yards and ran for a 15-yard touchdown.

Kinne surpassed the 300-yard plateau a week later with 310 yards and four touchdowns while completing 22-of-35 passes against New Mexico . . . he also rushed for 47 yards.

Tulsa's previous two quarterbacks – Paul Smith and David Johnson – had ranked among the nation's leaders in various QB categories . . . Kinne is ranked among the top-25 in five NCAA statistical categories.

DEE-FENSE . . .

√ Tulsa's defense has been dominant in its first two games, but this week's opponent – Oklahoma – poses a much bigger task for the Hurricane defenders.

After two weeks, Tulsa is second in Conference USA for rush defense, scoring defense and total defense . . . the Hurricane ranks 11th in rush defense nationally, allowing its first two opponents just 94 yards on the ground for a 1.6 average per carry . . . the Hurricane has been able to get to the quarterback as well, ranking second nationally in QB sacks as well as tackles for lost yardage.

Tulsa's defense is ranked 10th in the nation for turnovers gained and 15th for interceptions . . . Tulsa forced Tulane into two turnovers, both interceptions, and a game later had one pick-off and three fumble recoveries against New Mexico.

In it's second game of the year against New Mexico, Tulsa held the Lobos to six first downs, 1-of-15 on third down conversions, 55 rushing yards and 3.1 yards per play . . . the Hurricane defense held UNM to 70 yards of total offense in the second half.

TULSA HOLDS CONSECUTIVE OPPONENTS TO UNDER 15 POINTS FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE . . .

√ Tulsa held Tulane to 13 points and New Mexico to 10 points in the first two games of the season . . . the last time the Hurricane held two consecutive opponents to less than 15 points was in 2006, when Tulsa held three teams to less than 15 points in consecutive games — 6 by Southern Miss (Oct. 3), 10 at East Carolina (Oct. 14) and 14 at Memphis (Oct. 21).

WHAT A DEFENSIVE EFFORT IN THE OPENER . . .

√ The Tulsa defense was dominant early against the Tulane Green Wave in the season opener . . . Tulsa held Tulane to -4 yards on 10 plays in the Green Wave's first three possessions . . . in those first three possessions, Tulsa had four TFLs for -25 yards, including three sacks for -23 yards, and also an interception return to the Tulane five-yard line, which set-up Tulsa's second touchdown of the game . . . for the game, Tulsa had 11 tackles for -50 yards in lost yardage, including five quarterback sacks.

BRYAN HAS BIG DAY IN OPENER . . .

√ Senior linebacker Mike Bryan had a huge performance in the opening game of his senior season . . . he totaled 11 tackles, including seven solos and four tackles for -8 yards in lost yardage against Tulane . . . Bryan also had an 18-yard interception return to the Tulane 5-yard line, that led the Hurricane to its second TD of the game, and forced one fumble . . . after the first week, Bryan was ranked among the NCAA's defensive leaders in a number of categories — 1st in TFLs, 6th in forced fumbles, 9th for interceptions, 20th for solo tackles and 29th in total tackles.

SCORING OVER 40 POINTS . . .

√ Tulsa scored 40 points for the first time this season at New Mexico, with 44 points . . . since the 2007 season when Coach Graham took the helm of the Hurricane program, Tulsa has scored over 40 points in 17 of 30 games . . . in 10 of those contests, Tulsa has scored over 50 points . . . Tulsa has now scored 40+ points in 15 of the last 22 games dating back to the 2007 season . . . over the last 21 contests, Tulsa has averaged 49.1 points (1,032) per game . . . Tulsa had nine 40+ point scoring games last year, including four over 50 points, three over 60 and one over 70 points.

TWO RECEIVERS HAVE ALREADY REACHED 1,000 CAREER YARDS, TWO MORE ARE APPROACHING . . .

√ Juniors Trae Johnson and Charles Clay reached the 1,000-yard receiving mark as freshmen . . . this season, two more receivers in their second season with the Hurricane, senior Slick Shelley and sophomore Damaris Johnson are getting close to eclipsing the 1,000 career receiving plateau . . . Johnson needs just 96 more yards and Shelley needs 240 more yards to reach the 1,000-yard mark . . . Johnson has 904 yards on 60 receptions, while Shelley has caught 48 passes for 760 yards.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING . . .

√ Since Todd Graham has taken over the Tulsa coaching reigns in 2007, the Hurricane offense had never had the same starting lineup in consecutive games until this season . . . it took the 29th and 30th games of Graham's tenure at Tulsa for the same starting offensive lineup to appear on the field in consecutive games —against Tulane and New Mexico.

FEWEST SINCE . . .

√ The Tulsa defense held New Mexico to 171 yards of total offense . . . it was the fewest total yards allowed by a Tulsa defense since Nov. 24, 2006 . . . Tulane gained just 152 yards, including 74 rushing and 78 passing, in that contest.

Earlier in the 2006 campaign, the Hurricane defense held the North Texas offense to just 89 yards on Sept. 16, 2006, giving up just 27 yards on the ground and 62 passing yards.

In the first two games, Tulsa held Tulane to just 39 rushing yards and New Mexico to 55 yards on the ground . . . however, it was just last year that the Hurricane held an opponent to less than 100 yards in consecutive games . . . UTEP, UCF and Arkansas in consecutive games last year gained less than 65 yards each against Tulsa's defense.

WILLIAMS GOES OVER 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS . . .

√ Junior Jamad Williams, the back-up in each of the last two years to Tulsa's career, single-season and single-game record-holder Tarrion Adams, entered the 2009 campaign with 981 yards, needing 19 yards to reach the 1,000 career rushing mark . . . Williams surpassed the 1,000 rushing plateau in the first game as he totaled 34 yards on 12 carries, giving him 1,015 career yards . . . he now has career totals of 1,039 rushing yards on 214 carries for a 4.85 per carry average.

TWO TDs IN 20-SECONDS . . .

√ Tulsa scored its 10th and 17th points in the season opener at Tulane within 20-seconds of each other . . . G.J. Kinne ran 15 yards for a TD at the 6:20 mark of the first quarter to give Tulsa a 10-0 lead . . . after a Mike Bryan interception, Tulsa's Charles Clay ran in from five yards out for a touchdown while only 0:20 elapsed off the clock.

TULSA'S 661 POINTS LAST YEAR WAS SECOND MOST IN NCAA HISTORY, BEHIND OU'S 716 . . .

√ Tulsa scored 661 points in 14 games in the 2008 season, bettering the previous year's total of 576 points in 14 games . . . the 661 point total broke the previous school record of 621 points set in the 1920 campaign, which was established in 11 contests . . . Tulsa's 661 points gave the Hurricane a 47.2 scoring average to rank second in the nation . . . in the modern era, Tulsa's 661 points ranks as the second-most in NCAA history behind Oklahoma's 2008 total of 716, and followed by Hawaii's 656 in 2006, Nebraska's 654 in 1983, Texas' 652 in 2005 and Southern Cal's 638 in 2005.

FIRST 3, 5 OF FIRST 7 GAMES ON THE ROAD FOR TULSA . . .

√ Going into the third week of the season, Tulsa will be playing its' third straight road game . . . Tulsa has defeated Tulane, 37-13, and New Mexico, 44-10, in the first two weeks . . . this week's non-conference game at Oklahoma is the third of those road games . . . the first three C-USA games are also on the road for the Hurricane, including the season opener at Tulane, Rice on Oct. 3 and UTEP on Oct. 21 . . . among the first seven games, only Sam Houston State on Sept. 26 and the Oct. 14th game against Boise State are at home.

FOUR TULSA PLAYERS ON C-USA PRESEASON TEAM . . .

√ The Hurricane had four players named to the C-USA Coaches pre-season all-conference team this year . . . Tulsa is represented on the team by sophomore kick returner Damaris Johnson, sophomore offensive tackle Tyler Holmes, senior linebacker Mike Bryan and senior safety James Lockett . . . Johnson was also selected as the C-USA Special Teams Player of the Year.

TULSA'S DAMARIS JOHNSON NAMED PRESEASON SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE YEAR . . .

√ Tulsa sophomore kick returner/receiver Damaris Johnson was named the Special Teams Player of the Year by the C-USA Coaches in their preseason poll this year, and also in the C-USA media poll . . . last season, Johnson led Tulsa and C-USA in all-purpose yardage with 2,475 all-purpose yards for a 176.8-yard average . . . he set a school record with 1,382 kickoff return yards and also added 743 receiving yards and 327 rushing yards.

TULSA HAS PLAYED FOR THREE C-USA TITLES IN FIRST FOUR YEARS IN THE LEAGUE . . .

Tulsa entered Conference USA as a member in all sports on July 1, 2005 . . . a little over five months later the Golden Hurricane captured the school's first C-USA title in any sport.

Tulsa completed its first season by winning the C-USA West Division with a 6-2 league record and posted a win over UCF in the C-USA Championship Game.

In 2007, Tulsa had another 6-2 record to win the West Division and went on to face UCF in the title game once more . . . this time the Knights captured the championship game victory . . . last year, after finishing 7-1 in C-USA play and winning its' third West Division title, Tulsa hosted East Carolina in the Championship Game, but dropped a 27-24 decision.

Tulsa has won 34 conference titles in school history . . . Tulsa's C-USA crown in 2005 was the first since 1985 when the Hurricane won the Missouri Valley Conference Championship.

NINE TU GAMES ON NATIONAL OR REGIONAL TV THIS SEASON . . .

√ Tulsa will have nine games televised regionally or nationally this season, including four on ESPN and three on CBS College Sports Network, one on Fox Sports Southwest and one on the Mountain Network.

ESPN aired the Tulsa season opener at Tulane (Sept. 4), and will also air the home game against Boise State (Oct. 14), at UTEP (Oct. 21) and home against East Carolina (Nov. 15) . . . CBS College Sports Network (CBS C) will televise Tulsa league games at Rice (Oct. 3), and home games against Houston (Nov. 7) and Memphis (Nov. 27) . . . the Southern Mississippi game on Nov. 21 could be added to the CBS College Sports Network schedule 12 days out.

The New Mexico game was on The Mountain Network and the Oklahoma contest will appear on Fox Sports-Southwest.

This is the most televised games since Tulsa had seven games televised nationally in 2007 including regular season games vs. UL-Monroe (ESPN2), BYU (CSTV), Oklahoma (ESPN2), Tulane (CSTV), Army (ESPN Classic), UCF in the C-USA Championship Game (ESPN2) and Bowling Green (ESPN) . . . Tulsa was 5-2 on national TV in 2007. Tulsa had a total of six games nationally televised last year.

TOP 3 RECEIVERS ON ALL-TIME FRESHMAN RECEIVING LIST RETURN . . .

√ Returning players Trae Johnson and Charles Clay, both juniors, and sophomore Damaris Johnson are ranked 1-2-3 on the school's all-time freshman receiving list.

In 2007, Trae Johnson had 1,088 yards on 70 receptions and Clay had 1,024 yards on 69 catches . . . they became just the 12th and 13th players in school history to reach 1,000 receiving yards in a single season.

Damaris Johnson, who is ranked third on the freshman receiving list, had a team-high 53 receptions last year and was second in yardage with 743 yards, while leading the team in TD catches with 10.

Trae Johnson and Clay became part of NCAA history in 2007 by teaming with another 1,000-yard receiver, junior Brennan Marion, in becoming just the third trio in NCAA history to have three 1,000-yard receivers on the same team in the same season . . . Texas Tech's 2003 trio of Carlos Francis, Wes Walker and Nehemiah Glover each hit the 1,000-yard mark, while also in 2007, Hawaii's trio of Ryan Grice-Mullen, Davone Bess and Jason Rivers reached 1,000 receiving yards apiece.

TWO FROSH ALL-AMERICANS RETURN FOR SOPHOMORE SEASONS . . .

√ Last year, Damaris Johnson was named to Freshman All-America teams by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), The Sporting News magazine, Rivals.com and Phil Steele's magazine.

He was a first-team kick return specialist by FWAA and The Sporting News, first-team all-purpose selection by Rivals.com and second-team kick returner by Phil Steele . . . Johnson led Tulsa and C-USA in all-purpose yardage with 2,475 all-purpose yards for a 176.8-yard average . . . he set a school record with 1,382 kickoff return yards and also added 743 receiving yards on a team-high 53 receptions.

Red-shirt freshman offensive tackle Tyler Holmes also received Freshman All-America recognition last year, awarded by Collegefootballnews.com . . . Holmes started all 14 games for the Hurricane and graded over 80-percent in seven contests.

GRAHAM IN FIRST YEAR OF NEW 10-YEAR CONTRACT . . .

√ Tulsa's Todd Graham is in the first year of a new 10-year contract, it was announced on January 1, 2009 . . . the contract, terms of which were not disclosed, runs through the 2018-19 academic year . . . Graham is the only coach in school history to lead two teams to 10-win seasons, and he accomplished that feat in consecutive years, 2007 and 2008.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46). Tulsa has played in 14 bowl games.

- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive stand-out for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.

- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.

- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.

- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which is just north of Skelly Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000.

- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

- Some other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte.

- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and, Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears). Chicago Bears Defensive Coordinator Bob Babich is also a Tulsa graduate.

TULSA'S SUCCESS OVER SEVEN-YEAR PERIOD . . .

√ Although Todd Graham was in his first season as Tulsa's head coach in the 2007 season, he came to the Hurricane in 2003 and spent three seasons as Tulsa's defensive coordinator before serving as the head coach at Rice in 2006 . . . Graham helped lay the groundwork for the recent success that the program has seen . . . in addition to appearing in five bowl games, Tulsa has 52 victories in the last seven seasons, posting a 52-29 (.642) record . . . the 52 wins is ranked in a 19th place tie for most victories in the last seven years among FBS schools . . . in an 11-year stretch before that, Tulsa won just 34 games from 1992 through the 2002 campaign, compiling a 34-88 mark for a .279 winning percentage.

TULSA HAD SECOND STRAIGHT GMAC BOWL WIN . . .

√ For the second straight year, Tulsa not only participated in the GMAC Bowl but won big . . . Tulsa defeated #22 ranked Ball State, 12-1 heading into the game, by a score of 45-13 in the final game of the 2008 season, on January 6, 2009 . . . a year earlier, the Hurricane defeated Bowling Green, also of the Mid-American Conference, by a 63-7 score . . . that 56-point win margin was the largest margin of victory in NCAA Bowl history . . . Tulsa has played in a bowl game in five of the last six years, including four straight.

TULSA LED NATION IN BACK-TO-BACK YEARS FOR THE THIRD TIME IN SCHOOL HISTORY . . .

√ Tulsa led the nation in total offense in 2007 with 543.9 yards and in the 2008 campaign with 569.9 yards . . . the feat of leading the nation in total offense in back-to-back years has occurred two other times in school history . . . only five other schools have led the nation for total offense in back-to-back seasons, while three of those schools have done it more than once — Houston (1966, '67, '68 and 1989, '90) and BYU (1979, '80 and 1983, '84, '85) have accomplished it twice . . . Tulsa has done it three times in consecutive seasons . . . the Tulsa teams of 1951 (280.1) and 1952 (466.6) were the nation's leaders in total offense, and before the 2008 season the last time came in 1964 (461.8) and 1965 (427.8).

"THE ROCK"

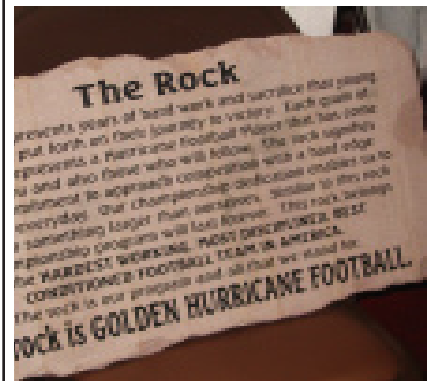
The Golden Hurricane unveiled a new tradition in 2007 as the "ROCK" took center stage at the team's practice the day prior to the season opener. Tulsa began practice as the entire travel team gathered in the end zone, and stretched out from sideline-to-sideline, hand-in-hand and began the walk.

Steve Craver, a senior safety and the player in charge of the "ROCK" for that road trip, was flanked by honorary coach Steve August, a 1976 All-American as an offensive lineman at Tulsa. The team walked the entire field with Craver carrying the 60-pound, 1.5x2-foot "ROCK". At the end of the walk, Craver, then August, talked to the team.

The "Rock" is inscripted with the following words: "The rock represents years of hard work and sacrifice that young men have put forth in their journey to victory. Each grain of this rock represents a Hurricane Football Player that has come before you and also those who will follow. The rock signifies our commitment to approach competition with a hard edge mentality every day. Our championship dedication enables us to belong to something larger than ourselves. Similar to this rock our championship program will last forever. This rock belongs to the HARDEST WORKING, MOST DISCIPLINED, BEST CONDITIONED FOOTBALL TEAM IN AMERICA. The rock is our program and all that we stand for. The rock is GOLDEN HURRICANE FOOTBALL."

The "Rock" travels with the Hurricane and accompany the team at meetings, meals and to the stadium.

The "Rock" was a tradition that Tulsa Head Coach Todd Graham originated at Allen High School as that school's head coach in the 1990s.

√ Last year as a true freshman, Damaris Johnson established new single-season school records for kickoff returns and kickoff return yardage . . . he finished his freshman season with 1,382 yards on 54 returns for a 25.6 average per game, breaking the previous records of 1,131 yards on 37 returns by Ashlan Davis in the 2004 campaign . . . Johnson led Tulsa and Conference USA in all-purpose yards with 2,475 all-purpose yards in 2008.

√ Tulsa gained 791 total yards against UTEP on October 18th for the NCAA's season-best single-game performance in 2008 . . . Tulsa compiled six of the top-55 single-game bests for total offense last season . . . Tulsa also had five of the top-40 scoring games . . . Tulsa's 77 points against UTEP was the second-most points scored in 2008 in the NCAA . . . Tulsa's 489 rushing yards on 59 carries against Tulane ranked third in the NCAA in 2008 as well.

THE COACHING TREE . . .

√ Tulsa Head Coach Todd Graham has coached with five of Tulsa's nine assistant coaches before . . . defensive coordinator Keith Patterson and Graham were college teammates and roommates at East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma . . . Patterson then coached three years under Graham at Allen High School, and has been at Tulsa five years with Graham . . . Graham and co-offensive coordinator/line coach Herb Hand were on the staff together at West Virginia for one year . . . when Graham was the co-defensive coordinator at West Virginia in 2002, Paul Randolph was coaching the defensive line . . . tight ends coach Bob McClain coached on the same West Virginia staff as Graham in 2001 and 2002.

Vs. NEW MEXICO . . . Tulsa game captains were G.J. Kinne and Mike Bryan . . . Tulsa won the coin toss, and deferred to the second half. Last week, Tulane won the coin toss . . . Tulsa Head Coach Todd Graham coached from the press box against New Mexico It's the first time as a college head coach that he has coached from the press box . . . Tulsa's Cory Jefferis' first kick-off was downed in the end zone for a touchback . . . George Clinkscales recovered a fumble on Tulsa's first punt, it was his third career fumble recovery . . . James Lockett forced a first quarter fumble, it was his sixth of his career as well as the sixth in the last two years (Tulsa did not recover the fumble) . . . in his second collegiate game, Cory Dorris had his first and second career forced fumbles and fumble recoveries against New Mexico . . . Damaris Johnson had his third career 100-yard receiving game, as he had two last year in his freshman season . . . John Destin had his second interception of the season. He had his first of the year last week for a 32-yard return against Tulane . . . Slick Shelley caught two touchdown passes in the game, totaling 17 and 22 yards. It was his third two touchdown game in his two-year career with the Hurricane . . . G.J. Kinne's four touchdown passes was the most for a Tulsa quarterback since David Johnson's four TD passes last year at Houston . . . Tulsa has gone over 400 yards in each of its first two games this season. Tulsa has now surpassed 400 yards in total offense in 27 of the 30 games with Todd Graham as head coach . . . Tulsa has now scored 40 or more points in 17 of 30 games since Todd Graham became the head coach in 2007. The Hurricane has now scored over 40 points in 15 of the last 22 games . . . Trae Johnson has five receptions on the season, and three have gone for touchdowns, including two vs. New Mexico.
