QUICKLY -- In a game which will be televised on ABC, No. 24 AP/No. 21 Coaches Kansas (5-1, 1-1 Big 12) hosts No. 25 AP Oklahoma (3-3, 1-1 Big 12) on Saturday, Oct. 24 at 2:30 p.m.

- KU is 27-4 at home in the last five seasons.
- KU is 28-8 in its last 36 games overall.
- Saturday's game is the only home game in a four-game stretch for Kansas, which played at Colorado last week and will go to Texas Tech and Kansas State the next two weeks.
- KU is 17-5 playing as a ranked team in the Mark Mangino era.
- KU won its last game vs. a ranked team defeating No. 12 Missouri on Nov. 29, 2008.
- KU will be hosting a ranked team in Lawrence for the eighth time in the Mark Mangino era. KU is 2-5 in the seven times a ranked opponent played in Memorial Stadium, with wins against No. 23 Missouri in 2003 and No. 25 Iowa State in 2005.
- While KU is 19-18 against Big 12 North teams in the Mark Mangino era, KU is 4-17 against South team rivals (was 0-3 last year after going 3-0 vs. the South in 2007).
- KU is looking for its sixth win of the season, which would give the Jayhawks at least six victories for the fifth consecutive season, a streak which has only been accomplished twice in school history (1895-99 and 1902-06).

KU RANKED VS. OPPONENT RANKED -- Saturday's game features two ranked teams, an occurrence which has been rare for Kansas football. In fact, since No. 11 KU defeated No. 25 UCLA in the 1995 Aloha Bowl, both teams have been ranked in a Kansas football game just five times. Here is a look:

- 2007 - No. 2 Kansas vs. No. 4 Missouri - L 28-36
- 2007 - No. 8 Kansas vs. No. 5 Virginia Tech (Orange Bowl) - W 24-21
- 2008 - No. 13 Kansas at No. 19 South Florida - L 34-37
- 2008 - No. 16 Kansas at No. 4 Oklahoma - L 31-45
- 2008 - No. 19 Kansas vs. No. 8 Texas Tech - L 21-63

DID YOU KNOW? -- Kansas has won five of its 17 games against ranked teams in the Mark Mangino era. Prior to his arrival, KU had posted five wins its previous 60 games against ranked teams.

1-2-3-3-3 -- WR Dezmon Briscoe is leading the nation in receiving yards per game (134.20), WR Kerry Meier is second in receptions (9.00) and QB Todd Reesing is third in passing yards (330.00), completions (27.17) and total offense (340.17). In all, Jayhawks are in the top 10 nationally in eight different individual statistical categories (see page six of this release).

ABC IN LAWRENCE -- For just the second time since 1998, ABC will be broadcasting a game out of Lawrence (2007 game against Iowa State).

Head Coach Mark Mangino

Mark Mangino (Youngstown State, 1987) is in his eighth season as the head coach at Kansas. Mangino has continually improved the Kansas program, which had not posted a winning record in any of the six seasons before his arrival. Prior to coming to Kansas, Mangino helped in the turnaround of the Kansas State football program in the 1990s before becoming an assistant at Oklahoma. He also coached at New Castle (Pa.) High School, Youngstown State, Geneva College, and Ellwood City (Pa.) High School.

MANGINO HIGHLIGHTS

- Consensus National Coach of the Year (2007).
- Only coach in NCAA to earn both the national coach of the year and the national assistant coach of the year honors (Broyles Award in 2000).
- Has been a part of 13 bowl games in his last 16 years of coaching.
- Is the first Kansas coach to have a winning record since Jack Mitchell (44-42-5) in 1966 (KU had seven full-time coaches in between).
- Was the offensive coordinator for the national champion Oklahoma Sooners in 2000.

KANSAS ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN MANGINO ERA

- Four bowl games in a six-year span (2003-present). That represents one-third of KU's bowl appearances in just six years (eight bowl games in the previous 56 years since KU's first bowl game in 1948).
- Bowl games in consecutive years (2007 and 2008) for the first time in school history.
- Three consecutive bowl victories for the first time in school history.
- Eight wins in consecutive seasons (2007 and 2008) for the first time since 1908 and 1909.
- Twenty wins in a two-year period, the most in consecutive years in school history (won 18 games combined in 2006-07 and 1904-05).
- Six wins in four-straight seasons (2005-08) for the first time since 1903-06.
- Combined 33-17 record from 2005-08 for the most wins in a four-year period in school history.
- Set new home attendance average records in each of the last four seasons.
- KU returned to the national polls in 2007, the Jayhawks' first ranking since 1996.
- KU was ranked in a school-record 19 consecutive Associated Press polls from 2007 through half of 2008.
- Reached No. 2 in the polls after winning first 11 games in 2007.

KANSAS HONORS IN MANGINO ERA

- KU has produced 72 All-Big 12 selections.
- KU has produced 45 Academic All-Big 12 First Team selections.
- Four Jayhawks were drafted after the 2007 season, including first-round selection Aqib Talib.
- In 2007 and 2008 KU had a combined three All-Americans and 24 All-Big 12 selections.
- A number of Jayhawks have made national award lists, including two finalists in Aqib Talib (Nagurski Award) and Anthony Collins (Outland Trophy) in 2007.

ANOTHER TOUGH SCHEDULE -- Based on the opponents' record, Kansas had the nation's seventh-most difficult schedule in 2008 as Jayhawk opponents were a combined 79-53 for a 59.8 winning percentage when not playing KU. This year KU's 11 FBS opponents were a combined 78-54 last season for a winning percentage of 59.1 percent when not playing the Jayhawks.

20-6 LAST TWO YEARS -- Kansas posted a combined 20-6 record in 2007 and 2008. Five of those six losses were to ranked teams, including three teams that were ranked fourth in the nation at game times. The only non-ranked team the Jayhawks lost to in the previous two seasons was at Nebraska in 2008. The Huskers would finish the year 9-4 after defeating Clemson in the Gator Bowl.

EXPLOSIVE OFFENSE -- In the last two years the Kansas offense has ranked among the best in the country. The 2007 team set school records in total offense, passing and scoring. Last year's team set a new record in passing offense.

FORCING TURNOVERS -- In the last two years the Kansas defense forced a combined 60 turnovers (35 in 2007 and 25 in 2008). That total was the ninth best in the nation in that span.

PRESEASON POLLS -- For the second year in a row, and seventh time overall, Kansas was ranked in the Associated Press AP Top 25 poll at the start of the 2009 season. This year the Jayhawks were listed No. 25. In 2007 KU was ranked 14th. KU's other preseason AP Top 25 listings include 1952 (17th), 1961 (8th), 1968 (12th), 1976 (19th), and 1996 (25th).

KU VS. AP TOP 25 -- Kansas has won five of its 17 games against ranked teams in the Mark Mangino era. Prior to his arrival KU had posted five wins in its previous 60 games against ranked teams.

KU CONFERENCE FINISHES -- Kansas tied for the Big 12 Conference North Division title in 2007 with a 7-1 conference record and placed third in 2008 with a 4-4 league mark. Prior to the last two seasons, KU had not finished higher than fourth in the North Division in the first 11 years of the conference.

TV EXPOSURE -- In 2007 and 2008 19 of 26 Kansas football games were televised nationally, including 11 straight in 2008. For the first time in history, all four KU non-conference games were broadcast in 2009 and it is expected that all 12 regular season games will be televised for the first time as well.

BOWL APPEARANCES (AND WINS) -- Kansas has played in four bowl games in the first seven years of the Mark Mangino era. The Jayhawks had played in eight bowl games in the previous 55 seasons. Under Mangino KU appeared in consecutive bowls for the first time in history. KU has also won each of its last three bowl appearances, a first in Kansas football history.

NEW STUFF -- Prior to the start of the 2008 season a football facility was built adjacent to Memorial Stadium. In 2009 a new playing surface was added to the stadium as FieldTurf was laid down this past summer.

RED JERSEYS -- Kansas is 7-1 (lost to Texas Tech last year) when wearing red jerseys in the Mark Mangino era, including 1-0 this year (beat Southern Miss.). Prior to the Mangino era, KU last wore red jerseys in the 1947 Orange Bowl.

This Week's Game

KU-OU SERIES -- Oklahoma leads the all-time series 67-27-6, including a 30-14-3 advantage in games played at Lawrence. The Sooners have won five straight in the series since KU won three straight from 1995-97. Oklahoma is making its first trip to Lawrence since 2001 as the teams played in Norman in 2004 and 2008 and in Kansas City in 2005.

KU-OU HISTORICAL NOTE -- The 96 straight games KU and OU played against each other from 1903-97 ranks as the nation's fifth-longest uninterrupted series. The streak was stopped for Big 12 scheduling. This year's meeting is the 101st in the series.

KU-OU LAST YEAR -- Despite a record-breaking performance by KU WR Dezmon Briscoe, No. 16 Kansas lost 45-31 at No. 4 Oklahoma on Oct. 11. Briscoe caught what was then a school record 12 passes for what still is a school best 269 yards and two touchdowns. The 269 yards were the most in a game in the NCAA last year. QB Todd Reesing was 24 of 41 for 342 yards and two touchdowns. RB Jake Sharp ran 12 times for 103 yards and a touchdown. KU put up 491 yards of offense, but the Sooners ran up 674, including 468 passing. KU trailed just 31-24 early in the third quarter before Oklahoma scored two touchdowns to lead 45-24 with 12:02 left.

KU-OU LAST TIME AT LAWRENCE -- As mentioned Oklahoma has not played at Lawrence since the 2001 season. Kansas opened the scoring with a Johnny Beck field goal in the first quarter before the Sooners ran up 38 consecutive points before KU scored on a 77-yard pass from Mario Kinsey to Roger Ross with five minutes left. The Sooners won 38-10 behind 151 passing yards and 117 rushing yards from Jason White. Kansas gained just 223 yards, while Oklahoma accumulated 403. KU LB Leo Etienne recorded 18 tackles in the loss.

KU'S OKLAHOMANS -- Kansas has 11 players from the state of Oklahoma including LS Kayl Anderson (Tulsa/Bishop Kelley), PK Jacob Branstetter (Lawton/MacArthur), CB Anthony Davis (Tulsa/East Central), TE Bradley Dedeaux (Midwest City), CB Chris Harris (Bixby), OL Gavin Howard (Owasso), DE Jake Laptad (Tulsa/Jenks), LB Dakota Lewis (Sulphur), RB Rell Lewis (Muskogee), OL Michael Martinovich (Tulsa/Cascia Hall Prep), and DT John Williams (Tulsa/Washington).

MORE KU-OU CONNECTIONS -- KU Head Coach Mark Mangino was an assistant coach at Oklahoma from 1999-2001, serving as the offensive coordinator in 2000 and 2001... KU TE Coach Brandon Blaney was a GA at Oklahoma in 1999 and 2000... KU Director of Strength and Conditioning Chris Dawson was a LB at Oklahoma from 1992-94 and was a GA at OU in 1995 and an assistant strength and conditioning coach from 1996-2000... KU On-Campus Recruiting Coordinator Rajeeb Hossain is a Norman HS graduate... KU Offensive Graduate Assistant Tommy Mangino played high school football at Norman HS before moving to Lawrence for his junior and senior seasons... OU players from the state of Kansas include LB Jayden Bird (Conway Springs), TE Brody Eldridge (La Cygne/Prairie View) and FB Marshall Musil (La Crosse).

THINGS TO LOOK FOR AGAINST OKLAHOMA

- KU will be trying to win consecutive games against a ranked opponent for the first time since beating No. 4 Colorado and No. 15 Oklahoma in 1995 (KU defeated No. 12 Missouri last year in its last game against a ranked opponent).
- KU has scored at least 30 points in eight straight games dating back to last year.
- KU has produced at least 400 yards of total offense in eight games in a row.
- KU has scored points in 21 consecutive quarters (and in 23 of 24 this season).
- QB Todd Reesing has thrown multiple touchdowns in four straight games.
- Reesing has thrown for 400 yards in two straight games.
- WR Kerry Meier has recorded at least 10 receptions and 100 receiving yards in three straight games.
- Meier has at least one touchdown catch in four straight games.
- Meier (1,904) needs 96 yards to become the fourth KU player to record 2,000 career receiving yards.
- Meier has caught at least four passes in nine straight games and at least two in 27 consecutive.
- WR Dezmon Briscoe has caught at least four passes in nine straight games and at least two in 24 consecutive contests.
- Briscoe has recorded at least 100 receiving yards in eight of the last nine games.
- DE Jake Laptad has been in on a sack in five of six games this year and in six of the last eight contests.
- S Darrell Stuckey has recorded double-digit tackle totals in two straight games.

Kansas Team Notes

LAST TIME OUT -- Kansas rallied from a 21-point deficit at 24-3 late in the second quarter to pull ahead 30-27 early in the fourth period before Colorado escaped with a 34-30 victory. The Buffaloes scored the go-ahead touchdown with 8:36 remaining as Kansas had two final drive attempts end at the CU six and 19-yard lines.

- Six Jayhawks made their first appearance on the defensive side of the ball this season.
- DT John Williams and S Lubbock Smith became the 13th and 14th Jayhawks to make their first career starts this year as well as the fifth and sixth freshmen.
- Kansas trailed by more than one score for the first time on the season.
- Colorado had touchdown drives of one and three yards after Kansas turnovers.
- QB Todd Reesing recorded his third career 400-yard passing game with 401.
- WR Dezmon Briscoe went over the 100 receiving yard mark for the third straight game.
- WR Kerry Meier recorded at least 10 receptions and 100 yards for the third straight game.
- LB Drew Dudley had a career-high 17 tackles, while S Darrell Stuckey had 12 tackles.
- PK Jacob Branstetter recorded the three longest field goals of his KU career (43, 42 and 37 yards).
- Kansas scored at least 30 points in its seventh straight road game.

KU drove inside the CU 20 on each of its last two possessions but came up empty-handed... KU has committed two or fewer turnovers in 11 consecutive games... The Jayhawks had two turnovers at Colorado, which resulted in the Buffaloes taking possession at the one and three-yard lines and promptly scoring touchdowns... -- After not attempting a field goal in the previous two games, PK Jacob Branstetter was three of three against Colorado as he made the three longest field goals of his career (37, 43 and 42 yards)... P Alonso Rojas recorded a 50-yard punt for the third straight game.

NEW FACES

-- Last week at Colorado several Jayhawks saw either their first or most extensive action on defense. Among that group were redshirt freshmen, first-time starters DT John Williams and FS Lubbock Smith. Williams was an offensive lineman before last week. CB D.J. Beshears, a true freshman, made his collegiate debut last week. LB Angus Quigley, who was a running back before this year, played on defense for the first time. In addition, regular WR Bradley McDougald, a true freshman, played several snaps on defense.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

-- This season 14 different Jayhawks have made their first collegiate starts, including three true freshmen in RB Toben Oporum, WR Bradley McDougald and LB Huldon Tharp. Redshirt freshmen who have started include OT Tanner Hawkinson, DT John Williams and FS Lubbock Smith. Other first-time starters this year include OG Brad Thorson, OG Sal Capra, DE Maxwell Onyegbule, DT Patrick Dorsey, LB Drew Dudley, LB Justin Springer, CB Anthony Davis and DB Ryan Murphy.

FRESHMEN EXPERIENCE

MID-SEASON BREAKDOWN

TODD REESING - (see page 8 for more information)... In his last five games against Big 12 competition he has averaged 356.0 passing yards per game, with 14 touchdowns and five interceptions... Has thrown at least two touchdowns in four straight games and in seven of the last eight games... His 273.1 passing yards per game for his career ranks third among all active NCAA players... His 442 yards against Iowa State was second most in school history... Had his first career reception at Colorado on a 14-yard pass from Kerry Meier.

KALE PICK - Saw first collegiate action against Northern Colorado and was two-of-two for 11 yards passing, while running for 47 yards on three carries... At UTEP ran twice for 87 yards, including a 55-yard rush... Had an 18-yard run vs. Duke... 2008 KU offensive scout team player of the year.

KERRY MEIER - Started eight games at QB as a freshman in 2006... Career passing numbers are 134 of 219 (61.2 percent) for 1,612 yards and 17 touchdowns... In the last two years he is 29 of 33 for 363 yards and four touchdowns... This season he is two of three for 70 yards.

Had a touchdown reception in each of the first three games... Ran for 103 yards at Oklahoma last year.

TOBEN OPURUM - After averaging 83.6 yards in the first five games, he carried just two times for three yards and one touchdown at Colorado last week... The true freshman has scored at least one touchdown in all six games... Against Southern Mississippi he became the first KU freshman since 2002 to rush for 100 yards in a game (106)... Followed that with 98 yards on 24 attempts against Iowa State.

WIDE RECEIVERS

KERRY MEIER - (see page 8 for more information).

DEZMON BRISCOE - (see page 8 for more information)... His 269 receiving yards at Oklahoma last season were the most in the country in 2008... That figure is also a school record... His 83.0 receiving yards per game in his career is second among active NCAA players.

BRADLEY McDOUGALD - The true freshman has caught at least one pass in every game... Best games were seven for 46 vs. Southern Mississippi and six for 37 vs. Duke... Has had just three catches in the two games since then... Played a few snaps on defense at Colorado last week.

LAWRENCE, Kan. – To get the Jayhawks' 2009 season off on the right foot, senior quarterback Todd Reesing took matters into his own hands – and feet. Before a record crowd of 52,530, Reesing rushed for KU's first two scores and threw a pair of second quarter touchdown passes to give the 25th-ranked Jayhawks a 49-3 triumph over visiting Northern Colorado in the season-opener at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium Saturday evening. The senior quarterback accounted for 287 of KU's 543 yards in the game, carrying the ball 13 times for 79 yards and throwing for 208. On the Jayhawks' first play from scrimmage, Reesing hit fellow senior Kerry Meier on a slant pattern for 30 yards, which set the tone for the KU offense. Reesing capped the drive with a one-yard scamper around the left end in which he juked his way through a group of would-be tacklers to give KU a 7-0 lead. Reesing capped another long drive with a 13-yard run early in the second quarter and then threw touchdown passes to Jake Sharp on a shovel pass and Tertavian Ingram to give Kansas a 28-0 lead heading into the halftime break. Reesing led Kansas on one more scoring drive, a seven-play, 64-yard march, before giving way to backup quarterback Kale Pick early in the fourth quarter. Kansas ran for 328 yards, compared to just 74 on the ground for Northern Colorado. As impressive as the Jayhawk offense was, the defense might have been better. Kansas held the Bears to 246 yards of total offense, including 95 in the first half. Northern Colorado penetrated the Jayhawk 20-yard line just twice in the contest, with both drives ending with field goal tries.

EL PASO, Texas – Senior DE Maxwell Onyegbule and the Jayhawk defense set the tone early as Kansas rolled past UTEP 34-7. In the first half alone, Onyegbule had two sacks and four total tackles for loss to lead a defense that finished the half with five sacks, an interception and a pair of quarterback hurries. UTEP was forced to punt on six of its seven possessions of the period and mustered just three first downs. With the defense and special teams setting the tone, it gave the offense the breathing room it needed to get in rhythm. As it turned out, it was just what the offense needed after putting just three points on the board for the first quarter and a half. Kansas opened the scoring with a 21-yard field goal from junior PK Jacob Branstetter. After forcing UTEP to punt on its opening possession, the Jayhawks drove the ball 75 yards on their opening drive with the key play coming on a trick play where senior WR Kerry Meier hit streaking junior WR Dezmon Briscoe for 56 yards through the air. Kansas punted on its next two possessions then came to life, scoring on its next three. Kansas racked up 250 yards of total offense in the first half compared to just 49 for UTEP. Reesing went 17-of-26 through the air for 134 yards and a TD. UTEP was able to get on the board at the 12:39 mark of the fourth quarter on a 75-yard touchdown pass from Trevor Vittatoo to Donavon Kemp. The TD wiped away KU's attempt at a shutout, but the defense still had to walk away happy. For the game, the defense held UTEP to just 208 yards and seven first downs. Seven players recorded tackles for losses led by Onyegbule with five. Add to that line six quarterback hurries, three passes broken up and an interception, and it was a good night in El Paso. Reesing finished 25-of-41 for 260 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Kansas racked up 576 total yards and outdid the Miners 23-7 on first downs.

LAWRENCE, Kan. – Kansas QB Todd Reesing threw for 338 yards and three touchdowns and also collected 51 yards on the ground to lead Kansas to a 44-16 win over Duke. Reesing completed 28-of-41 passes against the Blue Devils, including touchdowns to three different receivers. His 338 yards in the air marked his seventh-straight game with 200 or more passing yards and his 14th career 300-yard passing game. Duke opened the game with a two-play 87-yard scoring drive capped by a 21-yard touchdown run by QB Thaddeus Lewis. Kansas answered right back with a 14-yard touchdown reception by WR Dezmon Briscoe just two and half minutes later to knot the score at 7-7 midway through the first quarter. The two teams traded punts on the next few possessions before Reesing connected with RB Jake Sharp for a six-yard TD with just under five minutes remaining in the first half. Reesing collected his third TD pass of the first half as he hit WR Kerry Meier in the end zone for a six-yard score with just over a minute to play before the break. The Jayhawk defense got the scoring started in the second half of play as DE Maxwell Onyegbule picked off a Lewis pass on the opening possession of the third quarter. Onyegbule returned the interception for a 48-yard touchdown pushing the Kansas lead to 27-7. Briscoe finished the game with 117 yards receiving, his sixth-straight 100-yard receiving game. S Darrell Stuckey led the Jayhawk defense with a season-high 11 tackles. LB Huldon Tharp recorded a career-high 10 tackles, while LB Drew Dudley finished with a career-best eight tackles. KU finished with five sacks on the afternoon.

KU's victory ended the nation's second longest winning streak at eight games. Reesing completed 30-of-41 passes against the Golden Eagles, including touchdowns to two different receivers. After Southern Miss tied the game at 28, Kansas received ideal field position after Darrell Stuckey posted a 50-yard kick return to place the ball at the Southern Miss 40-yard line just before the end of the third quarter. The Jayhawks took advantage of the kick return, and Reesing found Meier uncovered for a 12-yard touchdown, his second of the game, to make the score 35-28. The KU defense then held USM to 27 yards in the fourth quarter as USM threw an interception, punted twice and had a drive end on downs to end the game.

LAWRENCE, Kan. – Kansas senior WR Kerry Meier set a school record with 16 receptions for a career-high 142 yards and two touchdowns, while senior QB Todd Reesing tied his school record with 37 completions for a career-high 442 yards and four touchdowns as No. 16 Kansas outlasted Iowa State 41-36. Reesing's main two targets for the afternoon were Meier, with his record-setting 16 receptions and junior WR Dezmon Briscoe, who had 12 catches for 186 yards and two touchdowns. Meier and Briscoe ended the day as KU's career receptions leaders with Meier first at 167 and Briscoe at 165. For Reesing, his 442 yards were second in school history. Despite the offensive fire power displayed by the Jayhawks, the team needed a fourth-down stop at its own 31-yard line to solidify the win. Trailing by five with 2:36 remaining in the game, ISU regained possession on its own 34-yard line and marched to the KU 31 before the Jayhawks' defense held fast to produce a turnover on downs. KU CB Chris Harris made a huge tackle of Iowa State receiver Jake Williams on second-and-10 and then broke up the third-down pass, resulting in a fourth-and-nine attempt for the Cyclones. On fourth down, pressure forced ISU quarterback Austen Arnaud's pass to sail incomplete. KU scored what proved to be the winning touchdown when Reesing hit Meier in the end zone with a six-yard touchdown pass, giving Kansas a 41-30 with 8:42 remaining on the game clock. Reesing went 5-for-6 for 61 yards on the drive, while Meier caught three passes and tallied his fifth touchdown of the season.
