NEWS AND NOTES

The Final Stop

The Oklahoma State Cowboys (9-2/6-1) conclude the 2009 regular season Saturday when they head south to Norman to take on the Oklahoma Sooners. Kickoff is set for 11:40 a.m. with the game selected for a national telecast by FSN. Calling the action will be Bill Land. Dave Lapham will provide analysis and Jim Knox will report from the sidelines. Bob Steinfeld is the producer. OSU will be playing on FSN for the third time this season. Previous appearances in 2009 came vs. Houston and at Texas A&M.

More TV Stuff

The 2009 Oklahoma State football team is the most televised group of Cowboys in program history. On Saturday, OSU will be making its 11th TV appearance of the season. OSU's previous high for TV games was 10 on two occasions. The Bedlam game will be OSU's eighth on national television. The total will rise to nine after the bowl game.

20/16 Vision

When quarterback Alex Cate and receiver Tracy Moore opened in the starting lineup against Colorado, they increased to 36 the number of starters used by Oklahoma State this season. Twenty players have started on offense with only offensive linemen Russell Okung, Andrew Lewis and Noah Franklin starting all 11 games. Sixteen players have started on defense.

What's Already Done

Oklahoma State enters the OU game having already clinched sole possession of second place in the Big 12 South. It will be the best conference finish for the Cowboys in the 14-year history of the Big 12 with a school-record six conference wins already in the bank. A loss by Texas to Texas A&M on Thanksgiving night would give OSU a share of the Big 12 South title, although the Longhorns have already clinched the South's spot in the Big 12 title game. Road Test

Oklahoma State enters the OU game riding one of the best road stretches in program history with four straight road wins, including a 3-0 mark this season.

- OSU is riding its first four-game road winning streak since the 2003-2004 seasons.
OSU last won five straight road games in the 1943-1946 seasons when the Aggies reeled off a school-record 11 in a row.
OSU has won four straight conference road games (including the 2008 win at Colorado) for the first time since 1979 and for just the third time in history.
OSU has never won five straight conference road games.
The last time OSU registered a perfect road season was in 1945.
The Cowboys last won four road games in the same season in 1997 when they were 4-1.

Poll Position

Oklahoma State will be entering the Oklahoma game as a member of the AP top 25 for the 12th time. However, Saturday's game marks just the third time in the soon-to-be 104 games between the state schools that OSU enters Bedlam as a ranked team while facing an unranked OU team.

Fast Facts

- A couple of items right off the top...
The Cowboys have won six conference games for the first time ever.
The OSU defense is just one of eight in the country

- yet to allow a 100-yard rusher in 2009.
Last week, Keith Toston became the third different OSU back to rush for 1,000 yards in the last three seasons.
Keith Toston has the best (206 yards vs. Iowa State) and third best (172 vs. Colorado) rushing games in the Big 12 this season.
The OSU offensive line is fourth nationally in sacks allowed and in tackles for loss.
The Cowboys are sixth nationally in time of possession (32:56 per game).
OSU is No. 4 in the country in rushing defense, allowing 82.6 yards per game.
The Cowboys have climbed to No. 31 nationally in total defense, allowing 326.5 yards per game.
Linebacker Patrick Lavine is No. 11 nationally with five interceptions.
OSU senior Perrish Cox leads the nation with 1.90 passes defended per game (passes broken up plus interceptions).
OSU has two active players with more than 2,000 rushing yards each in Kendall Hunter and Keith Toston. Zac Robinson could hit 2,000 yards before his career is over.
Last year OSU allowed 5.6 yards per offensive play by the opponent. This season that number has dropped to 4.8.
Dan Bailey is perfect in his career on extra points with a school-record 130 in a row.
Dan Bailey is ninth in OSU history with 220 career points.
OSU is 19-6 in its last 25 football games with four losses to teams ranked in the top three of the AP poll.

Senior Morning

Twenty-two OSU players will be making their final regular-season appearance as Cowboys when OSU visits OU. That total does not include senior linebacker Ori Lemon, who is expected to return to the squad next year after losing 2009 to injury. The outgoing

Class Ranking

This year's senior class of Cowboy football players will rank among the best in the program's history. It will be the first class to appear in four straight bowl games, although a handful of Cowboy individuals with a redshirt year sprinkled in at the right time have accomplished the feat. The win total for this year's class also ranks among the best in OSU history. The current seniors become the eighth in school history to enjoy four straight winning seasons. Below is a look at the most successful senior classes in OSU history. Class is listed based on their final football season and not a default spring graduation date.

Class Notes

Class of 1933 - 30 Victories

Under Hall of Fame coach Lynn "Pappy" Waldorf, the A&M Aggies lost just seven games over four years and did not lose a conference game during that era.

Class of 1945 - 26 Victories

The Class of 1945 claimed Cotton and Sugar Bowl titles and reached the top five of the final AP poll in 1945. The 26 victories came in just 34 games.

Class of 1985 - 32 Victories

Coached by Jimmy Johnson and later Pat Jones, the class of '85 ended their careers with three straight bowl games and were part of team that went 6-0 at home in 1984 (OSU's last team to be perfect at home).

Class of 1986 - 32 Victories

This class enjoyed four straight winning seasons (the last class until 2009 to accomplish the feat), and narrowly missed making four straight bowl appearances when they went 6-5 as seniors.

Class of 1987 - 34 Victories

The seniors in 1987 led OSU to just the second 10-win season in school history and featured future NFL Hall of Famer Thurman Thomas.

Class of 1988 - 34 Victories

The most prolific offensive team in school history was the 1988 squad with Mike Gundy at quarterback, All-American and first-round NFL pick Hart Lee Dykes at receiver and Heisman winner Barry Sanders at running back.

Class of 2009

This class is the first to make four straight bowl appearances. Their conference won-loss record improved every year, including a school record six wins in 2009.

Sweet November

Oklahoma State heads to Norman having won three straight games in November for the first time since 2002. A win at OU would give OSU its first perfect November since 1945 and it would give OSU four November wins for the first time ever.

The Series

Oklahoma leads the series with OSU by a 79-17-7 count. The series dates back to 1904, three years before Oklahoma became a state. There has been no interruption in the series since 1910. Other series notes:

- OSU scored 41 points against OU last season to tie its second best point total in series history.

a 5-3 advantage over an eight-year period from 1995 through 2002.

- OSU's current three-game losing streak in Norman is short compared to the rest of the Big 12. OSU is the only conference team to have won in Norman (2001) since Bob Stoops became the Sooner head coach in 1999. OU has lost just twice at home under Stoops overall.
• Oklahoma State and Texas are the only two schools in the Big 12 that have knocked off OU in consecutive seasons since Stoops arrived in Norman. OSU accomplished the feat in 2001 and 2002.
• OSU won just once in Norman from 1966 to 1994. Beginning with 1995, OSU has won three times at OU (1995, 1997 and 2001).

Last Year In Stillwater

The Sooners put away a back-and-forth game with a 24-15 advantage in the fourth quarter for a 61-41 win. Perrish Cox returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown with 10:33 left in the game to cut OU's lead to 44-41. But a Sooner scoring drive and an ensuing Cowboy turnover clinched the outcome. It was a dizzying game that saw both teams score in every quarter. The teams combined for 1,009 yards of total offense (557-452, OU). Zac Robinson rushed for 90 yards and a score and threw for 254 yards and three more touchdowns. Dez Bryant had 91 receiving yards with two scores and a two-point conversion while Kendall Hunter had 84 rushing yards and 46 receiving yards, including a TD.

The Big 12 Count

Oklahoma State is 6-1 in conference play heading into the season finale. It's a milestone for OSU as the Cowboys had never recorded six conference wins in a season prior to 2009. OSU's best Big 12 record was 5-3 on four occasions, including last year. OSU's current 11-4 record in its last 15 conference games is the best for the school since joining the league. In fairness to Cowboy teams past, the advent of the "super conference" has helped increase win totals. Eight OSU teams have gone undefeated in conference play, but did not play enough league games to reach six victories.

The South Side

Oklahoma State will be looking to reach yet another milestone on Saturday. OSU has never won four games against the Big 12's South Division. OSU is 3-1 against its division in 2009. Last week's 31-28 win over Colorado clinched OSU's second straight 3-0 record against the Big 12 North.

The Seventh Signs

Another first for OSU - the Cowboys have won at least seven games in four straight seasons for the first time in school history. OSU is also enjoying its seventh, seven-win season in the same decade for the first time ever. OSU has won 67 games since 2000, make the current decade the second winningest 10-year period in OSU history. The Cowboys won 71 games under Jimmy Johnson and Pat Jones in the 1980s.

Totaling The Wins

Some quick points regarding OSU's 18-game win total over the last two seasons to date:

- OSU has won eight games in a season for the 16th time in school history and OSU has accomplished the feat in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2002 and 2003.
• OSU has won eight games in consecutive seasons

seven times in the history of the program.

- The Cowboys are currently 9-2. OSU has nine nine-win seasons, including each of the last two years.
• Only once before has Oklahoma State won nine games in consecutive seasons. That achievement was first reached by Pat Jones and the 1987 and 1988 Cowboys, who carved out two straight 10-2 seasons.
• Jones and Gundy are the only two coaches in OSU history with multiple nine-win seasons to their credit. Jones had three 10-win seasons as the Cowboy boss.

Another Win...

One more victory by the Cowboys this season would clinch the fourth 10-win season in Oklahoma State history and the first since 1988. OSU has never won more than 10 games in a season.

Number Nine The Hard Way

Oklahoma State is coming off an interesting win over Colorado, 31-28, on Nov. 19. OSU lost the turnover battle, 4-1, and allowed a touchdown on a kickoff return. The Cowboys had just 126 yards of offense at halftime and started the second half with a quarterback who was listed third on the depth chart.

However the victory materialized because:

- OSU got a 67-yard punt return for a score by Perrish Cox.
• The Cowboys got two touchdowns, 170 rushing yards and 45 receiving yards from Keith Toston.
• Brandon Weeden came off the bench to pass for 168 yards and two scores in the second half. He engineered three scoring drives of more than 70 yards.
• The OSU defense limited Colorado to 251 yards of total offense and just 13 rushing yards (the 14th lowest total by an opponent in OSU history).
• The Cowboys rallied from a halftime deficit for the second straight week and trailed 21-10 in the third quarter.

On The Charts

The final week of the season is the perfect time to check the current Cowboys and where they rank on the OSU's single-season lists.

- Zac Robinson has 1,922 passing yards to rank ninth. He already holds down the second and third best seasons in OSU history.
• Robinson's 15 TD passes to date tie him for the ninth. He also holds the second and fourth spots on the top 10 list.

- Keith Toston has rushed for 1,130 yards to rank No. 14.
- Toston's 11 rushing touchdowns are good enough for No. 11.
- Hubert Anyiam needs one more reception to reach 40 and No. 22 on the single-season list in that category.
- Dan Bailey's 84 points are tied for the 15th best season total at OSU. His 110 points last season rank No. 4.
- Bailey's PAT season makes him one of eight kickers without a miss.
- Freshman Quinn Sharp's punting average of 43.7 yards currently ties him for the eighth best season average.
- Perrish Cox has 601 kick return yards, already good enough for fifth. He has the top two single-season totals in OSU history.

You Can't Make This Stuff Up

The balanced offense philosophy is verbalized all across the country. However, absolutely no one takes it more literally than Oklahoma State. The Cowboys enter the final week of the season averaging 203.5 rushing yards per game and 197 passing yards per game. Those balanced numbers in '09 come on the heels of the past three years in which OSU was almost 50-50. In fact, in 2007, OSU ended the season with a perfect pass/run balance.

Chalk Talks

In its last game, OSU rallied from a 14-10 halftime deficit to pick up the win over Colorado. It marked the seventh time since the beginning of the 2007 season that OSU rallied for a victory from a halftime tie or deficit. It was third victory this season in which OSU trailed at the half. The Cowboys trailed at Texas A&M, 15-14, but won 36-31, trailed 10-7 vs. Texas Tech but won 24-17, and then registered the 31-28 win over CU.

The Turnover Thing

The Oklahoma State defense is continuing to develop a taste for the turnover. The Cowboys enter the CU game No. 20 nationally having intercepted 14 passes. The Cowboys picked off 12 all of last season. OSU is No. 32 overall in turnovers forced with 23. OSU has at least one interception in nine of the 11 games this season and the Cowboys picked off three passes in wins over Missouri, Iowa State and Tech.

Historic Numbers

The Cowboys enter the OU game allowing just 82.6 rushing yards per game and just 2.9 yards per attempt by the opposition. Oklahoma State has not had a defense end the season allowing less than 100 yards per game on the ground since 1982 when the Leslie O'Neal-led Pokes yielded a school record low of 99.2 yards per game. The Cowboys are fourth nationally in rush defense and second in the Big 12 behind Texas. OSU is one of just eight defenses in the country yet to allow a 100-yard rusher in 2009.

Below Par

OSU has held every Big 12 opponent below its season rushing average and the 13 rushing yards gained by Colorado represents the 14th lowest total by an opponent in Cowboy history.

Totally Speaking

Oklahoma State enters the Oklahoma game No. 31 nationally in total defense, allowing 326.5 yards per game. It has been 10 years (1999) since OSU ended the season allowing less than 326.5 yards per game. That '99 squad yielded 297.5 yards per game. The Cowboy defense has especially hit its stride down the stretch as OSU has limited its last eight opponents, including every Big 12 opponent, below its season average in total offense. Three of the last four opposing offenses have been limited to less than 300 yards.

The Tangibles

Oklahoma State has recorded 24 quarterback sacks in '09 compared to a 2008 13-game total of 15. It is the most sacks by the Cowboys since 2006 when OSU recorded 37 in 13 games. OSU also has 14 interceptions to top last season's total of 12. O-State has forced '09 opponents to punt 64 times through 11 games, compared to 52 forced punts in 13 games last season.

The Rush Party

A big improvement in the OSU pass rush over the past season has come from the defensive front. As a group, the linemen had 10 sacks all of last season. This season that group, with most of the same players, has 14 sacks.

The Oklahoma State football program is celebrating the grand opening season of Boone Pickens Stadium in 2009.

New this year is the spectacular football operations center, which includes a brand new locker room, sports medicine center, weight room and equipment room, plus new coaches offices, team and position group meeting rooms, a new training table area and much, much more. Some facts and figures about the \$286 million project:

- :: The entire field level area is 146,000 square feet.
- :: The equipment room is 9,000 square feet, a substantial growth from the previous 3,000 square foot equipment room.
- :: The sports medicine center is 7,000 square feet with four hydrotherapy pools and a digital x-ray machine. Included in one of the hydrotherapy pools is an underwater treadmill complete with an underwater video camera that sports medicine professionals can use to record data.
- :: The locker room is 14,000 square feet with ventilated lockers.
- :: The football-only weight room is 20,000 square feet with all new equipment.
- :: The theater room seats 200 people with plush chairs and extra leg room for student-athletes.

The Unit

Oklahoma State's senior crew of linebackers might rank among America's most productive. The trio of Donald Booker, Patrick Lavine and Andre Sexton are 1-2-3 on the OSU tackle chart and lead in other categories as well. With Sexton spending much of his time covering receivers, Booker and Lavine have had the opportunity to record big defensive numbers. Booker is No. 8 in the Big 12 with 80 tackles.

Lavine And The INT

Senior linebacker Patrick Lavine picked off his fifth pass of the season against Tech and returned it 21 yard for a touchdown. He now has eight career interceptions, two of which he returned for scores (the first time was vs. Texas A&M in 2007). Lavine is No. 11 nationally with his five picks. He is tied for the lead in that category among linebackers and is second in the Big 12 only to Texas defensive back Earl Thomas. Perrish Cox checks in at No. 25 nationally with his four interceptions.

Reaching 50

Andre Sexton will reach a milestone in the season finale when he becomes the first OSU player to start for the 50th time in his career. Russell Okung will start his 46th game, all in a row. Patrick Lavine will also start No. 46, including 35 in a row. Andrew Lewis has started 37 straight and Perrish Cox will be making the 36th start of his career.

LBs Move Up

Four-year starters Andre Sexton and Patrick Lavine continue to climb the OSU and NCAA career record charts. Sexton is fourth in the NCAA with 208 career solo tackles and No. 18 in total tackles with 304. At OSU, Sexton is No. 12 all-time in total tackles. Lavine is No. 15 all-time at OSU with 288 tackles.

Back On Familiar Turf

Following a three-game total of 814 yards vs. Iowa State, Texas Tech and Colorado, Oklahoma State is back in familiar territory. The Cowboys lead the Big 12 in rushing with an average of 203.5 yards per game. OSU has won the Big 12 rushing title each of the past three years. Prior to 2006, OSU had never led its conference in rushing. The rushing average in 2009 illustrates the evolution of the Cowboy offense. Three games into the season, OSU averaged 158 rushing yards per game. In conference games only, Oklahoma State is averaging 204 yards per game to lead the league by 26 yards.

The Protectors

The Oklahoma State offense line continues to be among the nation's best in the tangible categories of protection. OSU has allowed just eight sacks this season to rank No. 4 nationally in that category. Oklahoma State is also No. 4 in fewest tackles for loss allowed (3.55 per game). It continues a trend for the Cowboys under Mike Gundy and offensive line coach Joe Wickline. OSU is looking to finish among the top five nationally in fewest sacks allowed for the second time in three years and among the nation's top 20 in that category for the fourth straight year.

Records In Progress

Senior quarterback Zac Robinson enters the Oklahoma game holding several OSU records but the three most prestigious are the career marks in total offense, passing yards and touchdown passes. The last of those to fall was passing yards when Robinson moved past Mike Gundy in the road win at Ames. Robinson is 24-10 as OSU's starting quarterback, including 19-6 over the last 25 games.

Zac's Other Marks

- Other notables for OSU's senior quarterback:
- He is No. 22 all-time at OSU with 1,855 rushing yards.
 - He has 22 career rushing touchdowns to rank No. 9 all-time at OSU. The only quarterback ahead of him is Tony Lindsay, who ran for 23 touchdowns from 1997 through the 2000 season.
 - He is No. 21 all-time at OSU with 132 career points.
 - His 88 touchdowns responsible for are No. 10 among active NCAA players.
 - His career passing efficiency of 151.93 is seventh in the NCAA.
 - His 7.4 yards per play in his career are sixth nationally.

Record Breaker

Zac Robinson had a record-breaking performance at Baylor. Against the Bears, the senior signal caller completed 23 of his 27 passes for a completion percentage of 85.2. The old record for completion percentage in a game with more than 20 attempts was 77.1 (27-of-35) set by Mike Gundy against Kansas in 1989.

Another One To Watch

Zac Robinson set a school record last year by completing 65.0 percent of his passes to edge out Mike Gundy's mark of 64.8 percent in 1988. Through 10 games played (he sat out Colorado, ending a string

of 34 straight starts) of his senior season, Robinson is completing 63.5 percent of his passes (158-of-249).

The New Targets

While playing without consensus All-American Dez Bryant, Oklahoma State has been developing a youthful receiving corps on the fly.

- Against Baylor, OSU got touchdown receptions from sophomore tight end Will Youman (the first of his career), freshman tight end Cooper Bassett (the first of his career) and sophomore transfer Dameron Fooks (the third of his career).
- Fifteen Cowboys have caught passes in 2009, including six players who had never caught a pass at OSU.
- True freshman Tracy Moore is averaging a whopping 17.7 yards per catch with three TDs on his 10 catches.
- Sophomore transfer Dameron Fooks has three touchdowns on his 10 career catches.
- Twelve different Cowboys have a reception of at least 19 yards.
- Eight Cowboys have touchdown catches this season. Five caught scoring passes all of last season.

The Kiddie Corps

Of Oklahoma State's 172 pass receptions this season, 103 have been made by freshmen or sophomores. Those same two classes have accounted for 14 of OSU's 19 touchdown receptions. Despite not playing since the Rice game, Dez Bryant still leads the team with four TD catches.

From Backup To Bright Lights

Running back Keith Toston spent the bulk of his Cowboy career as an understudy, first to all-Big 12 selection Dantrell Savage, and then to All-American Kendall Hunter. However, as a senior, Toston's number has been called (very often) with Savage in the NFL and Hunter sidelined for most of the 2009 season. Not only has he answered the challenge, but he appears to be setting himself up for post-season accolades.

- Over the last nine games, Toston has rushed for 1,001 yards for an average of 111.2 yards per contest
- His season total of 1,130 yards already ranks No. 14 on OSU's single-season chart. He is authoring the 18th 1,000-yard season in OSU history.
- His 2009 numbers are more impressive when considering he had just 21 carries for 121 yards with a touchdown after the first two games while serving as Hunter's backup.
- He now has 2,637 rushing yards to rank No. 10 in OSU history.
- For his career, Toston averages 5.82 yards per carry.
- He is No. 14 all-time at OSU with 188 points.

The Conference Charts

In Big 12 games only, Keith Toston has a healthy rushing lead. He is averaging 121.4 yards per game for a 17.4-yard per game lead over any other Big 12 back.

History Being Made

Despite OSU's deep tradition at running back, only twice in its history had the school produced a 1,000-yard rusher in three straight seasons before 2009. Never before had three different running



backs reached 1,000 yards in three straight seasons. Keith Toston helped OSU accomplish the feat. In 2007, OSU got 1,272 yards from all-Big 12 running back Dantrell Savage. In 2008, the Cowboys got 1,555 yards from all-Big 12 and All-America running back Kendall Hunter with Toston completing the trifecta with his 1,130 yards to date. The last time OSU had three straight 1,000-yard runners was in 2002-03-04. Tatum Bell reached the mark the first two years, followed by Vernand Morency in 2004.

Two For 2,000

Keith Toston (2,637 career rushing yards) joins Kendall Hunter (2,518 career rushing yards) as current Cowboy running backs to have eclipsed the 2,000-yard mark. Toston and Hunter are the first duo in Oklahoma State history to have played together with over 2,000 rushing yards apiece in tow. For good measure, quarterback Zac Robinson has rushed for 1,855 yards.

Hunter Season

For Cowboy fans, it has been a happy November with the return of All-America running back Kendall Hunter to action. At Iowa State the junior saw his first extensive action since the Houston game. The 2008 first-team All-American (FWAA) ran for 47 yards on nine carries. He also had a 12-yard reception and definitely provided a spark for the OSU offense. He followed that up with 68 yards rushing and 28 receiving against Texas Tech. Against Colorado he chipped in 47 rushing yards and an eight-yard reception. Hunter's 2,518 career rushing yards are good for No. 11 in OSU history.

Russell Okung is putting the finishing touches on a career that will probably see him become the most decorated offensive lineman in OSU history. Rated as a high first-round draft pick and listed as the nation's top offensive lineman by at least three services, Okung has now started 45 straight games for OSU as he joined the first team midway through his true freshman season. Twice in his career, Okung has tossed a shutout against the NCAA's sack leader. Texas A&M's Von Miller entered the OSU game as America's top pass rusher with nine sacks. Against Okung, he did not record a sack and had five tackles. In the 2007 Insight Bowl, Okung held Indiana's Greg Middleton, another NCAA sack leader, without a tackle of any kind. Okung was the only offensive player among the 12 semifinalists for the Lombardi Award.

Continuing The Climb

Under Mike Gundy, Oklahoma State has been on a steady climb up the Big 12 South ladder. Gundy's first team finished with a 1-7 Big 12 record in 2005. Since that time, the Cowboys have improved to 3-5 in 2006, 4-4 in 2007 and 5-3 in 2008. Last year's five-win total was OSU's best conference showing since the 2003 team also went 5-3.

The Rankings

Bookend Returns

It was a fitting Senior Night for OSU's Perrish Cox. The Waco product began his true freshman season by returning the season's opening kickoff for a 96-yard touchdown against Missouri State. In the final home game of his senior season, Cox returned a punt 67 yards for a touchdown. He is completing a career that will rank him among the top return men in Big 12 history.
• In his career, Cox has returned four kickoffs and two punts for touchdowns.
• He holds the Big 12 career record with 2,756 kickoff return yards. That total is second among all active NCAA players.
• His four kickoff returns for scores is third in the NCAA.
• His two career punt returns for scores rank him No. 11.
• He is currently No. 22 in 2009 with an average of 11.3 yards per punt return. Cox spent little time returning punts in 2008 and early in 2009 while Dez Bryant fulfilled those duties.
• He has 10 career kickoff returns of more than 50 yards, including a 74-yarder vs. Georgia this season
• He is No. 10 in the NCAA with 688 career punt return yards
• Cox is a semifinalist for the Thorpe Award, presented annually to the nation's top defensive back

Sharp Start

One of the 2009 question marks entering the season was redshirt freshman punter Quinn Sharp stepping in to replace OSU's 2008 Ray Guy Award winner Matt Fodge. As his freshman season winds down, Sharp has answered lots of questions.
• He enters the OU game No. 16 nationally with a punting average of 43.67 yards.
• He has 14 punts in excess of 50 yards, including a pair of 61-yarders (vs. Georgia and Rice).
• Of his 45 punts, 18 have been downed inside the opponent's 20 (with only three touchbacks).
• Oklahoma State is No. 28 nationally in net punting with a 37.5-yard average.
• He has been named a mid-season All-American by Rivals.com
• While handling Cowboy kickoff duties, Sharp has recorded 33 touchbacks on 67 tries. OSU had 13 touchbacks all of last season on 96 kickoffs.
• Sharp leads the country in touchbacks on kickoffs.

Coaching Capsule

Gundy became Oklahoma State's head coach on Jan. 3, 2005. He served as OSU's offensive coordinator and associate head coach the previous four seasons. He served on Oklahoma State staffs under Pat Jones, Bob Simmons and Les Miles. He was also on staff at Baylor and Maryland before returning to his alma mater.

Playing Experience

Gundy was a four-year starter and letterman at Oklahoma State from 1986 through 1989. He remains OSU's all-time leading passer with 7,997 yards and he led the Cowboys to back-to-back 10-win seasons in 1987 and 1988. His 429-yard passing performance against Kansas in 1989 is still the second-best passing game at Oklahoma State and he owns three of Oklahoma State's top 15 single-game passing performances. He also still holds the Oklahoma State career record for interception avoidance (36 in 1,035 pass attempts).

Family

Gundy is the son of Ray and Judy Gundy. His father attended OSU on a basketball grant. He and his wife, Kristen, have three sons, Gavin, Gunnar and Gage. Kristen is also an OSU graduate. His brother, Cale, is on the coaching staff at Oklahoma.

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP) - Zac Robinson threw two touchdown passes to star receiver Dez Bryant and also scored on a quarterback sneak as No. 9 Oklahoma State proved itself deserving of its highest preseason ranking ever by beating 13th-ranked Georgia 24-10 on Saturday.

The Cowboys capitalized on a fourth quarter fumble by new Georgia starting quarterback Joe Cox to seal the season-opening win on a 12-yard touchdown pass from Robinson to Bryant.

The two also hooked up on an impressive 46-yard score in the first half that got Oklahoma State's offense going after a sloppy start.

Robinson finished with 135 yards on 11 for 22 passing, and Bryant made the most of his three catches for 77 yards.

A record crowd of 53,012 turned out as billionaire donor T. Boone Pickens rededicated the stadium. Career rushing-leader Thurman Thomas made a cameo, too.

Eventually, the Cowboys' current stars also showed up.

Bryant got Oklahoma State's scuffling offense going when he got behind the defense and made a diving catch of Robinson's 46-yard pass in the second quarter, tying the game at 7.

Safety Lucien Antoine then knocked the ball free from tailback Carlton Thomas on the second snap of Georgia's next drive, and Terrance Anderson scooped it up at the 6. Oklahoma State settled for Dan Bailey's 28-yard field goal and a 10-7 halftime lead after a holding call negated Robinson's scramble for a 1-yard TD on fourth-and-goal.

Perrish Cox returned the second-half kickoff 75 yards to get the Cowboys going again.

After another fourth-down gamble inside the 5 by Oklahoma State coach Mike Gundy, Robinson put OSU up 17-7 with his 1-yard sneak.

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP) - Case Keenum threw for 366 yards and three touchdowns, and Bryce Beall caught the go-ahead 6-yard pass off a batted ball as Houston stunned No. 5 Oklahoma State 45-35 on Saturday.

The Cougars (2-0) gave second-year coach Kevin Sumlin his first marquee win with the program's first victory over a Top 5 team since an upset of third-ranked Texas in 1984.

Oklahoma State (1-1) was coming off of perhaps the biggest opening win in the program's history last week against Georgia and vaulted into the Top 5 for the first time since 1985. But after overcoming a 17-point halftime lead, the Cowboys squandered their final chances for a win.

Zac Robinson fumbled a snap to end one OSU drive in the fourth quarter, and Jamal Robinson then returned his interception 32 yards for a score to seal the upset with 3:14 remaining.

Dez Bryant returned a punt for a touchdown against Houston for the second straight year as Oklahoma State reeled off 21 straight third-quarter points to surge ahead 28-24. But, unlike last year, Keenum and the Cougars had an answer this time.

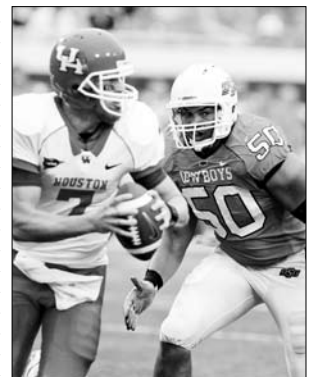
And Oklahoma State ran out of weapons. Kendall Hunter, last year's Big 12 rushing leader, didn't play in the second half due to an apparent leg injury and Bryant also missed time. He lay sprawled out on the turf for a few moments after tipping the pass that led to Jamal Robinson's return, and trainers stretched out his right leg before he left the field.

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP) -- Zac Robinson rushed for one touchdown and threw for two others--both to Dez Bryant--as No. 16 Oklahoma State rebounded from a home loss to Houston to beat Rice 41-24.

"He had a couple passes that I thought he could have thrown better," Coach Mike Gundy said. "I thought he ran the ball and played better. He took care of it. Overall, I thought it was the best he had played this season."

Oklahoma State (2-1) didn't exactly get its offense rolling--which Gundy attributed to a lack of snaps--but the Cowboys did enough to beat Rice (0-3).

Robinson completed 14 of 20 passes for 227 yards--about nine yards below last season's per-game average--against a defense that entered the game ranked last against the pass. And Bryant had nine catches for 161 yards, including touchdown grabs of 23 and 10 yards.

Their play helped Oklahoma State overcome the absence of star running back Kendall Hunter, who missed the game with a sprained right ankle.

Each time Rice threatened, Oklahoma State answered with points. Beau Johnson, who joined Keith Toston in subbing for Hunter, followed a 38-yard Robinson-to-Bryant pass with a 2-yard scoring run with 1:56 left in the third quarter.

Toston carried 18 times for 75 yards, while Johnson had 12 carries for 28 yards. The Cowboys had just 56 offensive snaps.

Robinson's two touchdown passes raised his career total to 56, pushing him past Josh Fields for the Oklahoma State career lead.

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP) -- Keith Toston ran for 84 yards and three first-half touchdowns, and No. 16 Oklahoma State overpowered Grambling State 56-6 on Saturday night even without its star running back and wide receiver.

All-America receiver Dez Bryant and all-Big 12 tailback Kendall Hunter watched from the sidelines as the Cowboys (3-1) piled up 587 yards of total offense, including 321 on the ground, against their only Football Championship Subdivision opponent this season.

It was the most lopsided win for Oklahoma State since a 59-7 victory over SMU in 2004, the year before Mike Gundy took over as coach.

Freshman Dameron Fooks made the first four receptions of his career and scored twice. He caught a 24-yard toss from Zac Robinson in the first half and walked into the end zone for a 19-yard score from third-stringer Brandon Weeden in the third quarter.

Fellow freshman Jeremy Smith had runs of 69 and 51 yards in the most prolific college debut for an Oklahoma State rusher. He finished with 160 yards on 15 carries and scored his first touchdown on a 5-yard run in the fourth quarter.

The only lingering concern for the Cowboys was a pair of turnovers by Robinson, who threw a first-quarter interception and fumbled a snap to set up the Tigers' first field goal. Backup Alex Cate replaced him in the second half and also fumbled on his second play from scrimmage. Cate didn't return after trainers attended to him on the field.

Weeden played the rest of the game, with Cate joining a slew of injured starters - Bryant, Hunter, cornerback Perrish Cox and defensive end Jermiah Price - on the sidelines.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) - Zac Robinson threw two touchdown passes and No. 15 Oklahoma State overcame the absence of their top two playmakers to beat Texas A&M 36-31 on Saturday.

The Cowboys (4-1, 1-0 Big 12) played without All-America receiver Dez Bryant, who was ruled ineligible by the school this week for lying to the NCAA about contact he made with a former NFL player. Oklahoma State was also missing Kendall Hunter, the Big 12's leading rusher in 2008, who sat out with an ankle injury.

Robinson completed 14 of 25 passes for 279 yards, Keith Toston ran for 130 yards and Beau Johnson ran for two scores as the Cowboys won at Kyle Field for only the second time since 1983.

Jerrold Johnson threw three touchdown passes for the Aggies (3-2, 0-1) and set a Big 12 record by extending his streak of consecutive passes without an interception to 228. But Johnson faced constant pressure and the Aggies, who came in with the nation's second-ranked offense, were held to 382 yards.

Leading 29-25 early in the fourth quarter, the Cowboys put it away with a 16-play, 93-yard touchdown drive that chewed up almost eight minutes. Robinson converted two third downs with long passes and Beau Johnson scored with 7:15 left in the game.

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP) - Hubert Anyiam had a career-high 119 receiving yards and the go-ahead touchdown, and No. 16 Oklahoma State shut out Missouri in the second half in a 33-17 victory Saturday night.

Dan Bailey hit three field goals, including a career-long 51-yarder, for the only points after halftime but it was enough for the Cowboys (5-1, 2-0 Big 12) as they limited Missouri (4-2, 0-2) to 80 yards in the second half after giving up 313 in a first half that was all about offense.

Zac Robinson threw for 227 yards, and Lucien Antoine added an interception return for a touchdown to help the Cowboys snap a four-game losing streak on their home field against the Tigers.

Missouri's pass-heavy offense fell flat after that prolific first half, and even a 60-yard punt return on a reverse couldn't spark a comeback. The Tigers were shut out in a half for the first time since a 13-3 loss to Kansas on Oct. 29, 2005, when they also went scoreless in the second half.

Oklahoma State started Big 12 play with back-to-back wins despite being without top running back Kendall Hunter, who missed his fourth straight game because of a sprained ankle.

Anyiam had only nine career catches coming into the game, but had a breakout performance. Anyiam had eight catches in the first half, including the go-ahead score with 2 seconds left when he darted in front of Kevin Rutland to catch Robinson's 8-yard pass and make it 24-17.

WACO, Texas (AP) - With injured running back Kendall Hunter and suspended receiver Dez Bryant still missing from the lineup, Oklahoma State quarterback Zac Robinson completed 23 of 27 passes for 250 yards with a season-high three touchdowns and the 14th-ranked Cowboys (6-1, 3-0 Big 12) stretched their winning streak to five games - the last four without their top runner and top receiver from a year ago.

Robinson's 85-percent completion percentage was the best-ever for an Oklahoma State quarterback with at least 20 attempts, breaking the record Gundy set by hitting 27 of 35 passes (77 percent) against Kansas in 1989.

Keith Toston ran for 109 yards and a 1-yard TD on his 15 carries, and Beau Johnson added 93 yards on 22 carries.

Nine different players caught passes, including tight ends Wilson Youman and Cooper Bassett each with their first career TDs.

Oklahoma State, which plays No. 3 Texas at home next weekend, led 10-0 after its first two possessions. It was 24-0 on Robinson's 19-yard TD to Bassett that capped an 87-yard drive to open the second half.

David Gettis' 17-yard touchdown catch with 7:17 left kept Oklahoma State from getting its first shutout in a Big 12 game since 2001.

The Cowboys led 10-0 after a 22-yard TD catch by Youman, who grabbed the ball with both hands and bobbled it briefly before pulling it in and holding on when he was popped by safety Jordan Lake. Anyiam had two first-down grabs that drive.

On Dameron Fooks' 16-yard TD catch for a 17-0 halftime lead, he leaped to make the catch between two defenders and held on despite being propelled into a mid-air spin before hitting the ground.

Texas scored 28 points off of Oklahoma State's five turnovers, with Brown and Thomas cashing in immediately and Johnson scoring on runs of 2 and 1 yards after two other take-aways.

That left McCoy, the runner-up for the Heisman Trophy, needing to do nothing spectacular in front of a Boone Pickens Stadium record crowd of 58,516.

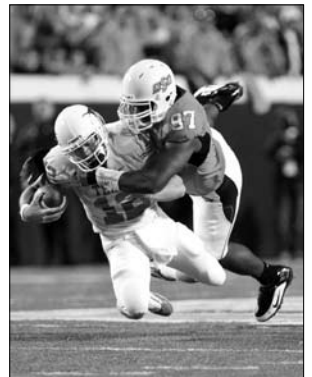

AMES, Iowa (AP) - Oklahoma State needed a bounce-back performance and Keith Toston helped the Cowboys deliver one.

Toston ran for a career-high 206 yards and three touchdowns, Zac Robinson threw a touchdown pass and No. 18 Oklahoma State came back strong from its loss to Texas with a 34-8 victory over Iowa State on Saturday.

Oklahoma State (7-2, 4-1 Big 12) controlled with game with solid play on both sides of the ball and reached seven victories for the fourth straight season, the first time in school history that has happened.

Toston, who carried 25 times, scored on runs of 2 and 17 yards as Oklahoma State built a 27-0 lead, then topped off his big day with a 1-yard TD plunge in the fourth quarter. That came three plays after he broke loose on a 69-yard scamper to the ISU 2 for the longest run of his career.

A 6-foot, 214-pound senior, Toston became the Cowboys' main back when Kendall Hunter was sidelined by a sprained right ankle in the second week of the season. He twice had topped 100 yards, but had never approached the number he put up against the Cyclones.

His previous career best was 148 yards against Missouri State last year.

Hunter, the Big 12's leading rusher last season, saw his most extensive action since getting hurt and showed some of his old elusiveness while carrying nine times for 47 yards. The Cowboys rolled up a season-high 331 yards on the ground.

Robinson sat up immediately, but then lay back down and stayed that way for a few minutes as a handful of teammates gathered around. He eventually walked to the bench with the help of team trainers.

Taylor Potts got Texas Tech to midfield with 58 seconds left but that's where the drive stalled. Tramin Swindall dropped a short pass on fourth-and-4 and OSU ran out the final 16 seconds.

Keith Toston put Oklahoma State up 17-10 with his touchdown run early in the fourth quarter, one play after his fumble inside the 1 was overturned by instant replay and two plays after he plunged forward for a 2-yard gain to convert a fourth-and-1 at the 6.

Lavine followed that by stepping in front of Steven Sheffield's pass to tailback Baron Batch and racing up the OSU sideline for the score. He came into the game tied with Kentucky's Sam Maxwell for the most interceptions among Bowl Subdivision linebackers, with four.

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP) - Brandon Weeden, the third-string quarterback for No. 12 Oklahoma State, threw for 168 yards and two touchdowns in the second half to lead the Cowboys back from an 11-point deficit for a 31-28 win against Colorado.

With starter Zac Robinson injured and backup Alex Cate ineffective, the Cowboys (9-2, 6-1 Big 12) turned to Weeden to spark the offense.

His 28-yard touchdown pass to Justin Blackmon with 8:11 remaining proved to be the winner, keeping pressure on No. 3 Texas in the Big 12 championship race. The Longhorns would have clinched the Big 12 South with an OSU loss.

Colorado got out to a 21-10 lead against the one-dimensional Cowboys before Weeden finally provided a viable passing threat. He went 10 for 15 and threw a 47-yard touchdown pass to Keith Toston.

The Buffaloes (3-8, 2-5) had one final chance to go for the win after stuffing OSU on fourth-and-short for the third time in the game with 3:14 remaining but decided to punt after Tyler Hansen threw three straight incomplete passes. The Cowboys, the Big 12's top rushing team, ran the final 2:45 off the clock.

Oklahoma State wore black uniforms for the first time since 1994.

Cate, who had attempted only five passes in his career, started in Robinson's place but went 0-for-9 with an interception in the first half -- and it could have been worse. Colorado players had chances for at least two more picks, but let the ball slip through their hands.
