**Ball State 2011 Team Captains:** Sean Baker (Canfield, Ohio/Canfield H.S.), Kreg Hunter (Lebanon, Ind./Lebanon H.S.), Adam Morris (Dublin, Ohio/Scioto H.S.), Briggs Orsbon (Convoy, Ohio/Crestview H.S.) and Andrew Puthoff (St. Henry, Ohio/St. Henry H.S.) have been selected as team captains for the 2011 season.

**The Series:** Ball State and Oklahoma have never met in football.

**Scouting Ball State:** Ball State improved to 3-1 overall with a 48-21 non-conference victory over Army at Scheumann Stadium Saturday afternoon . . . The Cardinals opened the 2011 season with a 27-20 win over Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind., then suffered a 37-7 loss to the nation's No. 22 ranked South Florida Bulls in Tampa, Fla. . . . The Cardinals improved to 2-1 overall and 1-0 in the Mid-American Conference with a 28-25 home win over Buffalo Sept. 17 . . . Ball State is averaging 232.5 passing yards and 155.8 rushing yards per game, while allowing 205.0 passing yards and 207.2 rushing yards a contest.

### Ball State Quick Hits

- Ball State has converted on 17-of-17 trips inside the Red Zone this season . . . The Cardinals are tied for first in the country for Red Zone Efficiency, and have scored 103 points from within the Red Zone.
- Some of Ball State's other top national statistical rankings include fewest interceptions thrown (1st tie), fewest penalties per game (4th tie), fewest turnovers lost (8th tie), fourth down conversions (15th tie), time of possession (16th), third down conversions (22nd) and sacks allowed (25th tie).
- Ball State's defense has registered eight sacks in its first four games and are tied for 48th in the nation with 2.00 sacks per game . . . Ball State tallied four sacks in its season opening victory over Indiana . . . It marked the most sacks for a Ball State defense since the Cardinals had six at Central Michigan Oct. 2, 2010.
- Ball State's game at Oklahoma will mark the highest ranked team the Cardinals have ever played . . . Oklahoma enters the game ranked No. 1 in the country by USA Today and No. 2 by the Associated Press . . . Ball State's highest ranked opponent to date was Michigan in 2006 . . . The Cardinals suffered a 34-26 loss at Michigan Nov. 4, 2006, in a game the Wolverines were ranked No. 2 by AP and USA Today.
- Ball State's 545 yards of total offense vs. Army was the seventh best single-game mark in school history and the most since tallying 610 total yards in a 41-40 loss at Nebraska Sept. 22, 2007.
- The Cardinals did not allow a completed pass vs. Army, which tied an NCAA single-game record.
- Ball State's 48 points scored vs. Army were the most for the Cardinals since posting 48 points against Northeastern Aug. 28, 2008.

**The Record:** Oklahoma improved to 3-0 with a 38-28 home win over Missouri Saturday night . . . The Sooners opened the season with a 47-14 home victory over Tulsa, and then managed a 23-13 win at the nation's fifth-ranked Florida State Seminoles.

**The Coach:** Bob Stoops (Iowa '83) is in his 13th season as the head coach at Oklahoma . . . He has posted a 132-31 record for the Sooners . . . Stoops first fulltime assistant coaching position was at Kent State in 1988.

**The Stats:** Oklahoma is averaging 354.7 passing yards and 167.0 rushing yards per game, while allowing 260.3 passing yards and 132.2 rushing yards a contest . . . Landry Jones has completed 88-of-122 passes for 1,022 yards with five touchdowns and four interceptions . . . Dom Whaley is rushing for 90.0 yards per game.

## Ball State Quick Hits

- Ball State finished the Army contest with 383 passing yards, which ranks as the sixth highest single game total in school history.
- Ball State's football team has played on television 20 times in the last three seasons . . . The Cardinals are scheduled for at least three television games in 2011 . . . Ball State played twice on ESPN2 plus appeared on ESPNU, CBS College Sports and Fox Sports in 2009 . . . In 2010, the Cardinals played on ESPNU once, ESPN Plus once and the Big Ten Network twice.
- Ball State has won 17 of its last 28 Mid-American Conference games . . . The Cardinals won their final three MAC games in 2007 and all eight league contests in 2008 for 11 straight conference victories, which is the second longest league winning streak in school history.
- Ball State opened the 2011 season by playing its first two games in stadiums that host National Football League teams . . . The Cardinals opened the year with a 27-20 win over Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium, the home of the Indianapolis Colts . . . Ball State played its second game of the season at Raymond James Stadium, the home of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.
- Keith Wenning (Coldwater, Ohio/Coldwater H.S.)** has completed 95-of-130 passes for 871 yards with seven touchdowns and zero interceptions . . . He has completed 73.1 percent of his passes in 2011 . . . **Wenning** completed three TD passes vs. Army, which marked his second straight multiple touchdown passing game and his third of the 2011 season . . . He threw for a career high 324 yards and tied his career best single game performance with three touchdown passes.
- Willie Snead (Muskegon Heights, Mich./Muskegon Heights H.S.)** managed a career high 180 receiving yards, including a career long 45-yard catch vs. Army . . . He became the first Ball State player to eclipse the 100-yard receiving mark in a game this season and his 180 receiving yards were the most for a Ball State player since Dante Love tallied 214 against Nebraska Sept. 22, 2007.
- Sean Baker (Canfield, Ohio/Canfield H.S.)**, who set Ball State's career interception mark as a junior last season, tallied his 17th career interception in the second quarter vs. Army.

### Career Head Coaching Record: 82-37/11th season

**NOTES:** Has guided the Cardinals to a 3-1 start in 2011, the school's second best start to a season since 1995 . . . Opened his Ball State coaching career with a 27-20 victory over Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind. . . . Coached Ball State to his first Mid-American Conference win and first Scheumann Stadium win in his first home game vs. Buffalo Sept. 17, 2011 . . . Led the Cardinals to their first-ever win over Army with a 48-21 victory at Scheumann Stadium Sept. 24 . . . Led Elon to 35 victories in five years after taking over a program that tallied a 14-42 record in the five years prior to his arrival . . . managed a 24-14 career record in the Southern Conference while at Elon . . . 2007 Southern Conference Coach of the Year . . . raised the NCAA Academic Progress Rate at Elon to 971 in 2009-10 and a four year average of 965 . . . the 2010 team averaged 435.2 yards of total offense per game, the fourth straight year the Phoenix averaged more than 400 yards per game on offense . . . led Elon to the 2009 Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs for the first time in the history of the program . . . the nine wins in 2009 tied the school record for most wins since 1999 . . . Elon spent two weeks ranked third in the nation in 2008, while the 7-4 record in 2007 was the school's first winning campaign since 2000 . . . led Elon to final rankings in the top-25 in three of his last four seasons -- 23rd in 2007, 17th in 2008 and ninth in 2009 . . . led Lehigh to the 2001 and 2004 Patriot League Championship and berths in the FCS Playoffs . . . his .759 winning percentage at Lehigh was the highest for a head coach in the school's history . . . named the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year and the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 . . . as an assistant at Dartmouth, helped the team to a 10-0 record and the Ivy League Championship in 1996 . . . as an assistant at Lehigh, helped the team to a 12-1 record in 1998, a 10-2 mark in 1999 and a 12-1 ledger in 2000, and three straight Patriot League Championships.

## Ball State Notes

**Wenning's Winning Ways:** Keith Wenning, who passed for a career best 324 yards vs. Army, also tied his career high with 24 completions and tied his single game career mark with three touchdown passes vs. the Black Knights . . . The 324 passing yards vs. Army were the most for a Ball State player since Nate Davis threw for 351 yards against Buffalo Dec. 5, 2008 . . . **Wenning's** 324 passing yards marked the 13th best single-game effort in Ball State history.

**Wenning's Winning Ways Part Two:** Keith Wenning has started the last 14 games at quarterback for the Cardinals . . . **Wenning** started the final 10 games of the 2010 season as a true freshman after appearing in Ball State's first two games in relief . . . He posted his 19th and 20th career touchdown passes vs. Army in his third multiple passing touchdown game of the season and the sixth of his career . . . **Wenning**, who rushed for a career best 61 yards in Ball State's 27-20 season opening victory over Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind., rushed for a touchdown and passed for two TDs in the win . . . It marked the third time he has both rushed and passed for a touchdown in his career . . . As a matter of fact, in every game that **Wenning** has rushed for a TD, he has passed for at least one touchdown . . . He rushed and threw for a TD in the same game twice in 2010 -- vs. Eastern Michigan and at Kent State

**More on Wenning's Army Performance:** In addition to the yards, completions and TDs against Army, **Keith Wenning** completed a 51-yard touchdown pass to **David Schneider (Cincinnati, Ohio/Moeller H.S.)** for the second longest TD pass of his career . . . It marked a career high reception for **Schneider** and was the second touchdown catch of his career.

**Baker is Ball State's All-Time Interceptions Leader:** Sean Baker, who set Ball State's career interception record as a junior in 2010, recorded the 17th interception of his career vs. Army and returned it 18 yards in the second quarter vs. the Black Knights . . . **Baker** is the active leader in career interceptions among all Football Bowl Subdivision players in 2011 . . . With 17 career picks, he is five ahead of Casey Hayward of Vanderbilt's 12 interceptions . . . **Baker** became Ball State's career interceptions leader with his 15th and 16th picks at Buffalo in 2010 to pass Mike Lecklider (1973-76) and Shafer Suggs (1972-75), who shared the school standard with 14 apiece . . . He has four multiple interception games in his career, including vs. Liberty and at Buffalo in 2010.

**Baker More than Just Interceptions:** Sean Baker, who led the Cardinals with 11 tackles at South Florida, managed eight tackles, one tackle for loss, one sack and one interception vs. Army . . . He was third on the team with eight tackles in the season opener vs. Indiana and third for the Cardinals with six tackles vs. Buffalo . . . He returned a recovered fumble 26 yards for a touchdown at Buffalo in 2010, marking the second time in his career he has accomplished the feat . . . **Baker** recorded his first career blocked field goal vs. Liberty in 2010 . . . He was credited with the first sack of his career vs. Southeast Missouri State last season.

**More News on Baker:** In addition to setting the Ball State career interceptions mark, **Sean Baker** has 139 career interception return yards and needs four to move into fourth on Ball State's all-time chart . . . He is second on the Cardinals' career chart with 59 fumble return yards . . . His fumble return for a touchdown at Buffalo in 2010 was the second of his career and he became the first player in Ball State history to return two fumbles for TDs in a career.

**Offensive Line Returns Experience:** Seven offensive linemen with a combined 108 career starts are on the 2011 squad . . . **Kreg Hunter (Lebanon, Ind./Lebanon H.S.)** is the veteran among the returning linemen with 24 starts in his career . . . Hunter started four games as a freshman in 2008, all 12 games at center in 2009, five games in 2010 and four contests in 2011 . . . **Kitt O'Brien (Walton, Ind./Lewis Cass H.S.)** has 18 career starts . . . He started started two games in 2009, all 12 in 2010 and three in 2011 . . . **Dan Manick (Dyer, Ind./Lake Central H.S.)** has 20 career starts . . . **Cameron Lowry (Indianapolis, Ind./Pike H.S.)** started all 12 games in 2009, the first three games of 2010 and one game in 2011 . . . **Austin Holtz (Holt, Mich./Holt H.S.)** started eight games in 2009, six contests in 2010 and three in 2011 . . . **Jordan Hansel (Covington, Ky./Simon Kenton H.S.)** started six games in 2010 and the first four in 2011, while **Jerrold Gray (Bradley, Ill./Bourbonnais)** started seven games in 2010.

**Freshman Running Back Off to Great Start:** Jahwan Edwards (Matthews, N.C./Butler H.S.), a true freshman running back who rushed for a career high 112 yards vs. Buffalo, rushed for a career best three touchdowns vs. Army . . . His three rushing TDs were the most for a Ball State player since **Cory Sykes (Harvey, III./Thornton H.S.)** rushed for three at Eastern Michigan Oct. 24, 2009 . . . His 23-yard rush in the third quarter vs. Army was a career long . . . **Edwards** began his Ball State career with a four yard rush in the second quarter of the Cardinals season opening win over Indiana at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind. . . . In addition to gaining 84 yards vs. Indiana, **Edwards** tallied his first career reception for 11 yards . . . In his second collegiate contest, **Edwards** rushed for 41 yards and one touchdown on seven carries vs. the nation's 22nd-ranked South Florida Bulls . . . The TD at USF was the first of his career . . . In addition to his career high performance against Buffalo, he scored his second and third career TDs for the first multiple rushing TD game of his career and the first for Ball State since Nov. 20, 2010, vs. Northern Illinois . . . **Edwards** leads the Cardinals with 75.2 rushing yards per game.

**Garrett Making a Mark:** Jeffery Garrett, a sophomore for the Cardinals, blocked an extra point attempt by Buffalo . . . It marked the first blocked kick of his career . . . **Garrett** ranks sixth on the team with 15 tackles . . . **Garrett** had a career high seven tackles vs. Indiana in Ball State's season opening 27-20 victory and tallied his first career tackle for loss vs. Buffalo.

He has helped limit opponents to eight punt returns for a 3.0 average . . . **Kovanda**, who managed a season long 57-yard punt vs. Indiana, tied his career long with a 63-yard punt vs. Eastern Michigan in 2010, a feat he also accomplished vs. North Texas in 2009 . . . He punted a career high nine times for a career best 343 yards at Iowa . . . Ball State has a long tradition of outstanding punters . . . With 2:40 left in the contest, Neu completed a 15-yard scoring strike to receiver Kyle Robinson. Followed by Swart's extra point kick, the Cardinals were down 30-24. Ball State's final score came on a Neu to Erin McCray 6-yard pass as time expired in the game. Swart's extra point kick with no time left on the clock gave the Cardinals a 31-30 win.*
