THE GAME . . . The **TULSA GOLDEN HURRICANE** (10-3, 6-2 C-USA in 2010) opens the 2011 football season on the road against the nation's No. 1-ranked **OKLAHOMA SOONERS** (12-2, 6-2 Big 12 in 2010) . . . the two teams will kick-off the season on Saturday, September 3, 2011 in a nationally televised game on FX from the Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium (82,112) in Norman, Oklahoma . . . kick-off time is 7:11 pm (CT).

THE SERIES . . . This is the 25th meeting between Tulsa and Oklahoma . . . OU leads the series 16-7-1 . . . the Sooners have won the last five meetings, including the last time in Norman in 2009 by a score of 45-0 . . . the Sooners have outscored the Hurricane by a margin of 233 to 36 in the last five meetings . . . Tulsa's last victory in the series came in the 1996 season, as the Hurricane captured a 31-24 win in Norman . . . OU has won 10 of the last 11 games, while in nine of those wins the Sooners were ranked among the nation's top-20 . . . Oklahoma leads the series in Norman, 10-3-1 . . . the most points scored by Tulsa in the series was those 31 points in the 1996 game.

TULSA OPENS ON THE ROAD FOR THE FIFTH STRAIGHT YEAR . . . This year's season opener at No.1-ranked Oklahoma marks the fifth consecutive season that Tulsa has opened up the football season on the road . . . three of those five road openers have come against Conference USA foes . . . Tulsa has posted a 3-1 record in the previous four road openers, losing only last year at East Carolina, 51-49, on a "Hail Mary" pass with no time remaining.

TOUGHEST MONTH IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL FOR THE HURRICANE . . . In three of the first four weeks of the football season, Tulsa plays three of the *Associated Press'* top-10 teams -- #1 Oklahoma, # 5 Boise State and #9 Oklahoma State . . . only Arizona also plays three top-10 teams in the first four games, including #3 Oregon, #7 Stanford and #9 Oklahoma State . . . by contrast, the entire Big East, Big 10 and Mountain West Conferences play one top-10 team opponent among their league members in the first four games.

TULSA IN SEASON OPENERS . . . In it's 111-year history, Tulsa has posted a 65-45-1 record in its' season openers . . . the most consecutive seasons in which Tulsa won the season opener was seven, winning the opener from 1925-1931 . . . the Hurricane has won four of its' last five season openers, including three of those victories on the road.

A LOOK AT 2010 . . . Tulsa finished the 2010 season with an overall 10-3 record . . . the Golden Hurricane was Conference USA West Division Co-Champions with a 6-2 league mark, tying SMU . . . it was a season that presented some early season adversity, but one that ended with a seven-game winning streak . . . included among those final seven wins was a dramatic 28-27 win over Notre Dame for one of the most prestigious victories in school history . . . a huge C-USA road win over rival Houston and a Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl victory over 24th-ranked Hawai'i, 62-35, closed out the 2010 season.

THE HEAD COACHES . . . Tulsa's **BILL BLANKENSHIP** (Tulsa '79) is in his first season as the Golden Hurricane head coach . . . Blankenship was promoted as the 28th Head Football Coach in school history on January 14, 2011 . . . he spent the previous four years as a Tulsa assistant coach . . . Blankenship returned to his alma mater in January 2007 to coach the wide receivers . . . in 2008, Blankenship was named special teams coordinator and in 2009 added the responsibilities of running backs coach as well . . . in 2010, Blankenship served as senior associate head coach, running backs coach and special teams coordinator.

Before entering the collegiate coaching ranks, Blankenship spent 23 years as an Oklahoma High School coach . . . Blankenship resigned as the head football coach at Tulsa's Union High School in December 2005 after leading his team to a second consecutive state championship at the Oklahoma Class 6A school.

As a head coach on the prep level, Blankenship compiled a 205-68 record, including an average of 10 wins per season for his last 20 years, appeared in the state championship game eight times and won three state titles.

He spent 14 years as the head football coach and athletic director at Union High School, where he registered a record of 154-26 . . . his teams qualified for the state playoffs 14 times, reached the quarterfinals 10 times and made the semifinals in nine seasons . . . Blankenship's teams made the state championship game seven times . . . he guided his Union team to Oklahoma Class 6A state titles in 2002, 2004 and 2005.

Oklahoma's **BOB STOOPS** (Iowa '83) is in his 13th season as the Sooners' head coach . . . he has posted an overall 129-31 record in his only collegiate head coaching position . . . Stoops has led his OU teams to nine 10-win seasons in his 12 years as the Sooner head coach . . . in just his second season in Norman, his 2000 team won the national title . . . his teams have won seven Big 12 crowns, has had two Heisman Trophy winners and has played in 12 straight Bowl games . . . Stoops reached 100 victories faster than any coach in college football history. . . before becoming the OU head coach, he had assistant coaching stops at Iowa (1983-87), Kent State (1988), Kansas State (1989-1995) and Florida (1996-98).

TULSA COMING OFF THIRD 10-WIN SEASON IN LAST FOUR YEARS . . . The Tulsa Golden Hurricane ended the 2010 season with a 62-35 victory over 24th-ranked Hawaii to clinch a 10-3 record . . . it marked the eighth time in school history that the Hurricane has won 10 games and the third time in the last four seasons . . . Tulsa finished the 2007 campaign with a 10-4 record and the 2008 season with an 11-3 mark . . . other 10-win seasons came in 1916, 1920, 1942, 1982 and 1991.

TULSA ENTERS 2011 SEASON WITH SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK . . . After a three-point loss against Co-Conference USA West Division Champion SMU on October 9th, Tulsa rattled off a seven-game winning streak to close out the 2010 season with a 10-3 record . . . in those seven games, Tulsa outscored the opposition 45.9 to 30.9 points . . . Tulsa's wins in that seven-game winning streak came against Tulane, at Notre Dame, Rice, at Houston, UTEP, Southern Miss and at Hawaii.

TULSA PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN PRESEASON

POLL . . . The Tulsa Golden Hurricane was picked to finish in second place in the Conference USA West Division in a preseason poll of the league's media.

Tulsa edged out third-place SMU, while Houston is the preseason favorite to win the C-USA West Division . . . Tulsa and SMU tied for the West title last year with 6-2 records, but the Mustangs represented the West in the C-USA Championships against the UCF Knights . . . the Cougars grabbed half of the available first-place votes, while the Hurricane had eight first-place votes . . . Rice was fourth and Tulane and UTEP tied for fifth place in the C-USA West.

UCF was the overwhelming favorite to win the C-USA East Division . . . the Knights picked up 20 of 24 possible first-place votes following their 11-3 season capped with a Liberty Bowl win over Georgia. . . Southern Miss was selected second and grabbed the four remaining first-place votes . . . the Golden Eagles have made nine consecutive bowl game appearances . . . East Carolina was tabbed third, followed by Marshall, UAB and Memphis in the C-USA East.

The preseason poll, administered by the *Tulsa World*, was made up of 24 voters with each school represented by one print reporter that covers the team and one radio representative . . . Conference USA does not conduct its own poll.

TULSA AGAINST THE NATION'S TOP-25 . . .

Tulsa has a 15-55 record against the top-25 . . . the last win against a top-25 team was against No. 24 Hawaii in the 2010 Sheraton Hawaii Bowl by a 62-35 score . . . before that, it was No. 22 Ball State in the 2009 GMAC Bowl, 45-13 . . . the last Tulsa victory against a top-20 team was a 27-20 win over No. 19 Iowa on Sept. 21, 1996 . . . Tulsa's last win against a top-15 team was a 35-34 win over No. 15 Texas A&M on Sept. 21, 1991 . . . Tulsa has played 21 top-25 teams at home and has posted a 7-14 mark . . . the highest-ranked team Tulsa has faced was the No. 1 team in the nation four times, including TCU in 1938, Miami in 1986 and Oklahoma in 1987 and 2002 . . . the highest-ranked opponent the Hurricane has defeated was No. 7 Arkansas, 21-20 on Sept. 25, 1971.

AGAINST THE NATION'S NO. 1 TEAMS . . .

Tulsa has faced off against the No. 1 ranked team in the nation four times before . . . the first came in the 1938 season, when Tulsa dropped a 21-0 decision against TCU in Fort Worth . . . the next time Tulsa faced No. 1 was the Miami Hurricanes on the road in 1986, as Tulsa dropped a 23-10 decision . . . the last two games against the nation's top-ranked team came against this weeks opponent, the Oklahoma Sooners . . . OU was No. 1 in 1987 as the the Sooners claimed a 65-0 victory and the most recent came in the 2002 season as the Hurricane opened the season with a 37-0 loss at the hands of the Sooners.

TULSA'S SUCCESS OVER THE LAST EIGHT YEARS . . .

The first three years of 2000's were lean for the Tulsa football, posting just a 7-28 combined record in 2000, 2001 and 2002 . . . in the last eight seasons, Tulsa has 65 victories with a 65-39 (.625) overall record . . . the Hurricane has appeared in six Bowl games in the past eight seasons, posting a 4-2 record in those games, while winning one outright Conference USA Championship (2005), three C-USA West Division titles (2005, 2007, 2008) and sharing one West crown (2010).

FRESHMEN ALL-AMERICANS JACKSON AND NELSON RETURN FOR SOPHOMORE SEASONS . . .

Tulsa defenders Marco Nelson and Shawn Jackson earned Freshman All-America accolades after the 2010 season . . . Nelson was named to the Football Writers Association of America All-America team (FWAA) and also earned third-team honors by to Phil Steele's Magazine. . . Nelson started 12 games at safety for the Hurricane and totaled 86 stops and added six pass breakups and six interceptions this season . . . Jackson, a linebacker, was in the starting lineup nine times and was credited with 88 tackles, a team-leading 15.5 stops for -74 yards, a team-leading 8.5 sacks for -55 yards and two interceptions . . . he was named to Phil Steele's Freshman All-American second team, while both he and Nelson also earned Freshman Honorable Mention All-America merits by collegefootballnews.com.



FIVE 2010 C-USA FRESHMAN TEAM SELECTIONS

RETURN TO TULSA LINEUP . . . Tulsa had five freshmen named to the C-USA All-Freshman Team in 2010 . . . Tulsa tied Southern Miss and UCF for the most rookies named to the freshman all-conference team . . . the C-USA Freshman Team recognized two players on offense and three players on defense for the Hurricane . . . the offensive selections included receiver Thomas Roberson and offensive guard Stetson Burnett, while Tulsa's all-freshman team defensive performers were linebackers Shawn Jackson and Cody Wilson and safety Marco Nelson.

SENIOR LINEBACKER CURNELIUS ARNICK ANCHORS

TULSA DEFENSE . . . Tulsa senior linebacker Curnelius Arnick returns for his senior season as one of the top linebackers in Conference USA . . . last year, Arnick had a team-leading 115 tackles and added nine stops for -41 yards, four pass breakups and four interceptions . . . he turned in seven double-digit tackle games this season . . . Arnick had a season-best 12 stops at Notre Dame and against Southern Miss . . . he enters his senior season with 185 career tackles in 37 games.

HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE ABUNDANT ON THE HURRICANE SIDELINES . . .

Tulsa Head Football Coach Bill Blankenship may be in his first year as a collegiate head coach, but he had 22 years as a head coach on the prep level . . . Blankenship also has three former college head coaches on his staff — Defensive Coordinator Brent Guy, Assistant Head Coach and Offensive Line Coach Denver Johnson and Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator and Tight Ends Coach Scott Downing . . . Guy spent four seasons (2005-08) as the head coach at Utah State . . . Johnson was a head coach for 12 seasons, spending three seasons at Murray State (1997-99) and nine years at Illinois State (2000-08) . . . he compiled an overall 69-66 record at the two schools . . . Downing served as the head coach at Northern Colorado for the past five seasons (2006-10).

TWO OF NATION'S TOP PICK-OFF ARTISTS RETURN FOR THE HURRICANE IN 2011 . . .

With six interceptions apiece, safeties Dexter McCoil and Marco Nelson ranked among the nation's best for interceptions . . . McCoil and Nelson tied for the fourth-most interceptions in the FBS during the 2010 campaign . . . McCoil ranked fifth with an average of .50 interceptions per game, as he played in 12 games . . . Nelson ranked in a 10th-place tie with three other players with an average of .46 pick-offs per game in 13 contests.

QB KINNE ENTERS 2011 IN THIRD PLACE ON TULSA'S CAREER CHARTS . . .

In only two years as the starting quarterback, senior G.J. Kinne has passed for 6,382 career yards and 53 touchdowns, while amassing 7,336 total offense yards . . . Kinne ranks third in school history for passing yardage, surpassing John Fitzgerald's (1994-98) total of 5,822 yards . . . he is also in third place on the career total offense list, surpassing Fitzgerald (1994-98) and is 1,744 yards shy of moving into a second place tie with T.J. Rubley (9,080) . . . he trails Tulsa's all-time leader Paul Smith's (2003-07) by 4,554 passing yards and 4,266 total yards . . . Kinne also ranks third in school history for touchdown passes with 53, trailing Smith's four-year total by 30 TD passes.

TULSA'S EXPLOSIVENESS . . .

Over the last four seasons, Tulsa has gone over 500 yards in 33 of a total of 53 games, while also surpassing 40 points in 26 contests . . . in that time span, Tulsa totaled 500 yards and scored 40 points in the same game 23 times, posting a 20-3 record in those contests . . . the Hurricane had 500+ yards and 40+ points in six games in the 2010 campaign . . . that feat happened against East Carolina (49 points/579 yards), Central Arkansas (41 points/539 yards), Tulane (52 points/538 yards), Rice (64 points/612 yards), Southern Miss (56 points/634 yards) and Hawai'i (62 points/531 yards).

O-LINE RETURNS EXPERIENCE . . . Eight players on Tulsa's offensive line have received starting assignments during their careers . . . all five starters from a year ago return this season as those five players combined to start 57 games in 2010, and have 100 starting assignments in their careers . . . three other lineman have combined to start 14 career contests.

Tulsa returns the fifth-most experienced offensive line in college football, based on starting assignments with 114 starts . . . SMU leads the way with 158, followed by Northwestern (137), UAB (118) and Clemson (116) ahead of the Hurricane.

Senior Tyler Holmes has 33 career starts at left tackle, senior guard Clint Anderson has 24 career starts, junior center Trent Dupy has started 23 games, while on the right side of the offensive line – junior tackle Brian DeShane has started 11 games and sophomore Stetson Burnett has nine career starts . . . in addition, seniors David Lazenby and Eric Sproal, have started seven and six games, respectively, and junior Jared Grigg has one career start.

CAN THEY BE SPECIAL AGAIN? . . . In 2010, Tulsa's punt and kickoff coverage units were pretty special, and those units will look to maintain that success in the 2011 campaign . . . Tulsa ranked first in the nation for punt return defense, as the Hurricane has allowed only 29 yards on 19 punts for 1.53-yard average . . . the Hurricane also ranked 10th nationally in kickoff return defense, allowing 19.1 yards on 86 returns.

Since the new Conference USA was formed and began competition in the 2005-06 season, Tulsa athletic teams have won a league-best 34 Conference USA Championships, including regular season and post-season tournament titles. The next closest since 2005 is Houston and Rice with 20 C-USA titles apiece.

TULSA HAS PLAYED FOR THREE CONFERENCE USA TITLES IN FIRST SIX YEARS IN THE LEAGUE . . .

Tulsa entered Conference USA as a member in all sports on July 1, 2005 . . . a little over five months later the Golden Hurricane captured the school's first C-USA title in any sport.

Tulsa completed its first season by winning the C-USA West Division with a 6-2 league record and posting a win over UCF in the C-USA Championship Game.

In 2007, Tulsa had another 6-2 record to win the West Division and went on to face UCF in the title game once more . . . this time the Knights captured the championship game victory . . . in the 2008 campaign, after finishing 7-1 in C-USA play and winning its third West Division title, Tulsa hosted East Carolina in the Championship Game, dropping a 27-24 decision.

Tulsa has won 34 conference titles in school history. Tulsa's C-USA crown in 2005 was the first since 1985 when the Hurricane won the Missouri Valley Conference Championship.

TULSA OFFENSE TWO-DEEP QUARTERBACKS

4 — GJ KINNE (6-2, 224, SR) — has started all 25 games in which he has played and has a 15-10 record as a starter... named the 2010 C-USA Offensive Player of the Year... earned first-team all-C-USA honors and all-Academic team accolades... became the 5th Tulsa quarterback to pass for 30+ TDs in a season with 31... had his first career 400+ passing game with 406 yards and 4 TDs against Southern Miss... has nine career 300+ passing games... had a career-best 190 rushing yards and one TD and threw for 154 yards and two TDs in a win over Houston... his 190 yards is the third-best rushing performance for a Tulsa quarterback... had thrown 194 passes before throwing an interception against Houston, while going five games without an INT... has 6,382 career passing yards and 53 touchdowns... ranks 3rd on both the school's career passing and touchdown passes charts... ranks 3rd for career total offensive yards with 7,336 yards... completed 60 percent of his passes for 3,650 yards and 31 TDs in 2010... became the first quarterback in school history to pass for 300 yards and rush for 100 yards in the same game when he threw for 334 yards and rushed for 100 yards against #13 Houston in the 2009 season... has been named to the Davey O'Brien and Manning Award Watch Lists for the second straight season.

15 — KALEN HENDERSON (6-0, 202, FR-RS) — red-shirted last year... established himself as the No. 2 quarterback in preseason drills... threw for 1,734 yards and 21 TDs, while rushing for 534 yards and 11 TDs as a senior at East St. John (La.) High School.

TAILBACKS

22 – TREY WATTS (5-11, 203, SO) — played in 11 games and started 4 contests in 2010... missed the Tulane and Notre Dame games with an injury... completed the season with 197 rushing yards and one TD on 62 carries, and caught 20 passes for 172 yards and 2 touchdowns... a former walk-on athlete... son of former Oklahoma quarterback J.C. Watts.

8 – ALEX SINGLETON (6-1, 250, JR) — has played in 14 career games, including all 13 last year... gained 391 yards for a 4.6 average per carry and a team-high 11 TDs in 2010... had three multiple TD games last year — Rice, Tulane and Hawai'i — with 2 rushing TDs in each game... was rated as the No.11 fullback in the nation by Rivals.com as a prep senior in 2008.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46). Tulsa has played in 16 bowl games.

- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.

- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.

- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.

- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which is just north of Skelly Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000.

- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

- Some other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.

- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears). Chicago Bears assistant coach Bob Babich is also a Tulsa graduate.

- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).



25 – JATERIAN DOUGLAS (5-11, 180, SO) — played 12 games as a true freshman in 2010... had 335 yards and 3 TDs on 43 carries for a 7.8 average last year... his 3 TDs came on runs of 18, 20 and 33 yards...had a season-best 64 yards and one TD against Tulane on 5 carries... out of high school, ranked as the No. 41 running back in the nation by Rivals.com.

H-BACKS

34 – WILLIE CARTER (6-2, 221, JR) — has played in 25 career games... had 19 catches for 299 yards, including 5 TDs receptions in 2010... also rushed for 162 yards and two touchdowns... totaled 93 yards and two TDs on four catches, and 52 yards rushing and one TD on four carries against Southern Miss in 2010... his touchdowns against Southern Miss covered 67 and 12 yards receiving and a 41-yard rushing touchdown... had a career-long 75-yard TD reception in the opener against East Carolina... carried 6 times for a career-best 54 yards and a 34-yard touchdown against Sam Houston State in 2009.
