BIG 12 FOOTBALL QUICK HITS

- Nine Big 12 teams open the 2012 season over Labor Day weekend while TCU opens its renovated stadium the following week on Sept. 8.
- Oklahoma, West Virginia, Texas, TCU, Oklahoma State and Kansas State enter the season ranked nationally in both the coaches and media polls. Baylor received votes in each.
- Including bowl games, the Big 12 was a nation-leading 33-5 (.868) in games outside the conference in 2011, including a 27-3 (.900) mark in non-conference regular season games. The .900 winning percentage was the best among all conferences since 1996.
- The Big 12 has made seven appearances in the BCS national championship game.
- Six Big 12 teams won 10 or more games in 2011.
- Since 1996, the Big 12 has been home to more Heisman winners than any other league with five honorees.
- The Conference has had a Heisman finalist (top four in the final voting) 11 out of 16 seasons.
- The Big 12 leads all conferences with 77 NCAA-recognized national award winners. All-time the Big 12 has produced 97 individual award winners.
- The Big 12 has ranked in the top eight nationally in scoring offense every season; with a team in the top five 13 of 16 years.
- Defensively, the Conference has had a team finish among the top eight in the NCAA in scoring defense 12 of 16 seasons.

Big 12 Players of the Week

A Big 12 offensive, defensive and special teams player of the week will be announced each Monday, except for the first week of the season when the announcement will be made on Tuesday. Nominees are forwarded by each institution's media relations department and selected by a panel of media voters who cover the league on a regular basis.

Postseason Awards

Big 12 postseason football awards will be announced at the conclusion of regular season play.

BCS Sightings

The Big 12 has made 19 appearances in a BCS game in the 14-year history of the structure. The Conference has placed at least one team in the top four of the final BCS Standings in 11 of 14 years. The Big 12 is 9-10 all-time in BCS games and has advanced two teams in the same season five times (2001, '03, '04, '07, '08). The Conference ranks second with seven appearances in the BCS national championship game.

Heisman Trophy Winners

The Big 12 had produced five Heisman Trophy winners since the inception of the league in 1996, which leads all conferences during this time span. The Big 12 has had a Heisman finalist (top four in the final voting) 11 out of 16 seasons.

In a compilation of Heisman voting since 1996 (based on the top four finishers assigning four points for first, three for second, etc.), the Big 12 has had the most Heisman success with 45 points, outdistancing the SEC in second with 35 points and the Pacific-12 in third with 32 points.

Consensus All-America

The Big 12 leads the country with 95 football consensus All-America selections.

Television Selections

Television selections will be announced on either a 12-day or six-day advance by the Conference office. The 12-day advances will be released on Mondays while the six-day will be available on Sunday's prior to that week's games.

National Win Streaks

No. 2 TCU (W8), No. 3 Baylor (W6) and No. 4 (tie) West Virginia (W4) enter the season ranked in the top four nationally for longest win streaks.

Baylor enters 2012 with a six-game winning streak, the third-longest national streak among FBS schools.

The Bears set or tied 101 offensive school records in 2011. Baylor set or tied 26 team and 75 individual marks, and was the only school that ranked in the nation's top 10 in both rushing and passing yards.

Iowa State starts the season one win away from the 500th victory in program history as it currently has a record of 499-595-46.

Steele Jantz is projected to begin the season as the Cyclones' signal caller. Jantz started seven games in 2011, throwing for 1,519 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Charlie Weis enters his first season as the 37th football head coach in KU history.

RB James Sims finished last season with 727 yards rushing. He has led Kansas in rushing each of the past two seasons. The last Jayhawk to lead KU in rushing for two straight seasons was Jon Cornish in 2005 and 2006.

Last season, K-State reached the 10-win plateau for the ninth time in school history, including the eighth time under Bill Snyder.

Returning quarterback Colin Klein's 27 rushing touchdowns in 2011 tied former Texas player Ricky Williams for the most rushing TDs by a Big 12 player in a single season.



OKLAHOMA (0-0, 0-0)

Oklahoma is ranked No. 4 in both preseason polls, marking the eighth time since 2001 that the Sooners will open the season ranked in the top five, and the 12th consecutive year in which OU is featured in the preseason top 10.

OU posted its 33rd season with at least 10 wins in 2011 - a number that leads the nation.



OKLAHOMA STATE (0-0, 0-0)

The Cowboys finished 2011 at 12-1, reaching a dozen wins for the first time in school history. The squad set a record for total offense per game with an average of 545.8 yards.

The season opener against Savannah State will mark OSU's 23rd straight game as a member of the AP top 25. OSU has been in the preseason AP top 25 just five times in its history, but three of the last four seasons.



TCU (0-0, 0-0)

Gary Patterson needs just one win to become the Horned Frogs' all-time winningest coach. His 109 victories are currently tied for the top spot with Dutch Meyer (1934-52).

TCU is the only school in the nation to win at least 11 games in six of the last seven seasons. The Horned Frogs have won at least 10 games eight times in the last 10 years, including seven campaigns with at least 11 victories.

The Longhorns, who welcome back 16 offensive and defensive starters from last year's 8-5 squad, are ranked among the top 15 in the AP preseason poll for the 12th time in the last 13 seasons.

Mack Brown is 13-1 in openers at Texas, including 12 in a row, and has won 15 of his last 16 and 21 of his last 24 season-opening games.

In his first full season as a starter in 2011, Seth Doege threw for 4,004 yards and 28 TDs while finishing seventh nationally in total offense with 337.5 yards per game.

Tommy Tuberville is one of just five head coaches in NCAA history to win a bowl game at three different schools.

West Virginia owns a 46-25-2 combined record against its 2012 opponents.

Senior quarterback Geno Smith finished with 4,385 yards passing for the 2011 season, becoming the first 4,000-yard passer in WVU history. He was named Big 12 Preseason Offensive Player of the Year.

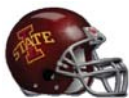
