The Match-Up

- OU is coming off a 69-13 win vs. Florida A&M (9/8). Kansas State claimed a 35-21 victory vs. North Texas (9/15).
- OU is a perfect 14-0 under Bob Stoops at home vs. ranked teams and 44-2 at home against Big 12 teams.
- Oklahoma is 6-0 in games played on Sept. 22, most recently a 52-10 win vs. Tulsa (9/22/90).
- The Sooners are aiming to start 3-0 for the 10th time in 14 seasons under Stoops.
- Oklahoma is 14-4 in the regular season under Stoops following a bye week.

The Series

- The Sooners lead the all-time series 71-17-4 and own a 35-6-3 advantage in games played in Norman.
- Last season at K-State, QB Landry Jones threw for a school-record 505 yards and added five TDs and the No. 9 Sooners scored the final 44 points of the game en route to a 58-17 win against the No. 8 Wildcats (10/29/11).
- Oklahoma has won five straight and eight of the last nine meetings between the two schools.
- The Sooners registered a 42-30 win (10/31/09) when OU and KSU last met in Norman.
- The two teams are 4-4 in the previous eight meetings when both squads have been ranked.

Big 12 Openers

- Oklahoma is 11-2 in Big 12 openers under Stoops: 7-0 home, 3-1 away and 1-1 neutral sites.
- OU has won four straight Big 12 openers, winning by an average score of 37.0 to 18.0.
- Oklahoma is a perfect 13-0 in its opening Big 12 home game of the season under Stoops, outscoring those foes by a combined margin of 512-219 (avg. score of 39.4 to 16.8).
- The Sooners are 8-1 against Kansas State under Stoops, including a perfect 8-0 in regular season games. Kansas State's last regular season win vs. OU was a 26-7 victory in Norman (10/25/97).

Pupil vs. Mentor

- Bob Stoops owns a 7-1 head-to-head record as a head coach vs. Bill Snyder.
- Stoops played under Hayden Fry at Iowa (1979-82) when Bill Snyder worked on Fry's staff. Stoops later served as a grad assistant at Iowa under both Fry and Snyder.
- When Snyder took the job at Kansas State in 1989, he brought in Stoops as the DBs coach and eventually promoted Stoops to co-defensive coordinator in 1991.

What to Watch

- Oklahoma is 78-3 (.963) at Gaylord Family – Oklahoma Memorial Stadium under Stoops, including a 35-1 mark in the month of September. That lone September blemish was a 17-10 setback vs. TCU (9/3/05).
- OU is No. 6 in the AP Poll and remains No. 5 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll.
- QB Landry Jones owns a 31-8 (.795) record as a starter. He is one win away from tying QB Steve Davis (32 wins from 1973-75) for the top spot in OU history.
- The Sooners have outscored their first two opponents by a 93-20 margin, allowing only three second-half points.

Best Program of the BCS Era

The Sept. 17, 2012, "Franchise Issue" of *ESPN The Magazine*, sought to find the best program in the BCS era. Sooners fans will be pleased with the results as Oklahoma was chosen as the No. 1 team.



Top 5 Programs of the BCS Era

1. OKLAHOMA
2. Ohio State
3. Alabama
4. LSU
5. Texas

ESPN the Magazine created three major categories of FBS success (on-field success, off-field success, traditions of success), then split them into nine factors (see below). Oklahoma ranked near the top in almost every category:

- Strength of Schedule (No. 1) - Average strength of schedule since 2003.
- Stadium Edge (No. 2) - *SportsNation* poll results for game-day experience; home win percentage; differential between home and road win percentages.
- Title Track (No. 2) - National titles [since 1936, emphasizing BCS era]; BCS bowl bids and wins; league titles; years in final AP Top 25 poll and AP top 10.
- Head Coach (No. 3) - Tenure [CFB and NFL]; winning percentage; average turnover margin and average penalties per game [all since 2001].
- Player Success (No. 7) - NFL draft picks [weighted by round]; Heisman winners [all].
- Recruiting (No. 10) - Total ESPN 150 signees [since 2007].
- Football Revenue (No. 12) - 2010 figures, per U.S. Department of Education.
- Academics (No. 33) - *US News and World Report* ranking in 2012; Academic Progress Rate in 2010-11.
- NCAA Violations (Grade: B) - Grade based on severity of sanctions since 1998.



THE PROGRAM

- Oklahoma's all-time record stands at 823-307-53 (.718) in 117 seasons.
- Since WWII, OU leads the nation with 579 victories.
- The Sooners have captured seven national championships (1950, 1955, 1956, 1974, 1975, 1985, 2000).
- OU has 45 bowl appearances (No. 7 nationally) with 27 bowl victories (No. 4 nationally) and an all-time record of 27-17-1 (.611).
- OU has 43 conference championships, including seven Big 12 titles overall (no other school has more than three).
- Oklahoma is the only program in FBS history to have four coaches with 100 or more wins.
- With a 69-13 win over Florida A&M (9/8/12), Oklahoma became the first program in college football history to break the 32,000-mark in all-time points scored (32, 035). No program has scored more points than OU.
- OU has 153 All-Americans and 73 consensus All-Americans, including NCAA career receptions leader Ryan Broyles in 2011.
- Under Stoops, OU has had 33 All-Americans, including 23 consensus. Of the 33 players, 15 were on offense, 16 on defense and two on special teams representing 14 different positions.
- Oklahoma boasts five Heisman winners. Sooners have also won the Bednarik (1), Butkus (4), Camp (4), Lombardi (3), Maxwell (2), Nagurski (2), O'Brien (3), Outland (5), Tatupu (1), Thorpe (3) and Unitas (1).
- OU leads the nation with 33 seasons in which the program has won 10 or more games.
- Sooner teams have gone undefeated 14 times in program history, the first in 1896 and the latest in 2000.
- Oklahoma's 47-game win streak from 1953-57 is still the NCAA D-I record.
- Oklahoma has had 102 Academic All-Big 12 honorees under Stoops.
- The Sooners have gone 78-3 at home in Stoops' 14 seasons. In all, Oklahoma has won 81 percent of its home games since Gaylord Family - Oklahoma Memorial opened in 1923.
- Oklahoma has played in front of 81 consecutive home sellouts - every game of Stoops' tenure.
- Including the seven Sooners picked in the 2012 NFL Draft, OU has had 357 players picked all-time in the draft.
- Oklahoma has 42 first-round picks, including three No. 1 overall selections.
- In 2010, Sooners were chosen with three of the first four picks in the draft, with QB Sam Bradford at No. 1, DT Gerald McCoy at No. 3 and OT Trent Williams at No. 4.
- Bob Stoops' career average of 10.7 wins per year is tops among active FBS head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.
- Stoops is the only active head coach on the FBS level to have reached a bowl game in each of his first 13 seasons. Georgia's Mark Richt (11) comes in second.
- Of the 13 bowls, eight have been BCS bowl games and four have been for the BCS title.
- Stoops' 10 double-digit win seasons in his first 13 as a head coach are unmatched among active FBS coaches. He joins Richt and BYU's Bronco Mendenhall as the only active coaches with five such seasons in their first seven years.

THE TEAMS AT A GLANCE



OKLAHOMA Sooners

Oklahoma is 2-0 to start a season for the third year in a row and the 12th time in Bob Stoops' 14 seasons. After downing

UTEP (9/1) in the season opener, 24-7, the Sooners trounced Florida A&M (9/8), 69-13, in the home opener.

Offense

A balanced offensive attack has been the name of the game for the Sooners so far in 2012. Landry Jones has completed 62.5 percent of his passes for 474 yards and four touchdowns. He has spread the ball around to 10 different receivers in two games, but his primary target has been Kenny Stills, who is third in the Big 12 and sixth in the NCAA with 120.5 receiving yards per game. In the backfield, junior college transfer Damien Williams has been a pleasant surprise, leading the Big 12 in rushing yards (129.5 per game) and touchdowns (five). He is seventh in the NCAA in rushing yards and tied for second in the country in scoring. He scored four of the Sooners' eight rushing touchdowns in the team's win over Florida A&M (9/8).

Defense

Oklahoma boasts the No. 10 defense in the nation through two games, giving up just 245.0 yards of offense per contest. In addition, the 10.0 points per game allowed is tied for eighth in the country. After allowing 207 yards rushing in the opener against UTEP (9/1), OU limited Florida A&M (9/8) to just 61 rushing yards. A pick by Javon Harris against FAMU marked the first turnover created by the Sooners this season.

Special Teams

Sophomore Michael Hunnicutt has made 1-of-2 field goals in 2012 and 12-of-13 extra points. Senior punter Tress Way is third in the Big 12 with a 44.7 avg. this year. Justin Brown is sixth in the nation with 22.0 yards per punt return.



Kansas State Wildcats

Kansas State has also started the season undefeated and is 3-0. After taking care of Missouri State (9/1)

in the opener, 51-9, the Wildcats came back in week two and scored an impressive, 52-13, beating of Miami [FL] (9/8). K-State is coming off a 35-21 win vs. North Texas (9/15) in its last outing.

Offense

Quarterback Collin Klein is the catalyst for a Wildcats offense that is 13th in the country with a 46.0 scoring average. Klein is averaging 203.0 passing yards and 70.0 rushing yards per game and has accounted for nine touchdowns on the season (five passing, four rushing). Junior running back John Hubert ranks third in the Big 12 with 98.7 rushing yards per game, while Tramaine Thompson leads the KSU receivers with 13 catches for 211 yards and three touchdowns.

Defense

Giving up just 14.3 points per game, which is tied for 20th in the NCAA, Kansas State has the No. 41 total defense. The Wildcats' weakness so far has been in the passing game, surrendering 251.0 passing yards per game, 80th in the country. Senior linebacker Arthur Brown leads the team with 28 tackles, while senior defensive back Jarard Milo is second with 22 stops. The Wildcats have created six turnovers this year, five on fumbles and one off an interception.

Special Teams

Senior kicker Anthony Cantele has made 4-of-5 field goal tries this season and all 18 extra points. Senior Ryan Doerr is averaging 44.7 yards per punt. Kansas State leads the nation in punt return average (36.2) and is seventh in kickoff return average (32.0), scoring touchdowns in each category.

THE HEAD COACHES



Bob Stoops Oklahoma

Last season, Oklahoma registered its 10th 10-win season under Stoops. In 2010 Oklahoma won its seventh Big 12 title, all of which have come under the current head coach. Stoops didn't arrive

at OU until the Big 12 was three years old, but already he has coached the program to more than twice as many championships as any other school in the league.

Stoops won a national crown in 2000, just his second season in Norman, and has led the Sooners to a school-record 13 consecutive bowl games, including eight of the BCS variety.

Along the way, he has picked up 17 coach of the year citations, including eight on the national level (only five coaches nationally have won more conference coach of the year awards), and watched five assistant coaches move into Football Bowl Subdivision head coaching positions.

Stoops can claim 141 victories (he reached 100 victories faster than any coach in college football history) and has a 44-18 mark against opponents ranked among the Associated Press top 25.

Two Heisman winners and five Heisman finalists have been characteristic of the talent Stoops and his staff have attracted. The offenses have been among the best in college football history (the 2008 team was the first to score 60 or more points in five straight games en route to scoring an NCAA record 716 points).

The defense has been stingy and is the only program to produce two players who won the Thorpe and Nagurski Awards in the same season.

Stoops has been characterized as a grounded family man, big-game coach, relentless recruiter, strong leader and a person with uncommon perspective.

The son of a coach, Stoops was a four-year starter at Iowa. He began his coaching career in 1983 as a volunteer in the Hawkeye program under Hayden Fry, working through the ranks until he became co-defensive coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95). There he played a key role in one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history while serving on Bill Snyder's staff.

Eventually, he left for Florida and a three-year stint as Steve Spurrier's defensive coordinator. It was with the Gators, and a national championship team in 1996, that the spotlight found Stoops and made him one of the hottest names in the profession.



Bill Snyder Kansas State

Bill Snyder returned to lead the Kansas State football program in 2009 after 17 seasons as the head coach from 1989-2005.

In 2011, Snyder's Wildcats jumped out to a 7-0 start - the best in 12 years - and finished No. 8 in the final BCS standings and earned their first invitation to the Cotton Bowl since 2001.

For his efforts in 2011, Snyder was named the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as picking up national coaching honors from *Sporting News*, *Rivals.com* and *CBSports.com*, and the Big 12 Coach of the Year by the AP and Big 12 Coaches.

Named the 32nd head football coach at K-State on Nov. 30, 1988, and again as the 34th on Nov. 24, 2008, Snyder has amassed a 160-83-1 (.658) record during his tenure with the Wildcats, including an 89-64-1 (.581) mark in Big 8/12 games. His 160 victories are the 11th-most among active FBS coaches and are more than triple the man in second place on K-State's all-time coaching victories list.

To fully understand the turnaround ushered in by Snyder at Kansas State one must only consider that the Wildcats were in the midst of an 0-26-1 run when he was hired. It also took K-State 51 seasons (1938-1988) to total just 130 wins, while the 12 head coaches prior to Snyder's arrival in Manhattan combined to win just 116 games from 1945-1988.

Snyder led Kansas State to 11 straight bowl berths between the 1993 and 2003 seasons, making K-State one of only seven programs in the nation to appear in the postseason every year during that stretch. During that span, Snyder's Wildcats won nearly 80 percent of their games, chalking up 109 victories - nearly 10 wins per season - and making Kansas State the nation's second-winningest program over that period.

Snyder has been named the National Coach of the Year on three occasions (1991, 1994 and 1998). He has been a finalist for the prestigious Bear Bryant/FWAA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993 and 1995 before winning in 1998; a finalist for the Football News National Coach of the Year Award in 1995 and 1998; and a finalist for the Kodak/AFCA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993 and 1998.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Landry Jones threw for a school-record 505 yards and five touchdowns, his All-American wide receiver Ryan Broyles caught 14 passes for 171 yards and a score, and 11th-ranked Oklahoma took out some pent up frustration with a 58-17 thumping of No. 10 Kansas State.

Jones shattered the previous school record for yards passing of 468, which he had shared with Sam Bradford, and moved into first place on the Oklahoma career list with 90 touchdown passes.

Kansas State actually led 17-14 midway through the second quarter, but the Sooners scored late in the half, and John Hubert's fumble with 19 seconds left allowed Michael Hunnicutt to kick a career-long 53-yard field goal on the final play for a 23-17 halftime advantage. It was the start of 44 straight points scored by the Sooners.

Broyles hauled in a 29-yard touchdown catch early in the third quarter. Moments later, Jones hit Jaz Reynolds for the second of his two touchdown catches to give Oklahoma a 37-17 lead.

Roy Finch added a 31-yard touchdown run later in the third quarter and the rout was on.

Lindley and freshman defensive back Gary Simon.

How About that Home Opener?

- With a 69-13 win over Florida A&M (9/8), the Sooners are now 47-9-5 in home openers and 13-1 in home openers under Bob Stoops.
- Oklahoma has outscored its opponents a combined 640-192 in 14 home openers under Stoops.

Red Zone Production

- The Sooners rank No. 1 in the nation in Red Zone efficiency on both offense and defense in 2012.
- Oklahoma is tied with 16 teams in the nation with a Red Zone scoring percentage of 100. However, only eight of those 16 teams have more trips inside the Red Zone than OU's 10.
- On defense, Oklahoma is the only program in the country that has not allowed a team to score from inside the Red Zone this season. In fact, OU opponents have reached the Oklahoma 20-yard line just once this season, the fewest trips allowed in the country.

- OU is 67-3 when ranked and 11-0 when unranked at home.

SI also named junior offensive lineman Gabe Ikard and junior defensive back Tony Jefferson to its preseason second-team All-America squad.

Ikard was named to the Outland Trophy watch list earlier this year. Playing at left guard and center, Ikard earned third team All-America accolades from the Associated Press and Yahoo! in addition to receiving first-team All-Big 12 honors and second-team Academic All-America recognition.

Jefferson, who has also been named to the Bednarik, Camp, Nagurski and Thorpe watch lists, led the Sooners with four interceptions and was third on the squad with 74 tackles in 2011 to earn honorable mention All-Big 12.

About the Offense

- Under Bob Stoops, OU has produced career leaders in passing, receiving, total offense and all-purpose yards, four top-10 career rushers and season record holders in rushing, passing, total offense and receiving yards.
- Stoops-led Sooner teams have set 66 offensive school records.
- OU has scored in 177 straight games since 11/7/98.
- Since Stoops' arrival, OU has scored 6,441 points - an average of 492 points per season and 37 per game.
- Oklahoma is the highest scoring college program in history. In 1,183 games, the Sooners have scored 32,025 points. Michigan is next at 30,845 points in 1,247 games.

Oklahoma 0

- Oklahoma has racked up 300 yards or more of total offense in 37 straight regular season contests dating back to early 2009. In a 58-17 win at No. 10 Kansas State (10/29/2011), OU totaled 690 yards, the eighth-most in team history and the highest total during that span.
- Oklahoma had over 300 yards both receiving and rushing for the third time in school history against Florida A&M (9/8). OU also did it against Texas A&M (11/8/08) and Iowa State (10/16/10).
- OU's 349 rushing yards against Florida A&M were the third-highest total in the Stoops Era and marked the 12th game of 300 rushing yards or more under Stoops.
- Oklahoma's eight rushing touchdowns are the most in the Stoops Era.

Wide Open

- Junior wide receiver Kenny Stills has had an impressive to the 2012 campaign. After catching six passes for 121 yards and one touchdown in the opener at UTEP (9/1), Stills followed it up with a career-high 10 catches for 120 yards and one touchdown vs. Florida A&M (9/8).
- His 120.5 receiving yards rank third in the Big 12 and sixth in the NCAA, while his 8.0 receptions per game is tied for 10th in the country and third in the conference.
- It was the fifth 100-yard game of Stills' career, moving Stills ahead of Eddie Hinton for fifth all-time at OU.

- Stills' 68-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter against UTEP (9/1) was the longest of his career, surpassing the 58-yarder he had vs. Texas Tech (11/13/2010).
- Among active players in the NCAA, Stills ranks No. 8 in receiving yards per game (69.5), tied for No. 12 in TD receptions (15), No. 14 in receiving yards (1,876) and No. 15 in receptions (138).

Williams Continues to Wow

- A transfer from Arizona Western, junior running back Damien Williams has made his presence felt in his first two games at Oklahoma.
- After finishing with 10 carries for 103 yards and a touchdown last week at UTEP (9/1) in his OU debut, Williams gained 156 rushing yards and four touchdowns against Florida A&M (9/8).
- With an average of 129.5 rushing yards per game, Williams leads the Big 12 and ranks seventh in the nation.
- Williams' 156 total yards rushing were the most in home debut in Oklahoma history, surpassing Dominique Whaley's 131 yards vs. Tulsa (9/3/11).
- He is the first Sooner to score at least one touchdown in each of the first two games of his career since Ryan Broyles did so against Chattanooga (9/6/08) and Cincinnati (9/13/08).
- Williams is the first Sooner to register 100-yard rushing games in each of the first two games of his OU career since Adrian Peterson rushed for 100 yards against Bowling Green (9/4/04) and 117 against Houston (9/11/04).
- Williams had the first back-to-back 100-yard rushing games for OU since DeMarco Murray did so against Texas (115 yards, 10/2/10) and Iowa State (112 yards, 10/16/10).
- His 89-yard TD run was the longest since DeMarco Murray's 92-yarder against Utah State in (9/14/07) and ties for the seventh-longest run play in school history.

Dynamic Duo

- With Kenny Stills recording 120 receiving yards and Damien Williams rushing for 156 yards vs. Florida A&M (9/8), it marked the 28th time during the Bob Stoops era that OU had a 100-yard rusher & a 100-yard receiver in the same game.
- The pair did it in the season opener against UTEP (9/1) when Stills had 121 receiving yards and Williams had 103 rushing yards.

Metoyer Meets the End Zone

- Trey Metoyer caught his first career touchdown against Florida A&M (9/8) on an 18-yard reception with 0:36 left in the first half.

Back to the Future

- OU associate head coach and defensive coordinator Mike Stoops is back on the Sooner coaching staff after previously guiding the OU defense from 1999-03.
- In his first stint in Norman, four of Stoops' five defenses finished No. 7 or better nationally in scoring defense and in the top 10 for total defense.
- From 2000-03, Stoops' defenses also finished in the top 25 in pass defense and rush defense every season and in pass efficiency defense and turnovers forced twice.
- In addition, Stoops is the only coach to have an athlete win both the Nagurski and Thorpe awards in the same season, doing so twice with Roy Williams in 2001 and Derrick Strait in 2003.

About the Defense

- Oklahoma has ranked in the top 16 in the nation in total defense eight of the last 11 years.
- OU has forced at least one turnover in 152 of 175 games over the last 14 seasons - 87% of games played in that span.
- The Sooner defense has at least one interception in 74% of its games (129 of 175) over the last 14 years.
- Oklahoma has 13 shutouts under Bob Stoops.
- Under Stoops, the Oklahoma defense has surrendered an average of just 18.3 points per game.
- The defense has allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game in five of the last 11 seasons.
- In 2012, Oklahoma has permitted only three second-half points through its first two games.

Third-Down Defense

- Under Bob Stoops' tenure, no program has been better at stopping foes on third down than OU, limiting teams to an FBS-best 30.5 percent success rate since the start of the 1999 season.
- The Sooners have kept that trend going in the 2012 season, holding both Florida A&M (9/8) and UTEP (9/1) to just 3 conversions in 16 attempts each (18.8%).
- The Oklahoma defense posted the No. 5 third down defense in the nation in 2011, allowing just 60 conversions in 196 attempts (30.6%).
- In home games, no team was better in the category than OU's 20.2% mark.
- The Sooners have consistently been at the top of the rankings in third-down defense, ranking No. 11 two seasons ago and No. 3 in 2009.

Defensive Shutout

- In the opener at UTEP (9/1), the OU defense held the Miners' offense scoreless, marking the first time OU kept an opposing offense off the board since a 52-0 win vs. Iowa State (10/16/10).
- During Mike Stoops' first tour of duty as OU's defensive coordinator from 1999-03, the Sooners pitched six shutouts.

No Passing Zone

- The OU defense held UTEP to just 48 yards passing in the season opener (9/1), the fewest passing yards allowed by the Sooners since Oklahoma State had 47 (11/28/2009).
- The 48 passing yards allowed were the second-fewest in the FBS' opening week and the best for a team facing a fellow FBS opponent.
- Under Bob Stoops, the Sooners are 26-1 when limiting teams to 100 yards passing or less and 10-1 when teams pass for 50 yards or less.

Tops in Tackles

- Multiple Sooners posted career highs in tackles in the season-opening win at UTEP (9/1).
- R.J. Washington set a career high with six tackles, breaking his old mark of two, which he did six times.
- Chuka Ndulue, who earned the first half-sack of his career in the first quarter, finished with a career-high seven tackles, besting his old mark of two which was set last year against Ball State (10/1/2011).
- Rashod Favors recorded the first four tackles of his career.

Defensive TDs at 42 in Stoops Era

- With a school-record three defensive touchdowns against Texas in 2011, Oklahoma now has 42 in Bob Stoops' 13 seasons.
- Thirteen of those touchdowns came via a fumble return.
- The defense has scored at least one touchdown in all of Stoops' first 13 seasons, including four in 2011.
- The four defensive scores last season were one shy of the most in Stoops' tenure. OU had five touchdowns on defense in 2007, 2001 and 2000.

Way Good at Punter

- Tress Way is first among active punters in the NCAA's FBS with 206 career punts and 9,050 total punt yards.
- Way also ranks No. 3 among active punters in the NCAA with a 43.9 yards per punt average.
- His career average currently ranks No. 1 in OU history with a season left to play, just ahead of Jeff Ferguson (1998-01) at 42.5 ypp.
- With three of them against UTEP (9/1), Way has 61 punts of 50+ yards in his career to set the OU program record. Ferguson previously held the record with 52.
- Way's 58.8 average against Oklahoma State on 11/28/09 is the highest in a game in program history.
- In 2011, Way has played a central role in field position with 34 of 63 punts downed inside the 20. Only six of Way's punts resulted in a touchback.
- In 2010, Way had 19 boots of 50+ yards with 18 inside the 20 and an average of 44.0 yards on 73 kicks. His average ranked No. 20 nationally, but he had more attempts than anyone ahead of him on that list.

Hunnicut Through the Uprights

Returning kicker Michael Hunnicutt came into the starting role as a freshman last season. Despite not playing in two games...

- Hunnicutt made 21 field goals, tying the OU single-season record set by Tim Duncan in 2001.
- The total also tied him for the 13th-most conversions in the nation in 2011.
- His 118 total points (21 FG, 55 XP) ranked No. 10 on the OU season scoring list.
- Hunnicutt broke the OU freshman field goal record (16, Trey DiCarlo, 2002) and tied the OU freshman scoring record (Jimmy Stevens, 2008).
- Hunnicutt became the first kicker in OU history to hit four field goals in two different games (Kansas, 10/15/11; Iowa State, 11/26/11).
- Among kickers who made 20 or more field goals last season, Hunnicutt ranked No. 5 with an 87.5 (21-of-24) conversion percentage.
- Hunnicutt tied with two other kickers for the most field goals made between 20-29 yards with 11.
- He made a 53-yard field goal at Kansas State (10/29/11), which tied for the longest kick under Bob Stoops. Garrett Hartley also hit a 53-yarder vs. Utah State on 9/15/07.

What Can Brown Do For You?

- Senior wide receiver Justin Brown has shown his playmaking ability on both offense and special teams in 2012.
- Brown returned three punts for a career-high 102 yards against Florida A&M (9/8), which tied for the 19th-most punt return yards in a game in Oklahoma history.
- Brown's 102 total punt return yards made him the 12th player under Stoops with 100 or more punt return yards in a game and the first player since Ryan Broyles had 209 yards vs. Oklahoma State (11/28/09) to do so.
- A 62-yard punt return in the second quarter was a career long for Brown, besting a 43-yard return earlier in the game in the first quarter. It was the longest by a Sooner since Ryan Broyles' 87-yard punt return vs. Oklahoma State (11/28/09).
- Brown became the 11th player in OU history to have three separate plays of 40 yards or more (46-yard reception, 43-yard punt return, 62-yard punt return) and the first since Ryan Broyles had two punt returns and a reception of over 40 yards against Oklahoma State (11/28/09). It's the 12th time an OU player has accomplished the feat overall.

EL PASO, Texas (AP) -- Riding its defense all night and scoring a pair of touchdowns in the fourth quarter, No. 4 Oklahoma survived a scare by slogging out a 24-7 win over Texas-El Paso on Saturday night.

Oklahoma labored from the start of its opener, unable to generate much of a running game or get anything going downfield.

Tied at halftime and up just 10-7 after three quarters, the Sooners finally created a gap from the gritty Miners by stuffing UTEP on a fake punt to set up an 18-yard touchdown pass to Brannon Green midway through the fourth quarter.

They finally sealed it in the closing minutes, when Damien Williams burst through the right side and ran to the left pylon for a 65-yard touchdown run.

Jones threw for 222 yards and a pair of touchdowns on 21 of 36 passing while Williams had 103 yards on 10 carries, giving the Sooners a respectable 204 yards on the ground with his big run late.

Nathan Jeffery ran for 177 yards and returned a blocked punt 24 yards for a touchdown for UTEP, which also blocked a field goal to remain tied with Oklahoma at the half.

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) -- Running back Damien Williams ran for 156 yards and four touchdowns in a record-setting Owen Field debut, Kenny Stills added 120 yards receiving and a score, and No. 5 Oklahoma beat Florida A&M 69-13 on Saturday night.

Williams' rushing total was the most for a player in his first game at the Sooners' home field, and he became only the fourth player at the school to eclipse 100 yards rushing in each of his first two games.

Williams surpassed the record set just last year by Dominique Whaley in his Owen Field debut, running for 136 yards in last season's opener against Tulsa.

He had the clinching 65-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter of last week at UTEP, and one-upped that by dashing 89 yards untouched for a score in the third quarter. That tied for the seventh-longest run in Oklahoma history.
