The Game . . .

√ The **TULSA GOLDEN HURRICANE (2-0, 0-0 C-USA)** hosts the nation's third-ranked **OKLAHOMA SOONERS (3-0, 0-0 BIG 12)** on Friday, September 21, 2007 . . . game time is set for 7:00 pm (CT) at Skelly Field at H.A. Chapman Stadium (35,542) in Tulsa, Okla. . . the game will be televised nationally on ESPN2 . . . it's the third straight game that the Hurricane has been on national television.

The Series . . .

√ This is the 23rd meeting between Tulsa and Oklahoma . . . OU leads the series 14-7-1 and has a 5-3 mark against the Hurricane in Tulsa . . . OU has won the last three meetings, including a 31-15 win in the last meeting at Norman in the 2005 season . . . Tulsa's last win in the series came in Norman in 1996 as the Hurricane claimed a 31-24 victory . . . the first meeting dates back to the 1914 season as Oklahoma won 26-7 in Tulsa.

Tulsa Off to 2-0 Start . . .

√ Tulsa is off to a 2-0 start to the 2007 campaign for the first time since 1998 . . . since then, Tulsa has had only three seasons with a 1-1 start after two games and have lost its first two games in five of those seasons . . . in 1998, Tulsa opened with home wins against SW Missouri State (49-14) and Oklahoma State (35-20) . . . Tulsa has wins this year over UL-Monroe and BYU.

A Wild One . . .

√ In the last outing, Tulsa and BYU combined for 102 points, 1289 total yards, 1027 passing yards, 164 plays and 59 first downs . . . Tulsa won the contest 55-47 and amassed 595 total yards, 490 passing yards, had an 8.5 average per play with a time of possession of 24:56.

Smith Has Career Day . . .

√ In Tulsa's 55-47 win over Brigham Young last week, senior quarterback Paul Smith completed 21-of-35 passes for a career-best 454 yards and a career-high five touchdowns . . . after throwing an interception on Tulsa's third possession, Smith threw for four consecutive TDs, covering 43, 17, 75 and 18 yards . . . at halftime, Smith had completed 12 passes for 302 yards and four TDs . . . in the first half, he was just six yards shy of his career-high passing game . . . on the year, Smith has completed 65-percent of his passes for 761 yards and eight TDs, to just two interceptions for a pass efficiency of 195.95 while leading Tulsa to a 2-0 record.

This Time Its Number Three . . .

√ Oklahoma comes to Tulsa for the ninth time in the 23-game history of the series . . . the last two times Oklahoma visited Tulsa, the Sooners were either ranked No. 1 or 2 in the nation, while this year OU comes in as the nation's third-ranked team . . . OU was the Associated Press' No. 1 team in 1987 and the No. 2 team in 2002.

The School . . .

- Δ Tulsa has an 11:1 student-faculty ratio
- Δ 2007 is the 100th year that TU has been located in the city of Tulsa
- Δ TU is ranked 91st in the U.S. News and World Report
- Δ 1 in 10 is the ratio of National Merit Scholars in the undergraduate student body, and is also the ratio of student-athletes among the student population
- Δ 27 is the average ACT score of incoming freshmen
- Δ 1,019,940 is the amount of square feet added to the campus in the last decade
- Δ \$174,079,000 is the investment in campus construction projects over the last decade.

The Program . . .

- Δ Tulsa was the first school to appear in five straight New Years Day bowl games
- Δ Tulsa has played in 14 bowl games
- Δ TU has won 34 conference championships

Smith Among The Nations' Best . . .

√ Senior quarterback Paul Smith is among the nation's leaders in several offensive categories — 5th for passing efficiency (195.9) and points responsible for (24.0); and 6th for passing yards per game (380.5) and total offense (380.0) . . . Smith is already in second-place on the school's all-time passing, total offense and TD passes charts.

More on Smith . . .

√ Paul Smith's 454 passing yards vs. BYU was the fifth-best passing performance in school history . . . it was the seventh 400+ passing game in school history, but Smith is only the fourth quarterback to accomplish that feat — the others are Billy Guy Anderson (4), Jerry Rhome (1) and Greg Barton (1) . . . Smith had a career-best five TD passes vs. BYU as well, covering 43, 17, 75, 18 and 37 yards.

About Smith's Career . . .

√ Senior quarterback Paul Smith has career totals of 6,178 yards on 524-of-814 passes for a completion percentage of .644 percent and 45 touchdowns in 36 career games . . . he ranks second on the school's career passing chart, 2,692 yards shy of first-place TJ Rubley . . . he has 20 career 200+ passing games, and has three 300+ passing games . . . he opened the 2007 season with a 307-yard performance against UL-Monroe, falling one yard shy of his career best which came last year in his 23rd career start with 308 yards vs. Rice . . . a year ago, he had the fifth-best single-season passing performance with 2,727 yards and 15 TDs with an efficiency rating of 141.02 and a completion percentage of 66.6 . . . in 2005, Smith had an efficiency rating of 142.90 and a completion percentage of 62.4 percent while completing 227-of-364 passes for 2,847 yards and 20 touchdowns . . . his 2005 passing total ranks fourth on the school's single-season passing list . . . Smith's 20 touchdown passes in 2005 was the sixth-most for a single season for the Hurricane . . . he went over the 200-yard mark 10 times in 2005, which was the most since 1993 when Gus Frerotte had nine games passing for over 200 yards... in 2006, he surpassed the 200+ mark in eight games.

The Coaches . . .

√ Tulsa's **Todd Graham (East Central '88)** may be in his first season as head coach of the Golden Hurricane, but he is no stranger to the team he inherited . . . he has an overall collegiate coaching mark of 9-6 and is off to a 2-0 start this year with the Hurricane . . . Graham spent last year as head coach at Rice, where he led the Owls to a 7-6 record, second-place in the C-USA West Division and the school's first bowl berth in 45 years . . . before his stint at Rice, Graham spent three seasons as the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Tulsa . . . he helped the Hurricane post a 21-17 record and the 2005 C-USA Championship and 2005 Liberty Bowl title . . . prior to coming to Tulsa, he spent two years at West Virginia . . . he coached in the high school ranks in Texas and Oklahoma before jumping to the college level.

√ Oklahoma's **Bob Stoops (Iowa '83)** is in his ninth season as the Sooners head coach . . . he has compiled an 89-19 record, led OU to bowl games in his first eight years, won four Big 12 crowns, won a national title in 2000 and has a 25-10 record against ranked opponents . . . before coming to Oklahoma, he was the defensive coordinator at Florida (1996-98) and co-coordinator at Kansas State (1991-95).

Coleman and Smith Named to Preseason C-USA Team . . .

√ Seniors Nelson Coleman and Paul Smith were named to the Conference USA preseason all-league first-team as selected by the C-USA Coaches . . . Coleman has been Tulsa's leading tackler in each of the last two seasons, while Smith has thrown for over 2,000 yards in each of the last two years and ranks second on the school's all-time passing chart.

Three for Three . . .

√ Freshman fullback Charles Clay didn't just have three receptions for 98 yards against BYU, but the true frosh took all three of those catches for touchdowns . . . he had TD receptions of 43, 18 and 37 yards in the BYU contest . . . he had his second straight 90+ receiving game, as he tallied 92 yards in the season opener against UL-Monroe . . . he has a team-leading 11 catches for 190 yards.

TD Trae . . .

√ The first two times true freshman Trae Johnson put his hands on the ball this season, it resulted in a touchdown . . . Johnson caught his first collegiate pass in the season opener against UL-Monroe, which went for a 41-yard touchdown . . . a game later against BYU, his first reception resulted in a 17-yard TD . . . in the BYU game, Johnson went on to catch four more passes . . . he ended the game with five receptions for 95 yards.

Coleman Moves Into 10th Place on Tackles Chart . . .

√ Senior linebacker Nelson Coleman entered the BYU game needing five more tackles to move into a 10th place tie with Xavier Warren (1983-86) on the school's all-time tackles list . . . Coleman had his 11 career double-figure game with 17 tackles against BYU . . . Coleman leads the Hurricane in stops with 21 tackles this year . . . he has led Tulsa in tackles in each of the last two seasons . . . he had a team-best 117 stops in 2005 and tallied 98 stops last year . . . among his double-digit tackle games, Coleman had three in 2006, six in 2005 and one in his red-shirt freshman season of 2004.

Adams Goes Over 1,000 Yards . . .

√ With 129 yards rushing in the season opener against UL-Monroe, junior running back Tarrion Adams surpassed the 1,000-yard career rushing plateau . . . it was also his third career 100+ rushing game . . . he now has 1,111 career rushing yards, after coming into the season with 903 yards . . . in the opener, Adams had two TDs, one receiving and one rushing, for his fifth multiple TD game of his career in the opener . . . he now has 16 career touchdowns (11 rushing and 4 receiving).

Small Doesn't Mean Much . . .

√ Tulsa football has a tremendous tradition in football with 60 winning seasons and seven more with a .500 winning percentage, 14 bowl games and 34 conference championships in 107 years of football . . . in the last five years including this year, Tulsa posted a 31-22 record with three bowl appearances and a Conference USA Championship in 2005 Tulsa

has accomplished these feats against large public institutions as well as some private schools, while being the smallest NCAA Division I-A school in the nation . . . based on 2005 statistics (2006 numbers will not be released until 2007), Tulsa's undergraduate enrollment of 2,796 is the smallest among the 119 NCAA 1-A institutions . . . the next closest is fellow Conference USA member Rice at 3,112.

Tulsa No Stranger to Scoring Points . . .

√ In its first two games, Tulsa has put up 35 and 55 points for an average of 45.0 points per game . . . the point production continues from what the Hurricane had been able to do in the previous four seasons . . . Tulsa was second last year in scoring offense in C-USA with a 27.7 average, while a year earlier the Hurricane put up 33.1 points to lead the league in 2005 . . . since the 2003 campaign. Tulsa has put up at least 30 points in 31 of 53 games.

Marion Makes a Move . . .

√ Junior college transfer Brennan Marion did not catch a pass in the first game for Tulsa this year . . . but in the second game, Marion was a "big-play" receiver, leading Tulsa with 171 yards on three receptions against BYU . . . he had a long of 75 yards which went for a touchdown . . . that 75-yard reception was the 16th longest in school history.

True . . .

√ Of Tulsa's eight touchdown receptions this year, six of those TD catches have been by a true freshmen . . . Charles Clay has three TD catches, followed by Trae Johnson with two and one for A.J. Whitmore . . . another newcomer, JC transfer Brennan Marion has one TD reception.

Frosh Put Up Numbers In Opener . . .

√ Four freshmen, including three true freshmen made an impact in the season opener as true freshmen Charles Clay, A.J. Whitmore and Trae Johnson and red-shirt freshman Jamad Williams combined for 315 all-purpose yards . . . the three true freshmen caught 10 passes for 148 yards and two TDs . . . Whitmore had a 15-yard TD, while Johnson caught his only pass for a 41-yard TD . . . Clay had a team-high eight receptions for 92 yards . . . Williams had 88 rushing yards and 74 KOR yards, while Clay also had five rushing yards . . . the four have combined for 569 all-purpose yards.

Converting on Third Down . . .

√ In each of the last two seasons with Paul Smith at the helm of the Tulsa offense, the Hurricane led Conference USA in third down conversions . . . Tulsa converted 48.7 percent of its third downs in 2005 to finish sixth nationally, while last year the Hurricane made 46.0 percent of its third downs to rank 16th in the nation . . . the Hurricane has converted 41-percent of its third downs this year . . . Tulsa converted 9-of-16 third downs for a 56-percent conversion percentage in the season opener.

Smith Named to AFCA Good Works Team . . .

√ Paul Smith was one of 11 players from the Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly NCAA Division 1-A) to be named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Team . . . the AFCA has been selecting the Good Works Team since 1997 . . . nominations were submitted to the AFCA by the college sports information departments . . . nominees have to be actively involved and committed to working with a charitable organization, service group or involved in other community service activities . . . candidates have to display sincere concern and reliability, while also having made a favorable impression on the organizations with which they are involved.

Case Athletic Complex Open For Business . . .

√ The Case Athletic Complex is the new home for Tulsa football . . . the building was moved into in June and was dedicated on the weekend of Sept. 14-15, 2007 . . . on November 11, 2004, University of Tulsa President Steadman Upham unveiled plans for the Case Athletic Complex to be located in the north end zone of Skelly Stadium . . . excavation began on January 13, 2006 . . . the 30,000 square foot complex was built at a cost of \$10 million, and it began phase one of the renovation of Skelly Field . . . the Case Athletic Complex, named for Mike Case, a developer and philanthropist who made a significant financial gift for the project, houses football coaches offices, meeting rooms, game day suites, academic support center for all student-athletes, football locker room and equipment room, athletic training room, video production suite and Lettermen's Club suite.

New Name for Football Stadium . . .

√ Skelly Stadium received a new name in April 2007, changing to Skelly Field at H.A. Chapman Stadium . . . on April 24th, President Steadman Upham announced during his opening remarks at the school's annual All-Sports Banquet that the University had, within the past two hours, received the naming gift for renovation of the football stadium . . . the H.A. and Mary K. Chapman Trust has provided the financial gift for half of the estimated cost for renovation of the H.A. Chapman Stadium . . . trustees of the H.A. and Mary K. Chapman Trust are Donne Pitman and Jerry Dickman . . . renovation of the stadium, estimated at between \$20-24 million, will begin following the 2007 season . . . when the stadium was constructed in 1930 it was originally named Skelly Field, but was changed to Stadium in 1947 when 5,000 seats were added to the north end zone.

Six Players Named to Preseason Watch Lists . . .

√ Tulsa had six players named to preseason Watch Lists for various national awards . . . senior Paul Smith was named to the 2007 Manning Award and Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award Watch Lists . . . senior linebackers Nelson Coleman and Chris Chamberlain were selected to the Butkus Award List, honoring college football's top linebacker . . . Coleman was also added to the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List . . . junior place-kicker Jarod Tracy was named to the Lou Groza College Place-kicker Award Watch List . . . running backs Tarrion Adams and Courtney Tennial were both named to the 2007 Doak Walker Award Watch List.

Fifty Years Experience as Head Coaches . . .

√ Tulsa's coaching staff consists of five coaches who have served as high school head coaches for a combined 50 years . . . Head Coach Todd Graham was a head coach for seven seasons on the prep level including six years in Texas and one in Oklahoma . . . receivers coach Bill Blankenship has the most years as a high school head coach with 22, followed by co-offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn's 14 . . . co-defensive coordinator Keith Patterson served four years as a prep head coach in Oklahoma, while Dean Jackson was a head coach for three seasons in Texas.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46). Tulsa has played in 14 bowl games.

- **Ellis Jones**, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.

- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are **Bob St. Clair**, **Jim Finks** and **Steve Largent**.

- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback **Jerry Rhome** in 1964 and receiver **Howard Twilley** in 1965.

- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is **Glenn Dobbs** (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which is just north of Skelly Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000.

- Former TU players — **Glenn Dobbs**, **Howard Twilley** and **Jerry Rhome** — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

- Some other former TU players went on to the NFL — **Drew Pearson**, **Rickey Watts**, **Don Blackmon**, **David Alexander**, **Jerry Ostroski**, **Gus Frerotte**, **Dennis Byrd**, **Tom Miner** and **Steve August**.

- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — **Tommy Hudspeth** (Detroit Lions); **Sam Rutigliano** (Cleveland Browns); **Ray Rhodes** (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and, **Lovie Smith** (Chicago Bears). The Coaching Tree . . .

√ Tulsa Head Coach Todd Graham has coached with seven of Tulsa's nine assistant coaches before . . . co-defensive coordinator/linebackers coach Keith Patterson and Graham were college teammates and roommates at East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma . . . Patterson then coached three years under Graham at Allen High School, and was also at Tulsa three years with Graham . . . Graham and co-offensive coordinator/line coach Herb Hand were on the staff together at West Virginia for one year . . . when Graham was the co-defensive coordinator at West Virginia in 2002, Paul Randolph was coaching the defensive line . . . tight ends coach Dean Jackson coached under Graham for two years (1998-2000) at Allen High School and last year at Rice . . . cornerbacks coach/special teams coordinator Jason Jones was at Tulsa in 2005 and last year at Rice with Graham . . . safeties coach/recruiting coordinator Jess Loepp was Graham's defensive graduate assistant at Tulsa for three years and spent last year at Rice . . . Graham's son, Bo, was a student coach at Tulsa from 2003-05, and was on the football strength staff at Rice last year.

QB-WR Coach Connection Had Amazing Numbers on Prep Level . . .

Co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Gus Malzahn and receivers coach Bill Blankenship had highly successful head coaching careers on the prep level . . . Malzahn is in only his second season on the collegiate level, and Blankenship is in his first . . . between them, they posted a 349-104-1 record, made 15 state championship game appearances and won six state titles.

√ A few Tulsa players claim famous sports personalities as relatives . . . the closest relative is the father of linebacker Mike Bryan, as Rick Bryan was an All-American defensive end at Oklahoma and went on to a solid NFL career with the Atlanta Falcons . . . former Ohio State two-time Heisman Trophy winner Archie Griffin is the second cousin to tight end Ted Curtis . . . receiver Nick Henderson's second cousin is former Olympic Gold Medalist and three-time 100-meter World Champion Maurice Greene . . . linebacker George Clinkscale is second cousin to former Dallas Cowboys linebacker Dexter Clinkscale . . . Walter Boyd is a distant cousin to former Oklahoma and Atlanta Hawks star guard Mookie Blaylock.

A Young O-Line . . .

√ Last year, Tulsa's offensive line ended the season having combined for 156 collegiate starts between the five starters to rank among the top-five offensive line units for starts in the country. . . only junior guard Justin Morsey, who started 11 games a year ago, returns for the Hurricane . . . together with one start by Jody Whaley and Wade Whitlow with four career starts, the offensive line totaled just 16 career starters coming into the season . . . first-game starters Rod Thomas, Curt Puckett and Walter Boyd started their first career games on the offensive line, although Boyd has started seven games on defense . . . Tulsa's Defense Among C-USA's Best For Two Years . . .

√ Since Tulsa joined Conference USA in 2005, the Hurricane defense ranked among the league's best in the four major defensive statistical categories . . . only in rush defense in 2005, the Hurricane did not finish among the top-3 in the league . . . Tulsa finished among the top-3 in the league in all four of those categories last year (total, rush, pass efficiency and scoring defense) . . . here's a look at the last two years and Tulsa's ranking within C-USA.

Chamberlain Reaches 200 . . .

√ In Tulsa's second game, a win over BYU, senior linebacker Chris Chamberlain had 10 tackles for his second career double-double tackles game . . . with his 10 stops he surpassed the 200 plateau and now has 203 career stops . . . he is now the second current player on the Tulsa roster this year to have more than 200 career stops, as fellow linebacker Nelson Coleman is the other.

The New Guys . . .

√ In its opening day lineup, Tulsa had seven first-time starters . . . Tulsa also had 13 players play in their first collegiate game, including four true freshmen — Charles Clay, Trae Johnson, Odrick Ray and AJ Whitmore; four red-shirt freshmen — Logan Cawyer, Tyler Scarbrough, Michael Such and Jamad Williams; and five junior college transfers — Eliot Allen, John Destin, Wilson Garrison, Brennan Marion and Dion Toliver.

TV Exposure Has Increased . . .

√ Since beginning its membership in Conference USA in 2005, Tulsa has appeared on national TV 12 times and has compiled a 9-3 record . . . Tulsa has played seven times on the ESPN network, posting a 5-2 mark . . . Tulsa is 4-0 on CSTV and 0-1 on FOX Sports . . . with this years five nationally televised games scheduled, the Hurricane will have had 15 national TV exposures in three years.

Tulsa Against Big 12 Schools . . .

√ In school history, Tulsa has played all but two members of the current Big 12 Conference — Nebraska and Texas — on the football field . . . the longest series with a current Big 12 opponent is 70 games with Oklahoma State, followed by 23 against Texas Tech, 22 against Oklahoma and 18 against Kansas State . . . the Hurricane has an overall 71-86-7 record against schools that are now members of the Big 12 Conference . . . the last Tulsa win against a Big 12 team came against Oklahoma State, 35-20, on Sept. 12, 1998 . . . since then Tulsa has lost the last 10 meetings against a Big 12 school.

"THE ROCK"

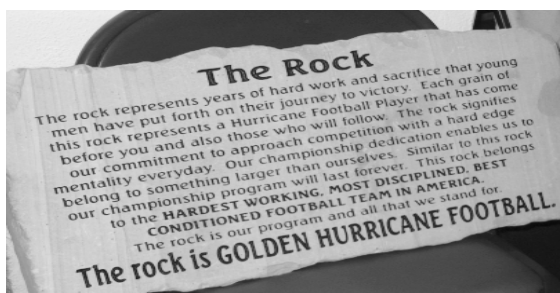
The Golden Hurricane unveiled a new tradition as the "ROCK" took center stage at the team's practice the day prior to the season opener. Tulsa began practice as the entire travel team gathered in the end zone, and stretched out from sideline-to-sideline, hand-in-hand and began the walk.

Tulsa senior safety Steve Craver, the player in charge of the "ROCK" this road trip, was flanked by honorary coach Steve August, a 1976 All-American as an offensive lineman at Tulsa. The team walked the entire field with Craver carrying the 60-pound, 1.5x2-foot "ROCK". At the end of the walk, Craver, then August, gave talked to the team.

The "Rock" is inscripted with the following words: "The rock represents years of hard work and sacrifice that young men have put forth in their journey to victory. Each grain of this rock represents a Hurricane Football Player that has come before you and also those who will follow. The rock signifies our commitment to approach competition with a hard edge mentality every day. Our championship dedication enables us to belong to something larger than ourselves. Similar to this rock our championship program will last forever. This rock belongs to the HARDEST WORKING, MOST DISCIPLINED, BEST CONDITIONED FOOTBALL TEAM IN AMERICA. The rock is our program and all that we stand for. The rock is GOLDEN HURRICANE FOOTBALL."

The "Rock" will travel with the Hurricane and accompany the team at meetings, meals and to the stadium.

The "Rock" was a tradition that Tulsa Head Coach Todd Graham originated at Allen High School as that school's head coach in the 1990s.



Tulsa Game Notes . . .

Vs. LOUISIANA-MONROE . . . Nelson Coleman and Paul Smith each started their 27th straight games . . . Tulsa's offense saw five players see their first collegiate start — Dion Toliver, Cameron Clemons, Rod Thomas, Curt Puckett and Jacob Frank. The defense also had George Clinkscale and Charles Davis make their first collegiate starts . . . junior running back Tarrion Adams had his third 100+ career rushing game and went over the 1,000 career rushing plateau . . . true freshmen Charles Clay, Trae Johnson, A.J. Whitmore and red-shirt freshman Jamad Williams accounted for 213 of Tulsa's 523 yards on offense for 41-percent of the offense . . . true freshman A.J. Whitmore made the most of his first collegiate catch as his 15-yard reception for a touchdown gave TU a 21-17 lead with 9:41 left in the third quarter . . . true freshman Trae Johnson made the most of his second collegiate play and first reception as he caught a 41-yard touchdown pass with 6:24 left in the third quarter to give TU a 28-17 lead . . . senior Paul Smith had his fifth career game with three TD passes. It was his 11th career game with two or more passing touchdowns . . . Smith's 307 yards passing is his second-best performance of his career, falling just one yard shy of his career best.

Vs. BYU . . . Tulsa now has a 55-23 record in home openers at Skelly Field since 1930 . . . the Golden Hurricane is 10-8 in home openers since the 1990 season, and 4-4 since 2000 . . . Paul Smith and Nelson Coleman each started their 28th straight game. . . . Smith's 75-yard pass to Brennan Marion was the longest pass play from scrimmage in 2007 and Smith's longest pass in his career. The pass play tied for the 16th longest pass play in TU history, tying T.J. Rubley-Dan Bitson's 75-yard connection vs. Arkansas in 1988 . . . Smith's five touchdown passes is a new career high. It is the first time a TU quarterback threw for five touchdowns since James Kilian threw five TD passes vs. East Carolina on Nov. 6, 1993 . . . Smith now has six career games with at least 3 TD passes, including the first two games this season. He had two all of last season and has never had more than two in a half. It was his 12th career game with two or more passing touchdowns . . . it only took Brennan Marion two receptions to get over 100 yards receiving, and is the last Tulsa player to get over 100 receiving yards since Idris Moss had 120 yards against SMU on Nov. 18, 2006. Marion finished with three receptions for 171 yards . . . Tulsa's 31-point performance in the first half was the first time since TU scored 31 points against Stephen F. Austin on Aug. 31, 2006 . . . Roy Roberts' 49-yard interception return for a touchdown is the first since Chris Chamberlain's 25-yarder against UTEP on Oct. 27, 2006. It was Roberts fifth-career interception . . . Nelson Coleman had 17 tackles to move up to 10th place on the career tackles list with 295 career stops . . . Chris Chamberlain's interception early in the third quarter was his third-career interception. Chamberlain also forced a fumble on Andrew George with 27 seconds remaining on the clock; the force fumble was the fourth of his career. The fumble, recovered by Steve Craver was the first of his career . . . Tarrion Adams 10-yard touchdown rush was the longest rush for a touchdown so far this season . . . Smith threw for a new career high of 454 passing yards. It is only the seventh time a TU player has gone over 400 passing yards and he is only the fourth player to do so . . . eight different players had at least one reception for the second time in as many games this season . . . Charles Clay caught three TD passes, while the last player to have three or more receiving touchdowns in a game was Garrett Mills against SMU on Oct. 25, 2003 . . . the 102 combined points were the most ever between two teams since TU lost to Nevada in 3OTs, 48-54 (102 total points) on October 23, 2004 . . . Tulsa's 55 points is the most since scoring 56 points against UTEP on November 1, 2003 . . . Tulsa is now 19-9 with Paul Smith as the starter.

MORE ABOUT TU . . .

- 2007 marks the 100th anniversary of TU's partnership with Tulsa. A group of eight Tulsa businessmen raised \$200,000 in 1907 to purchase Muskogee's Henry Kendall College and relocated it to Tulsa that year.
- This fall, TU completed the installation of a wireless internet service, which provides 100% coverage across TU's 200-acre campus, including both inside and outside of buildings. TU is the first university in Oklahoma to provide complete campus-wide wireless coverage. This functionality was added to campus to meet student requests, as well as to enhance classroom teaching technologies.
- While TU accounts for only 2% of all Oklahoma college students, TU students have earned more nationally competitive scholarships than all other Oklahoma colleges and universities combined. Since 1995, more than 100 TU students have earned some of the nation's most prestigious scholarships, including Goldwater Scholarships, National Science Foundation Fellowships, Fulbrights, Department of Defense Fellowships, and more.
- The Princeton Review ranks TU for having the 6th happiest student body in the nation, and the 9th best campus for overall quality of life. These rankings are compiled from student surveys held annually by the publication. Additionally, TU is ranked 91st by U.S. News and World Report in its 2008 edition of "America's Best Colleges."
- One in 10 of TU's undergraduates is a National Merit Scholar, which is one of the highest concentrations of these scholars in the nation. Additionally, 1 in 10 TU undergraduates competes in intercollegiate athletics. TU is the only school in the nation with such a high concentration of national merit scholars and student-athletes.
- Voice mail was invented by the late TU alumnus Gordon Matthews, who in 1983 registered a U.S. patent for a computer that could send, receive, exchange, store, forward and erase messages from a touch-tone phone.
- In the past decade, TU has added more than 1 million square feet to campus in the past decade, with an estimated investment of more than \$170 million. These campus improvements to build or renovate seven academic facilities, five residence halls, 835 new apartment units, and provide on-campus homes to each of TU's 18 athletic programs.

12 – Paul Smith (6-2, 195, SR) — named to preseason Watch Lists for the Manning Award and the Davey O'Brien Award... has completed 65.2% of his passes for 761 yards and 8 TDs this year... had career-bests of 454 yards and 5 TDs vs. BYU... threw for 307 yards in the season opener... was named to the coaches all-C-USA second team, and third-team by the media in 2006... has played in 36 games and has 28 career starts... has an 19-9 record as a starter... has thrown for two or more TDs in 12 career games, has 44 career TD passes to rank second on the school's career list, and has 20 200+ career passing games... only the third QB in school history to pass for over 2,000 yards in two consecutive seasons... ranks second on all-time passing chart with 6,632 yards and second on the career total offense chart with 7,178 yards . . . has 6 career games with 3 or more TD passes.
