OKLAHOMA OPENS 2009 SEASON AT MIZUNO INVITATIONAL

The Sooners usher in the sixth season under head coach Santiago Restrepo at the 2009 Mizuno Invitational hosted by Rice University in Houston. Oklahoma opens play against Houston Baptist on Friday at 1 p.m. before taking on host Rice at 7:30 p.m. CT. The Sooners close out the event taking on Nicholls State at 10 a.m. CT on Saturday and Central Arkansas at 5:30 p.m.

BOULAVSKY SISTERS FINALLY MEET

The Sooners and Owls were scheduled to meet last season at the SFA Tournament in Nacogdoches, Texas, but due to Hurricane Ike the tournament was canceled. This season's meeting finally pins two sisters against each other - OU sophomore RS **Suzy Boulavsky** and older sister, Jessie, who plays OH for Rice.

BOULAVSKY, LAPLANTE, EDWARDS RETURN HOME

Sophomore RS **Suzy Boulavsky** and senior OH **Bridget Laplante** both hail from the Houston area. Boulavsky prepped at Clear Brook HS, while Tomball-native Laplante attended Klein Oak HS. Freshman DS **Alex Edwards** played high school volleyball at Taylor HS in Katy.

BEGINNING THE YEAR WITH FIRSTS

Rice is the only tournament opponent Oklahoma has previously met. The Sooners hold a slim 3-2 series lead against the Owls. It will be the first meeting between Oklahoma and Houston Baptist, Nicholls State and Central Arkansas.

THE SOONERS IN SEASON OPENERS

Oklahoma is 4-1 in season openers under head coach **Santiago Restrepo**. Since the Big 12's inception, OU is 7-6.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

When Oklahoma began the 2008 season, the Sooners returned just two starters. What a difference a year makes. To start the 2009 season, Oklahoma returns all six position starters. Of those six, one is a senior (OH **Bridget Laplante**). The team's only other senior is OH **Jackie Fotu**.

OU GETS NOD IN PRESEASON AVCA POLL

Oklahoma received five points and appeared on at least two ballots in the pre-season American Volleyball Coaches Association Division I Coaches poll.

SOONERS TABBED SEVENTH IN PRESEASON VOTING

The OU women's volleyball team was selected to finish in seventh place, based on votes by the conference coaches. Voting coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams.

SOONERS SELECTED FOR NATIONAL BROADCAST

Oklahoma's home match against Nebraska on Sept. 30 has been selected for national broadcast by ESPNU. The match between the Sooners and Huskers tips at 6 p.m. CT at McCasland Fieldhouse.

PLAYER TO WATCH

Junior Francie Ekwerekwu
Arlington, Texas

Ekwerekwu enters her junior season looking to continue a successful sophomore campaign. The redshirt led the Sooners in kills in 2008 (2.66/s). She totaled 74 blocks last season, 14 of those solo blocks (0.81/s). Ekwerekwu's most recent career highlight was delivering the final kill to defeat Texas in Austin (2008). At middle blocker, Ekwerekwu is the most dominant and one of the most explosive players in the Sooner starting lineup. Her ability to play both ends provides OU with a different dimension of protection and attack to the offense.

Entering his sixth season as the head coach at the University of Oklahoma, Santiago Restrepo has brought the program to new heights in just five seasons at the helm of the program. Pairing his international recruiting with his hard-working, blue collar coaching style, Restrepo has made a name for Oklahoma within the volleyball community.

The program felt Restrepo's impact as soon as he arrived on campus from his previous coaching stop at Southern Mississippi. In his first season at the helm of the Sooner program, he led the 2004 OU squad to a 12-17 record. No Sooner squad had produced a better record since the 1997 squad that reached the NCAA Tournament.

While the 2004 season caught many people's eye, nobody would predict what would happen two years later as Restrepo led the Sooners to the best season in school history. The 2006 season broke plenty of OU records and sparked momentum for the 2007 season.

Restrepo earned Big 12 and Regional Coach of the Year honors and was recognized by CVU.com as its National Coach of the Year as he led the Sooners to the best one-year turnaround in Big 12 history. Behind Restrepo's leadership, the Sooners recorded the best winning percentage in school history with a 28-6 record (.824) and finished a program-best second in the Big 12 Conference race (17-3).

Restrepo's successful 2006 season included OU's first-ever win over Texas in the series history as well as entry into the 2006 NCAA Tournament for only the fourth time in school history and the program's second Sweet 16 trip. Oklahoma finished the season as one of the best in the country with a No. 12 final ranking, its highest in history.

The Oklahoma players also felt the presence of Restrepo, individually, as all five seniors of the 2006 class earned All-Big 12 recognition while Joanna Schmitt and Eliane Santos became the second and third All-Americans in school history.

OU did not disappoint in 2007, either. After being picked ninth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Sooners advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season. It also marked the second time in OU history that the Sooners made back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

Senior outside hitter Sarah Weiland represented OU on the All-Big 12 honorable mention team, while freshman Francie Ekwerekwu was named to the All-Big 12 freshman team. For their efforts in the classroom, five Sooners earned Academic All-Big 12 honors and three were named Academic All-District.

The history-making 2006 and 2007 seasons were remarkable, considering they followed a 2005 season that saw the Sooners finish 7-22.

However, Restrepo was getting his tools in place in 2005 for the historic next year as his recruiting skills shined with the addition of juco transfer Santos. In her junior season,

Santos made her mark on Big 12 volleyball, finishing in the top five in the conference in blocks and kills and was named one of Collegiate Volleyball Update's top-five blockers in the country.

In 2008, he coached Brianna Barker and Caitlin Higgins to All-Big 12 Freshman team honors. Higgins became the first Oklahoma player to earn the Sports Imports/American Volleyball Coaches Association Division I National Player of the Week on Nov. 4.

Restrepo was named the fourth head coach in OU volleyball history on January 26, 2004. During the search process, OU Athletics Director Joe Castiglione was set on making a program-changing hire that fit perfectly into the values of the university.

A former NCAA Division I All-American at East Stroudsburg, Restrepo was also a four-time all-conference selection. He earned team Most Valuable Player honors all four years and was the co-winner of the Senior Athlete Award in 1986. He was inducted into the East Stroudsburg Hall of Fame in 2004.

Following his collegiate career, Restrepo played one season professionally in France and returned to the United States where he played on the American Volleyball Players Pro Beach Tour.

He earned a 3A player rating on the AVP tour and had the opportunity to play against some of the giants of professional beach volleyball, including Karch Kiraly, Sinjin Smith, Randy Stoklos and Kent Steffes.

Highly involved in the international circuit and USA Volleyball, Restrepo served as co-head coach of one of two USA Volleyball under-22 select teams that toured Argentina in June 2005 and 2006.

Restrepo and his wife, the former Heidi Nichols, have two sons, Diego Ignacio and Javier Santiago.
