Freshman **María Fernanda** has started every match of her true freshman campaign. The defensive specialist has played at libero, providing Oklahoma with strength on the back row. Fernanda leads the team with 4.65 digs per set and has four service aces. Fernanda set a season-high in digs with 23 against North Carolina and also recorded her only kill of the season against the Tar Heels. Fernanda came to Oklahoma with a bevy of international experience, having played on the Puerto Rican U20 National Team, and is now putting that experience to the test.

FREUDENRICH: A ONE-PERSON WRECKING CREW

Junior **Sarah Freudenrich** is causing havoc in every match she has played in this season. While leading the team in points per set (3.09), Freudenrich is averaging 2.39 kills per set and hitting .339. In six matches played this season, she has had 10 kills in four of those contests. Considering her offensive power is potent, what really makes her a valuable commodity is her blocking. She already has 29 blocks on the year, a 1.26 per set average. With three block solos and 26 block assists, Freudenrich is a responsible for 84 of the Sooners' 417 points so far this season.

FERNANDA OFF TO A GREAT START

Freshman **María Fernanda** started every match of the Mizuno Invitational at libero. She had 17 digs against Houston Baptist and Central Arkansas. Fernanda also had 16 digs in the win against Rice. She continued her hot streak at the Best Western Shocker Classic. Fernanda 22 digs against Grambling State, a season-high 23 against North Carolina and closed out the weekend with 21 against Wichita State.

DOUBLE VISION

Sophomore **Brianne Barker** and senior **Bridget Laplante** have returned to form to begin the season. Barker had three double-doubles in the first weekend, while Laplante had one. Barker followed up with two more double-doubles at the Best Western Shocker Classic and Laplante added one more to her tally. For good measure, sophomores **Kylie Cowan** and **Caitlin Higgins** each had their first double-doubles of the season in Wichita.

FERNANDA NAMED TO SHOCKER CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Freshman **María Fernanda** was named to the all-tournament for the Best Western Shocker Classic. It marks the second straight weekend the rookie was named among the best at an event. She was previously named to the all-tournament team at the Mizuno Invitational in Houston.

SOONERS OUT-HITTING OPPONENTS

Oklahoma fares quite well in out-hitting opponents. The Sooners have hit .221 as team in the first seven matches of the season. They have held opponents to a .122 clip.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Oklahoma has yet to play a match at home this season. The Sooners have played seven straight on the road and will play 10 matches before the home opener on Saturday, Sept. 19 against Missouri. The last time OU played a home opener that late was in 2003. The Sooners opened their home slate on Sept. 24 against Texas.

SOONERS PLAY A PAIR OF FIVE-SET MATCHES

After breezing through the opening weekend with three three-set matches and one that went four, the Sooners played back-to-back five setters to open the Best Western Shocker Classic. OU dropped Grambling State in five before winning the first two against North Carolina and falling to the Tar Heels in five.

TRIO NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Sophomore setter **Brianne Barker** was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2009 Mizuno Invitational hosted by Rice. Freshman LB **María Fernanda** was named to the team as was senior OH **Bridget Laplante**. Barker averaged 9.85 assists per set and 3.31 digs. Fernanda led OU with 4.23 digs per set and Laplante led the team in kills with 34.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

When Oklahoma began the 2008 season, the Sooners returned just two starters. What a difference a year makes. To start the 2009 season, Oklahoma returns all six position starters. Of those six, one is a senior (OH **Bridget Laplante**). The team's only other senior is OH **Jackie Fotu**.

BIG 12 ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2008

- For the first time in league history, the Big 12 had two representatives, Nebraska and Texas, in the NCAA Championship semifinals. The conference also had three teams play in the regional finals for the first time -- Iowa State, Nebraska and Texas.
- Three Big 12 squads participated in NCAA Championship regional semifinal action for the third consecutive year. Iowa State, Nebraska and Texas also played in the round of 16 in 2007, while Oklahoma joined the Huskers and Longhorns in '06.
- Overall, the Big 12 has earned 79 NCAA Volleyball Championship bids in 13 years, highlighted by the Huskers' national titles in 2000 and '06.
- The Big 12 posted an 85-35 (.708) record against non-conference opponents.
- Four conference squads earned a top 50 ranking in the final NCAA RPI report -- Nebraska (3), Texas (4), Kansas State (29) and Iowa State (32). The Big 12 was the only league with two squads in the top four.
- At least three Big 12 teams were ranked in the Bison/AVCA Top 25 Poll each week, including Nebraska and Texas, which was rated in the top 10 in every poll. The conference finished 2008 with four squads ranked, tying a season-high (preseason poll).

Entering his sixth season as the head coach at the University of Oklahoma, Santiago Restrepo has brought the program to new heights in just five seasons at the helm of the program. Pairing his international recruiting with his hard-working, blue collar coaching style, Restrepo has made a name for Oklahoma within the volleyball community.

The program felt Restrepo's impact as soon as he arrived on campus from his previous coaching stop at Southern Mississippi. In his first season at the helm of the Sooner program, he led the 2004 OU squad to a 12-17 record. No Sooner squad had produced a better record since the 1997 squad that reached the NCAA Tournament.

While the 2004 season caught many people's eye, nobody would predict what would happen two years later as Restrepo led the Sooners to the best season in school history. The 2006 season broke plenty of OU records and sparked momentum for the 2007 season.

Restrepo earned Big 12 and Regional Coach of the Year honors and was recognized by CVU.com as its National Coach of the Year as he led the Sooners to the best one-year turnaround in Big 12 history. Behind Restrepo's leadership, the Sooners recorded the best winning percentage in school history with a 28-6 record (.824) and finished a program-best second in the Big 12 Conference race (17-3).

Restrepo's successful 2006 season included OU's first-ever win over Texas in the series history as well as entry into the 2006 NCAA Tournament for only the fourth time in school history and the program's second Sweet 16 trip. Oklahoma finished the season as one of the best in the country with a No. 12 final ranking, its highest in history.

The Oklahoma players also felt the presence of Restrepo, individually, as all five seniors of the 2006 class earned All-Big 12 recognition while Joanna Schmitt and Eliane Santos became the second and third All-Americans in school history.

OU did not disappoint in 2007, either. After being picked ninth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Sooners advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season. It also marked the second time in OU history that the Sooners made back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

Senior outside hitter Sarah Weiland represented OU on the All-Big 12 honorable mention team, while freshman Francie Ekwerekwu was named to the All-Big 12 freshman team. For their efforts in the classroom, five Sooners earned Academic All-Big 12 honors and three were named Academic All-District.

The history-making 2006 and 2007 seasons were remarkable, considering they followed a 2005 season that saw the Sooners finish 7-22.

However, Restrepo was getting his tools in place in 2005 for the historic next year as his recruiting skills shined with the addition of juco transfer Santos. In her junior season, Santos made her mark on Big 12 volleyball, finishing in the top five in the conference in blocks and kills and was named one of Collegiate Volleyball Update's top-five blockers in the country.

In 2008, he coached Brianne Barker and Caitlin Higgins to All-Big 12 Freshman team honors. Higgins became the first Oklahoma player to earn the Sports Imports/American Volleyball Coaches Association Division I National Player of the Week on Nov. 4.

Restrepo was named the fourth head coach in OU volleyball history on January 26, 2004. During the search process, OU Athletics Director Joe Castiglione was set on making a program-changing hire that fit perfectly into the values of the university.

A former NCAA Division I All-American at East Stroudsburg, Restrepo was also a four-time all-conference selection. He earned team Most Valuable Player honors all four years and was the co-winner of the Senior Athlete Award in 1986. He was inducted into the East Stroudsburg Hall of Fame in 2004.

Following his collegiate career, Restrepo played one season professionally in France and returned to the United States where he played on the American Volleyball Players Pro Beach Tour.

He earned a 3A player rating on the AVP tour and had the opportunity to play against some of the giants of professional beach volleyball, including Karch Kiraly, Sinjin Smith, Randy Stoklos and Kent Steffes.

Highly involved in the international circuit and USA Volleyball, Restrepo served as co-head coach of one of two USA Volleyball under-22 select teams that toured Argentina in June 2005 and 2006.

Restrepo and his wife, the former Heidi Nichols, have two sons, Diego Ignacio and Javier Santiago.
