STORY LINES

- Baylor is 4-0 vs. Top 25 teams at home since 2011.
- Baylor is 11-1 in months of Nov. & Dec. since 2011 (4-1 vs. ranked teams in Nov/Dec).
- Baylor owns a school-record 11-game winning streak and has not lost since Nov. 10, 2012, at Oklahoma (3rd-longest active streak in FBS).
- Baylor is off to a 7-0 start for the first time since 1980. BU is seeking the first 8-0 start in school history.
- Baylor's offense leads NCAA in: Total Offense (718.4ypg), Scoring (63.9ppg), Passing (417.3ypg), Pass Efficiency (207.1), Yards/Play (9.06), Passing Yds/Comp (19.6).
- Baylor's defense has more interceptions (9), than passing TDs allowed (7)
- Baylor's starting (first string) defensive unit has given up just 8 TDs through 7 games.
- Baylor has trailed for just 4:33 over last 9 games (540 total minutes) dating to 2012 (9-0 during span).
- Baylor is outscoring opponents 295-44 in the first half (42.1-6.3 average halftime score).
- Baylor leads nation in both defensive 3-and-outs (7.1) and fewest offensive 3-and-outs (1.1).
- Baylor owns a 4-0 record in Big 12 play for the first time ever. The Bears were last 4-0 in conference play in 1985 when they started 5-0 in Southwest Conference play.
- Baylor has won 8 straight at home and has not lost at "The Case" since Oct. 13, 2012, vs. TCU. The Bears are looking to tie a Floyd Casey Stadium record of 9 straight home wins.
- In home games, Baylor is 17-1 since 2011, 21-3 over the last 3+ seasons and 27-10 in the Art Briles era.
- Baylor faces its first ranked opponent of 2013 in OU. BU is 5-4 over the last 2 seasons vs. ranked foes.
- Baylor is currently No. 5 in both the AP Top 25 and the USA Today Coaches polls, while sitting at No. 6 in the BCS standings. The No. 5 AP ranking is Baylor's highest in that poll since 1953 when it was No. 3.
- Baylor is 7th in the country and 1st in the Big 12 in rushing offense, averaging 301.1 yards per game.
- Baylor and Oklahoma will meet for the 23rd time on Thursday. OU leads the all-time series 21-1 and holds a 10-1 advantage in games played in Waco. BU's lone win in the series came at home in 2011.
- Baylor ranks 6th in the FBS and 1st in Big 12 in scoring defense, giving up only 15.9 points per game.
- Baylor leads the NCAA in percentage of drives ending in a TD by scoring 57 TDs on 100 drives (.570). The starting offense has 71 drives that have resulted in 46 touchdowns (.648).

STORYLINES CONTINUED...

- Baylor ranks 11th in country and 2nd in Big 12 in total defense, surrendering only 316.0 yards per game.
- BU is 1 of 3 teams (Fla. St. & Ohio St.) in FBS ranked top-12 in total offense and total defense.
- Baylor is bowl-eligible for the 4th consecutive year for the first time in school history.
- Baylor's Floyd Casey Stadium has hosted 8 games in which both teams have been ranked. BU is 4-4 in those games. The only other game with two top-10 teams was in 1956 (No. 7 TAMU 19, No. 8 BU 13).
- Baylor has won school-record 7 straight Big 12 games (previous high was 5 in 2010).
- Baylor's offense has topped 700 yards in 5 of the last 7 games and surpassed 600 yards in 8 of its last 10 (10-0 record in that span).
- Baylor's defense is 3rd in the FBS and 1st in the Big 12 in tackles for loss with 9.1 per game.
- Baylor's defense leads the nation in red zone defense (55.0%).
- Baylor's opponents are 3 of 18 (16.7%) on 4th down. That mark is 3rd in the FBS and 1st in the Big 12.
- Baylor's defense is limiting opposing offenses to 177.3 yards per game through the air. That total is 6th nationally and 1st in the conference.
- Baylor has posted at least 400 yards offense in 34 straight games and is averaging 608.8 yards per game since 2011. Both marks lead the nation.
- Baylor has completed 25 passes for 40 yards or longer this season, including 17 for TDs.
- Baylor is 53 of 95 (56%) on 3rd downs this year, which is 4th best in the country and leads the Big 12.
- **Phil Bennett's** defense has forced 2 or more turnovers in 10 of its last 14 games (Baylor's record is 12-2 in that span). BU is 20-2 when forcing 2+ turnovers during **Bennett's** 2+ seasons.
- Baylor is 8th nationally and 1st in Big 12 in sacks with 3.29/game. Baylor's defense has 30 sacks over last 8 games (3 vs. KU, 5 vs. ISU, 2 vs. K-State, 4 vs. WVU, 2 vs. ULM, 2 vs. Buffalo, 6 vs. Wofford and 6 in Holiday Bowl win over UCLA). BU is 23-4 over past 3+ years with 2 or more sacks in game.
- Baylor team passing efficiency defense is 3rd-best nationally and 1st in the Big 12 at 95.92.
- Baylor ranks 13th in tackles for loss allowed and 1st in the Big 12, giving up only 4.14 per game.
- Baylor's defense is 19th in the country and third in the Big 12 in 3rd-down conversion defense (32.8%).
- Baylor is 21st nationally and 2nd in the conference by surrendering only 1.14 sacks per game.
- Baylor's offense has suffered just eight 3-and-outs in 103 drives this season (leads nation).
- Baylor's combined 447 points scored in the first 7 games are the most over any 7-game stretch in school history and more total points than BU has scored in 66 of the last 68 full seasons.
- Baylor has four 70-point games this season -- only three such games in its 111 years prior.
- Members of the All-Floyd Casey Stadium team will be honored at halftime of Thursday's contest. The team was selected earlier this year by a voting panel. Attending honorees include All-Americans **Santana Dotson** and **Daniel Sepulveda**. For a complete listing of the team see page 10.
- In first 7 games of year, BU notched 6 of top-7 single game yardage totals in program history with 692 vs. Wofford, 714 vs. ISU, 743 vs. KU, 781 vs. Buffalo and ULM and school and Big 12 record 872 vs. WVU.
- The Bears have posted the top-five scoring outputs in school history in the modern-era (post-WWII) in their first seven games with 69 vs. Wofford, 70 vs. both Buffalo and ULM, 73 vs. West Virginia and 71 vs. ISU.

- **Bryce Petty** leads the nation in Pass Efficiency (219.0) and Yds/Comp (20.11).
- **Petty** leads Big 12 in Passing Yds (350.4) and Completion % (69.3).
- **Lache Seastrunk:** 124.1 Rush Yds/Gm (9th nationally, 1st Big 12); 11 TDs (13th nation, 1st Big 12).
- **Seastrunk** has 10 100-yard rushing games in last 11 and is averaging 9.1 yards per carry (2nd nationally).
- Junior **Antwan Goodley** is 3rd nationally and 1st in Big 12 with 127.7 receiving yards/game. He is 3rd in FBS with 23.5 yards per catch.
- Senior **Tevin Reese** is 7th in FBS and 2nd in Big 12 with 117.7 yds/game.
- **Goodley** and **Reese** rank 12th in NCAA & lead Big 12 with 8 TDs in 2013. Both are on Biletnikoff watch list.
- **Reese** ranks 4th in receptions (182), 3rd in yards (3,059) and 3rd in TDs (24) in BU history.
- **Reese** has scored 21 of his 24 career TD receptions from 40+ yards. He averages 52.56 yards per career TD reception. Reese is second in the nation with 25.0 yards per catch.
- **RB Glasco Martin** has 5 rushing TDs in 2013 (had 15 in 2012, the 2nd-most in BU history). He has 23 for his career, which ranks 6th all-time at BU.
- **LB Eddie Lackey** claimed the Big 12's Defensive POW after Iowa State game. He had eight tackles, a sack, 1.5 TFLs and a fumble recovery. He is BU's first-ever three-time defensive POW winner.
- **LB Bryce Hager** is 5th in the Big 12 with 8.3 tackles per game.
- **DE Shawn Oakman** is 4th in NCAA with 1.7 TFLs per game.
- **DE Chris McAllister** is tied for 2nd on the school career sacks list with 14.0.
- **DE Terrance Lloyd** is .5 sacks shy of cracking BU's top 10 list with 9.0.
- **WR Levi Norwood** has caught a pass in 21 consecutive games.
- **S Terrell Burt** won the Big 12's Defensive POW after ULM game. Career-high 7 tackles (4 solo) and INT (returned 63 yards for TD).
- **PK Aaron Jones** is 54-for-54 on PATs in '13. BU's career leader in scoring with 399 pts. and FG made (51).
- **Jones** boasts NCAA's longest active streak of 161 straight made PATs (school record). 246 career made PATs is 7 shy of NCAA all-time record (Art Carmody, Louisville, 253).

Baylor leads the country in total offense (718.4 ypg.), scoring offense (63.9 ppg.), passing offense (417.3 ypg.) and passing efficiency (207.12). The Bears are the only team in the country to be ranked in the top 10 for both passing (1st, 417.3) and rushing offense (7th, 301.1). Baylor's offensive machine has ranked among the nation's top two offenses in each of the past three seasons, the only school to achieve the feat...

KANSAS GAME BULLETS

Baylor improved to 7-0 overall and 4-0 in Big 12 play with a 59-14 win over Kansas on Oct. 26. Here are some of the highlights from that game.

- Baylor's 743 yards of total offense were the most ever by Baylor in a road game and the 5th-most in BU single-game history.
- Baylor's 59 points were its 6th-most ever in a conference game (Big 12 or SWC) and its 2nd-most ever in a conference road game (63 in loss at West Virginia in 2012).
- Baylor's 45 point margin-of-victory tied its 5th-highest ever in a conference game and was its 2nd-highest ever in a conference road game (46 at SMU in 1989).
- The Bears have scored in two minutes or less in 44 of 55 TD drives this season (8 of 8 vs. KU). BU had 42 TD drives of less than two minutes during the 2012 season.
- QB Bryce Petty completed 20-of-32 passes for a career-high 430 yards and 3 TDs, and he added his 6th rushing TD of the year. He's thrown for 300+ yards and at least 2 TDs in all seven career starts.
- Petty's 430 passing yards tied Robert Griffin III (2011 at Texas A&M) for 3rd-most in a game in Baylor history.
- Petty extended his school record with a 7th straight 300-yard passing game.
- IR Tevin Reese (110 receiving yards) had his 12th career 100-yard receiving game, 3rd-most in program history. He trails only Terrance Williams (13) and Kendall Wright (19).
- Reese had a 62-yard TD catch in the 1st quarter and a 25-yard TD catch in the 2nd quarter, giving him 24 career receiving TDs (3rd-most in BU history). He's gone 40+ yards on 21 of his 24 career receiving TDs, and he averages 50.6 yards per career TD catch.
- Goodley had his streak of 7 consecutive games with at least one TD catch snapped -- it was the nation's 2nd-longest active streak entering the day.
- RB Lache Seastrunk (13 carries, 109 yards, 1 TD) has rushed for 100+ yards in 10 of his last 11 games.
- Seastrunk had his 11th career 100-yard rushing game, passing Jerod Douglas for sole possession of 2nd on Baylor's career list.
- RB Glasco Martin had a 14-yard rushing TD in the 1st quarter to give him 23 for his career, passing Jay Finley for sole possession of 6th on Baylor's all-time list.

THE NATION'S MOST BALANCED OFFENSE

Despite scoring quick touchdowns in its first seven games, Baylor has continued to establish its run game in order to set up the pass play. The Bears have 335 rushes on the season and only 220 passes. Baylor is the nation's only team to rank among the top 25 in both rushing and passing in each of the last four years.

BEARS D STEPPING UP

A significant, but oft-overlooked, component to Baylor's success in 2013 (and 11-game winning streak that spans back to 2012) is the improvement of the defense. The Bears veteran D ranks sixth nationally and leads the Big 12 in points allowed (15.9/game) and ranks 11th nationally and second in the Big 12 in total yards allowed (316.0/game).

11-GAME WINNING STREAK

Baylor set a new school record with 11 straight wins with the road win at Kansas That mark surpasses the 10 straight games won in 1936 and 1937. The Bears won the final three regular-season games in 2012 as well as a decisive 49-26 victory over No. 17 UCLA in the Holiday Bowl. Three of the 10 wins in the streak have come over top 25 teams (No. 1 Kansas State, No. 24 Oklahoma State and No. 17 UCLA). The current streak is 3rd-longest nationally.

NOVEMBER (AND DECEMBER) IS FOR CONTENDERS

Baylor has compiled an 11-1 mark in November and December since 2011 (7-1 in Nov., 4-0 in Dec.). Included in those games is 4-1 record vs. Top 25 teams (wins over No. 5 OU in 2011 and No. 2 K-State, No. 23 Oklahoma State and No. 17 UCLA in 2012).

SUCCESS AT HOME IN 'THE CASE'

Baylor is on an eight-game winning streak at home and has compiled a 21-3 record in Floyd Casey Stadium over the past three-plus seasons (including having won 17 of its last 18 games). Over its last 18 games in Waco, BU is beating its opponents by average score of 53-25 (953-446), while totaling an average of 632 yards of offense per game. Baylor plays a school-record tying seven home games during Floyd Casey's curtain-call season in 2013.

PETTY PRETTY NEAR PERFECTION IN FIRST SEVEN STARTS

Through seven games, Bryce Petty is averaging 350.4 passing yards per game, while completing 69.3 percent of his passes with 18 touchdowns and only one interception. He leads the country in passing efficiency at 219.01 and in ESPN's adjusted QBR rankings with a score of 95.3. Petty's 13-for-16 performance with 338 yards and two touchdowns against Buffalo is listed as the No. 1 game of the year in the adjusted QBR rankings. Petty served as the backup to Robert Griffin III and Nick Florence the past two seasons. The junior had thrown just 14 passes in 11 career games played entering 2013, but has been through three seasons and four spring drills at Baylor since signing in 2009 and enrolling in January 2010.

SEASTRUNK SENSATIONAL THROUGH SEVEN

Junior running back Lache Seastrunk has racked up 869 yards of rushing on 96 attempts through the first seven games. He is second in the nation with 9.1 yards per carry and leads the Big 12 with 11 rushing touchdowns. He is less than 62 yards away from cracking the Baylor top 10 list for most yards in a single season and his 124.14 yards per contest would currently be a new BU school record. That mark is ninth nationally with Seastrunk gaining at least 100 yards in six of the season's first seven games.

REESE RACING INTO RECORD BOOKS

A two-time All-Big 12 honoree, Tevin "Sweet Feet" Reese is averaging 117.7 receiving yards per game, which ranks seventh in FBS and second in the Big 12 behind teammate Antwan Goodley. Reese ranks second nationally with 25.0 yards per catch, and his eight touchdown catches are tied with Goodley for the Big 12 lead and rank 12th nationally. He's third in Baylor history with 3,059 career receiving yards and 24 career receiving touchdowns, and his 182 career receptions are fourth-most ever at Baylor. One of the nation's best big-play threats, Reese averages 52.6 yards per TD reception, and 21 of his 24 career receiving TDs have gone for 40 or more yards.

STARTING OFFENSE IS WELL-OILED MACHINE

Baylor's starting offense has had 71 drives that have resulted in 47 touchdowns, five field goals, 11 punts, three turnover on downs, one interception and four fumbles (four End Of Halves and 4 defensive TDs not included).

STARTING D TOUGH TO SCORE ON

Baylor's defense ranks sixth nationally in points allowed with 15.9, but has actually only allowed 62 points (8.9/gm) by its starting defense (42 of 111 total points allowed after reserves entered and 7 allowed by special teams – see chart below), including zero points over the last two games. The starting unit has allowed just eight TDs in seven games this season.

BAYLOR'S DISRUPTIVE DEFENSE

Baylor's veteran defense, with ranks 11th nationally under third-year defensive coordinator Phil Bennett, has proven to be a force in disrupting opposing offenses through seven games in 2013. The Bears have doubled their average sacks and tackles for loss (compared to recent seasons) and are on pace to top recent totals for interceptions and total turnovers. 400 YARDS - COMMONPLACE FOR BAYLOR OFFENSE

Baylor has racked up over 400 yards of offense in 34 straight games. That is currently the nation's longest active streak and 13 more than the next closest school (Texas A&M, 21). The last time BU failed to reach the 400-yard plateau was Nov. 20, 2010 vs. Oklahoma (361). Under Briles, Baylor has had more than 400 yards of offense in 50 of 70 games. Since the start of the 2011 season, the Bears have had 33 games with over 400 yards of total offense, which is the most in the country in that time period.

STARTING FAST

BU has scored first in six of its seven games this year to help it outscore its opponents by a combined total of 167-20 in the opening quarter. BU has put points on the scoreboard in the 1st quarter in 23 of its last 24 games dating back to Nov. 19, 2011.

NORMAN, Okla. - Landry Jones threw for 277 yards and two touchdowns, Damien Williams ran for 99 yards and two scores and No. 14 Oklahoma beat Baylor 42-34.

Lache Seastrunk ran for 91 yards and three touchdowns for Baylor (4-5, 1-5 Big 12), the last score getting the Bears within eight with 1:26 to play after quarterback **Nick Florence** got in on the 2-point conversion.

The Bears, who entered the game with the nation's top overall offense and top passing attack, piled up 252 yards on the ground and became the fourth Sooners opponent to surpass 200 yards rushing. **Florence** had 83 yards and a score, to go with 172 yards on 12-for-33 passing with no interceptions.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 58-yard field goal in the 1st quarter was its longest since a 58-yard field goal Oct. 12, 1991.
- Baylor's 19-play scoring drive in the 4th quarter was the Bears' longest of the season in plays and took 4:42 off the clock.
- Baylor has now scored 27 TDs on drives of 2 minutes or less (2 vs. Oklahoma).

ALMOST PERFECT IN RED ZONE

During its past eight games, Baylor has been to the red zone 40 times and has scored on 35 of those occasions. This season, BU is 31 for 36 inside the 20-yard line with 26 touchdowns and five field goals.

OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSE

Baylor's defense under coordinator **Phil Bennett** has demonstrated a knack for making big plays at key moments to contribute to the Bears winning ways over the past three seasons. In two-plus years under Bennett, Baylor's D has recorded at least one takeaway in 29 of 33 games - a total of 69 takeaways (43 interceptions, 26 fumbles recovered). Fifty-eight of those 69 takeaways have come over the last 24 games, an average 2.42 per game (Baylor is 20-4 during that stretch). Overall under Bennett, Baylor is 20-2 when recording two or more takeaways. This year, BU has forced 15 takeaways (nine INTs, six fumbles).

BAYLOR'S D BEHIND ENEMY LINES

Baylor's defense ranks third nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 9.1 per game, while individually **Shawn Oakman** is fourth in the country with 1.7 TFLs per game. The Bears have totaled 64 stops behind the line of scrimmage for 226 yards in total losses - including 24 sacks for -141 yards. The 3.29 sacks per game ranks eighth nationally and first in the Big 12 Conference.

BAYLOR HOME WINNING STREAK AMONG NATION'S BEST

Baylor's eight straight home wins are only one victory shy of the school record of nine, which has been achieved twice (last in 2011-12). The streak is tied for the nation's eighth-longest active streak.

BEARS GET DEFENSIVE ON FOURTH DOWNS

Baylor's opponents are just three of 18 on fourth down this year, meaning the Bears are giving up fourth-down conversions at only a 16.7 percent clip. That ranks tied for third nationally and first in the Big 12. BU also ranks 19th nationally and third in Big 12 with a 32.8 percent (41 of 125) conversion rate against it on third down.

SPEAKING OF RANKINGS

Baylor remained at No. 6 in the third edition of the BCS standings released this week. That is the Bears' highest BCS rank in the 16-year history of the system. Baylor has made a steady rise in the AP Top 25 and the *USA Today* Coaches Poll, after only receiving votes in both polls to open the season. This week, Baylor sits at No. 5 in both the AP poll and the coaches poll. BU's AP rank is its highest since 1953 when the Bears were third. Baylor has now been ranked in both polls at least once in four consecutive seasons for the first time since being ranked in five straight years in 1953-57. Prior to being ranked in 2010, BU had gone 16 years without making it into the polls.

BAYLOR'S RETURN TO PROMINENCE UNDER BRILES

It's no secret that **Art Briles** has completely rebuilt Baylor's football program back to its former winning ways, but most impressive is how speedy and pronounced the transformation has been. Briles is fourth on the BU career wins list and 10 victories away from moving into the third spot. The chart below shows the marked change in Baylor's football success in five-plus years under Briles compared to the previous 12 seasons since the start of the Big 12.

OFFENSE FLEXING ITS MUSCLE

Baylor has seven quarters this season in which it has scored 28 or more points. That number equals the number of times the Bears scored 28+ points in a quarter in their 1,137 all-time games entering the year.

OKLAHOMA SERIES HISTORY

Thursday's contest will be the 23rd meeting between Baylor and Oklahoma. OU holds a 21-1 advantage in the series and a 10-1 mark over BU in games played in Waco. The Sooners picked up a 42-34 victory in last season's game in Norman. The last time the two teams played in Waco, Baylor got its first win of the series with a dramatic 45-38 win. 2011 Heisman winner **Robert Griffin III** threw for a then-school record 479 yards and found **Terrance Williams** from 34 yards out, with eight seconds left to give Baylor its first win over OU. Baylor and Oklahoma first met Oct. 26, 1901; the Sooners left Waco that day with a 17-6 victory. The teams did not play again until 1973, a 42-14 Oklahoma victory in Waco. The Bears and Sooners met again the following season in Norman with OU winning 28-11. Baylor and Oklahoma met twice more before the inception of the Big 12 in 1996, playing at Norman during the 1984 and 1989 seasons.

RANKED VS. RANKED IN WACO A RARE OCCURENCE

JONES JOINING NATION'S ELITE WITH EVERY KICK

With nine points last week at Kansas, Aaron Jones became the Big 12's all-time leading kicking points scorer with 399 points, surpassing Nebraska's Alex Henery (397 points, 2007-10). He needs seven PATs to tie Louisville's Art Carmody for the most in NCAA history (253). Jones currently owns the nation's longest active PAT streak with 161 made in a row. He needs two field goal attempts to take over the BU career lead from Miami Dolphins GM and former Baylor kicker Jeff Ireland.

RUSHING ATTACK FLOURISHES FOR BEARS

Baylor's underrated rushing attack, which is frequently overshadowed by the Bears' passing game, is currently ranked seventh in the country with 301.1 yards per game on the ground. It has ranked among the top 15 nationally in each of the last two seasons (14th at 231.7 ypg in 2012 and 10th at 235.6 in 2011). Baylor led the Big 12 in rushing last season and ranked second in 2011. The Bears punishing rushing game has produced 1,000-yard rushers in each of the last three seasons: Jay Finley in 2010 (1,218), Terrance Ganaway in 2011 (school-record 1,547) and **Lache Seastrunk** in 2012 (1,012).

“COLLEGE FOOTBALL’S BEST ONE-TWO PUNCH AT RB”

Baylor's top two returning rushers in 2013, termed “college football's best one-two punch” by Lindy's, are senior **Glasco Martin** (889 yards, 15 TDs in 2012) and junior **Lache Seastrunk** (1,012 yards, seven TDs). The RB corps was rated seventh nationally by Lindy's and 11th by *Phil Steele* in the preseason, and the Martin-Seastrunk duo is one of just six returning nationally (the only duo in the Big 12) to have each gained 850-plus rushing yards in 2012.

“COUNTRY’S BEST RECEIVING DUO”

Baylor's top two receivers, Antwan Goodley and Tevin Reese, through the first seven games are also the country's best receiving duo according to FOX Sports' Joey Harrington and the statistics. Reese and Goodley are No. 2 and 3 respectively in yards per catch average at 25.0 and 23.5. Goodley and Reese also rank third (127.7) and seventh (117.7) in the nation in receiving yards per game, respectively. Goodley and Reese each have eight receiving touchdowns, which are the 12th most in the country.

DEFENSE LOADED WITH THREE-YEAR STARTERS

Almost half of Baylor's starting defense (five players) are in their third season as starters, including one in his fourth season. Those players include **Terrance Lloyd**, DE, 4th season (37 starts), **Ahmad Dixon**, S, 3rd season (33 starts), **Sam Holl**, NB, 3rd season (30 starts), **K.J. Morton**, CB, 3rd season (24 starts) and **Joe Williams**, CB, 3rd season (22 starts).

ATTENDANCE AT RECORD PACE

In its 64th and final season of play at Floyd Casey Stadium, Baylor has averaged 43,875 fans through five home games, which is 2,681 ahead of last year's average of 41,194 (No. 2 all-time) and 2,507 better than the stadium-record average of 41,368 established in 2011. Baylor's last three teams, all of which played in bowl games, own the 1st, 2nd and 8th positions on the Floyd Casey Stadium single-season attendance list. BU's 2013 home attendance average is up 6.5 percent from a year ago, and with capacity crowds expected for the final two home games, that figure should increase.

BAYLOR STADIUM RISING ON BANKS OF BRAZOS RIVER

Baylor Stadium, a \$260 million riverfront stadium is being built on a 93-acre site at the intersection of Interstate 35, one of the nation's busiest highways, and the Brazos River, the longest waterway in the state of Texas. The stadium will hold 45,000 spectators, with the flexibility to expand to 55,000, and feature a bridge crossing the Brazos connecting the stadium to the campus. Baylor's first football game in its new home will be the 2014 season opener against SMU.

CLOSING DOWN “THE CASE” IN STYLE

As part of Baylor's 64th and final season at Floyd Casey Stadium, Baylor will utilize its seven home games in 2013 to celebrate the stadium, highlighted by player reunions surrounding each game (except Nov. 7 Thursday night game vs. Oklahoma) that will correspond to each of six decades in which the Bears have called Floyd Casey home. An All-Floyd Casey Stadium team has been chosen by a selection committee (see page 10), and various video vignettes will air historic moments and personal memories about The Case throughout the season. Throwback events to bring back former traditions are planned, such as Homecoming's "card sections" on Oct. 19 vs. Iowa State. But the most anticipated part of the planned events may be the wearing of Nike retro uniforms, inspired by the 1950 Baylor squad in order to honor the first team to play in Floyd Casey Stadium, for the season finale Dec. 7 vs. Texas.

BAYLOR AMONG BIG 12'S BEST OVER LAST THREE YEARS

Baylor (18-12) is among four league schools with a combined winning record in Big 12 games over the past three-plus seasons, joining Kansas State (20-11), Oklahoma (24-7) and Oklahoma State (23-8).

COACHING STAFF REMAINS UNCHANGED

Baylor has one of just 18 football staffs across the country that remained completely intact from 2012. All of BU's current assistant coaches have been with the program for at least two years.

BRILES' PIPELINE OF STELLAR QBs

Baylor head coach **Art Briles** has established himself as a serious recruiter and mentor of elite quarterbacks. His list of proteges over the last 12 years includes Nick Florence (Baylor), Robert Griffin III (Baylor/Redskins), Case Keenum (Houston/Texans), Kevin Kolb (Houston/Bills) and Kliff Kingsbury (Texas Tech/Jets).

BAYLOR'S O-LINE NFL PIPELINE

Baylor has a history of sending offensive linemen to the NFL over the past several years under O-line coach Randy Clements. The Bears have had five linemen drafted in the last five years (included two first-rounders).

BAYLOR QBS EXCEL ACADEMICALLY

Each of the last three seasons Baylor has been led by quarterbacks with degrees in hand, Robert Griffin III in 2011, Nick Florence in 2012 and **Bryce Petty** in 2013, all played having previously earned their undergraduate degrees from Baylor. Petty continues another impressive distinction, as BU boasts three straight QBs who have all achieved first-team Academic All-Big 12 honors. Petty, a 2012 first-teamer in the classroom, joined predecessors Florence (2009 and 2012 first-teamer) and Griffin (2010 and 2011 first-teamer). Florence (first team) and Griffin (second team) also earned Academic All-America honors.

BAYLOR ADDS WESTERN TRANSFERS RETURNING TO HOME STATE

Baylor's roster includes a trio of transfers from Pac-12 schools, all three native Texans who returned to their home state after one season out of state. Senior starting tight end **Jordan Najvar**, from Spring, Texas, spent the 2009 season as a redshirt at Stanford before transferring to Baylor prior to the 2010 season. Junior running back **Lache Seastrunk**, a prep All-American from nearby Temple, Texas, spent the 2010 season as a redshirt at Oregon before transferring to BU prior to the 2011 season. A third transfer, cornerback and returner **Demetri Goodson** (also a native Texan from Spring, Texas), transferred from a Western university, Gonzaga, after playing three seasons of basketball for the nationally ranked Bulldogs.

BAYLOR FOOTBALL ON THE RADIO

Baylor football is aired live via the Baylor-IMG College Radio Network on ESPN Central Texas and flagship station 1660 AM/99.1 FM ESPN Radio (KRZI) in Waco and worldwide on Sirius XM Radio. All games are broadcast by the "Voice of the Bears" John Morris and former BU standouts J.J. Joe (analyst) and Ricky Thompson (sideline reporter). Morris is in his 27th year in the Baylor broadcast booth, while Thompson and Joe are in their 14th and 10th years, respectively. Games can be heard free of charge live on the Internet at BaylorBears.com. Houston-area listeners can listen on Newstalk 1070 AM, KNTH. In Dallas, Newstalk 660 AM, KSKY, will broadcast the games, while San Antonio-area fans can tune in for games on "The Word in South Texas" 630 AM, KSLR. In addition to those stations, games will also air in Abilene (KMWX, 92.5FM), Amarillo (KZRK, 107.9FM), Austin (KLGO, 1490AM), Big Spring (KBYG, 1400AM), Fort Worth (KCLE, 1460AM), Lubbock (KFYO-AM & KKAN-AM, 790 /1340), Lufkin (KYBI, 100.1FM), Stephenville (KWBY-FM & K300BD-FM, 98.5/107.9), Temple (KTON-AM & K265DV, 1330/100.9FM) and Tyler (KPXI, 100.7FM).

A TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE ON THE FIELD

A year after watching all 19 of its teams reach postseason play for the first time in school history (2011-12), Baylor's 2012-13 season produced a strong encore, as it advanced 17 teams to postseason play and won five Big 12 Conference championships. BU's five conference titles were one shy of a school record and brought the Bears' all-time Big 12 total to 50 championships, which ranks fourth among current Big 12 teams just one behind third-place Oklahoma State. Throw in 26 All-America awards, 13 season-ending Big 12

SCORING BECOMING HISTORIC

• Baylor has scored in 81 straight games, the second-longest streak in school history behind an 89-game string that spanned from Dec. 31, 1979 thru Oct. 24, 1987. In their current 81-game streak, the Bears have scored 29 or more points 53 times, compared to 31 such performances in the school-record streak.

• Through seven games, Baylor has racked up 447 points. In 2011, BU set the school record for points with 589. The Big 12 scoring record for a season is 716 by Oklahoma in 2008.

individual awards and 139 All-Big 12 citations for good measure, and the 2012-13 year went down as another strong one in the Baylor record book.

For the first time in school history, seven sitting Baylor head coaches hold their respective program's records for career wins, including **Jim Barnes** (volleyball), **Marci Jobson** (women's soccer), **Matt Knoll** (men's tennis), **Glenn Moore** (softball), **Kim Mulkey** (women's basketball), **Joey Scrivano** (women's tennis) and **Steve Smith** (baseball). All-told, these seven have combined for 2,456 victories in 87 years of service to Baylor. Men's basketball coach Scott Drew needs just 22 wins to break Bill Henderson's BU record, which has stood for more than 50 years. Of course, no one is likely to match the longevity record of Baylor's **Clyde Hart**, who completed his 50th year on the Baylor staff in 2012-13, the first 42 as the program's head coach and the last eight as its director of track & field at his alma mater.

In the Big 12's 17-year history, Baylor has won a combined 50 regular-season and tournament conference championships in eight sports; 21 more than it won in 81 years of Southwest Conference membership.

Over the last 10 academic years (2003-04 thru 2012-13), Baylor has won a combined 41 Big 12 regular-season and tournament championships in seven sports which ranks No. 2 to Texas in that stretch. In that same span, Baylor has won three NCAA team championships (2004 men's tennis and 2005 and 2012 women's basketball) and 13 NCAA individual titles, while registering nine of its 12 highest finishes in the Learfield Directors' Cup all-sports standings.

All 19 of Baylor's sports teams have made at least one postseason appearance over the last nine years with football reaching three straight bowl games for the first time in program history (2010-11-12), men's basketball reaching the 2009-10 and 2011-12 Elite 8 and winning the 2013 NIT; women's basketball advancing to three Final Fours (2004-05 and 2011-12 national champions and 2009-10), baseball making the 2005 College World Series, softball advancing to the 2007 and 2011 (fourth-place) Women's College World Series, men's tennis advancing to the NCAA's Round of 16 each of the last 12 years (including the 2004 NCAA team championship, which started a run of four straight Final Fours) and women's tennis' five Elite 8's which include a pair of Final Four appearances in 2008 and 2011.

Prominent Baylor athletes include Olympic gold medalists **Michael Johnson** and **Jeremy Wariner**; **Mike Singletary**, NFL Hall of Famer; **Ted Lyons**, MLB Hall of Famer; 2007 NBA Finals participants **David Wesley** and **Melvin Hunt**; 2007 NFL Super Bowl XLI participants **Fred Miller** and **Justin Snow**; Current MLB players include **David Murphy** and **Kelly Shoppach**.

Baylor has produced some top NFL prospects in recent years. **Robert Griffin III** (Washington Redskins) and **Kendall Wright** (Tennessee Titans) were selected in the first round of the 2012 NFL Draft, while **Jason Smith** (St. Louis Rams, 2009), **Phil Taylor** (Cleveland Browns, 2011) and **Danny Watkins** (Philadelphia Eagles, 2011) were also first-round selections under Art Briles.

A TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE OFF THE FIELD

The combined GPA of all 500+ Baylor student-athletes at the end 2012-13 academic year was a school-record 3.23. It marked the eighth straight year BU student-athletes registered a new classroom standard for GPA, and the seventh-straight year that the year-end mark was above a 3.00.

For the sixth time in Big 12 Conference history, Baylor produced the league's top overall student-athlete graduation rate, as its 2012 federal rate of 71 percent tied the University of Texas for the top spot. It marked the first time since 2004 that BU student-athletes had the Big 12's top federal graduation mark and the ninth time it has finished either first or second in grad rates among league schools.

Baylor's 2012 student-athlete grade rate was a 7 percent increase over its 2011 average. Baylor, which also registered the Big 12's top federal graduation mark in 1996, 1998, 2000, 2001 and 2004, has graduated at least 60 percent of its student-athletes 13 times in the Big 12's 17-year history. The 2012 federal graduation data also revealed that Baylor graduated a league-high 87 percent of its female student-athletes, and that its baseball (54 percent), men's basketball (75 percent) and women's volleyball (90 percent) programs tallied the top marks among Big 12 schools in their respective sports.

Baylor student-athletes continued their winning ways in the classroom, too, as a school-record 159 individuals were selected to 2012-13 Academic All-Big 12 teams, including a record 125 first-team honorees. It marked the fifth consecutive year BU produced 100 or more overall Academic All-Big 12 honorees. Every BU program produced at least two, 2012-13 Academic All-Big 12 performers with 16 having multiple first-team honorees, led by women's track & field's 20 first-teamers and equestrian's 19.

For the second consecutive year, a school-record tying 630 Baylor student-athletes earned Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll status—314 for the 2012 fall semester and 316 for the 2013 spring term. One-hundred-twenty-five (125) of those were named with a perfect 4.0 grade-point averages for at least one of the two terms—59 in the fall and 66 during the spring term. Student-athletes must achieve a minimum 3.00 semester grade-point average to earn Commissioner's Honor Roll status.

In each of the last 10 semesters, the cumulative GPA of all Baylor teams has been above a 3.0, with the last five terms (spring 2011, fall 2011, spring 2012, fall 2012 and spring 2013) standing as the highest semester GPAs in school history for any semester. BU student-athletes had a 3.12 cumulative GPA for the fall 2012 semester, followed by a 3.15 mark in spring 2013—the second-highest semester GPA in school history.

For the 19th straight year and the 27th time in the last 28 years, Baylor produced at least one Capital One Academic All-American as selected by CoSIDA, as a school-record six student-athletes earned 2012-13 honors—**Nick Florence**, football, first team; **Dana Larsen**, women's soccer, first team; **Kolt Browder**, baseball, second team; **Blake Niccum** men's track & field, second team; **Lisa Sliwinski**, women's soccer, third team and **Taylor Jackson**, men's track & field, third team. Larsen was also tabbed as the Academic All-American of the Year for women's soccer, becoming just the second Baylor student-athlete ever to earn this distinction for their respective sport.

Athletics Chaplin **Wes Yeary** led a mission trip, which included 45 Baylor student-athletes and staff, to Kenya in May 2013. It marked the fifth straight Yeary-led African mission trip.

More than 500 Baylor student-athletes, coaches and staff packed 108,000 meals to feed thousands of starving children in the developing world, Aug. 27, at the Ferrell Center. Through a partnership between Baylor Athletics and Twin Cities-based Feed My Starving Children (FMSC), volunteers prepared the life-saving meals during a FMSC MobilePack TM event. Feed My Starving Children is a unique ministry that provides meals to 70 countries around the world in a large-scale relief project started in 1987 by a Minnesota businessman who felt called by God to help feed the starving children of the world during a humanitarian visit to Honduras.

Lache Seastrunk ran for 111 yards and two touchdowns, Bryce Petty threw for 290 yards and two scores in his first start and Baylor scored its most points since 1929 in a 69-3 victory over Wofford.

The Bears celebrated the opening of their final season at Floyd Casey Stadium by taking a 28-0 lead in the first quarter. Petty, a junior, needed just 10 plays and 2:05 combined on game-opening drives of 70 and 65 yards for a 14-0 lead.

Wofford, one of the best running teams in FCS, struggled in its first game without all-time rushing leader Eric Breitenstein. Playing their first game in Texas, the Terriers needed 60 carries to get 173 rushing yards, 2.9 yards per run.

The game-time temperature was 102, but the heat didn't bother the Bears, who surpassed what the school calls the modern era scoring record -- a 68-13 victory against Northwestern State in 2009, the second season under coach Art Briles.

It was the most points for Baylor since an 88-0 victory against Stephen F. Austin in 1929.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 692 yards of offense ranks third in program single-game history.
- Baylor topped 600 yards of total offense for the 21st time in program history (16 times in Briles era).
- Baylor scored 28 points in both the 1st and 3rd quarters -- the Bears had scored 28+ points in a quarter just seven times in program history entering the game.
- The attendance of 44,989 was the 2nd-largest opening day crowd in Floyd Casey Stadium history, trailing only 46,000 vs. Oklahoma in 1973.
- Baylor's 69 points were the 4th-most in program history, most in Floyd Casey Stadium history and most in the Briles era.
- Baylor's 66-point margin of victory was the 5th-highest in program history.

Bryce Petty threw for 338 yards and two touchdowns, Lache Seastrunk ran for 150 yards with three scores and Baylor's first-team offense had 576 total yards in only 11 minutes with the ball as the 23rd-ranked Bears beat Buffalo 70-13.

The starters for the Bears (2-0) had eight touchdowns in their nine drives. The only non-scoring driving was when they had the ball at the end of the first half.

Baylor finished with a school-record 781 total yards and topped the 69 points scored a week earlier in what had been the most for the Bears since 1929.

Petty completed 13 of 16 passes, and two of his incompletions were balls caught but ruled out of bounds. He also ran for a score.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 70 points broke the school record (set last week at 69) in the modern era (4th-most all-time, most since 1929).
- Baylor's 781 yards of total offense were the most in program history.
- Baylor's 452 passing yards were the 3rd-most in program history.
- Baylor had 300+ rushing yards (329) and 300+ passing yards (452) in the same game for the 3rd time in program history.
- Baylor became the nation's first team to score 28+ in the 1st quarter of consecutive games since Oklahoma in 2008, according to Stats, Inc.

Bryce Petty threw for 351 yards with four touchdowns and ran two yards for another score as No. 20 Baylor kept piling up the points, beating Louisiana-Monroe 70-7.

The fast-paced Bears (3-0) had seven offensive touchdowns in the 10 drives Petty played. Those TD drives took a total of six minutes.

Baylor is the first FBS team since LSU in 1930 to open a season with at least 60 points in three consecutive games, according to STATS. Those Tigers had at least 70 points in each of those games - Baylor scored 69 in its opener before 70 points in each of its last two games.

ULM (2-2), coming off a victory at Wake Forest of the ACC last week, suffered its worst loss since a 73-7 loss at Auburn in 2003.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor became the first FBS or FCS team to score 28+ points in the 1st quarter of three straight games during the BCS era (1996-present) -- the only previous team to score 28+ points in the 1st quarter three different times at any point during a season during the BCS era was Oklahoma in 2008 (info via Stats LLC).
- Baylor has scored 41+ points in a school-record nine consecutive games (previous high was eight straight spanning 2011 and 2012).
- Baylor became the first FBS team to score 70+ points in back-to-back games since Ohio State in 1996.
- With 781 yards of offense in the game, the Bears have had at least 400 yards of total offense in 30 straight games dating back to Dec. 29, 2011 -- the 30-game streak is the nation's longest active streak (Texas A&M is next closest at 15 straight entering the day).

Bryce Petty and No. 17 Baylor quickly had an answer to everyone wondering how their big-play offense and high-scoring ways would translate against a Big 12 opponent.

While it was the rematch of the highest-scoring Big 12 game ever, West Virginia couldn't keep up with the Bears this time. And this wasn't another overmatched non-conference opponent.

Petty threw for 347 yards with two touchdowns and had one of Baylor's school record-tying eight rushing TDs in a 73-42 victory over West Virginia.

While playing only one drive into the second half, Petty completed 17 of 25 passes. He left when the Bears already had 674 yards while scoring touchdowns on nine of 10 offensive drives for a 63-21 lead.

Lache Seastrunk had his eighth consecutive 100-yard rushing game, coinciding with Baylor's winning streak, and he did it without running after halftime. He ran 15 times for 172 yards and two touchdowns, including an 80-yard score as the Bears had 28 points in the first quarter for the fourth game in a row.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 73 points is a Big 12 record for most points in a Big 12 head-to-head matchup.
- Baylor set a school record for points in a conference game (SWC or Big 12) and broke the school record for points in any game in the modern era (post-WWII).

- Baylor's 617 yards in the 1st half were the most by a team in the 1st half of a game in last 10 years.

Bryce Petty just needed to get Baylor home to put the Bears back on their point-a-minute pace.

Petty threw for 343 yards and two touchdowns, Antwan Goodley had 182 yards receiving and two scores, and No. 12 Baylor tied a school record with its 10th straight win, beating Iowa State 71-7 on Saturday night.

The Bears, who came in averaging 70.5 points in four home games but were slowed in a come-from-behind win at Kansas State last week, led 37-0 at halftime and narrowly missed their first shutout win in the Big 12.

The Bears (6-0, 3-0 Big 12) had their nation-leading 33rd straight game of at least 400 yards by halftime and finished with 714 - their fourth game this season with at least 700 yards.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The attendance was the 13th-largest in Floyd Casey Stadium history and the largest against an opponent other than Texas, Arkansas or Texas A&M.
- Baylor's 64-point margin of victory was Baylor's largest ever in a conference game (SWC or Big 12).
- Baylor is bowl eligible for a 4th straight season for the first time in program history.
- Baylor's 714 yards of total offense rank fifth all-time in single-game history -- Baylor has four such games this season and had two total prior to 2013.
- Baylor threw a TD pass in the red zone for the first time all season -- the Bears' first 19 red zone TDs of the season were all rushing.
- Baylor's 174 total yards given up are the fewest since it has given up since allowing 172 to Arkansas State on Sept. 8, 2001.
- QB Bryce Petty completed 23-of-31 passes for 342 yards and 2 TDs, and he rushed for his 5th TD of the year. He's thrown for 300+ yards and 2+ TDs in all six career starts.

Seastrunk ran for 109 yards and a score and sixth-ranked Baylor routed Kansas 59-14 for its school-record 11th straight win.

The Bears (7-0, 4-0 Big 12) piled up 500 yards of offense in taking a 38-0 lead by halftime, and then relaxed as coach Art Briles pulled many of his starters in the third quarter.

The nation's highest-scoring offense still finished with 743 yards, and eight of its nine scoring drives took fewer than 2 minutes. Four different Baylor players had touchdown runs - Petty among them - while **Tevin Reese** hauled in two of his three TD tosses.

Jake Heaps was held to just 85 yards passing and a touchdown for Kansas (2-5, 0-4), which has now lost 25 consecutive Big 12 games.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 743 yards of total offense were the most ever by Baylor in a road game and the 5th-most in BU single-game history.
- Baylor's 59 points were its 6th-most ever in a conference game (Big 12 or SWC) and its 2nd-most ever in a conference road game (63 in loss at West Virginia in 2012).
- Baylor's 45 point margin-of-victory tied its 5th-highest ever in a conference game and was its 2nd-highest ever in a conference road game (46 at SMU in 1989).
- Petty's 430 passing yards tied **Robert Griffin III** (2011 at Texas A&M) for 3rd-most in a game in Baylor history.
