ABOUT THE GAME

- ▶ No. 25 TCU begins its third season of Big 12 play when it hosts No. 3 Oklahoma on Saturday at 2:30 p.m.
- ▶ The Horned Frogs have opened with a 3-0 record for the seventh time in the last 12 seasons.
- ▶ TCU is looking to go 4-0 for the fifth time in the last seven years and sixth time overall in the 14-season tenure of head coach Gary Patterson.
- ▶ Saturday will mark TCU's first Big 12 home game as a ranked team versus a ranked conference opponent.
- ▶ After having a pair of open dates in September, TCU will be playing back-to-back weeks for the first time this season. The Horned Frogs are now in the midst of playing eight consecutive weeks.
- ▶ The Horned Frogs are the only Big 12 team yet to play a conference game.
- ▶ TCU is 4-2 in its last six games versus top-five opponents with only one of those contests at home. The stretch began with a 17-10 win at No. 5 Oklahoma in the 2005 season opener.
- ▶ As TCU's head coach, Patterson is 14-14 against ranked opponents. He is 6-8 versus top-10 teams.
- ▶ Since TCU began Big 12 play two seasons ago, Oklahoma has won both meetings by a combined 10 points (24-17, 2012; 20-17, 2013).
- ▶ Patterson is 1-3 as a head coach versus OU.
- ▶ TCU is 63-14 under Patterson at Amon G. Carter Stadium.
- ▶ TCU is playing its third season in Amon G. Carter Stadium after its \$164 million rebuild.

SERIES NOTES

- ▶ Oklahoma holds a 9-4 series lead over TCU.
- ▶ The first game in the series was a 34-19 Sooners' win in Oklahoma City in 1944.
- ▶ The Horned Frogs are 1-5 versus the Sooners in Fort Worth, 3-3 in Norman and 0-1 in Oklahoma City.
- ▶ TCU's lone home win over Oklahoma came in the teams' first meeting in Fort Worth, a 13-7 victory in 1945.
- ▶ TCU's 17-10 win at No. 5 Oklahoma in 2005 was its first victory over an opponent ranked that high since a 6-0 decision at No. 1 Texas in 1961.

FAMILIAR FACES

- ▶ TCU's only two players from Oklahoma are both in the starting lineup.
- ▶ Left guard Jamelle Naff (Dell City) has started all three games this season and five in his career.
- ▶ Defensive tackle Davion Pierson (Oklahoma City; Millwood High School) is in his third year as a starter. His 21 career starts rank sixth among current Horned Frogs.

IT COMES HOME

- ▶ TCU great LaDainian Tomlinson, in conjunction with his selection this year to the College Football Hall of Fame, will be honored with an On Campus Salute at the end of the first quarter on Saturday.
- ▶ Tomlinson will be the 11th Horned Frog enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

TRUE STUDENT-ATHLETES

- ▶ Safety Sam Carter and defensive tackle Chucky Hunter represent TCU on the Preseason All-Big 12 Team. They also set the pace in the classroom.
- ▶ Carter is playing this season as a graduate student, having earned his TCU degree in May. He majored in sociology with a minor in business.
- ▶ Hunter, a criminal justice major, is scheduled to graduate in December in just 3 1/2 years.

TCU NOTABLES

- ▶ TCU leads the nation in fewest first downs allowed (40) while placing second in scoring defense (7.0 ppg), total defense (218.7 ypg) and pass efficiency defense (79.6).
- ▶ TCU's new offense, under co-coordinators Doug Meacham and Sonny Cumbie, is averaging 532.0 yards per game and is on pace to set school records for first downs, passing yards and total offense.
- ▶ TCU is one of just two schools (Alabama) nationally to rank in the top-five defensively (second) and top-15 offensively (15th).
- ▶ TCU has started fast in all three games, building first-half leads of at least 24-0 in each contest.
- ▶ Trevone Boykin is one of just nine players nationally to lead his team in passing yards (858) and rushing (183).

NORMAN, Okla. - A late-arriving offense put TCU in a hole against No. 11 Oklahoma and the Horned Frogs weren't quite able to pull themselves out in a 20-17 loss.

Trailing by 13 at halftime, TCU twice pulled within three points but Oklahoma used a late 76-yard touchdown run by Brennan Clay to hold off the Horned Frogs.

After limiting Oklahoma to eight plays and four yards of offense in the third quarter, TCU pulled within 13-10 on a 2-yard touchdown run by Trevone Boykin. The Horned Frogs had two chances after that to take the lead but punted both times.

Oklahoma took over at its own 18 after the second punt. Clay carried for a 6-yard gain, then broke into the open and outran everyone for his career-long 76-yard touchdown run with 4:37 left. TCU quickly answered, as a 45-yard pass from Boykin to David Porter and a 21-yard screen pass from Boykin to B.J. Catalan led to an 8-yard touchdown scramble by Boykin with 2:26 left. Oklahoma quarterback Blake Bell then ran out the clock, running for a pair of first downs.

STRONG STARTS

► In the opening three games this season, Trevone Boykin has had his second-best career passing game (320 yards versus Samford), his second-best career rushing game (92 yards against Minnesota) and a career-high for total touchdowns (6 versus SMU).

► Boykin also had a career-best 29 completions in the Samford game.

DID YOU KNOW?

► Trevone Boykin is the only quarterback in TCU history to throw four touchdown passes in back-to-back games (versus Baylor and Texas Tech in 2012).

► His third career game of four touchdown passes came at SMU.

GOING FAST

► TCU's new up-tempo offense debuted with 96 plays from scrimmage against Samford, marking its most in a game since a school record 111 versus San Diego State in 2007.

► In two of the opening three games this season, TCU has had first-down totals that are in the top eight in school history. The 33 against Samford in the season opener tied for fourth and were its most since a school-record 39 at San Diego State in 2007.

► The Horned Frogs' 614 yards of offense at SMU was the eighth-best total in school history and the most since recording 617 on Nov. 5, 2011 at Wyoming.

► TCU's 555 yards of offense versus Samford marked its best output since the Andy Dalton-led Horned Frogs posted 558 in a 47-7 win over No. 5 Utah on Nov. 6, 2010, in Salt Lake City.

NEW FACE, FAMILIAR NAME

► Quarterback Matt Joeckel, who has his degree from Texas A&M, arrived at TCU in June for his final season of college football.

FROG OFFENSIVE NOTES

▶ Joeckel is not the first member of his family to be a student-athlete at TCU. His older sister, Sarah, was an all-conference volleyball player for the Horned Frogs and a three-year letterwinner from 2008-11.

▶ Joeckel has thrown for a touchdown in two of three games, including a 2-yard scoring toss to Kolby Listenbee against Samford on his first pass at TCU.

▶ Joeckel has seen action in all three games and is 9-of-15 in the air for 104 yards with two touchdowns.

IT'S A RUSH

▶ The Horned Frogs are 67-4 when rushing for at least 200 yards under Gary Patterson as head coach.

▶ TCU ran for a season-high 265 yards at SMU, its highest single-game total since a 390-yard effort at Wyoming on Nov. 5, 2011.

CATALON REACHES CENTURY MARK

▶ B.J. Catalon had his first career 100-yard rushing game with 114 yards on 19 carries, including a 9-yard touchdown, at SMU. It was the first 100-yard game by a Horned Frog since Trevone Boykin ran for 101 yards at Texas Tech last season.

GOING FOR A HAT TRICK

▶ B.J. Catalon has led TCU in rushing in each of the last two seasons. A second-team 2013 Academic All-Big 12 honoree, Catalon is second on TCU to Trevone Boykin (183) with 172 yards this season.

▶ Catalon is looking to become the first player to top the Horned Frogs in rushing in three consecutive seasons since Joseph Turner from 2007-09.

BREAKOUT GAME

▶ Deante' Gray had career highs against SMU with his team-best totals of six receptions, 96 yards and two touchdowns. The receiving scores, 28 yards in the second quarter and 7 yards in the third quarter, were the first of his career.

▶ Gray's 96 receiving yards are the most by a Horned Frog in a game this season.

▶ When All-America cornerback Jason Verrett was

sidelined for a late-season game at Iowa State last year, Gray moved to cornerback and did not allow a reception while making his first start on defense.

CHANGING UNIFORMS

▶ Josh Doctson is the only player in TCU history to score a touchdown for and against the Horned Frogs. He is also the lone active player in college football to reach the end zone for and against his current school.

▶ Playing for Wyoming in 2011, Doctson had three receptions for 43 yards versus TCU, including a 7-yard scoring grab for the Cowboys' first points of the game in a 31-20 loss to the Horned Frogs.

▶ Doctson's mother, Tracy Syler-Jones, is TCU's vice chancellor for marketing and communications.

THE CATCH

▶ Josh Doctson had the Play of the Day on ESPN's SportsCenter with a one-handed 7-yard touchdown catch against Minnesota.

▶ White's 30 career starts are the most among active Horned Frogs, one more than Sam Carter (29).

► Oberkrom's streak of 12 consecutive games with a field goal, which had been third-longest in the nation, came to an end in the Texas game last season.

THE BREAKOUT PERFORMANCE

► Jaden Oberkrom set TCU and Big 12 records, while tying the NCAA freshman mark, with six field goals in a 2012 game against Texas Tech. The NCAA single-game record is seven.

► Oberkrom was 6-of-6 on field goals versus the Red Raiders with made kicks from 32, 41, 32, 45, 42 and 38 yards. His 42-yard field goal with 18 seconds left in regulation forced overtime.

► Oberkrom scored 23 points (six field goals, five PATs) to set TCU and Big 12 single-game records for points by kicking. He was one shy of the NCAA mark.

► Carter, a preseason All-American and two-time All-Big 12 selection, earned his TCU degree in sociology with a minor in business.

▶ TCU has sold out 15 of its last 22 dates at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

▶ TCU has sold out of football season tickets twice in the last three campaigns. Last year's new record number of season tickets sold was 31,425.

▶ TCU has set a school record for season ticket sales in four of the last five years.

▶ Four of the top-six home crowds in TCU history have been in the last three seasons. The 48,212 for last year's Texas game was second.

▶ Nearly 35,000 TCU fans traveled to the 2011 Rose Bowl. Over 20,000 made the trip the previous year to the Fiesta Bowl.

▶ The Horned Frogs have finished in the top 25 in six of the last nine seasons.

▶ TCU is one of just 21 schools to have won multiple national championships (1935, 1938) and produce a Heisman Trophy winner (Davey O'Brien, 1938).

▶ The other schools are Alabama, Army, Auburn, Florida, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Miami (Fla.), Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Penn State, Pittsburgh, SMU, Texas, Texas A&M and USC.

BOWL MAINSTAYS

▶ TCU is one of just 17 programs nationally to play in a bowl game in 14 of the last 16 seasons.

▶ In 2012, the Horned Frogs played in a bowl game for a school record eighth consecutive season.

▶ TCU has gone to a bowl game in 11 of Gary Patterson's 13 seasons as a head coach.

Gary Patterson is TCU's all-time winningest football coach, while his 123-44 record (.737) ranks seventh among active coaches nationally.

Patterson is one of just six current coaches with at least 100 victories at their current school. He became TCU's career wins leader with a 56-0 victory over Grambling State in the 2012 season opener, enabling him to break the previous mark of 109 wins by Dutch Meyer (1934-52).

In August 2011, Patterson was named the nation's top coach by Sports Illustrated and ESPN The Magazine. Sporting News tabbed him in January 2012 as the nation's third-best coach. He was fourth in an SI.com July 2013 ranking of the nation's best coaches.

In leading TCU to back-to-back BCS appearances in the 2009 and 2010 seasons, including a 2011 Rose Bowl championship, Patterson received 10 National Coach of the Year honors.

Patterson has produced at least 10 wins in eight of the last 12 years, including seven seasons of 11 or more victories. He has helped lead the Horned Frogs to seven conference titles and 14 bowl games in 16 years.

In 13 seasons as TCU's head coach, Patterson has had 33 players drafted with 72 in NFL camps.
