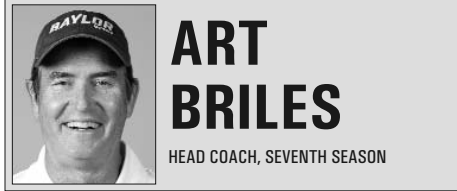

STORY LINES

- Baylor plays its final true road game of the year at Oklahoma on Saturday. The contest will be broadcast on FS1 at 11 a.m. CT.
- Baylor is 22-3 in its last 25 games, tied for 2nd-best over that stretch (FSU, 24-1 & Michigan St. 22-3).
- Baylor leads the country in total offense (590.3 ypg) and scoring offense (50.3 ppg), while its defense is 17th nationally in total defense (325.3 ypg) and 31st in scoring (21.9 ppg).
- Baylor has won 9 of its last 12 games played outside of Waco.
- Baylor is 7-5 in true road games over the last 2-plus years, after going 6-14 in true road games in the first 4 years of the Briles era.
- Baylor is 25-7 when ranked under head coach **Art Briles**, but just 8-19 vs. ranked foes.
- BU is 8-6 vs. ranked foes since 2011, after starting the Briles-era 0-13 in such games.
- Baylor and Oklahoma will meet for the 24th time on Saturday. OU leads the all-time series 21-2 and holds a 11-0 advantage in games played in Norman. BU has won 2 of the last 3 meetings in the series.
- Baylor faces its second ranked opponent of 2014 in OU, after beating No. 9 TCU 61-58 on Oct. 11.
- Baylor has been ranked in 27 straight weekly AP Polls (ranked in Top 10 in 17 of last 20).
- Baylor is 9-4 over its last 13 games away from Waco when ranked.
- Baylor is a 16-3 in games after Oct. 31 since 2011, including an 11-2 mark in November games.
- Baylor has outscored foes 403-175 through 8 games and is 2nd in the FBS in victory margin (28.5).
- Baylor's offense is No. 1 in the country in first downs per game (29.4), 4th in passing yards per completion (15.95), 5th in passing offense (349.0 ypg) and tied for 6th in tackles for loss allowed (3.63).
- Baylor's defense is 5th nationally in TFLs per game (8.0) and 12th in sacks (3.38).
- Baylor's leads the Big 12 in rushing offense (229.1 ypg, 20th FBS) and rushing defense (99.1 ypg, 8th).
- Baylor has scored at least one TD in 29 of 32 quarters played this season.
- Individually, senior QB **Bryce Petty** is 7th in FBS with 19.7 points responsible for per game and with 15.41 passing yards per completion, 13th with 290.6 yards passing per game.
- Sophomore CB **Xavien Howard** 3rd in the nation with 1.8 passes defended per game, while junior DE **Shawn Oakman** is 3rd nationally in fumbles recovered (3) and 9th with 1.6 tackles for loss per game.

TEAM QUICK HITS

- Baylor is 32-2 over the last 4-plus seasons when leading at halftime with 25 straight wins.
- Baylor has outscored opponents 243-72 in the first half this season 30.4-9.0 average).
- Baylor's 3 losses in its last 24 games were all away with home with two coming against top-15 teams.
- Art Briles earned his 51st win at BU vs. KU. He is now the 3rd-winningest coach in BU history.
- Baylor is the most successful FBS-team in Texas since 2011 with a win percentage of .771 (37-11).
- Baylor has been ranked in the Top 15 in 22 straight weekly polls.
- The Bears have now been ranked in 5 straight seasons for the 1st time since being ranked in 5 straight from 1953-57.
- Baylor is the only school in the country to have wins over top 10 teams in each of the past four seasons.
- Baylor is bowl-eligible for the 5th consecutive year for the 1st time in school history.
- Baylor is playing its 7th season of football under Briles and its 113th season in program history.
- Baylor returned 48 lettermen and 10 starters (5 o; 4 d; 1 st) from a 2013 squad that won a school-record 11 games, claimed its first Big 12 title and earned its first trip to a BCS-bowl game.
- After winning the Big 12 in 2013, BU looks to repeat as conference champion for 1st time in school history.

OFFENSE

- Baylor is outscoring its opponents 137-35 in 1st quarters and 106-37 in 2nd quarters this year.
- Baylor has scored in 95 straight games -- the previous record was 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 through Oct. 23, 1987.
- Baylor is 15-1 since the start of 2012 when attempting 50 or more rushes.
- Baylor has scored 40+ points in 31 of its last 40 games and has scored 30+ points in 35 of its last 40 contests.
- Baylor has topped 400 yards of offense 45 times in the 48 games since 2011.
- Baylor has gained 500+ yards in 15 of 21 games since 2013, including 12 games with 600+ yards in that span.
- Baylor has reached 600 yards of offense in 5 games this year. BU has 32 such games in its history (27 in Briles era).
- Baylor has scored at least 20 points in the 1st halves of 7 of 8 games this season.
- Baylor has scored at least 14 points in 17 of 32 quarters played this season.
- Baylor has topped the 50-pt mark 20 times since 2011, the most in FBS.
- 37% of BU's rushing total has come in the 4th quarter of Big 12 games (5.88/rush average vs. 4.28 in first 3 quarters)
- Baylor ranks 10th in team passing efficiency (157.25) and 14th in 4th-down conversion percentage (.731).
- Baylor is tied for tied for 7th nationally by averaging 3.25 rushing TDs per game.
- Baylor is the only school in the country with three players on the Biletnikoff watch list (Cannon, Goodley, Norwood).
- Baylor set an NCAA scoring record in 2013 with 681 points in 13 games. BU's 52.4 points/game were tied for fourth-most all-time.
- Baylor had 4 of its top 5 returning receivers miss time during the season's first four games due to injury.

DEFENSE

- Baylor has forced 11 fumbles over the last 3 games (recovered 6).
- Baylor has as many fumbles recovered (10) as it did all of last season.
- Baylor is 7th in the NCAA in yards allowed per play (4.41). BU led the Big 12 allowing only 4.75 yards per play in 2013.
- Baylor is tied for 7th nationally by forcing 5.88 3-and-outs per game.
- Baylor is 5th in FBS by limiting foes to a .200 conversion percentage (3-of-15) on 4th down.
- BU is 13th nationally in first downs allowed (139).
- Baylor tied for 19th nationally in 3rd-down conversion percentage (.333).
- Baylor has recorded three or more sacks in 6 of 8 games this season.
- Baylor has allowed 14 or fewer points in 11 of its last 21 games and 4 of 8 games of 2014.
- **Phil Bennett's** defense has forced multiple turnovers in 19 of its last 28 games (23-5 record in that span), including 3 takeaways vs. KU.
- Baylor's defense is 27-4 under Bennett when recording 2+ takeaways.
- Baylor's D has 3 or more turnovers in 10 games since 2013 & has won 22 of its last 23 with 3+ takeaways.
- Baylor is 18-1 when forcing 3+ turnovers during the Briles era.
- Baylor tied a school record with nine sacks vs. SMU as 9 different players recorded at least half a sack.
- Baylor's total defense (67 yards) vs. SMU is the 3rd-best performances of 2014 in FBS.
- Baylor's opening-day shutout of SMU was its first over an FBS opponent since Sept. 23, 1995 (14-0 vs. NCST).
- 11 members of Baylor's defense have recorded at least half a sack in 2014, while 6 have 2.0 or more sacks.

INDIVIDUAL QUICK HITS

OFFENSE

- QB **Bryce Petty** has thrown a TD in 20 straight games in which he has played. He is picking up 15.41 yards per completion, the nation's 7th-best mark. He has been responsible for 2 or more TDS in 20 straight, a current FBS-best.
- RB **Shock Linwood** leads the Big 12 with 97.1 yards rushing per game. Linwood has 10 rushing TDs on the year. That figure ranks 16th-best in the country.
- **KD Cannon** ranks 22nd nationally with 89.3 yards receiving per game.
- In Big 12 games only, WR **Corey Coleman** is averaging 114.4 receiving yards per game, 2nd-best in the league.
- Coleman has a 5-game streak with at least 1 receiving TD (7 total in 5 games since returning from injury).
- Baylor has had 5 players tally 11 100-yard receiving performances (**Cannon 3, Corey Coleman 3, Jay Lee, Lynx Hawthorne, Goodley 3**) in 2014.

DEFENSE

- DE **Shawn Oakman** is 2nd in the Big 12 and 9th in the NCAA with 1.56 tackles for loss per game. He leads BU with 12.5 TFLs (needs 7.5 to tie BU single season record) and 6.0 sacks on the year (4.5 away from BU record).
- MLB **Bryce Hager**, an All-America candidate, leads the team with 63 tackles. He has had 34 over his last 3 games, after only having 29 in the previous 5 games. He led the Big 12 in tackles in 2012 (124, 9.5/game)
- DE **K.J. Smith** filled up the stat sheet vs. KU with 5 tackles (all solo), 2 sacks, 3 tackles-for-loss, 2 forced fumbles and 1 QB hurry.
- DE **Beau Blackshear** already has 4.5 sacks in 2014. That is more than he had in his previous 2 years combined.
- 3 starters (**Blackshear, Andrew Billings & Orion Stewart**) are Waco natives.

BAYLOR IS AMERICA'S TOP OFFENSE

Baylor leads the country total offense (590.3 ypg) and scoring offense (50.4 ppg) through the season's first eight games. BU returned a nation's-best 6,319 yards from its 2013 totals when it led the country in both categories. Currently BU's offense is on of only two (Oregon) in the country to be in the top-five of total offense each of the last four years [see listing below]. Over the past few years, the Bears have shattered numerous NCAA, Big 12 and school records.

BAYLOR'S DISRUPTIVE DEFENSE

Baylor's defensive impact has steadily improved under fourth-year defensive coordinator **Phil Bennett**. The Bears' takeaways have remained constant from year-to-year, but the chart below shows the increase in sacks and tackles-for-loss during Baylor's 2013 Big 12 championship run and then into the start of the 2014 season. Baylor also intercepted or broke up 82 passes in 13 games last year, the most of any major conference team and fifth in all of FBS.

BAYLOR'S RETURN TO PROMINENCE UNDER BRILES

It's no secret that **Art Briles** has completely rebuilt Baylor's football program back to national prominence, but most impressive is how speedy and pronounced the transformation has been (Briles is third on the BU career wins list). The chart below shows the marked change in Baylor's football fortunes in six-plus years under Briles compared to the previous 12 seasons in the Big 12 era.

- Baylor is 44-43-4 all-time in Homecoming games, including wins in its last 5 Homecoming games.
- Troy Baker, Andrew Billings and Spencer Roth served as captains vs. Kansas.

TEAM NOTES

- Baylor is averaging 59.0 points per game over 4 games played at McLane Stadium (45, 70, 61, 60). The Bears have out-scored opponents 236-78 in those games.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior QB Bryce Petty threw for 277 yards in the game and now has 6,374 career passing yards, passing Nick Florence (6,301) for 2nd on the Bears' all-time list.
- Petty threw 3 TDs, giving him 20 on the season, which ranks 6th on Baylor's single-season list.
- Petty had his 20th straight game with multiple touchdowns responsible for, which is the nation's longest active streak.
- WR Corey Coleman had a career-long 72-yard TD catch in the 1st quarter, which tied the 41st-longest pass in program history.
- Coleman's 167 receiving yards were a career high and the 20th-most in a game in BU history (most by any player with fewer than 5 receptions; Coleman had 3 catches).
- DE Shawn Oakman had his 3rd fumble recovery of the season (4th of career), giving him the most in a season by a Baylor player since Ahmad Dixon had 3 in 2011.
- Oakman had 2 tackles-for-loss, giving him 12.5 on the season, equaling his total from last year. With 25.0 career TFLs, he needs 3 more to reach Baylor's all-time top 10.
- RB Shock Linwood had a 39-yard run in the 1st quarter, which was Baylor's longest rush of the season, besting Seth Russell's 31-yard TD run at Buffalo.
- Linwood's 18 career rushing TDs are tied for 10th-most in Baylor history, and his 10 rushing TDs this season are tied for 8th on Baylor's single-season list.
- RB Devin Chafin had a career-high 112 rushing yards, recording his 2nd career 100-yard rushing game.
- PK Chris Callahan tied a school record with 4 field goals made in a game, marking the 7th time a Baylor player has reached that number and the 2nd time Callahan has tied the record in the last 3 games.
- Callahan became the 6th FBS player to make 4 field goals in a quarter and the first since Oregon State's Jose Cortez on Oct. 31, 1998.
- Callahan had 18 points scored kicking in the game, moving him into 5th on Baylor's single-season list with 61 points scored kicking.
- Callahan's field goals made were from 27, 33, 33 and 37 yards, giving him 10 consecutive made field goals after starting his career 1-of-6.

OKLAHOMA SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's contest will be the 24th meeting between Baylor and Oklahoma. OU holds a 21-2 advantage in the series and a 11-0 mark over BU in games played in Norman. Last year, a fifth-ranked BU team claimed a 41-12 victory over No. 12 Oklahoma in Waco. The Sooners picked up a 42-34 victory in the last game in Norman. Baylor got its first win of the series with a dramatic 45-38 win. 2011 Heisman winner **Robert Griffin III** threw for a then-school record 479 yards and found **Terrance Williams** from 34 yards out, with eight seconds left. Baylor and Oklahoma first met Oct. 26, 1901; the Sooners left Waco that day with a 17-6 victory. The teams did not play again until 1973, a 42-14 Oklahoma victory in Waco. The Bears and Sooners met again the following season in Norman with OU winning 28-11. Baylor and Oklahoma met twice more before the inception of the Big 12 in 1996, playing at Norman during the 1984 and 1989 seasons.

IMPROVED GANGGREEN DEFENSE

It's hard to overstate the role Baylor's defense had in the success to open the season and in the 2013 Big 12 championship run. **Phil Bennett's** D ranks among the national and Big 12 leaders in several categories (see list below).

PUNISHING GROUND GAME EXCELS LATE

Through five Big 12 Conference games, Baylor's punishing rushing attack (leads Big 12, 20th nationally at 241.3 ypg) has excelled throughout games and overwhelmed opponents in fourth quarters. Thirty-seven percent of Baylor's rushing yardage (453 of 1,215 yards) in conference games has been accumulated in the final quarter, and the Bears' per-rush average is 1.6 yards more in the fourth quarter [see chart below].

INJURIES PROVING COSTLY FOR BEARS

When Baylor takes the field against Oklahoma, the Bears will be without three starters, who have all been lost to season-ending injuries. Senior OL **Troy Baker**, junior OL **Desmine Hilliard** and junior DE **Jamal Palmer** have all been sidelined for the rest of year. Baker suffered his injury in the West Virginia game, Hilliard came out late in the TCU contest and Palmer went down at Iowa State. Five other starters have missed one or more 2014 games due to injury: QB **Bryce Petty**, WR **Antwan Goodley**, WR **Corey Coleman**, LB **Aiavion Edwards**, WR/PR **Levi Norwood**.

OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSE

Baylor's defense under coordinator **Phil Bennett** has demonstrated a knack for making big plays at key moments to contribute to the Bears winning ways over the past three seasons. In three-plus years under Bennett, Baylor's D has recorded at least one takeaway in 42 of 47 games - a total of 99 takeaways (59 interceptions, 40 fumbles recovered). Overall under Bennett, Baylor is 27-4 when recording two or more takeaways.

BU AT ITS BEST POST-HALLOWEEN

Baylor has compiled a 16-3 mark in games after October 31 since 2011 (11-2 in Nov., 5-0 in Dec., 0-1 in Jan.). Included in those games is a 6-3 record vs. AP Top 25 teams (wins over No. 5 OU in 2011, No. 2 K-State, No. 23 Oklahoma State and No. 17 UCLA in 2012 and No. 12 Oklahoma and No. 23 Texas in 2013).

STARTING FAST

Bryce Petty threw for three touchdowns and ran for two more, **Shock Linwood** ran for 182 yards and fifth-ranked Baylor stayed undefeated by passing its first big test with a 41-12 victory over No. 12 Oklahoma.

Baylor (8-0, 5-0 Big 12) scored twice in the final minute before halftime and stretched its school-record winning streak to 12 games since a loss at Oklahoma last November. The Bears are 8-0 for the first time.

Following two wins at home to open the season, Baylor went on the road to win its next three games by an average of 28 points (63-21 at Buffalo, 49-28 at Iowa State and 28-7 at Texas). The Bears are the only Power 5 conference team to have three straight road games this season. It was BU's first three-game road trip since 2005 and the first time that the Bears have won back-to-back-to-back road games since 1960.

PETTY GARNERS NATIONAL ATTENTION

Following his 510 yards and six TDs in the comb-from-behind win against No. 9 TCU, QB **Bryce Petty** was recognized as the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week, the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and the Athlon Sports National Player of the Week.

WEAPONS RETURN FOR CONFERENCE PLAY

WR **Corey Coleman** made his season-debut count as he rolled up 154 yards on 12 catches with a TD grab in the win over Iowa State. The sophomore wide receiver did not play in the season's first three games due to a hamstring injury. Senior WR **Clay Fuller** (broken clavicle) played for the first time in 2014 vs. the Cyclones as well, recording two catches for 21 yards. Finally, senior All-American receiver **Antwan Goodley** (quad) got back into a game for the first time since the season opener to tally six catches for 114 yards.

SUBS SHINE IN INCREASED ROLL

With injuries plaguing many of Baylor's offensive stars, the first five games of the season gave young talent an opportunity to play key roles. QB **Seth Russell**, a redshirt sophomore, filled in for Bryce Petty with 438 passing yards and five touchdown passes vs. Northwestern State, while earning Big 12 Player of the Week honors. Meanwhile, freshman **KD Cannon** has helped ease the loss of injured receivers **Corey Coleman**, **Clay Fuller**, **Antwan Goodley** and **Levi Norwood**, as he has caught 6 TD passes and is averaging 89.2 yards receiving per game.

BU PICKED SECOND IN LEAGUE BY MEDIA

Baylor garnered its highest-ever preseason placing by being picked second in the 2014 Big 12 Football Preseason Poll. BU tallied 508 points and nine first-place votes to finish as the projected runner-up to Oklahoma. The ranking is the Bears' best since the league switched to the 10-team format in 2011. BU was picked sixth in 2011, seventh in 2012 and fifth last year.

BAYLOR'S CRAZY-FAST, POWERFUL OFFENSE

Baylor's 2013 offense led the nation in TD drives of one minute or less (29, next closest was Ohio State's 21), TD drives of two minutes or less (60, next Oregon's 49) and most plays of 40 yards or more (37, next Indiana's 27). The Bears 19.8 seconds per-play ranked behind BYU and Texas Tech's 19.5, but in first halves (with BU starters playing) BU led the FBS at 16.7 seconds per-play. [all stats via ESPN Stats & Info]

UNSUNG RUSHING ATTACK AMONG NATION'S BEST

Baylor's underrated rushing attack is frequently overshadowed by the Bears' passing game. The Bears currently lead the Big 12 in rushing (241.2), after having led the league in rushing the last two seasons and finishing second in 2011 - and have ranked among the top 15 nationally in each of the last three seasons (13th at 259.7 ypg in 2013, 14th at 231.7 in 2012 and 10th at 235.6 in 2011). The Bears' punishing rushing game has produced 1,000-yard rushers in four straight seasons: **Jay Finley** in 2010 (1,218), **Terrance Ganaway** in 2011 (school-record 1,547), **Lache Seastrunk** in 2012 (1,012) and 2013 (1,060).

YOUTH MOVEMENT

As Baylor reloaded from its 2013 Big 12 Championship season, it did so predominantly with a roster heavy with sophomores and juniors (see breakdown below). Of the 45 players listed on Baylor's preseason 2-deep, only seven were seniors and 24 were underclassmen (including punter and kicker would increase those numbers to eight and 25, respectively). BAYLOR BREAKS SCORING STREAK RECORD

Baylor has now scored in 95 straight games, which is a new school record. The Bears had scored 89 consecutive games from Dec. 31, 1979 thru Oct. 23, 1987. In the current streak, the Bears have scored 29 or more points 64 times, compared to just 31 times in previous run.

SELLOUTS NOW THE NORM IN WACO

Baylor has sold out seven of its last eight home games and the rest of the games at McLane Stadium in 2014 are marked as sellouts. Last season in the final year at Floyd Casey Stadium, Baylor fans turned out in record numbers with the most attended game of all-time (51,728 vs. Texas on Dec. 7, 2013) and the highest attendance average (45,958 per game) ever.

GREAT TIME TO BE A BAYLOR BEAR

Over the last four years, the Baylor football program has reached never-before-seen heights.

- Baylor tallied 7+ wins in 2013 for the 4th straight season for the first time in program history.
- Baylor played in a bowl game (Fiesta Bowl) for the 4th year in a row in 2013, a first in program history.
- Baylor's 36 wins over the last 4 seasons (7 in 2010, 10 in 2011, 8 in 2012 & 11 in 2013) are the most in program history over a 4-year span.

BAYLOR BECOMES REGULAR IN RANKINGS

After a 7-1 start to the season, Baylor sits at No. 10 in both polls. The Bears have now been in 27 straight AP Top 25 polls, a school record. BU is one of just six schools in the country to be currently ranked for 27 or more consecutive weeks. Baylor opened the 2014 season ranked 10th in both AP & Coaches (Amway) preseason polls. It was the first time the Bears have been ranked in preseason by the coaches since 1991 when they were 25th and the first in the AP poll since 1986 (12th). The No. 10 preseason ranking in the AP Top 25 is the highest since 1957 when the Bears were seventh.

WIN OVER No. 1 K-STATE CATALYST FOR SURGE

Since defeating BCS No. 1 Kansas State at home on Nov. 17, 2012, Baylor's record of 22-3 is tied for second-best in FBS behind Florida State (24-1) and with Michigan State (22-3). The Bears lead the nation in scoring offense, total offense, plays per game, first downs and yards per passing attempt during that 25-game stretch. [*ESPN Stats & Info*]

TRANSFERS PLAYING BIG PART IN SUCCESS

This season two transfers have made a big impact for BU in the trenches - starting DE **Shawn Oakman** (Penn State) is as imposing as any player in the country at 6-9, 280 pounds, and starting OG **Blake Muir** (Hawaii). Both those players have been in the program for at least a year, while CB **Chris Sanders** (Georgia), OL **Ishmael Wilson** (Texas A&M), OL **Rami Hammad** (Texas) and CB **Miles Johnson** (Oregon) are newcomers, who will be counted on in the future. The Bears have had good success with transfers in the past as five have gone on to careers in the NFL in the Briles era, including **J.D. Walton** (Arizona State), **Phil Taylor** (Penn State), **Jordan Najvar** (Stanford), **Lache Seastrunk** (Oregon) and **Demetri Goodson** (Gonzaga MBB).

OFFENSIVE MACHINE IS WELL-OILED

Despite having three different quarterbacks in the last three years, Baylor has earned the title as America's top offense. BU has been in the top-two in the nation in total yards each of the last three years, while rewriting the Baylor record books. The offense has been on a steady climb since Briles' arrival in 2008. Below is a comparison of Baylor's offense the year before Briles came to Waco (2007) and last season's NCAA-leading offensive attack.

KEEPING LOCAL TALENT LOCAL

Five starters from BU's preseason two-deep are from Waco-area schools, three from Midway [Hewitt] HS (DT **Beau Blackshear**, WR/PR **Levi Norwood** and S **Orion Stewart**), one from Waco HS (NT **Andrew Billings**) and one from Connally HS (OT **Troy Baker**).

COACHING STAFF REMAINS UNCHANGED

For a third straight year, Baylor's coaching staff has remained completely unchanged. All of BU's current assistant coaches have been with the program for at least three years. Only one change, the departure of current BGSU HC **Dino Babers**/addition of RB Coach **Jeff Lebby**, has occurred over last 4 seasons.

BRILES' PIPELINE OF STELLAR QBs

Baylor head coach **Art Briles** has established himself as a serious recruiter and mentor of elite quarterbacks. His list of proteges over the last dozen years includes **Nick Florence** (Baylor), **Robert Griffin III** (Baylor/Redskins), **Case Keenum** (Houston/Texans), Kevin Kolb (Houston/Bills) and Kliff Kingsbury (Texas Tech/Jets).

PRESEASON AWARDS AND WATCH LISTS

A total of 13 Baylor players earned 2014 preseason mention on various national award watch lists as well as All-America and All-Big 12 projections. Headlined by **Bryce Petty** (six lists), **Bryce Hager** (five lists), **Antwan Goodley** and **Shawn Oakman** (four lists each), eight different Bears were listed on 16 different award watch lists, including multiple players on seven lists (Senior Bowl, Bednarik Award, Biletnikoff Award, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, Maxwell Award, Nagurski Trophy, Rotary Lombardi Award). Preseason All-America mention was given to OL **Spencer Drango**, WR **Goodley**, LB **Hager**, QB **Petty** and P **Spencer Roth**. *[complete list of preseason honors on pages 6 & 7]*

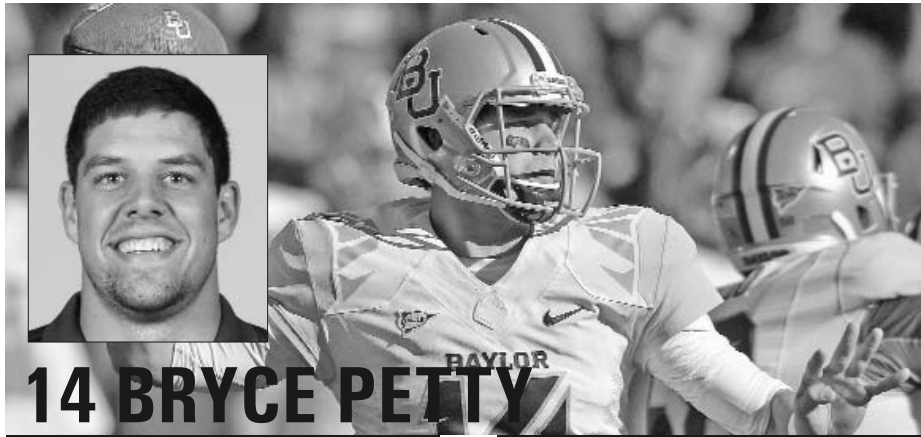

Bryce Petty and No. 10 Baylor had a nice housewarming party at their new riverfront campus stadium, even though the quarterback was clearly not feeling his best. Petty threw for 161 yards and accounted for three touchdowns while playing the first half of the Bears' 45-0 victory over SMU.

Petty, the reigning Big 12 offensive player of the year, was held out in the second half because of a bruise to his lower back.

Big 12 champion Baylor (1-0) led 24-0 after the first quarter, including TD drives of six yards after an SMU fumble and four yards after Levi Norwood's 45-yard punt return.

SMU's three quarterbacks were sacked a combined nine times. The Mustangs (0-1) were held to 67 total yards.

Robert Griffin III was on hand for the Bears' first game on campus since 1935. The Washington Redskins quarterback and Baylor's only Heisman Trophy winner took part in the statue dedication more than three hours before kickoff and was also on the field before the game, giving the invocation and taking part in the opening coin toss with former President George W. Bush.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 9 sacks tied a school record from a Sept. 17, 1983 game at UTEP.
- Baylor's last shutout was on Sept. 17, 2011, vs. Stephen F. Austin (48-0) and it's the 165th shutout in Baylor history.
- The contest was Baylor's first shutout of an FBS-opponent since Sept. 23, 1995 (14-0 vs. NCST).
- Baylor gave up only 67 yards vs. SMU, its fewest since 1988 win over UNLV (50 yards).
- Petty broke RG3's 2011 program record for most consecutive games with a passing TD with 14.
- RB Shock Linwood scored the first touchdown in McLane Stadium history with a 4-yard rushing TD in the 1st quarter.
- Baylor held SMU to [-24] yards rushing, its fewest allowed since the school-record effort -36 vs. TTU in 1980.

Baylor backup quarterback Seth Russell threw for 438 yards and five touchdowns while playing only the first half, freshman KD Cannon caught three of those scores and No. 10 Baylor overwhelmed FCS team Northwestern State 70-6.

Cannon went streaking past the secondary for TD catches of 50, 81 and 42 yards in the first quarter for the Bears (2-0) He finished with six catches for 223 yards, the second-most in school history.

Senior quarterback Bryce Petty, the reigning Big 12 offensive player of the year, didn't play a week after cracking two small bones in his back on the first series of the season opener.

The Bears were also without several top receivers, but still won their 12th straight home game, scoring at least 69 points for the sixth time in that streak.

Northwestern State (0-2) has lost 17 games in a row against FBS teams.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's defense held opposing teams scoreless for the first 77:06 of game time at McLane Stadium before NSU's field goal with 12:54 left in the 2nd quarter - the Bears haven't allowed a TD in the first two games played at McLane Stadium.
- Baylor's 28 points in the 1st quarter tied the 4th most in any quarter in program history.
- True freshman WR KD Cannon tied a school record with 3 TD catches in a game (all of which were in the 1st quarter), and his 223 receiving yards were 2nd-most in a game in Baylor history (and set the Baylor record for most in a half, with all recorded in the 1st half).
- Sophomore QB Seth Russell made his first career start and threw for 438 yards and 5 TDs in the 1st half, both Baylor records for a half. He sat out the 2nd half.
- Russell's 438 passing yards were 3rd-most in a game in BU history, and his 6 TDs accounted for tied the Baylor record, which had been accomplished 3 times before.

Bryce Petty threw four touchdown passes, leading No. 8 Baylor to a 63-21 victory against Buffalo. Petty went 23 of 34 for 416 yards through three quarters, and Shock Linwood had 98 yards rushing and two touchdowns for Baylor (3-0). Lynx Hawthorne and Jay Lee each caught two touchdowns passes.

It was Petty's first game since he cracked two small bones in his back during a season-opening 45-0 win against SMU.

The Bears scored on their first four possessions on their way to a 35-0 halftime lead. Baylor had more touchdowns (five) than Buffalo had first downs (four) in the first half.

The Bears finished with 669 yards of offense and 27 first downs. Their quick-strike attack was on track with six of nine scoring drives lasting less than two minutes.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 63 points tied the most in a road game in program history -- lost 70-63 at West Virginia in 2012 -- and tied 13th-most in any game in BU history.
- Baylor's 480 passing yards were the 3rd-most in a game in program history.
- Baylor had 3 different 100-yard receivers in the same game for the 2nd time in program history (2012 at West Virginia).
- Senior QB Bryce Petty threw for 416 yards, the 9th-most in a game in Baylor history and the 2nd-most in his career (430 at Kansas in 2013).
- True freshman WR KD Cannon caught an 89-yard TD pass from Petty in the 1st quarter, tying the 3rd-longest pass in program history.

Bryce Petty threw for 336 yards and a touchdown and ran for a pair of TDs as seventh-ranked Baylor cruised past Iowa State 49-28 in its Big 12 opener.

Shock Linwood had three TDs rushing for the Bears (4-0, 1-0 Big 12), who have started 4-0 in back-to-back seasons for the first time in 76 years.

Baylor's first game against a Power 5 school was a bit more difficult than its first three against weaker competition. But the Bears jumped ahead 35-7 late in the second quarter and led by at least 21 points for the entire second half.

The return of receivers Corey Coleman (hamstring) and Antwan Goodley (quadriceps) made Baylor's offense more explosive than ever. The pair combined for 18 catches, 268 yards and a touchdown.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor earned its first win in Ames since 2005, snapping a 2-game losing streak on Iowa State's home field.
- Baylor's offense scored at least one TD in its first 15 quarters played this season before going scoreless in the 4th quarter at Iowa State.
- Baylor and ISU met for the 13th time on Saturday, and the Bears now lead the all-time series 7-6, including a 3-4 mark in Ames.
- Baylor is 3-2 in its last 5 Big 12 openers after being 3-11 in those games over the league's first 14 years.
- WR Corey Coleman had a career-high 12 receptions and a career-high 154 receiving yards.
- Coleman's 12 receptions tied for 3rd-most in a game in BU history.
- RB Shock Linwood had his first career 3-TD game.

Shock Linwood ran for 148 yards and the clinching touchdown and No. 7 Baylor overcame a rare off day by quarterback Bryce Petty and the nation's No. 1 offense to beat Texas 28-7.

With Petty misfiring, the Bears (5-0, 2-0 Big 12) won with tough defense, two big plays on special teams and a power running game that wore down Texas (2-3, 1-1) in the second half.

Terrell Burt scored Baylor's first touchdown with a 62-yard return after a blocked field goal in the first quarter. A fake punt in the third set up Petty's touchdown pass to Antwan Goodley. Linwood put it away with a short touchdown run in the fourth.

Texas held Baylor to 390 total yards, but only narrowly avoided its first shutout at home since 1976. Longhorns quarterback Tyrone Swoopes had three turnovers, including a fumble at the Baylor 1 just before halftime.

Baylor was derailed for soft early season schedule, but the defending Big 12 champions are (20-2) since knocking off then-No. 2 Kansas State in 2012 and sit with Oklahoma as the league heavyweights again. The Bears have also completely flipped a rivalry the Longhorns have mostly dominated the last 100 years, winning four of the last five.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor has started 5-0 through in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1916 and 1917.
- Baylor held Texas to its lowest point total in the series since the Bears won 50-7 in Austin on Nov. 24, 1989.
- Senior QB Bryce Petty had a pair of TD passes, giving him 42 for his career and moving him past Nick Florence for 2nd on Baylor's all-time passing TDs list.
- WR Antwan Goodley had a 30-yard TD catch in the 3rd quarter for the 16th of his career (1st of season), giving him sole possession of 7th on BU's career receiving TDs list.
- With the 30-yard TD catch, Goodley became the 13th receiver in program history to reach the 100-career receptions mark.

Chris Callahan kicked a 28-yard field goal as time expired and No. 5 Baylor wiped out a 21-point deficit in the final 11 minutes to beat No. 9 TCU 61-58 in a crazy Big 12 scorefest.

Bryce Petty threw six touchdown passes for the Bears (6-0, 3-0), including a 25-yarder to Corey Coleman with 4:42 left in the fourth that tied it at 58. Petty passed for 510 yards and threw two interceptions.

TCU moved to midfield and faced fourth-and-3 from the Baylor 45 with 1:17 left in the fourth. Instead of punting, the Horned Frogs elected to try to keep the ball and end it in regulation.

Trevone Boykin tossed a sideline fade toward Josh Doctson that the receiver couldn't come up with. TCU (4-1, 1-1) was looking for a pass interference call on Ryan Reid but didn't get it and Baylor took over with 1:11 left.

With the help of a pass interference call on TCU and some good running by Shock Linwood, the Bears marched to the TCU 11.

Callahan came on with 4 seconds left and booted through the winner, setting off a celebration that brought the bright-yellow clad Baylor student section pouring onto the field to celebrate with their team.

- Baylor's 21-point comeback tied the largest deficit the Bears have ever overcome in a game (1980 vs. SMU, 2011 at Kansas).

Despite tying the game 27-27 entering the fourth quarter, No. 4 Baylor was unable to score again and was upset by West Virginia, 41-27.

Baylor (6-1, 3-1) couldn't overcome a double-digit deficit as it did in a 61-58 win against TCU a week earlier. Now the Bears will fall into a group of one-loss teams clawing for position the rest of the season for the College Football Playoff.

West Virginia sacked Baylor's **Bryce Petty** four times and limited the Bears to one touchdown after halftime. Petty finished 16 of 36 for 223 yards and two scores.

This was hardly the point-a-minute, yard-busting matchup of the past two years, when the winning team each time reached 70 points.

Baylor entered the game as the nation's most prolific offense but was held to 318 yards, 305 below its average and the lowest total of the season.

Shock Linwood scored Baylor's only touchdown of the second half on a 1-yard run with time winding down in the third quarter that tied the score at 27. Linwood, the Big 12's rushing leader, was limited to 69 yards on 21 carries.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 215 penalty yards were the most in school history, breaking the previous record of 157 yards set at Rice in 1976.
- Baylor's 215 penalty yards were also the most ever by a Big 12 Conference team, breaking the previous record of 183 by Texas Tech vs. Rice in 2007.
- Baylor lost for the first time in the Briles era when forcing 3+ turnovers -- the Bears are now 17-1 in those games.
- Baylor's 21-game winning streak when forcing 3+ turnovers was snapped. The Bears forced 3 or more turnovers for the 9th time in their last 20 games.

Bryce Petty had three touchdown passes, including two to **Corey Coleman**, and No. 12 Baylor scored on 11 straight possessions despite looking sluggish at times in a 60-14 victory over Kansas.

Baylor (7-1, 4-1 Big 12) had to settle for field goals after two of three first-half fumbles by the Jayhawks deep in their territory, but still rolled up 669 yards in their 14th straight home victory in the 91st homecoming game.

Coleman had a career-high 167 yards receiving and TDs of 72 and 49 yards, the latter putting the Bears up 46-7 early in the third quarter.

Kansas (2-6, 0-5) had 0 yards rushing at halftime in its 31st straight loss away from home and 28th in a row in a true road game since winning at UTEP in 2009.

Devin Chafin had a career-high 112 yards rushing and two touchdowns, and Big 12 rushing leader **Shock Linwood** finished with 81 yards and a leaping score from the 1.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor and Kansas met for the 14th time on Saturday -- the Bears now lead the all-time series 10-4, including a 7-0 mark in games played in Waco.
- Senior QB Bryce Petty threw for 277 yards in the game and now has 6,374 career passing yards, passing Nick Florence (6,301) for 2nd on the Bears' all-time list.
- WR Corey Coleman's 167 receiving yards were a career high and the 20th-most in a game in BU history (most by any player with fewer than 5 receptions; Coleman had 3 catches).
- PK Chris Callahan tied a school record with 4 field goals made in a game, marking the 7th time a Baylor player has reached that number and the 2nd time Callahan has tied the record in the last 3 games.
- Callahan became the 6th FBS player to make 4 field goals in a quarter and the first since Oregon State's Jose Cortez on Oct. 31, 1998.
