THE STORYLINES . . .

- Tulsa football is under new direction as Philip Montgomery was named the 29th head coach in school history on December 11, 2014.
- This is the 116th season that Tulsa has fielded a football team and has accumulated a record of 604-472-27.
- Tulsa has the smallest undergraduate enrollment of FBS schools with 3,473 students . . . Oklahoma lists its enrollment as 30,753.
- Tulsa has 49 players on its full roster from the state of Oklahoma, and four from the city of Norman.
- Tulsa has thrown for 372.5 yards in its first two games to rank 10th nationally for passing yards, while Oklahoma ranks sixth for fewest passing yards allowed with 106.5 allowed per game.
- Tulsa averages 609.0 yards in total offense, while Oklahoma has allowed its opponents to gain only 240.0 yards per game, which ranks 10th in the nation for total defense.
- Both teams have already played an overtime game this year . . . Tulsa went to overtime and defeated FAU 47-44 on the first weekend of the season, and Oklahoma went to two overtimes in a second week 31-24 win at Tennessee.
- Both Tulsa and Oklahoma came back from a double-digit deficits in its overtime wins . . . Tulsa trailed by 10 to start the 4th quarter and Oklahoma trailed by 14 points entering the 4th period.
- Tulsa's receiving tandem of Keyarris Garrett and Keevan Lucas rank fifth and sixth in the nation, respectively, for receiving yards . . . Garrett with 265 yards and Lucas with 258 yards . . . they also rank sixth and seventh nationally for receiving yards per game . . . Garrett averages 132.5 and Lucas averages 129.0 yards per catch.

TULSA HEAD COACH PHILIP MONTGOMERY IN FIRST SEASON . . .

- Philip Montgomery became the 29th head coach in school history on December 11, 2014.
- Montgomery claimed his first career head coaching victory in the 2015 Tulsa season opener with a 47-44 overtime win over FAU . . . he has a 2-0 record as head coach.
- Before coming to Tulsa, he spent seven years at Baylor, where he spent the last three seasons as the offensive coordinator/QB coach.
- Under his guidance, Baylor led the nation in total offense and scoring offense in each of the last two seasons.
- Quarterbacks he tutored include 2011 Heisman Trophy winner Robert Griffin III as well as Bryce Petty and Nick Florence at Baylor and Kevin Kolb and Case Keenum at Houston.
- Before moving to Baylor, he spent five years at Houston, also under Art Briles.
- Has coached nine Bowl games in 12 years as a collegiate coach.
- Before moving to the college ranks, he spent one year as the offensive coordinator at Denton (Texas) HS, and before that spent six years at Stephenville HS, where he was a part of back-to-back Class 4A state championships in 1998 and 1999.

THE SERIES . . .

- This is the 28th meeting between Tulsa and Oklahoma.
- Oklahoma leads the series 19-7-1, including a 12-3-1 record in Norman.
- Thirteen of Tulsa's losses to the Sooners have come when Oklahoma has been ranked among the nation's top-20.
- Oklahoma has won the last eight games in the series.
- The last Tulsa victory in the series came in the 1996 season as the Hurricane captured a 31-24 win at Oklahoma's Memorial Stadium.

BROTHERLY LOVE . . .

- Tulsa fifth-year senior defensive end Derrick Alexander's younger brother, Dominique, is a junior linebacker for Oklahoma.
- Their father, Derrick Alexander Sr., played football at Oklahoma State.
- In last year's game, Derrick totaled three tackles, including 1.5 TFLs for -4 aydrds, while Dominique had seven total tackles for the Sooners.
- The first time the two played against each other came in 2013 when Dominique was a true freshman at OU and Derrick a red-shirt sophomore at Tulsa.

GETTING THAT ROAD WIN . . .

- With the win over New Mexico, Tulsa snapped a six-game road losing streak.
- Tulsa was 0-6 last year on the road, as the last road victory came in the final road game of the 2013 season when Tulsa defeated Louisiana Tech, 24-14, on Nov. 23 in Ruston, La.
- The victory also put Tulsa at 2-0 on the season for the first time since the 2009 season when Tulsa won its first two games, both on the road at Tulane (37-13) and New Mexico (44-10).

LONG PLAYS . . .

- Of Tulsa's 16 offensive plays covering more than 20 yards, 15 of them have come through the air . . . four of these 15 passing plays over 20 yards have gone for touchdowns.
- Only D'Angelo Brewer's 22-yard run against New Mexico is the only non-passing play that has gone for over 20 yards this year for Tulsa.
- Keyarris Garrett has been on the receiving end of six of those 20+ passing plays with a long of 50 yards against FAU . . . Keevan Lucas has five 20+ plays with a long of 43 yards against FAU . . . Josh Atkinson's 69-yard TD reception against New Mexico is one of his two 20+ yard plays.

LOOK AT ALL THESE NUMBERS . . .

- Tulsa has gained 600+ yards in each of its first two games with 618 yards against FAU and 600 yards at New Mexico . . . the last time Tulsa had back-to-back 600+ games of total offense came in the 2008 season with 602 vs. SMU (Oct. 11) and 791 vs. UTEP (Oct. 18).
- Tulsa has scored over 40 points in both games this year, marking Tulsa's first back-to-back 40-point scoring game since 2012 when Tulsa had 49 points at UAB and 45 at Marshall.
- Tulsa had two 100-yard rushers vs. New Mexico with Zack Langer gaining 139 yards and D'Angelo Brewer had his first career 100+ rushing game with 133 yards.
- The Hurricane not only had two 100-yard rushers, but also two 100-yard receivers as Josh Atkinson had his first career 100+ game with 119 yards on three receptions and Keyarris Garrett had 102 yards.
- QB Dane Evans has thrown for 745 yards and four TDs in the two games this year to rank fourth nationally for passing yards per game.
- Evans has completed 37 passes and averages a nation-leading 20.1 yards per completion.

THE WAIT IS OVER . . .

- It took the Tulsa defense eight quarters this year to get its first takeaway, but when it did, the second one came on the very next possession.
- With a 30-21 lead heading into the fourth quarter, the Tulsa defense became opportunistic in the final period.
- Senior end Derrick Alexander recovered a fumble on UNM's first drive of the fourth quarter, giving the offense the ball on the New Mexico side of the field.
- On New Mexico's next possession, sophomore cornerback Kerwin Thomas intercepted a pass and returned it 14 yards.
- The two takeaways amounted to 10 points for the Hurricane.
- On New Mexico's next drive, Tulsa's Trent Martin forced a fumble and a loss of two yards on a 4th-and-1 play, thus giving the Hurricane offense the ball.

GOING HOME . . .

- Four players on the Tulsa roster are from Norman, the home of the University of Oklahoma.
- Tulsa sophomore placekicker Redford Jones, who leads the nation in field goals per game, returns to his hometown . . . he has attempted an average of 3 field goals per game.
- Jones played his prep football at Norman North High School, where his team finished as the Class 6A runner-up in 2012.
- After missing his first field goal attempt this year, Jones has now connected on six straight field goals, including 4-of-4 last week at New Mexico.
- Also on the Tulsa roster from Norman is sophomore offensive lineman Zac Uhles, red-shirt freshman tight end Payton Prince and senior walk-on quarterback Brad Valentino . . . Uhles played at Norman High School, while Prince and Valentino played at Norman North HS.

ATKINSON AND BREWER HAVE CAREER DAYS . . .

- After the first game win over FAU, all the offensive focus was on receivers Keyarris Garrett and Keevan Lucas, as well as running back Zack Langer.
- But in the second game, there were two different players to talk about . . . junior receiver Josh Atkinson and sophomore running back D'Angelo Brewer.
- Atkinson scored Tulsa's first TD against New Mexico on a 69-yard catch and run and ended with a career-best 119 yards on three receptions . . . the 69-yard TD was his first catch of the season.
- Brewer had his first career 100+ rushing game with 133 yards and one TD.
- In two games, Brewer has 225 yards for a 6.2 average per carry.



LOOKING BACK AT THE OPENER . . .

- With the win over FAU, Tulsa improved to 67-48-1 overall in season openers and 61-24 in home openers at Skelly Field @ H.A. Chapman Stadium.
- It was the third straight season that Tulsa's home opener ended in dramatic fashion . . . in 2013 Carl Salazar knocked through 34-yard field goal with no time remaining to give Tulsa a 30-27 win over Colorado State . . . last year, Tulsa and Tulane went into two overtimes when a Demarco Nelson interception on Tulane's second possession preserved Tulsa's 38-31 lead.
- After trailing 7-0 in the first quarter, Tulsa scored the next 21 points for a 21-7 lead at the 12:49 mark of the second quarter . . . FAU rattled off the next 24 points to take a 31-21 lead at the 11:14 mark of the third period . . . Tulsa could get only as close to three points twice, before knotting the score at 41-41 with 0:03 left in regulation . . . Tulsa held FAU to a field goal in OT, before Zack Langer ran in from 3 yards out for a 47-44 win.
- Keevan Lucas and Keyarris Garrett combined for 356 receiving yards and 2 TDs.
- It was the second straight season opener that Dane Evans had thrown for over 400 yards, the only two 400+ yard passing games of his career.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT OPENERS . . .

- Dane Evans has started two season openers for the Golden Hurricane, including 2014 and this year, and has put up huge numbers.
- In overtime wins against Tulane in 2014 and FAU this season, Evans has thrown for 862 yards and six TDs.
- The junior has averaged 431 yards and three TDs in Tulsa's last two season openers.
- One of his favorite targets in the last two openers has been fellow junior Keevan Lucas . . . he has totaled 426 yards and five TDs for an average of 213 yards and 2.5 touchdowns in the last two season opening games.

THE WAIT PAYS OFF FOR LANGER . . .

- Senior Zack Langer came into this year's season opener having never carried the ball once in an opening game for the Hurricane.
- Langer played in both the 2012 and 2013 season openers but did not carry the ball, and in 2014 was injured for the first game.
- This year, it wasn't until Tulsa's last possession of the first half that Langer touched the ball for the first time in a season opener . . . he went for one yard on his first touch and a game-high 18 yards on his second carry.
- Langer ended the game as one of the heroes, finishing the game with 89 rushing yards and three TDs, as well as one reception for 34 yards.
- Langer's third TD, covering three yards, was the game-winner in overtime over FAU.

MORE YARDS FOR LANGER . . .

- Langer was a workhorse, yet again, in Tulsa's second game of the season, as he carried the ball 33 times for 139 yards and one TD in a win over New Mexico.
- In the second half, Langer rushed 24 times for 116 yards and his 5-yard touchdown run with 4:07 left in the game sealed the victory for the Hurricane.
- Langer has now rushed for 1,268 yards and 10 TDs in 38 career games.

MUDOH GETTING CLOSE TO TOP-10 . . .

- Senior safety Michael Mudoh had a career-high 20 tackles in the opener vs. FAU, which made him the nation's leading tackler after the first week of the football season.
- It's the third straight season opener that he has had double-figure tackles . . . his previous career-best was 17 stops coming in the 2013 opener vs. Bowling Green, and last year had 10 tackles against Tulane.
- The 20-tackle performance was his 15th double-figure tackle game of his career.
- Mudoh had four stops against New Mexico and now has 295 career tackles and is just 33 tackles shy of 10th place on the school's all-time tackles chart.

RECEIVING DUO NUMBERS ALMOST IDENTICAL . . .

- Senior Keyarris Garrett and junior Keevan Lucas headlined the Tulsa receiving corps in the season opener in a big way.
- The duo combined for 356 yards and two TDs on 15 receptions for a 23.7-yard average per catch.
- Lucas had 193 yards and two TDs on 10 receptions, while Garrett caught five passes for 163 yards.
- A year ago, the duo of Lucas and Garrett totaled nearly 2,000 yards and 16 touchdowns (1,917 yards to be exact).
- In their careers, the tandems receiving numbers are nearly identical as they have combined for 3,805 yards and 29 touchdowns.
- In 26 career games, Lucas now has 1,919 yards and 15 TDs on 147 receptions for a 13.1 average per catch.
- In 34 games, Garrett has 1,886 yards, 14 TDs and a 13.9-yard average on 135 career receptions.
- After two games this year, they have combined for 523 yards, an average of 261.5 yards between them, and three TDs.

LUCAS NAMED AAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AFTER WEEK ONE . . .

- In the season opener, Keevan Lucas caught 10 passes for 193 yards and two touchdowns, while also carrying the ball twice for 21 yards vs. FAU, thus earning the first American Athletic Conference's Offensive Player of the Week award this season.
- His 193 yards was the second-highest receiving total for the first weekend of the college football season.
- Lucas' touchdown receptions covered 39 yards to tie the game 7-7, and one for 43 yards to give Tulsa a 21-7 lead in the second quarter.
- On Tulsa's game-tying drive in the final minute, Lucas caught four passes covering 58 yards on the 12-play, 53-yard drive, with three catches going for first downs
- In the overtime series, Lucas took the first play 11 yards to the 14-yard line leading to the winning touchdown.
- The weekly award is the second straight year that Lucas has begun the year as the American Athletic Conference's Offensive Player of the Week. Last year, he won the award on the first week after a 233-yard, 3-touchdown performance against Tulane.

THE FIRST TIME . . .

- Red-shirt freshman offensive center Chandler Miller received his first career start in his first-ever collegiate game in the season opener.
- Including Miller, Tulsa had a total of 11 players who saw their first collegiate action against FAU in the season opener.
- Six offensive players and five defensive players saw their first-ever playing time in the season opener.
- The offensive players included WR Justin Hobbs, TE Chris Minter, OT Willie Wright, OG Tyler Bowling, C Chandler Miller and OG Alex Pagonis.
- The defensive players earning their first collegiate playing time were DB Sam Gottsch, DB McKinley Whitfield, DB J.R. Reed, LB Tim Quickel and DE Myles Mouton.
- Minter and Whitfield are true freshmen, Reed is a freshman gray-shirt, Pagonis is a JUCO transfer, while Hobbs, Wright, Bowling, Miller, Gottsch, Quickel and Mouton are all red-shirt freshmen.

- Δ The Golden Hurricane has produced three NFL Hall of Famers, the most among Oklahoma schools (Jim Finks, Bob St. Clair, Steve Largent)
- Δ TU has the most former football players (4) to serve as head coaches in the NFL among Oklahoma colleges
- Δ Tulsa has two Heisman Trophy runners-up – Jerry Rhome (1964) and Howard Twilley (1965)
- Δ Tulsa won a school record 11 games in 2008 and 2012
- Δ Paul Smith won the 2007 Wuerffel Trophy, while Wilson Halloway won the FedEx Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award in 2008

FIRST STARTS . . .

- A total of six players earned their first career starts in the season opener, including three on offense and three on defense.
- The first-time offensive starters were red-shirt freshmen OC Chandler Miller (Bixby, Okla.) and WR Justin Hobbs (Overland Park, Kan.) and sophomore OT Evan Plagg (Guthrie, Okla.).
- The three players on defense receiving their first career starts were sophomore SAF Jordan Mitchell (Owasso, Okla.), junior LB Matt Linscott (Jenks, Okla.) and sophomore DE Jeremy Smith (Sperry, Okla.).
- In the second game, three more Tulsa players saw their first career starting assignment with sophomore DE Frankie Davis (Broken Arrow, Okla.), junior SAF Jeremy Brady (North Little Rock, Ark.) and red-shirt freshman OT Willie Wright (Houston, Texas).

BRUBAKER RETURNS . . .

- Sophomore defensive tackle Jesse Brubaker had a huge sack in OT in the season opener.
- With FAU 2nd-and-Goal at the 6-yard line, Brubaker sacked FAU QB Jaquez Johnson for a five-yard loss putting the Owls back at the 11-yard line . . . the Owls had to settle for a field goal.
- Brubaker ended the game with three tackles and 1.5 stops for -7 yards, including that six-yard sack.
- Brubaker returned to the starting lineup in the opener after missing all but one game in 2014 due to an orbital bone fracture to his left eye . . . he played in just Tulsa's third game last year.
- In 2013, Brubaker started 10 games as a true freshman, collecting 20 tackles.

EVANS MOVING UP LISTS . . .

- Quarterback Dane Evans is in his fourth year, but just his third in a playing capacity . . . Evans red-shirted in the 2012 season, played in 2013 and then started all 12 games in 2014.
- Evans now has thrown for 4,745 career yards, moving into 9th place on the school's career passing chart.
- His 31 passing touchdowns is the 10th most for a Tulsa quarterback . . . with one more he'll tie for eighth place and with four more he'll move into a seventh-place tie on the school's all-time chart.
- Evans had his second career 400+ passing game in the season opener vs. FAU with 424 yards and two TDs.
- Evans moved into 5th place on the school's single-season passing list with 3,102 yards and had 23 TDs in 2014.
- In 2014, Evans became the 20th quarterback in school history to throw for over 2,000 yards in a single season, and it was just the sixth time that a player has thrown for over 3,000 yards in a season.

THE DEFENSE . . .

- Tulsa's defense returned 27 lettermen, including six returning starters and an other seven players who started at least one game in their careers entering this year.
- The defensive front returned three starters from the 2015 season, including end Derrick Alexander and tackles Derrick Luetjen and Jerry Uwaezuoke
- The line also welcomed back the return of 2013 starting tackle Jesse Brubaker, who missed all but one game last year with an injury.
- The linebacker corps returned starters Trent Martin on the inside and Football Writer's Association (FWAA) Freshman All-American Craig Suits on the outside.
- On the back-end, although still rather young, Tulsa returned eight lettermen with just two seniors.

- A total of 10 starters returned to the Tulsa offense in 2015.
- Six more players, who have started at least one game in their careers, also returned to the Hurricane offensive unit.
- The Hurricane returned 100-percent of its rushing and passing totals and 94 percent of the teams' receiving total.
- Tulsa's offense put up 412.5 total yards in 2014 to rank fourth in the American Athletic Conference for total offense.

STAFFORD NAMED TO TWO WATCH LISTS . . .

- Senior offensive guard Garrett Stafford, a 6'5", 300-pound senior from Tulsa's Memorial High School, has been named to preseason watch lists for the 2015 Rotary Lombardi Award and the Outland Trophy.
- He has now played in 34 career games and has started 28 consecutive contests.
- Stafford had started 24 straight games at left tackle before he started the season opener this year at left guard.
- Stafford moved to left guard during spring drills . . . all his previous starts had been at tackle (24 at left tackle, 2 at right tackle).
- In 2014, Stafford graded over 80-percent in all 12 games and finished the year with grades over 90-percent in the final six contests.
- Eligibility for the Rotary Lombardi Award is limited to down linemen, end-to-end, either on offense or defense, who set up no farther than 10 yards to the left or right of the ball, or linebackers who set up no farther than five yards deep from the line of scrimmage
- The Outland Trophy is given to the nation's best interior lineman on either offense or defense.

DERRICK ALEXANDER ADDED TO LOMBARDI LIST . . .

- Tulsa defensive end Derrick Alexander was added to the 2015 Watch List for the Rotary Lombardi Award on August 25, as the Rotary Lombardi Award Committee announced an updated watch list.
- Alexander joins teammate Garrett Stafford, a senior offensive guard, who was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award.
- He now has 98 career tackles, 28 TFLs for -164 yards and 18 sacks for -130 yards in 40 career games.
- A second-team American Athletic Conference selection in 2014, Alexander totaled 42 tackles in 12 games, including 12 stops for -72 yards.
- He ranked second in The American last season for tackles for lost yardage.

LUCAS ON BILETNIKOFF AWARD WATCH LIST . . .

- Junior receiver Keevan Lucas was named to the 2015 Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List, as announced by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club (TQC) Foundation, Inc.
- The Biletnikoff Award annually recognizes the outstanding receiver in college football.
- The 5'10" junior from Abilene, Texas, Lucas led the Hurricane with 101 receptions for 1,219 yards and 11 TDs to finish the season ranked sixth on the school's all-time receiving chart.
- He now has 1,919 career receiving yards and 15 TDs on 147 receptions after the first two games.
- A second-team all-American Athletic Conference selection in 2014, Lucas had five 100-yard receiving games with a career-best 233 yards and three TDs on 13 receptions against Tulane.
- He ranked among the nation's leaders in 2014 for receptions per game (5th), receiving yards per game (11th), receiving yards (12th) and receiving TDs (12th).

MORE ON KEEVAN LUCAS' 2014 SEASON . . .

- Junior receiver Keevan Lucas' 1,219 yards in 2014 ranks 6th on the school's single-season receiving chart.
- His 11 touchdown receptions in 2014 were the most since the 2007 season when freshman Trae Johnson had 13 TD catches.
- He became the first 1,000- yard receiver since Damaris Johnson had 1,131 yards in the 2009 season.
- Lucas became only the 15th Tulsa player in school history with 1,000 receiving yards in a single season.
- He had five 100-yard receiving games in 2014 and caught at least one TD pass in eight games.
- Lucas had a streak of four straight games with 100+ receiving yards — Colorado State, Temple, USF and Memphis.
- Lucas had a career day in his first game of the 2014 season with 233 yards and three TDs on 13 receptions against Tulane.

MUDOH ON WUERFFEL TROPHY WATCH LIST . . .

- Senior safety Michal Mudoh is one of 80 collegiate football players named to the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List.
- The Wuerffel Trophy, known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service," is presented annually by the All Sports Association in Fort Walton Beach, Florida.
- Named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Danny Wuerffel from the University of Florida, the Wuerffel Trophy is awarded to the FBS player that best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement.
- He has been involved in numerous community activities during his Tulsa career . . . he has participated in the Feed My Starving Children Program, performed karaoke at Cancer Treatments Center of America, has mentored young adults, assisted with the 'Chosen' ministry for inner city youth, has visited the Children's hospital, and has also been involved in various community outreach with his church.
- Former Tulsa quarterback Paul Smith was the 2007 recipient of the Wuerffel Trophy.

TULSA TRIO NAMED TO EARL CAMPBELL TYLER ROSE AWARD WATCH LIST . . .

- Tulsa receivers Keyarris Garrett and Keevan Lucas and quarterback Dane Evans were each named to the preseason watch list for the 2015 Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award
- This is the third year of the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, which recognizes the top offensive player in the Football Bowl Subdivision from the state of Texas .
- A total of 39 players from 10 different conferences and one independent have been named to Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Preseason Watch List .
- Garrett and Lucas are two of 11 receivers named to the list .
- Lucas was named as one of 16 semifinalists for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award in 2014.
- To be eligible for the award the nominee must meet one or more of the following criteria: (1) Born in Texas; (2) Graduated from a Texas high school; or (3) played at a Texas-based junior college of four-year college.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium before the 2013 spring game.
- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and currently with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers).
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).



TULSA'S RAY GUY AWARD CANDIDATE STARTS SEASON WITH BIG GAME . . .

- Junior punter Dalton Parks was named to the preseason watch list for the 2015 Ray Guy Award, the Augusta Sports Council announced . . . the Ray Guy Award is presented to the nation's top collegiate punter.
- In the season opener, Parks punted four times for a 50.2 average with a long of 63 yards and is currently ranked fifth nationally for punting.
- On the year, Parks averages 44.7 yards on seven punts.
- Parks has handled the punting duties since 2013, and last year he averaged 42.0 yards on 70 punts to earn honorable mention all-conference accolades.
- Parks had 20 punts land inside the 20-yard line, 14 travel 50 yards or more and 22 fair caught.
- He is just one of two punters from the American Athletic Conference named to the Ray Guy watch list, joining USF's Mattias Ciabatti.

LANGER HAD BREAK-OUT JUNIOR SEASON . . .

- Senior running back Zack Langer, hampered much of his career with nagging injuries, had a breakout year in 2014.
- He played in 10 games, missing the season's opener and finale with an injury.
- Langer had a team-high 801 rushing yards for a 4.1 average, and ranked second in the American Athletic Conference with an 80.1 average per game.
- He had four 100+ rushing games with a career-best 167 yards on 33 carries against SMU.
- In his last eight games of the 2014 season, Langer rushed for 732 yards and three TDs for an average of 91.5 yards per game.

A LOOK AT TULSA'S CONFERENCE HISTORY . . .

- Tulsa is in its second season as a member of the American Athletic Conference
- Tulsa began its membership in The American on July 1, 2014 after nine years as a member of Conference USA.
- Tulsa opened its' tenure in the American Athletic Conference with a 38-31 double overtime victory against Tulane in the 2014 season opener.
- The American is the sixth conference affiliation for the Tulsa football program, while the previous five include: Oklahoma Collegiate Conference (1914-28), Big Four Conference (1929-32), Missouri Valley Conference (1935-85), Western Athletic Conference (1996-2004) and Conference USA (2005-13).
- Tulsa was an independent for 12 years, coming between the Missouri Valley and its entrance into the WAC in 1996.
- In nine years as a C-USA member, Tulsa compiled a 49-23 regular season league record and a 2-2 mark in C-USA Championship Games – Tulsa was 2-1 against UCF in C-USA title games and 0-1 against East Carolina, both now members of the American Athletic Conference.

SINCE 2003 . . .

- The first three years of 2000's were lean for the Tulsa football, posting just a 7-28 combined record in 2000, 2001 and 2002.
- Since 2003, Tulsa has a 91-66 (.579) overall record. Nineteen 19 of those 66 losses came in the 2013 and 2014 seasons.
- From the 2003-2012, Tulsa had a 84-47 record for a .641 win percentage
- In 2012, Tulsa made its eighth Bowl game appearance within 10 seasons and had a 5-3 Bowl record during that 10-year stretch.
- Tulsa won two outright C-USA Championships (2005, 2012), four C-USA West Division titles (2005, 2007, 2008, 2012) and shared one West crown (2010).

WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

9 — DANE EVANS (6-2, 218, JR) — has played in 22 career games and has 19 starts . . . has completed 377-of-720 passes for 4,745 career yards and 31 TDs . . . has thrown a TD pass in 14 straight games . . . has completed 58.7-percent of his passes for 745 yards and 4 TDs in 2 games this year . . . completed 64-percent of his passes for 424 yards and 2 TDs vs. FAU in the season opener . . . threw for 3,102 yards and 23 TDs in 2014 to rank 5th on the school's single-season passing chart . . . had a career-best 438 yards and 4 TDs in the 2014 opener vs. Tulane . . . threw for a career-high 5 TDs against SMU in 2014 . . . has the school's 9th (438) and 12th (424) most passing yards in the history of Tulsa football.

8 – JOSEPH CALCAGNI (6-1, 212, SR) — has played in 11 career games, including nine at QB . . . holds this year on PATs and FGs . . . completed 7 passes for 74 yards in 4 games in 2014. . . completed 4-of-7 passes for 30 yards vs. Oklahoma in 2014 . . . has thrown for 179 career yards on 18 completions . . . threw his first career TD, covering six yards against UTSA in 2013.

10 – CHAD PRESIDENT (6-3, 205, FR-HS) — came to Tulsa in the spring from Temple High School . . . was a Rivals.com four-star prospect . . . threw for 2,391 yards and 23 TDs, while running for 878 yards and six TDs as a senior . . . led his team to a 13-2 record and an appearance in the Texas Class 5A state championship game.

RUNNING BACKS
