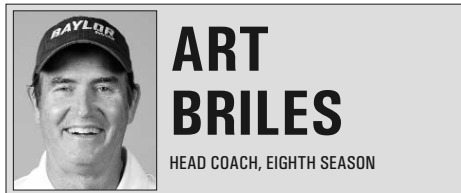

STORY LINES

- Baylor welcomes No. 12 Oklahoma for an #EveryoneInBlack showdown on ABC at 7 p.m. Saturday.
- For a 2nd-straight year ESPN's "College GameDay" will be live from Waco Saturday at 8 a.m. CT.
- Baylor owns the FBS's best home win streak (20 games) & has not lost in Waco since Oct. 13, 2012.
- Baylor is 8-0 for the 2nd-time ever (2013), after beating K-State, 31-24, Nov. 5 in Manhattan.
- #AmericasTopOffense leads the NCAA with 665.6 yards per game and 57.4 points per contest.
- Baylor is 8-0 vs. AP Top 25 opponents at home in the last 4 seasons.
- Baylor has won 10 straight Big 12 games overall, which is a new school record (9 in 2012-13).
- Baylor has won 21 of its last 23 Big 12 games, including 13 straight league games at home.
- Baylor is 37-8 when ranked under head coach **Art Briles**, including a 21-0 mark in home games.
- Baylor is 1 of 6 remaining unbeaten teams in FBS and 1 of 2 in the Big 12.
- Baylor is the only team in the country to lead every game by 13 or more points.
- Baylor is the only FBS school to be top-10 in passing (7th, 356.8) and rushing offense (2nd, 308.9).
- The Bears are the lone team in the nation to average over 8 yds. per play, gaining 8.36 a snap.
- Baylor and Oklahoma will meet for the 25th time on Saturday. OU leads the all-time series 21-3 and holds a 10-2 advantage in games played in Waco. BU has won 3 of the last 4 meetings in the series.
- Baylor has outscored foes 459-200 through 8 games and leads the FBS in victory margin (32.4).
- Baylor's 459 pts. through 8 games are the 3rd-most by any school since 1937 (BU had 488 in 2013).
- Baylor is 10-0 in the \$266 million McLane Stadium, with an average margin of victory of + 31.7 points.
- Baylor is averaging 56.6 points per game and 666.4 yards per game at two-year old riverfront stadium.
- Baylor has the nation's best home record since 2011 at 29-1.
- In home games, Baylor is 33-3 over the last 4+ seasons and 39-10 in Waco in the Briles era.
- BU has won 27 of its last 28 games played in Texas and is 38-4 in the state over the last 4+ years.
- Baylor has tallied at least 1 turnover in 24 straight games (21-3) - longest active streak in FBS.
- The #GangGreenBU defense has forced 21 turnovers and is 3rd in FBS with 2.625 forced per game.
- Baylor has compiled a 21-2 record in November and December since 2011 (15-2 in Nov.).

TEAM QUICK HITS

- Baylor is looking to start a season 9-0 for the 2nd time in program history (2013).
- Baylor is trying to move to 6-0 in Big 12 play for only the 2nd time ever. The Bears were last 6-0 in 2013.
- Baylor is the most successful Texas team since 2011 with a win percentage of .800 (48-12).
- Baylor's been ranked in a school-record 44 straight AP Polls, FBS' 4th-best streak (Top 10 in 34 of last 37).
- True freshman QB **Jarrett Stidham** (419 yds & 3 TD) made his 1st start at K-State for injured **Seth Russell**.
- BU is 10-7 vs. ranked foes since 2011 (3-1 in 2014), after starting the Briles-era 0-13 in such games.
- Baylor is tops in the Big 12 and 3rd nationally in turnover margin (1.38), forcing 21 and giving away only 10.
- Baylor is 21-2 in the last 2+ years in Big 12 play & 38-27 under head coach **Art Briles**. BU was 11-85 in Big 12 games prior to Briles' arrival in 2008.
- Baylor is 34-4 over its last 38 games. The 4 losses were all away from home; three vs. top-15 teams.
- Baylor's first-half scoring average this season (36.1) is the nation's highest since 1996 — the next closest is 2008 Oklahoma's 33.1 first-half points per game.
- Baylor has 289 first half points in 2015, averaging a 22.25 point lead at halftime - both marks lead the nation.
- Baylor improved to 5-0 in league action for a 2nd-consecutive season.
- With only 31 points at K-State, BU snapped a FBS-best string of 13-straight games with 35 or more points scored.
- Baylor is 41-0 when allowing less than 35 points and just 14-18 when allowing 35 or more since 2010.
- Baylor is 12-5 in games decided by 7 points or less in the last 5 seasons.

OFFENSE

- Baylor's 459 pts. through 8 games are the 3rd-most by any school since 1937 (BU had 488 in 2013).
- Baylor is the only team in the nation to have scored on every opening offensive drive of 2015.
- Baylor leads all FBS teams in TD drives of 2 minutes or less (40). BU had a nation's best 41 a year ago.
- Baylor has had 3 or more passing TDs in each game of 2015.
- Baylor leads the nation with .72 points per play.
- Baylor is averaging 30.6 first downs per game in 2015, which tops the FBS.
- The Bears have played both **Seth Russell** and **Jarrett Stidham** at QB and the pair combined for a 198.80 passing efficiency, which leads the country.
- Baylor has punted only 21 times in 2015, which is the lowest total in the country.
- Baylor averages 6.57 yards per rush, which is second-best nationally.
- BU's 17.19 yards per completion ranks 5th in FBS and leads the conference.
- Baylor is 49 of 102 (48.0%) on 3rd downs this year, which is 10th-best in the country.
- Baylor ranks tied for 10th in the country in TFLs allowed (4.25) and 18th in sacks allowed per game (1.13).
- Baylor has scored at least 20 points in the 1st halves in 20 of 21 games since 2014.
- Baylor has had a 1,000-yard rusher in 6 straight seasons (Jay Finley-2010; Terrance Ganaway-2011; Lache Seastrunk-2012, 2013; Shock Linwood-2014, 2015).
- Baylor has had a 1,000-yard receiver in 5 straight seasons (Kendall Wright-2011; Terrance Williams-2012; Antwan Goodley-2013; Corey Coleman and KD Cannon-2014; Cannon-2015). The Bears have had 6 1,000-yard receivers in the last 5 seasons after having just 2 1,000-yard receivers in program history prior to 2011.
- Baylor became only the 2nd-team since 2004 with 700 yards of offense in each of its first 3 games - the other 2013 BU.
- Baylor boasts the nation's only returning 1,000-yard receiving duo in 2015: **Corey Coleman** (64-1,119-11) and **KD Cannon** (58-1,030-8). So far in 2015 the duo has combined for 87 catches and 1,665 yards with 24 TDs.
- BU returns its entire starting O-line from the Cotton Bowl Classic, entire backfield & 10 of 13 receivers from 2014.
- Baylor's O-line has 6 players that have 16 or more career starts.

DEFENSE

- Baylor has forced at least 2 turnovers in 7 of 8 games of 2015, including 3 in the win at Kansas State.
- With 1 more fumble recovered against K-State, Baylor ranks tied for 4th in FBS and leads the Big 12 with 10 recovered.
- In total, Baylor is tied 7th nationally and 2nd in the league with 21 turnovers gained.
- Baylor is 18th in the country with 7.8 tackles for loss per contest.
- Baylor is giving up 25.0 points per contest, which is the 3rd-best scoring defense in the conference.
- The Bears are surrendering 5.0 yards per play in 2015, which is 3rd in the Big 12.
- Baylor is allowing just 388.4 yards per game in 2015, which is 2nd-best in the league.
- Baylor is giving up just 223.8 yards per game through the air, which is 2nd-best in the Big 12.
- Baylor ranks 5th in the conference by surrendering only 164.6 yards per game on the ground.
- Baylor ranks 5th in the Big 12 and 27th in the country with 11 interceptions.
- Three Baylor players, **Shawn Oakman** (1st with 1.57), **Jamal Palmer** (5th with 1.31) and **Andrew Billings** (8th with 1.14) are in the top-10 in TFLs per game in the Big 12.
- **Phil Bennett's** D has forced multiple turnovers in 40 of its 60 games.
- Baylor's defense is 35-5 under Bennett when recording 2 or more takeaways.
- Baylor forced 4 turnovers against Texas Tech and Iowa State - both most in a game since 4 vs. WVU in 2013.
- Baylor's D has 3 or more turnovers in 15 games since 2013 & has won 27 of its last 28 with 3+ takeaways.
- Baylor is 23-1 when forcing 3 or more turnovers during the Briles era.
- 3 defensive starters (**Beau Blackshear**, **Andrew Billings** & **Orion Stewart**) are Waco natives.

INDIVIDUAL QUICK HITS

OFFENSE

- **WR Corey Coleman** leads the FBS in receiving yard per game (147.3), TD catches (20) & scoring (15.4 ppg.).
- Coleman (1,178 receiving yards this season is 4th-most ever) recorded the 8th 1,000-yard receiving season in program history and became the first player in program history with multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons (had 1,119 in 2014).
- He (2,824 receiving yards for his career is 4th all-time) needs 279 to move into sole possession of 3rd on BU's career receiving yard list (Tevin Reese, 3,102) and 162 ards to pass Antwan Goodley (1,339) for 3rd on single-season list.
- In the last game, Coleman (216 receiving yards) recorded the 4th-most receiving yards in a game in program history. It was the 6th 200-yard receiving game in program history, and Coleman joined Kendall Wright as the only players with two 200-yard receiving games.
- Coleman (157 career receptions) is 8th on Baylor's career receptions list, and needs 7 catches to move past Gerald McNeil (163) for seventh on the list.

- Coleman (120 points scored) moved into 4th on Baylor's single-season points list — he's 12 back of Terrance Ganaway's school record of 132 points in 2011.
- Coleman earlier this season already broke the school single season (14) and career (30) receiving TD records. He now sits with 20 on the year and 33 for his career.
- Coleman has multiple receiving TDs in 7 consecutive games (a new Big 12 record) and at least one TD catch in 9 straight games.
- Coleman recorded his 11th career 100-yard receiving game, 5th-most in program history against K-State — he has 7 100-yard receiving games this season.
- Coleman (11 receptions vs. the Wildcats) had his 4th career double-digit receptions game, tying Terrance Williams for 2nd-most in program history behind Kendall Wright's 6 games.
- Coleman's yards per reception (20.31) are 20th-best nationally, while **Jay Lee** is 8th at 21.85.
- **Shock Linwood** (7.81) is 3rd nationally in rush yds. per carry and 12th in rush yds per game (130.8). Those are the top marks in the Big 12 as well.
- Linwood is 31st nationally and 2nd in the conference with 9 rushing TDs in 2015.
- RB Shock Linwood (1,046 rushing yards this season) recorded the 12th 1,000-yard rushing season in program history and joined Lache Seastrunk (2012, 2013) as the only players in program history with multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons.
- Linwood is tied with Alfred Anderson (1,046) for 10th on the BU single season rushing list. He needs 29 more yards to move into sole possession of 9th on the list passing Rashad Armstrong (1,074).
- Linwood now sits 2nd on BU's all-time rushing list (3,179). He need 486 to catch Walter Abercrombie (1978-81, 3,665).
- Linwood is also moving up the career rushing TD chart with 33. He is tied Robert Griffin III (33). Alfred Anderson holds the record with 35.
- Linwood set the BU freshman and sophomore rushing records. He needs just 141 yards to pass Abercrombie's junior record of 1,187.
- OL **Spencer Drango** was named a 2014 consensus All-America, Big 12 Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year and Outland Trophy semifinalist. In 2015, he leads the Outland Trophy's Schneider Scale Rankings (134.14) and is a Rotary Lombardi semifinalist.

DEFENSE

- With 1 sack against KU, DE **Shawn Oakman** broke the BU school record for career sacks (Daryl Gardener & Chris McAlister, 15.0). He now has 4.0 for the season, which ranks 6th-best in the Big 12 (.57 per game) and 17 for his career.
- Oakman is 8th nationally and leads the Big 12 with 1.57 TFLs per game for #GangGreenBU.
- Oakman is 2nd on BU's career TFLs list with 43.0. He needs 6.5 to move into first (Charles Benson, 49.0).
- Last year, Oakman ranked 10th nationally in TFL (1.5/gm) & 15th in sacks (.85/gm). He led BU with 19.5 TFLs and 11.0 sacks in 2014.
- NB **Travon Blanchard** ranks 17th nationally and 2nd in the Big 12 with .25 fumbles forced per contest.
- LB **Grant Campbell** is 6th in the Big 12 with 8.0 tackles per game, while his solo tackle tally of 5.5 is 26th nationally.
- DB **Xavier Howard** is averaging 1.25 passes defended per game, which is 2nd in the Big 12 and is 23rd in FBS.
- Howard is also 15th in the country and 1st in the Big 12 with .50 interceptions per game.
- S **Chance Waz** made his first career start against Rice and led the team with 8 tackles.
- With Waz starting, the team's longest starting streak snapped [**Terrell Burt**, 28]. **Beau Blackshear** now owns the honor with 31 straight starts.
- Burt re-entered the lineup for an injured Waz during the Kansas State game and got his 3rd career interception (1st of season) to end the Wildcats' final drive of the game.
- CB **Ryan Reid** recorded an interception for a 3rd straight game — he had 0 interceptions in 24 career games prior to that 3-game stretch.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Sophomore PK **Chris Callahan** made 23 of his last 28 FGs, after starting his career 1-of-6. He has also made 95-straight extra points, after going 61-for-61 to start 2015.
- P **Drew Galitz**, a freshman, has only punted 20 times on the season, but is averaging 42.0 yards per boot - 4th in Big 12.
- With that effort BU is 3rd in the Big 12 and 27th in the country in net punting at 39.52 yards.
- Baylor has attempted just 8 FGs on the year, while no other Big 12 school has kicked less than 10.

BRILES' UNIQUE SYSTEM IS AMERICA'S TOP OFFENSE

Art Briles' unique, record-breaking offense is leading the nation in total offense (665.6) and scoring (57.4) through eight games, after also having led in both each of the past two seasons - total offense (581.5 ypg 2014, 618.8 ypg 2013) and scoring (48.2 ppg 2014, 52.4 ppg 2013). Baylor's offense is the only one in the country to rank among the top-four in total offense each of the last four years [see listing below].

THE BRILES OFFENSE: A unique, up-tempo spread attack with origins in Bill Yeoman's 'Houston Veer' (perhaps most identifiable by wide splits of receivers and a power running game), **Art Briles** has honed his offensive system over the past four decades as a high school and collegiate coach; it's a balanced offense, not to be confused with more common pass-heavy spread attacks. The Briles offense is also in use at Bowling Green (head coach **Dino Babers**) and Tulsa (head coach **Philip Montgomery**) under former Briles assistants. In the latest NCAA statistics, those three programs, Baylor (665.6), Bowling Green (593.7) and Tulsa (5320.1) are first, third and 12th respectively in total offense.

LAST GAME'S LEFTOVERS

Baylor produced a 31-24 road win at Kansas State Thursday, Nov. 5 in Manhattan, Kan. Here are some of the note-worthy items from that game.

- Baylor is 8-0 for the second time in program history (2013).
- Baylor and Kansas State met for the 13th time. K-State leads the series 7-6, including a 4-2 mark in Manhattan. Baylor has won 5 of the last 6 series meetings.

TEAM NOTES

- Baylor's 21 first-half points were its fewest this season — the previous low was 27 first-half points against West Virginia.
- Baylor finished with 522 yards of total offense — its 2nd-lowest total this season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- WR Corey Coleman (1,178 receiving yards this season) recorded the 8th 1,000-yard receiving season in program history and became the first player in program history with multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons. He moved into 4th on Baylor's single-season receiving yards list.
- Coleman (216 receiving yards) recorded the 4th-most receiving yards in a game in program history. It was the 6th 200-yard receiving game in program history, and Coleman joined Kendall Wright as the only players with two 200-yard receiving games.
- Coleman extended his Baylor single-season record by grabbing his 20th TD reception of the season.
- Coleman's 20 receiving TDs tie the 3rd-most in a season by a Big 12 Conference player, equaling Oklahoma State's Justin Blackmon (2010).
- Coleman became the 12th player in FBS history to record 20+ receiving touchdowns in a season and he's tied for 9th on the NCAA's single-season TD receptions list.
- Coleman has multiple receiving TDs in 7 consecutive games (a Big 12 record) and at least 1 TD catch in 9 straight games.
- Coleman recorded his 11th career 100-yard receiving game, 5th-most in program history — he has 7 100-yard receiving games this season.
- Coleman (11 receptions) had his 4th career double-digit receptions game, tying Terrance Williams for 2nd-most in program history behind Kendall Wright's 6 games.
- Coleman also extended his school record with his 32nd and 33rd career receiving touchdowns.
- Coleman (157 career receptions) moved into 8th on Baylor's career receptions list, passing Antwan Goodley (150) and Trent Shelton (155).
- Coleman (2,824 career receiving yards) passed Gerald McNeil (2,651) for 4th on Baylor's career receiving yards list.
- Coleman (120 points scored) moved into 4th on Baylor's single-season points list — he's 12 back of Terrance Ganaway's school record of 132 points in 2011.

- True freshman QB Jarrett Stidham made his career-first start in place of injured QB Seth Russell.
- Stidham (419 passing yards) threw for the 10th-most passing yards in a game in program history and had the program's 17th all-time 400-yard passing game.

- WR KD Cannon (108 receiving yards) had his 5th career 100-yard receiving game, tying Bruce Davis for 10th-most in program history.

- WR Jay Lee (1,510 career receiving yards) became the 15th player in program history to record 1,500+ receiving yards.

- RB Shock Linwood (1,046 rushing yards this season) recorded the 12th 1,000-yard rushing season in program history and joined Lache Seastrunk (2012, 2013) as the only players in program history with multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

- PK Chris Callahan (208 career points) moved into 4th on Baylor's career kicking points list, passing Robert Bledsoe (204 from 1977-80).

- S Terrell Burt had his 3rd career interception (1st of season) to end Kansas State's final drive of the game.

BU WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

On the year, Baylor has been better than its opponent in 7 of 8 games in the turnover battle. The Bears have gained 21 turnovers in 2015, while only gifting 10 for a turnover margin of +11 or 1.38 per game. That mark is third in the country and leads the Big 12.

HOME WINNING STREAK IS NATION'S BEST

The Bears' 20-game home win streak is a school record and is the nation's best active string. The streak started on Nov. 3, 2012 and BU hasn't lost at home since Oct. 13, 2012. During its home win streak, BU is averaging 56.2 points, while limiting foes to 20.6 points. The Bears are racking up 666.6 yards per game and holding opponents to 324.0 during the streak.

STIDHAM MOVES IN TO PILOT #AMERICASTOPOFFENSE

True freshman Jarrett Stidham did not disappoint in his first-career start at Kansas State. Playing in place of the injured Seth Russell, the 19-year old from Stephenville, Texas, completed 23-of-33 passes for 419 yards and 3 TDs. He also added another TD on the ground. Stidham's 419 passing yards were the 10th-most passing yards in a game in program history and had the program's 17th all-time 400-yard passing game.

OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSE

Baylor's defense under coordinator Phil Bennett has demonstrated a knack for making big plays at key moments to contribute to the Bears' winning ways over the past four-plus seasons. BU currently leads the nation by forcing a turnover in 24-straight games. In four-plus years under Bennett, Baylor's D has recorded at least one takeaway in 55 of 60 games - a total of 130 takeaways (77 interceptions, 53 fumbles recovered). Overall under Bennett, Baylor is 35-5 when recording two or more takeaways, including 7-0 in 2015.

THE NATION'S MOST BALANCED OFFENSE

Currently, Baylor is the only team in the nation to be ranked in the top 10 in both passing (7th, 356.8) and rushing offense (2nd, 308.9). Baylor has ranked among the nation's top 15 in both rushing and passing yards in three of the past four years. Additionally, BU has rushed on more than 54 percent of plays over the last four seasons (yearly ratios below).

Baylor has compiled a 21-4 mark in games after October 31 since 2011 (15-2 in Nov., 6-0 in Dec., 0-2 in Jan.). COLEMAN PRODUCING HISTORIC NUMBERS

Maxwell Award semifinalist and Biletnikoff Award watch list member Corey Coleman is having one of the top seasons in college football. The junior from Richardson, Texas, has caught 58 passes for 1,178 yards and 20 touchdowns in eight games. He has already broken the BU single-season record for receiving touchdowns (14, Kendall Wright in 2011) and is on pace to set new Big 12 and NCAA record in the category.

WINNING STREAKS ALL AROUND

Baylor upped its overall win streak to eight with the victory at Kansas State. Baylor last ran off eight-straight wins in 2012-13 when it combined for the school record of 13 in a row. The streak is tied for 6th-longest nationally and tied for the fifth-longest in school history. Meanwhile, the Bears have won 10-straight Big 12 games, which is a new program record and is tied for second-longest nationally.

Corey Coleman set career highs of 15 catches and 224 yards to help No. 10 Baylor roll past No. 16 Oklahoma 48-14.

It was the most receptions ever by a player against the Sooners. Coleman also caught a touchdown pass and ran for another score as the Bears (8-1, 5-1 Big 12, No. 12 in CFP) rolled.

Bryce Petty completed 32 of 42 passes for 387 yards and a touchdown. It was Baylor's first road win in 12 tries against the Sooners (6-3, 3-3, No. 15 CFP).

Baylor has won three of the past four meetings with the Sooners after losing the first 20. Baylor took a 3-0 lead, but Oklahoma responded with two TD drives. Baylor scored the next 45 points.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor snapped a 37-game losing streak in road games against ranked opponents. The Bears' last win in those games was Nov. 2, 1991, when the Bears beat No. 24 Arkansas by a final score of 9-5. Today's starting quarterback Bryce Petty was 5 months old when that happened.
- Baylor also snapped an 18-game losing streak in the state of Oklahoma; BU's last previous win in Oklahoma was Sept. 2, 1995, a 37-5 win at Tulsa.
- Baylor handed Oklahoma just its 7th loss in Norman during the Bob Stoops era (89-7).
- Baylor's 34-point victory was the largest by a visiting team in Norman during the Stoops era.

VETERAN O-LINE PROTECTING NEW QB, POWERING RUN GAME

Baylor's offensive line has six linemen with 16 or more career starts (**Spencer Drango** 43, **Kyle Fuller** 21, **Blake Muir** 20, **Desmine Hilliard** 18, **Jarell Broxton** 16, **Pat Colbert** 16). The 2015 line is ranked second in the Big 12 and 18th in the nation by giving up just nine sacks in eight games. That veteran group has also helped BU become the nation's No. 4 rushing offense with 308.9 yards per game.

OWNING THE LONE STAR STATE

Baylor has racked up a 19-3 record vs. in-state foes over the last four-plus years, including victories in its last 12 meetings with other Texas schools. The Bears have also been successful against any opponent when the game has been played in the Lone Star State, boasting a 27-1 record over its last 28 games and a 38-4 mark in contests over the last four-plus years in Texas.

RUN GAME ROLLING FOR BEARS EARLY IN 2015

By rushing for over 275 yards in seven of the first eight games, Baylor is fourth in the country averaging 308.9 yards per contest on the ground. BU's rushing attack is led by Shock Linwood 1,046 yds. on 134 carries with 9 TDs. The junior is torching defenses for 7.8 yards per carry in 2015 and 130.8 yards per game. Both of those marks are No. 1 in the Big 12 and third and 12th in the country, respectively. The Bears' punishing rushing game has now produced 1,000-yard rushers in six straight seasons: **Jay Finley** in 2010 (1,218), **Terrance Ganaway** in 2011 (school-record 1,547), **Lache Seastrunk** in 2012 (1,012) and 2013 (1,060) and **Shock Linwood** in 2014 (1,135) and 2015.

OKLAHOMA SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's contest will be the 25th meeting between Baylor and Oklahoma. OU holds a 21-3 advantage in the series and a 10-2 mark over BU in games played in Waco. The Bears have won three of the last four meetings and the last two in Waco. Last year, Baylor got its first victory in Norman with a 48-14 win. In the last game in Waco, BU claimed a 41-12 victory over No. 12 Oklahoma in 2013. Baylor got its first win of the series with a dramatic 45-38 win in 2011 as Heisman winner **Robert Griffin III** found **Terrance Williams** for a TD with eight seconds left. Baylor and Oklahoma first met Oct. 26, 1901; the Sooners left Waco that day with a 17-6 victory. Baylor and Oklahoma met four more times before the inception of the Big 12 in 1996, playing in Waco in 1973 and at Norman in 1974, 1984 and 1989. In Big 12 play, OU leads the series 16-3.

BU LEADING NATION IN 50-POINT GAMES SINCE 2013

With its 56 points against SMU, 61 against Lamar, 70-point outburst against Rice, 63 vs. Texas Tech, 66 at Kansas and 62 against West Virginia, the Bears continued to lead the nation in 50-point outings since 2013.

COLEMAN CARRYING 'WIDE RECEIVER U' BANNER

Through eight games, junior Corey Coleman has been the nation's top receiver. He continues a long history of success for BU at the wide receiver position. Prominent alums include **Josh Gordon** (Browns), **Terrance Williams** (Cowboys) and **Kendall Wright** (Titans). Coleman currently leads the country in TD catches (20) and receiving yards per contest (147.3). Here's how Coleman's numbers stack up against some of the greats of #WRU through eight games of their breakout seasons.

RUSSELL SIDELINED FOR SEASON WITH INJURY

Through seven games, QB Seth Russell had shown he was more than capable of running America's top offense. However against Iowa State, the Garland, Texas, product suffered a neck injury that required season-ending surgery. The fourth-year junior had thrown for 2,104 yards and 29 touchdowns in his first season as a starter, and ran for 402 yards and six TDs. Individually, Russell led the FBS in passing efficiency (189.7).

COLEMAN BREAKS CAREER TD CATCH RECORD

With two more TD grabs against Iowa State, Corey Coleman set BU's career TD catch record passing Kendall Wright's career mark of 30. Now with 33 TD catches for his career, he ranks 39th all-time in NCAA history and seventh in Big 12 history. He now needs 1 more TD catches to tie Texas A&M's Jeff Fuller (34) for sixth on the Big 12 list.

BAYLOR EARNS HIGHEST-EVER RANKINGS

After starting the season 8-0, Baylor slipped to No. 4 in both the AP Top 25 and No. 3 in the Amway Coaches Poll. The Bears were ranked No. 6 in the College Football Playoff committee's first Top 25 rankings, which were released Nov. 3. Earlier this year, Baylor reached a program-high No. 2 ranking in both the AP poll. The Bears had previously been No. 3 in both 1953 and 2013. Baylor has now been ranked in a school-record 44 straight AP Polls, which is the FBS' fourth-best streak. The Bears have also been top 10 in 34 of the last 37 AP polls. Baylor had previously been as high as No. 3 in the coaches poll on Oct. 5, 2014. Baylor remains as the highest ranked Big 12 Conference team.

BAYLOR'S OFFENSIVE STREAKS

- Baylor has topped 500 yards of offense 48 times in the 60 games since 2011, which leads the nation.
- Baylor has gained 500+ yards in 27 of 34 games since 2013, including 18 games with 600+ yards in that span.
- Baylor has scored 30+ points in 48 of its last 53 contests and 40+ points in 42 of its last 53 games.
- Baylor has scored 50+ points 17 times since 2013, and 26 times since 2011, both most among all FBS teams.
- Baylor has scored in 108 straight games -- previous school record was 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 - Oct. 23, 1987.
- Baylor reached 600 yards of offense in 5 games in 2014 and has done so in 6 of 8 games of 2015. BU has 37 such games in its history (33 in Briles era).
- Baylor topped 700 yards of total offense in each of its first 3 games (SMU, 723; LU, 785 & Rice 793). BU has accomplished the feat 11 times in program history.

BAYLOR'S POWERFUL OFFENSE ALSO CRAZY FAST

Baylor is continuing a three-year period of dominance in scoring quickly. Through eight games of 2015, Baylor leads the nation in TD drives of two minutes or less (40). In 2014, Baylor's up-tempo offense led the nation in plays/game (87.5), TD drives of one minute or less (24), TD drives of two minutes or less (41, tied with Oregon) and fewest seconds-per-play in the first half (18.0). The Bears also led the NCAA in TDs of 40 or more yards (19) and TD throws of 25 or more yards (24). In 2013, Baylor's offense led the nation in seconds-per-play (16.7), TD drives of one minute or less (29), TD drives of two minutes or less (60) and most plays of 40 yards or more (37). *[all stats via ESPN Stats & Info]*

BAYLOR'S DISRUPTIVE GANGGREEN DEFENSE

BU's defensive impact has steadily improved under fifth-year D-coordinator **Phil Bennett**. Baylor's takeaways have remained constant from year-to-year, but the chart below shows the increase in sacks and tackles-for-loss during Baylor's back-to-back Big 12 championship seasons.

- Baylor is 29-1 in Waco since 2011 and 33-3 at home since 2010.
- Baylor's 29-1 record is the nation's best in the FBS since 2011 (at home field) with last loss in Waco Oct. 13, 2012
- Baylor has scored 60 or more points in 11 of its last 17 home games.
- Baylor has had 500 or more yards of total offense in 18 of the last 20 home games.

BAYLOR'S TWO-YEAR RUN OF DOMINATION

The Bears won 11 games in both 2013 and 2014. Here are notes from back-to-back Big 12 title runs.

- #AmericasTopOffense ranks in 2014: No. 1 nationally in scoring (48.2), total offense (581.5) and first downs (30.1).
- Baylor set an NCAA record in 2013 with 681 pts. in 13 games. BU's 52.4 points/game were tied for 4th-most all-time.
- Baylor was only the 2nd school to repeat as Big 12 champions - OU in '06-08.
- Baylor secured its first-ever back-to-back conference championships and the eighth conference title in school history (Southwest Conference: 1915, 1922, 1924, 1974, 1980, 1994; Big 12 Conference: 2013, 2014).
- BU tied a school-record with 8 conference victories in 2014. BU had 8 league wins in two other seasons: 1980 & 2013.
- Baylor won a school-record 11 games, claimed its second-straight Big 12 title and earned a second-consecutive trip to a BCS/New Year's Six bowl game in 2014.
- Baylor also led the FBS in total offense & scoring offense each of last 2 years, averaging 581.5 yds & 48.2 pts in 2014.

OAKMAN SETS SACK RECORD

Senior **Shawn Oakman**, a 2014 All-American and 6-9, 275-pound beast, headlines a stout front four and veteran Baylor defense. The aggressive defensive end has been labeled “the nation’s most intimidating player” by *Sports Illustrated* and described as “nearly impossible to block off the edge without help” by *Sporting News*. Oakman is ranked the No. 1 NFL Draft prospect at DE by *Lindy’s* and No. 1 senior DE prospect by *ESPN’s* Mel Kiper Jr. In 2015, Oakman has already broken the Baylor career sacks record by notching four to give him a career total of 17. He also has 11.0 TFLs this season.

ALL-AMERICAN OT DRANGO

Senior All-American tackle **Spencer Drango** is “the centerpiece of the platform BU’s offense is built upon,” per *ESPN*. The 2014 Big 12 Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year and Outland Trophy semi-finalist is ranked the No. 1 OT nationally and listed as the “Best run blocker” in the Big 12 by *Lindy’s*. Drango was named the “Top NFL Prospect” in the Big 12 (all positions) by *Sporting News*, No. 2 NFL Draft prospect among OT by *Lindy’s* and No. 2 senior OT prospect by *ESPN’s* Mel Kiper Jr. He is currently ranked No. 1 on the Outland Trophy’s Schneider Scale rankings for lineman with 134.14 points.

WORLD’S LARGEST TIGHT END

Often-publicized **LaQuan McGowan**, who turned heads nationally with an 18-yard TD reception in the 2015 Cotton Bowl, is a senior 6-7, 410-pound offensive lineman-turned tight end who wears a size 20 shoe. Listed as the back-up at TE, McGowan, who *ESPN* called a “nightmare matchup for the safeties of the Big 12,” was limited in his blocking role in spring drills to prevent injuries to his teammates. Early in 2015, McGowan has been a blocker in BU’s running game. He recorded his first TD catch of the new season against KU on Oct. 10 with an 18-yard grab.

GREAT TIME TO BE A BEAR

Over the last five years, the Baylor football program has reached never-before-seen heights.

- Baylor tallied 7+ wins in 2014 for the 5th straight season for the first time in program history.
- Baylor played in a bowl game for fifth-straight year in 2015, a first in program history.
- Baylor’s 47 wins over the last 5 seasons (7 in 2010, 10 in 2011, 8 in 2012, 11 in 2013 & 11 in 2014) are the most in program history over a 5-year span

Morris is in his 29th year in the Baylor broadcast booth and 21st as the signature voice of Baylor Athletics, while Thompson and Joe are in their 16th and 12th years, respectively. Houston-area listeners can catch the games on Newstalk 1070 AM, KNTH. In Dallas, Newstalk 660 AM, KSKY, will broadcast the games, while San Antonio-area fans can tune in for games on “The Word in South Texas” 630 AM, KSLR, while KLUP, 930 AM will also carry the game in the Alamo City market. In addition to those stations, play-by-play of the 2015 Bears will also air in Abilene (KMWX, 92.5FM), Amarillo (KNSH, 1550AM), Austin (KTXW, 1120AM), Big Spring (KBYG, 1400AM), Cameron (KTON, 1330AM), Carthage/Tyler (KXPI, 100.7FM), Fredericksburg (KNAF, 910AM), Lubbock (KFYO-AM & KKAM-AM, 790/1340), Lufkin (KYBI, 100.1FM), Ranger/Stephenville (K300BD, 107.9 FM), Ranger/Stephenville (KWBY, 98.5FM) and Temple (K265DV, 100.9FM).

Seth Russell threw for 376 yards and five touchdowns and also ran for a score to help fourth-ranked Baylor open the season with a 56-21 victory at SMU.

The two-time defending Big 12 champion Bears finally got to start fresh after the long, long offseason that followed their playoff snub last season.

SMU played its first game for new coach Chad Morris, Clemson's offensive coordinator the past four seasons. The Mustangs, who scored only 12 total points their first four games last season with a 45-0 loss at Baylor, had 21 points in the first 21 minutes.

Jay Lee had three TD catches for the Bears, who had 723 total yards.

Dual-threat quarterback Matt Davis had 166 yards passing and 115 rushing for SMU. But he was sacked on the final play of the first half with the Mustangs at the 3 and down only 28-21.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor set a school record for yards per play with 10.48.
- Baylor tied a school record with 6 TD passes in a game -- that was accomplished 3 times previously; 2007 vs. Rice, 2011 vs. TCU and 2014 vs. TCU.
- Baylor's 423 passing yards were the 3rd-most in a road game in program history and tied the 16th-most in any game in program history.
- Baylor held SMU scoreless for the final 39:03 of the game after allowing 21 points in the first 20:57 of game time -- BU closed the game on a 28-0 run.

Corey Coleman had a Baylor-record four touchdown catches, and the fourth-ranked Bears had 785 total yards in a 66-31 victory over FCS team Lamar in their home opener.

Seth Russell completed 23 of 34 passes for 342 yards with the four scores. Coleman had six catches for 182 yards.

Shock Linwood added 130 yards rushing and three TDs to help Baylor (2-0) win its 17th consecutive home game, matching second-ranked Alabama for the longest current streak.

Lamar's Joe Minden then scored on a 1-yard keeper to tie it at 21 with 4:34 left in the first half.

Less than a minute later, Russell hit Coleman in stride for a 61-yard TD. Coleman's 34-yard catch on the opening series after halftime made it 42-21.

Seth Russell matched a school record with six touchdown passes, three of his five in the first half to Corey Coleman, and No. 5 Baylor wrapped up its non-conference schedule with a 70-17 romp over Rice.

Russell threw for 277 yards and Shock Linwood ran for 158 with a score as the Bears (3-0) extended the nation's longest home winning streak to 18 games, including the first eight at their campus stadium on the Brazos River.

Baylor, the national leader in yards and points per game coming in, had 444 yards at halftime and finished with 793 heading into its Big 12 opener against Texas Tech at the home of the Dallas Cowboys.

The Owls (2-2) lost their 25th straight game against a Top 25 opponent, a streak that goes back to 1997.

Seth Russell tossed three touchdown passes, two of them to Corey Coleman, and Shock Linwood ran for 135 yards and a score as third-ranked Baylor romped to 66-7 victory over Kansas.

All three stars sat the entire second half, resting for what Baylor (5-0, 2-0 Big 12) hopes is a national title push.

Russell threw for 246 yards in his two quarters. Two of his TD strikes went to Coleman, pushing his nation-leading total to 13, and the other went to 6-foot-7, 410-pound tight end LaQuan McGowan as the Bears roared to a 52-7 halftime lead.

The quick-strike Bears scored on every possession of the first half except their last, and that was only because they ran out of time. Their first three touchdown drives all went more than 70 yards, yet none of their scoring drives required more than 3 minutes, 14 seconds.

Russell was 18-of-27 passing and ran for a score. Linwood, the nation's fifth-leading rusher, averaged more than 10 yards per carry. Coleman had seven receptions for 108 yards.

Even the Baylor defense got into the act, stripping KU QB Ryan Willis late in the first half. Xavien Howard picked up the fumble and scampered down the Kansas sideline 30 yards for a touchdown.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor finished with a season-low 644 yards of total offense, which ranked as the 26th-most in program history.
- Baylor's defense held Kansas scoreless on its final 13 drives, limiting the Jayhawks to 11 first downs in that span.
- Baylor's 28 points in the 2nd quarter tied its most ever in a 2nd quarter and tied the 4th-most in any quarter in program history.

Corey Coleman caught three more touchdowns and second-ranked Baylor won its FBS-best 19th consecutive home game, getting some measure of revenge with a 62-38 victory over West Virginia.

Coleman matched and then broke the single-season school record for TD catches, his nation-leading 16 coming halfway through the regular season for the Bears (6-0, 3-0 Big 12).

Seth Russell became the only Baylor quarterback other than Heisman Trophy winner Robert Griffin III in 2011 to throw for 300 yards and run for 100 yards in the same game. Russell threw for 380 yards with five TD passes, and ran 14 times for 160 yards with another score.

Baylor's only regular-season loss last year was 41-27 at West Virginia, and the Bears wound up the first team left out of the initial College Football Playoff.

Skyler Howard, from Fort Worth, Texas, less than 100 miles from the Baylor campus, threw four TD passes for West Virginia (3-3, 0-3).

Jarrett Stidham threw for 419 yards and three scores in his first start, Corey Coleman caught a pair of touchdown passes and No. 2 Baylor held on for a 31-24 victory over pesky Kansas State on Thursday night to keep its College Football Playoff hopes alive.

Stidham, taking over for the injured Seth Russell, also ran for a touchdown to help the Bears (5-0 Big 12, No. 6 CFP) improve to 8-0 for only the second time in school history.

The freshman quarterback's favorite target was Coleman, who caught 11 passes for 216 yards while pushing his nation-leading total to 20 touchdown receptions.

Kansas State got to 31-24 on Joe Hubener's touchdown pass to Deante Burton with 4:07 left, and Chris Callahan's missed field goal with 51 seconds remaining gave the Wildcats a chance.

But on their first play, Hubener threw a lateral to wide receiver Cody Cook, who then threw down the sideline. The sometimes-quarterback's pass was picked off by Terrell Burt, who managed to get his right foot down inbounds, and the interception stood after an official's review.

Baylor ran out the clock to drop Kansas State (3-5) to 0-5 in conference play for the first time since 1989, the first season for coach Bill Snyder on the sideline.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor is 8-0 for the second time in program history (2013).
- WR Corey Coleman (1,178 receiving yards this season) recorded the 8th 1,000-yard receiving season in program history and became the first player in program history with multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons. He moved into 4th on Baylor's single-season receiving yards list.
- Baylor has had a 1,000-yard receiver in 5 straight seasons (Kendall Wright-2011; Terrance Williams-2012; Antwan Goodley-2013; Corey Coleman and KD Cannon-2014; Cannon-2015). The Bears have had 6 1,000-yard receivers in the last 5 seasons after having just 2 1,000-yard receivers in program history prior to 2011.
- RB Shock Linwood (1,046 rushing yards this season) recorded the 12th 1,000-yard rushing season in program history and joined Lache Seastrunk (2012, 2013) as the only players in program history with multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons.
- Baylor has had a 1,000-yard rusher in 6 straight seasons (Jay Finley-2010; Terrance Ganaway-2011; Lache Seastrunk-2012, 2013; Shock Linwood-2014, 2015).
- True freshman QB Jarrett Stidham made his career-first start in place of injured QB Seth Russell and threw for 419 yards - 10th-most passing yards in a game in program history.
