STORY LINES

- Baylor faces its 1st ranked opponent of 2016 when it travels to Norman, Okla., for an 11 a.m. showdown with No. 9 Oklahoma on ABC/ESPN2.
- Baylor and Oklahoma will meet for the 26th time on Saturday. OU leads the all-time series 22-3 and holds an 11-1 advantage in games played in Norman. BU has won 3 of the last 5 games in the series.
- Baylor stayed ranked at No. 25 in both AP Top 25 and Amway Coaches Poll.
- BU's been ranked in a school-record 60 straight AP Polls, FBS' 4th-best streak.
- The Bears dropped out of the CFP Top 25 for the first time in the 15 CFP rankings history.
- Baylor is 13-4 in true road games over last 3+ years, after going 7-17 in the previous 5 years.
- BU has won 19 of its last 25 played outside of Waco, including 10 of its last 13 Big 12 away contests.
- Baylor will be looking to win 3 games in a row in the state of Oklahoma for the 1st-time since beating OSU in 1939 and 1942 and then winning at Tulsa in 1947. BU is 13-27 all-time in the state.
- BU has #AmericasTopOffense, which has led the NCAA in total and scoring offense for past 3 years.
- Averaging 541.8 yards of offense in 2016, BU is ranked 3rd in Big 12 and 6th nationally.
- Giving up just 394.8 ypg, the Bears are 3rd in Big 12 and rank 59th nationally in total defense.
- The Bears are 4th in conference and 16th in FBS in scoring offense, averaging 39.8 ppg.
- Baylor is 3rd in the Big 12 and 47th nationally in scoring defense, giving up just 25.0 ppg.
- The Bears have the Big 12's best rushing attack (278.5), which ranks 6th nationally.
- BU is 9th in FBS in team pass efficiency defense (103.74), while ranking 6th in team TFLs (8.3).
- Baylor has compiled 23 wins (23-6) in November & December since 2011 (16-5 in Nov.).
- Baylor has lost back-to-back games for just the 2nd time since 2012 – the only other time was also against TCU and Texas in 2015. BU hasn't lost 3 in a row since losing 4 consecutively in 2012.
- Baylor is 19-7 over its last 26 games away from Waco when ranked.
- Baylor is 1 of only 2 programs (Alabama) to have a win over a top-10 team in each of the last 5 years.
- BU is facing its first ranked opponent of the season at Oklahoma, but is 12-9 overall vs. AP Top 25 teams since 2011. The Bears do have a win over Oklahoma State, which is now ranked No. 17.

QUICK NOTES

- Baylor is playing its 114th season of football and 1st under acting head coach Jim Grobe.
- Baylor won at least 10 games for a 3rd-straight season, earned a program-high ranking of No. 2 and was 2015 Russell Athletic Bowl champions last season.
- Baylor returns 41 lettermen and 11 starters (4 o; 5 d; 2 st) from the 2015 squad.
- Baylor is outscoring foes 124-81 in the 2nd-halves of 2016's first 8 games and has allowed 23 points in the 4th quarter.
- 2016 marks a new era as acting head coach Jim Grobe takes the reins of the Baylor football program. Grobe's four decades on the sidelines include 20 seasons and 116 career wins as a head coach at Ohio, Wake Forest and Baylor.
- Grobe was the 1st BU coach to start his career 6-0, previous best was 4-0 by Sam Boyd (1956) & Bob Woodruff (1947).
- Including walk-ons, Baylor has played a total of 33 freshmen in 2016, 19 redshirt freshmen & 14 true freshmen.

OVERALL SUCCESS:

- Baylor opened the season 6-0 for the fourth-straight season, the only FBS team to do so.
- Baylor has won 56 games over the past 5-plus years (best in Big 12), as well as 2 Big 12 titles and 3 bowl games.
- In last 51 games BU has just 9 losses, 5 to top 15-ranked teams (and 6 away from home).
- Baylor is now bowl-eligible for a 7th-straight year for the 1st time in school history.
- Baylor has won 19-consecutive regular-season non-conference games, dating back to 2010.

#AMERICASTOPOFFENSE SUCCESS:

- While not putting up the record-breaking numbers of the past 3 years, Baylor's offense has still been potent.
- The Bears had their lowest rushing output of the season against TCU (133), but still managed 415 yards of total offense.
- BU produced 398 rushing yards against Texas, which were 10th-most in a game in program history.
- Against Kansas, the Bears raced out to a 49-0 lead thanks in part to 246 rushing yards in the game.
- The Bears ground attack was unleashed vs. Iowa State as BU had 469 yards, 5th-most in a game in program history.
- Baylor used its quick-strike, big play ability to beat Oklahoma St. with 4 TD drives of under 2 min. & 8 plays of 25+ yards.
- BU scored 38 points in the final 3 quarters vs. Rice as KD Cannon (9 catches for 213 yds.) started.
- The Bears didn't start fast against SMU (3 pts. on first 6 drives), but scored on 5 of their next 8 possessions.
- In less than a half against Northwestern State, Baylor's first team offense racked up 340 yards of offense and scored on all seven of its possessions (5 TDs, 2 FGs).
- Baylor is 2nd team in FBS history to lead nation in scoring (48.1 ppg in 2015) in 3 straight seasons (1979-81 BYU).
- #AmericasTopOffense in 2015: No. 1 nationally in Scoring (48.1) and Total Offense (616.2), 2nd in Rushing (326.7), 3rd in Pass Efficiency (170.8) and First Downs (29.5).

DEFENSIVE SUCCESS:

- For 2016, the Bears have switched to a 3-4 defense and it has had much success in the first eight games.
- BU has been especially good against the pass, ranking 9th in team pass efficiency defense (103.74), while giving up just 189.1 yards per game through the air, which ranks 1st in the league and 17th in the nation.
- On the season, the Bears have 16 takeaways, which ranks 2nd in the Big 12 and 37th nationally.
- Baylor is averaging 5.38 3-and-outs per game in 2016, which is 7th-most in the FBS.
- Baylor is allowing foes to score only 82.8 percent of the time in red zone, which is 4th-best in Big 12 and 54th in FBS.
- After giving up 14 early points, Baylor's defense held Texas to just 19 points the rest of the way.
- To beat Kansas, the Bears forced five turnovers and held the Jayhawks to 217 yards of total offense.
- BU once again rose to the occasion at Iowa State, holding the Cyclones scoreless and only 7 yards in the 4th quarter.
- Against OSU, the Bears held Mason Rudolph 60 yards below his passing ypg coming into the game (279/339.0).
- The Bears limited Rice to only 31 yards passing, the fewest by a Baylor FBS opponent since holding Arkansas to 28 yards on Nov. 10, 1990 (BU won 34-3).
- While the offense struggled early against SMU, the defense kept the game close, forcing 4 turnovers.
- Safety Orion Stewart was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week with 8 tackles and 2 INTs vs. SMU.
- Despite not forcing a turnover against Northwestern State, Baylor's defense allowed only 78 yards of offense to the Demons. For the game, Baylor forced 13 punts and 11 3-and-outs.
- Phil Bennett's defense has forced at least one turnover in 32 of its last 37 games and 63 of 73 games (89 INTs, 62 FR).
- Baylor's D has forced multiple turnovers in 46 of 73 games (with 39-7 record).
- Baylor forced at least 2 turnovers in 9 of 13 games of 2015 and has done so in 4 of 8 games in 2016.

RUSHING SUCCESS:

- For 8 games, the Bears are averaging 278.5 yards on the ground, which is tops in the Big 12 and 6th in the nation.
- BU's ground attack has been spread between 3 RBs (Shock Linwood, Terence Williams, JaMycal Hasty) and QB Seth Russell. Baylor is 1 of only 2 FBS teams with 4 players averaging 44.0 or more rushing yards per game.
- Senior RB Shock Linwood (4,056 yds.) became BU's career rushing leader vs. Rice breaking Walter Abercrombie's record of 3,665. Against KU, he set the BU career mark for rushing TDs (36).
- Linwood is the 7th player in Big 12 Conference history to reach 4,000 career rushing yards.
- Baylor has rushed for a TD in 37-straight games, longest streak among Power Five conference teams & 3rd-best in FBS.
- Baylor led all Power Five schools in rushing in 2015: 326.7 yards per game.
- Baylor's backfield has produced six 1,000-yard rushers in the last five seasons.

O-LINE EXCELLENCE:

- Baylor ranks 1st in Big 12 and 35th in FBS giving up only 1.63 sacks per game.
- BU also ranks 41st nationally and 4th in the Big 12 by allowing only 5.13 TFLs per contest.
- Despite 4 first-time starters, the wall is protecting Seth Russell and helping BU lead the Big 12 in rushing.
- Baylor's 2015 o-line led the Big 12 and ranked 15th nationally by giving up just 15 sacks in 13 games (1.15 per game).
- Baylor has accounted for 4 straight Big 12 Offensive Linemen of the Year (Spencer Drango 2015 & 2014[co], Cyril Richardson 2013 & 2012).
- BU has had at least one All-American o-lineman in seven of the last eight years.

#WIDERECEIVERU SUCCESS:

- Baylor has had 14 different players catch a pass in 2016, but is led by KD Cannon (catch in all 33 career games), who has 40 catches for 560 yards and 6 TDs.
- Since 2009 BU's receiving corps has totaled: 6 NFL Draftees, 1 Biletnikoff Award winner, 5 All-Americans, 17 All-Big 12 honors and 6 1,000-yard seasons.

SPECIAL TEAMS IMPROVEMENT:

- Acting head coach Jim Grobe has stressed specials teams throughout his tenure and the work has paid off.
- The Bears are 2nd in the Big 12, allowing only 18.62 yards per kickoff return, after ranking 7th a year ago (23.05).
- Baylor leads the Big 12 & is 5th in FBS, giving up just 1.20 yards on punt returns, after being 3rd & 12th last year (2.00).
- Meanwhile, BU ranks 6th in Big 12 and 33rd nationally with 10.59 yds per punt return, after 9th and 113th in 2015 (4.27).

RANKINGS SUCCESS:

- Baylor has been ranked in 60 straight AP Polls, the 4th-longest streak nationally (Top 15 in 49 of last 55 polls).
- Baylor has won 7 games over AP/Coaches/BCS/CFP top 10 teams since 2011.
- Baylor is 8-1 vs. AP Top 25 opponents at home over last 5 seasons.
- Baylor and Alabama are the only teams to beat at least 1 Top 10 team in each of last 5 years.
- BU is 12-9 overall vs. AP Top 25 teams since 2011.

HOME SUCCESS:

- Baylor has the nation's third-best home record since 2011 at 33-4, which is tops in the Big 12.
- In home games, Baylor is 37-6 over the last 6-plus seasons.
- Baylor is 14-3 in the \$266 million McLane Stadium, with an average scoring margin of +23.1 points.
- Baylor is averaging 48.1 points per game and 587.0 yards per game in 2+ years at the riverfront stadium.

ROAD SUCCESS: BU has won 19 of last 25 games played outside of Waco.

NEUTRAL SUCCESS: BU has won 7 of last 9 neutral-site games.

CONFERENCE SUCCESS:

- Baylor boasts the most wins (56) and conference titles (2, tied) in the Big 12 Conference over the last five-plus years.
- BU's three-year overall record of 38-9 is best among Big 12 schools, while its league mark ranks second at 25-7.

IN-STATE SUCCESS:

- BU has won 32 of its last 38 games played in Texas and is 43-9 in the state over last 5-plus years.
- Baylor is 21-7 vs. in-state schools over last 5-plus seasons and has won 14 of last 18 vs. Texas foes.

LATE-SEASON SUCCESS: BU has compiled 23 wins (23-6) in Nov. & Dec. since 2011 (7-1 in Dec.).

NFL DRAFT SUCCESS:

- Baylor had 6 players selected in the 2016 NFL Draft, 7th-most among NCAA schools and most in Big 12 or Texas.
- Baylor's 22 NFL Draft picks over the last 6 years tops all Texas schools.
- BU's 5 first-round NFL Draft picks over last 6 years is the Big 12's most.

MORE ON #AMERICASTOPOFFENSE

- Baylor led all FBS teams in TD drives of 2 min. or less in each of the last 2 seasons - 49 a year ago & 41 in 2014. The Bears have 23 such drives in the first 8 games of 2016.
- Baylor has scored 20+ points in the first half in 27 of 34 games since start of the 2014 season.
- Baylor has topped 400 yards of offense 69 times in the 73 games since 2011 — that is 2nd in the nation (Oregon, 70).
- Baylor has scored 30+ points in 58 of its last 66 contests.
- Baylor has had a 1,000-yard rusher in 6 straight seasons (Jay Finley-2010; Terrance Ganaway-2011; Lache Seastrunk-2012, 2013; Shock Linwood-2014, 2015; Johnny Jefferson-2015).
- Baylor is 49-3 over the last 6 seasons when leading at halftime and has led at the half in 20 of its last 27 games.

OFFENSIVE STANDOUTS

- In his first eight games back from an injury in October 2015, QB Seth Russell, a senior, has thrown for 1,978 yards and 19 TDs on 137-of-247 passing. Russell is 14-2 in his career as a starter. In his 16 career starts, Russell has thrown 53 TD passes (3.3 TD passes/game) and only 12 interceptions. The Garland, Texas, product is the Baylor career leader in pass efficiency (163.3) and total offense yards/play (8,507). He also ranks: second in yards/completion (16.10) and yards passing/attempt (9.240), third in TD/interception ratio (3.69) and passing TDs (59), fourth in interception percentage (.0278), sixth in completion percentage (.574) and eighth in passing yards (5,313) for his career.
- Senior RB Shock Linwood is a Maxwell, Doak Walker, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose, Senior Bowl and Rotary Lombardi watch list member. He is a veteran with 45 games played (third-most on squad) and 29 career starts (third-most on team). The Linden, Texas, native became BU's all-time leading rusher in win over Rice and now has 4,056 yards, which is fifth-most among active FBS players. He is just the 7th Big 12 rusher with 4,000 yards.
- Senior C Kyle Fuller has garnered a place on the Rimington Trophy, Outland Trophy, Senior Bowl and Rotary Lombardi watch lists in 2016. He has played 47 career games (most on team) and started 34 (most on squad). The Wylie, Texas, product is a three-year starter and helps anchor a young o-line that has allowed only 13 sacks in the first 8 games.
- Junior WR KD Cannon is on watch lists for the Biletnikoff and Tyler Rose awards. He is the most experienced receiver on the squad and ranks third all-time on school's lists for career yards-per-game (74.48) and sixth in yards-per-reception (16.61) and TDs (19) and seventh in yards (2,458). The Mount Pleasant, Texas, product has a 33-game reception streak (every game of career), but missed the ISU game with a groin injury.

DEFENSIVE STARS

- DE K.J. Smith is a fourth-year junior lineman. He is a technically sound veteran with 20 career starts and 34 games played on a young defensive line. He has played in every game over the past two seasons, including eight starts in 2014 as a redshirt freshman. He has 37 tackles, 3.0 sacks and 4.5 TFLs in the first eight games.
- Junior NB Travon Blanchard suffered a knee injury during fall camp and missed the first two games of the year. He started all 13 games a year ago earning honorable mention All-Big 12 honors from the league's coaches. The Orange, Texas, native is a quick, rangy, playmaker at hybrid linebacker/safety spot. He has made his presence known since his return with 41 tackles (28 solo), 1 sack, 7.5 TFLs and 5 PBU. He was named a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist on Oct. 24.
- Junior LB Taylor Young has been recognized on watch lists for the Bednarik, Butkus and Rotary Lombardi awards this fall. He is a returning All-Big 12 linebacker and starting WLB in 12 of 13 games in 2015. The DeSoto, Texas, product is a powerful, compact, leader with 28 starts and 33 games played. He was the 2014 Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year. Young leads the Bears with 61 tackles, 4.5 sacks and 9.0 TFLs in the eight opening games.
- DB Ryan Reid was recently selected to the Senior Bowl watch list. He is a fifth-year senior cornerback. The Dallas, Texas, native is a veteran with 30 career starts (third-most on team) and 39 career games played (sixth on squad).

LAST GAME'S LEFTOVERS

Baylor suffered its second loss of the season vs. TCU on Nov. 5. Here are some of the note-worthy items from that game.

- Baylor and TCU met for the 112th time. Baylor is now 52-53-7 in the all-time series, including a 34-31-5 mark in Waco.

- Baylor lost back-to-back games for just the 2nd time since 2012 – the only other time was also against TCU and Texas in 2015.

- Baylor's 19-play, 97-yard TD drive in the 2nd quarter was the Bears' most plays in a scoring drive since a 19-play TD drive vs. Oklahoma State on Nov. 22, 2014.

- Baylor's 121 penalty yards were a season high – the previous high was 101 penalty yards vs. SMU.

- QB Seth Russell is now 14-2 in his career as a starter. In his 16 career starts, he has thrown 53 TD passes (3.3 TD passes/game) and only 12 interceptions.

- Russell had a pair of 2-yard rushing touchdowns, giving him 8 rushing TDs on the season and 20 for his career.

- WR Ishmael Zamora caught an 81-yard TD pass from Russell in the 1st quarter, tying the 17th-longest pass in program history.

- Zamora (121 receiving yards) had his 2nd career 100-yard receiving game.

- Zamora recorded his 5th receiving TD of the season and 7th of his career.

- WR KD Cannon (5 receptions) moved into 11th on Baylor's all-time receptions list with 148, passing Lawrence Elkins (144).

- RB Shock Linwood (27 rushing yards) moved into 6th place on the Big 12 Conference's all-time rushing list with 4,056 yards, passing Oklahoma's Adrian Peterson (4,045).

- LB Taylor Young had a half sack, giving him 12.5 for his career, taking over sole possession of 9th on Baylor's all-time sacks list.

- S Chance Waz had a career-high 11 tackles and tied a career high with 7 solo stops.

NEW 3-4 ALIGNMENT TURNING BU DEFENSE INTO 'NO-FLY ZONE'

CANNON BECOMING MODEL OF CONSISTENCY AS TOP TARGET

After the loss of 2015 Biletnikoff Award winner Corey Coleman to the NFL, junior KD Cannon was expected to become Seth Russell's No. 1 target, but an injury heading into fall camp delayed the speedster's progression. Eight games into the season, Cannon has become Seth Russell's top target despite missing all of the Iowa State game with a groin injury.

OKLAHOMA SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's contest will be the 26th meeting between Baylor and Oklahoma. OU holds a 22-3 advantage in the series and a 11-1 mark over BU in games played in Norman. The Bears have won three of the last five meetings, including a victory in Norman in 2014. Last year in a top-15 contest, Oklahoma took a 44-34 victory at McLane Stadium to snap BU's 20-game home win streak. In 2014, Baylor got its first victory in Norman with a 48-14 win. Baylor got its first win of the series with a dramatic 45-38 win in 2011 as Heisman winner Robert Griffin III found Terrance Williams for a TD with eight seconds left. Baylor and Oklahoma first met Oct. 26, 1901; the Sooners left Waco that day with a 17-6 victory. Baylor and Oklahoma met four more times before the inception of the Big 12 in 1996, playing in Waco in 1973 and at Norman in 1974, 1984 and 1989. In Big 12 play, OU leads the series 17-3.

RUSHING TOUCHDOWN STREAK TOPS AMONG POWER FIVE

Baylor leads all Power-Five conference teams, after rushing for a touchdown in 37-straight games. The Bears have had at least one score on the ground in every game starting with a win over TCU on Nov. 30, 2013. BU's mark ranks third among all FBS schools, trailing only Navy (56) and New Mexico (45). Since the streak began, the Bears hold a 29-8 record with 110 (2.97 per game) rushing TDs and 8,628 (233.19 per game) yards gained on the ground.

THE BAYLOR SYSTEM IS AMERICA'S TOP OFFENSE

Baylor's unique, record-breaking system has set the standard for offense in contemporary college football. For three-straight seasons, Baylor has led the nation in both Total Offense (616.2 ypg in 2015, 581.5 ypg 2014, 618.8 ypg 2013) and Scoring (48.1 ppg in 2015, 48.2 ppg 2014, 52.4 ppg 2013), just the second program in NCAA history to do so (first since BYU 1979-81). THE BAYLOR OFFENSE: A unique, up-tempo spread attack with origins in Bill Yeoman's 'Houston Veer' (perhaps most identifiable by wide splits of receivers and a power running game); it's a balanced offense, not to be confused with more common pass-heavy spread attacks. The Baylor offense is also in use under former Art Briles assistants at Syracuse (head coach Dino Babers), Texas (offensive coordinator Sterlin Gilbert) and Tulsa (head coach Philip Montgomery).

BIG 12'S BEST HOMEFIELD ADVANTAGE

In the final years at Floyd Casey Stadium and since the opening of McLane Stadium, the Bears have been nearly unbeatable in Waco. At its new home on the Brazos River, the Bears are 14-3, which ranks as the fifth-best winning percentage (.824) for any stadium in the country. BU also leads the Big 12 and ranks third nationally in most home wins since 2011.

BAYLOR'S POWERFUL OFFENSE ALSO CRAZY FAST

After eight games it appears, Baylor will continue a three-plus year period of dominance in scoring quickly. The Bears have had 23 TD drives under two minutes in the first eight games of the year. In 2015, BU led the nation in plays per game (84.8), TD drives of two minutes or less (49), fewest seconds per play (17.7) in the first half and TD throws of 25 or more yards downfield (16). In 2014, Baylor led the nation in plays/game (87.5), TD drives of one min. or less (24), TD drives of two min. or less (41) and fewest seconds-per-play in the first half (18.0). The Bears also led the NCAA in TDs of 40 or more yards (19) and TD throws of 25 or more yards (24). In 2013, Baylor led the nation in seconds-per-play (16.7), TD drives of one minute or less (29), TD drives of two minutes or less (60) and most plays of 40 yards or more (37). [all stats via ESPN Stats & Info]

BAYLOR'S OFFENSIVE STREAKS

- Baylor has topped 500 yards of offense 55 times in the 73 games since 2011, which leads the nation.
- Baylor has gained 500+ yards in 34 of 47 games since 2013, including 23 games with 600+ yards in that span.
- Baylor has scored 30+ points in 58 of its last 66 contests and 40+ points in 48 of its last 66 games.
- Baylor has scored 50+ points 18 times since 2013, and 27 times since 2011, both most among all FBS teams.
- Baylor has scored in 121 straight games -- previous school record was 89 games from Dec. 31, 1979 - Oct. 23, 1987.
- Baylor reached 600 yards of offense in 5 games in 2014, in 8 of 13 games of 2015 and 3 of 7 in 2016. BU has 42 such games in its history (38 since 2008).
- Baylor topped 700 yards of total offense in five games in 2015 (SMU, 723; LU, 785, Rice 793; OSU, 700; UNC, 756). BU has accomplished the feat 14 times in program history.

UP NEXT

Following the game at Oklahoma, the Bears will return home for their final game at McLane Stadium in 2016. Baylor faces Kansas State on Saturday, Nov. 19. Time and TV arrangements for that game have not been announced.

Seth Russell threw four touchdown passes in less than a half and No. 23 Baylor beat FCS team Northwestern State 55-7 in their first game of 2016.

Russell was the top-rated FBS passer when he suffered a season-ending neck injury in the seventh game last season. He completed 14 of 20 passes for 163 yards with TDs to four receivers, including two tight ends. The Bears led 41-0 when he threw his last pass, a 10-yard TD pass to Pooh Stricklin with 5 minutes left in the first half.

Baylor had 498 total yards, 275 rushing and 223 passing.

The Bears scored on their first nine possessions, seven touchdowns and two field goals by Chris Callahan, and were up 55-0 before their first punt with 5 minutes left in the third quarter. Northwestern State finally scored on their ensuing possession.

Baylor led 48-0 at the half, when the Demons had 3 total yards and eight punts. For the game, the BU defense was overwhelming, holding Northwestern State to 78 total yards.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor's 48 first-half points were its 7th-most in a half in program history -- the six times scoring more points in a half have all been since 2013.
- Baylor scored 24 points in the 1st quarter, the 11th time on record (since 1964) that the Bears scored 24+ 1st-quarter points (tied for 22nd-most in any quarter).
- Baylor scored 24 points in the 2nd quarter, the 12th time on record (since 1964) that the Bears scored 24+ 2nd-quarter points (tied for 22nd-most in any quarter).
- Baylor threw touchdown passes to multiple tight ends (Sam Tecklenburg and Jordan Feuerbacher) in the same game for the first time since Sept. 8, 2007, when Justin Akers (2) and Brad Taylor (1) caught TD passes in a 42-17 win vs. Rice.
- QB Seth Russell threw 4 TD passes (4, 6, 5, 10 yards), giving him 44 career passing TDs, moving ahead of Nick Florence (41) for 3rd on Baylor's all-time passing TDs list.

Seth Russell threw for 261 yards and two touchdowns and added another on the ground, and No. 23 Baylor recovered from a slow start for a 40-13 win over SMU at McLane Stadium.

Russell and the Bears (2-0) struggled offensively in the first half and had to settle for a 6-6 tie at intermission, but they broke through with a 20-point third quarter to all but clinch their 13th straight victory over their former Southwest Conference foe.

Baylor missed on several deep shots in the first half, but Blake Lynch capped its opening march after halftime by breaking free in the right seam for a 31-yard touchdown reception from Russell, who added a 19-yard scoring burst on a scramble on the Bears' next possession. Russell finished 26-for-47 and was intercepted twice.

Orion Stewart intercepted two passes for Baylor -- one of which came in the end zone and stopped a promising SMU threat, the other of which he returned 33 yards for a touchdown to push Baylor's lead to 26-6.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor intercepted 3 passes in a game for the first time since a 41-38 win at TCU on Nov. 30, 2013.
- Baylor was held scoreless in the 1st quarter for just the 2nd time in its last 31 games -- the only other time in that span was Dec. 5, 2015 vs. Texas.
- Baylor had a 19-play drive in the 2nd quarter that tied its most plays in a single drive since a 21-play TD drive at Oklahoma State on Oct. 29, 2011. BU also had 19-play drives at Oklahoma on Nov. 10, 2012 and vs. Oklahoma State on Nov. 22, 2014.
- Baylor forced 4 turnovers, improving to 24-1 since 2008 when forcing 3+ turnovers.
- WR KD Cannon (93 receiving yards) became the 9th player in program history to reach 2,000 career receiving yards (2,037).
- Cannon had a career-high 10 receptions, giving him 123 career receptions, which moved him into 14th on Baylor's career receptions list, passing David Gettis (116) and Brandon Whitaker (120).

KD Cannon caught nine passes for 213 yards and two touchdowns.

Rice (0-3) led 3-0 after the first quarter before JaMycal Hasty scored on a 16-yard run, and Cannon caught a 10-yard pass from Russell to put the Bears up 14-3 midway through the second quarter.

The Owls closed to 14-10 with 3 minutes left before halftime, but that would be as close as they would get.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor held Rice to 31 passing yards, the fewest by a Baylor FBS opponent since the Bears held Arkansas to 28 passing yards on Nov. 10, 1990 (BU won 34-3).
- Baylor's 638 yards of total offense were the 30th-most in a game in program history.
- RB Shock Linwood had 57 rushing yards, setting a new school record with 3,676 career rushing yards. He passed Walter Abercrombie (1978-81) with 3,665 yards.
- WR KD Cannon's 213 receiving yards were the 5th-most in a game in program history.
- Cannon became the first player in program history with 3 games of 200+ receiving yards.

Seth Russell threw four touchdowns passes, including an 89-yarder to Chris Platt for the go-ahead score in the third quarter, and No. 16 Baylor held on to beat Oklahoma State 35-24 in the weather-delayed Big 12 opener for both teams.

Ishmael Zamora had career highs of 175 yards receiving and two touchdowns on eight catches in his season debut for the Bears after a three-game suspension. Platt also had two TDs.

Baylor earned its fourth consecutive 4-0 start in its first big test after a light nonconference schedule.

The game was stopped by lightning for about 1 1/2 hours after the Bears scored on the opening series.

The Cowboys (2-2) lost three fumbles, including the second by Justice Hill after he picked up a first down at the Baylor 2 with Oklahoma State trailing 28-24 with 9 minutes remaining. Hill, who had 122 yards rushing, was originally ruled down, but the call was overturned on review.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The game was delayed for 95 minutes due to lightning with 13:22 remaining in the 1st quarter. Play was stopped at 6:39 p.m. CT and resumed at 8:14 p.m.
- Baylor and Oklahoma State met for the 35th time. Baylor now trails 16-19 in the all-time series, including an 8-6 mark in Waco.
- Baylor has won 3 straight games against Oklahoma State for the first time since winning 9 in a row from 1915-42.
- QB Seth Russell threw for a season-high 387 yards, which tied for 20th on BU's all-time single-game list.
- S Orion Stewart had his 3rd interception of the season and 9th of his career (tied for 14th on BU all-time list), adding a 25-yard return for 232 career interception return yards (moves into 3rd all-time at BU).

Chris Callahan hit a 19-yard field goal as time expired and No. 13 Baylor rallied from 14 down in the fourth quarter to beat Iowa State 45-42.

Shock Linwood rushed for 237 yards for the Bears, who moved to 2-0 in the Big 12 for the fourth year in a row.

Baylor (5-0, 2-0), playing without star wide receiver KD Cannon because of a groin injury, trailed 42-28 before using scoring drives of 86 and 84 yards to tie it up.

Baylor's defense finally stiffened in the fourth quarter and Seth Russell — who was 12 of 22 passing for 178 yards — drove Baylor 83 yards to set up Callahan's chip shot.

Joel Lanning threw for 261 yards and two touchdowns for Iowa State (1-4, 0-2). Mike Warren added a season-high 130 yards rushing for the Cyclones.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor overcame a halftime deficit to win for the first time since trailing 31-27 at the break in a 61-58 win over TCU on Oct. 11, 2014.
- Baylor rushed for 469 yards, 5th-most in a game in program history.
- RB Shock Linwood ran for a 2-yard TD in the 2nd quarter, tying Alfred Anderson's (1980-83) school record with 35 career rushing touchdowns. Linwood already holds Baylor's all-time rushing record with 3,916 career rushing yards.
- Linwood (237 rushing yards) had the 4th-most rushing yards in a game in program history -- it was the 10th 200-rushing yard game in program history.

Seth Russell threw two touchdowns and ran for two more while playing only the first half, Ryan Reid returned the first of his two interceptions for a score and No. 11 Baylor remained undefeated with a 49-7 win over Kansas.

Shock Linwood's 4-yard score on the first play after a Kansas fumble was his 36th career rushing touchdown and broke a tie with Alfred Anderson for the most in school history. Linwood was already the career rushing leader for the Bears (6-0, 3-0 Big 12).

Kansas (1-5, 0-3) had five turnovers that led to 21 points for the Bears.

Reid's 64-yard interception return ended the first offensive drive for Kansas and gave the Bears a 14-0 lead. He returned a pick in the second quarter 52 yards to the Jayhawks 19, but Baylor then had the first of its three missed field goals.

The Bears led 42-0 after Russell's last pass, a 4-yard TD to Ishmael Zamora with 1:45 left in the first half.

Russell, 14-0 when starting for Baylor, was 9-of-22 passing for 144 yards. He led the Bears with 68 yards rushing, and got flipped after he leaped in the end zone for a 26-yard TD when converting a fourth-and-3 to make it 21-0 in the first quarter.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Baylor improved to 46-43-4 all-time in Homecoming games, including 7 straight wins.
- Baylor had back-to-back 1-play TD drives in the 2nd quarter. KD Cannon caught a 59-yard TD pass from Seth Russell and Shock Linwood had a 4-yard rushing TD. It was the first time BU had back-to-back 1-play TD drives since Oct. 5, 2013 vs. West Virginia.
- Baylor's 170 combined interception return yards broke the school record of 160 vs. Rice in 1956.
