WICHITA STATE 76, OKLAHOMA 73 DECEMBER 10, 2016 • POSTGAME NOTES

- Oklahoma (6-3) fell to Wichita State (9-2) in the 79th All-College Classic, 76-73. The non-conference meeting took place at Chesapeake Energy Arena in Oklahoma City. The Sooners now own a 4-1 record at "The Peake" under head coach Lon Kruger.
 - Senior guard **Jordan Woodard** scored a career-high-tying 28 points with seven rebounds, four assists and two steals. Woodard's 28 points are the most by a Sooner this season and represents the 12th 20-plus point performance in his career. Bringing his career scoring total to 1,302 points, Woodard became just the 21st Sooner to score over 1,300 points in a career. He surpassed both Blake Griffin (1,278) and Cameron Clark (1,284) in OU's all-time scoring rankings, moving up to No. 21 on the all-time scoring list.
 - Woodard went a perfect 10-for-10 from the free throw line, marking just the second time in his career he has shot perfect from the charity stripe on a minimum of 10 attempts. He previously shot 10-for-10 against Kansas on Jan. 8, 2014.
 - Sophomore guard **Christian James** scored 15 points with six rebounds in his fourth-consecutive game of double-digit scoring. Sophomore guard **Rashard Odomes** added 10 points in his sixth double-digit performance of the season.
 - Junior forward **Khadeem Lattin** posted three points, eight rebounds, two steals and four blocks. Lattin has tallied multiple steals and multiple blocks in five of his last six games and has seven games of two or more blocks this season. With 129 career rejections, Lattin is three blocks away from moving into fourth on OU's career blocked shots list.
 - The Sooners surrendered a season-low 10 turnovers against a Shocker team that entered the game forcing 16.3 a game.
 - Oklahoma shot 27-of-34 (.794) from the free-throw line, sinking its second-most foul shots of the season.
 - OU led the Shockers, 39-37, going into halftime. The Sooners have led at the halftime break in eight of their nine games this season.
 - Next up, Oklahoma welcomes the Memphis Tigers to the Lloyd Noble Center for just the second time in program history. The Sooners and Tigers meet on Saturday, Dec. 17 at 11:30 a.m. CT on CBS. The Tigers own a 6-1 all-time record against the Sooners, winning the sole previous meeting in Norman, 80-78, on Dec. 13, 1997. Saturday's game will be televised nationally on CBS. The Sooners have not hosted a CBS game at the Lloyd Noble Center since Jan. 22, 2005 vs. Texas.
 - The Sooners opened the 2015-16 season with their first-ever win against the Tigers at FedEx Forum in Memphis. The 84-78 victory was fueled by a 30-point performance from Buddy Hield. Jordan Woodard added 15 points, nine rebounds and seven assists.
