K-STATE HOSTS NINTH-RANKED OKLAHOMA SATURDAY ON FOX

Kansas State looks to shake off a 26-6 loss to No. 6 TCU on Saturday as the Wildcats continue Big 12 Conference play at home against the ninth-ranked Oklahoma Sooners. Saturday's game at Bill Snyder Family Stadium, which kicks at 3 p.m., will be shown nationally on FOX with **Gus Johnson** (play-by-play), **Joel Klatt** (analyst) and **Jenny Taft** (sideline) on the call.

The game can also be heard across the 40-station K-State Sports Network with **Wyatt Thompson** (play-by-play), former K-State quarterback **Stan Weber** (analyst) and **Matt Walters** (sidelines) calling the action. Coverage will also be available on Touchdown Radio, SiriusXM channel 81 in addition to the TuneIn app. Live stats are available at kstatesports.com, while Twitter updates (@kstate_gameday, @KStateFB) will all be a part of the coverage.

A LOOK AT K-STATE

- Guided by Hall of Famer **Bill Snyder**, who is in his 26th year at the helm, the Wildcats are looking to defeat a top-10 team at home for the first time since 2006.
- K-State's defense continues to put in solid work as the Wildcats head into the weekend with the league's No. 2 unit in scoring defense and No. 3-ranked total defense.
- K-State held its first four opponents to under 21 points for the sixth time under Snyder, joining the 1994, 1996, 1998, 2000 and 2002 teams.
- K-State also enters the OU game ranked 15th nationally in turnover margin (+6), 39th in scoring defense (21.0 points per game) and 45th in total defense (362.5).
- The Wildcats are led by linebacker **Trent Tanking**, who is seventh in the Big 12 with 50 tackles, while defensive tackle **Will Geary** has a team-best 6.5 tackles for loss and three sacks, both ranked seventh in the Big 12.
- Kendall Adams** has been a ballhawk this year with two interceptions – including a pick-six – and a fumble-return touchdown this season. Adams also ranks third on the team with 40 tackles.
- Cornerbacks **D.J. Reed** and **Duke Shelley** are tied for sixth in the Big 12 with six passes defended. Reed has 25 career passes defending in just his second season.
- Senior **Jesse Ertz** enters this week ranked second in the nation in yards per completion (16.91) and seventh in yards per attempt (9.30), but it was **Alex Delton** who earned his first-career start against TCU.
- Ertz also leads the team with 336 rushing yards and has 1,399 in his career to rank third in school history in career rushing yards by quarterbacks.
- Six different Wildcats have scored on the ground this year, while four different receivers have carded a touchdown catch, led by **Dalton Schoen**'s three.
- Schoen, who had 128 yards and touchdowns of 82 and 12 yards at Texas, leads the Wildcats with 286 yards through the air.

A LOOK AT THE SERIES

- Oklahoma leads the all-time series, 74-19-4, including an 11-5 edge in the series since Big 12 play began in 1996.
- K-State is 2-3 against Oklahoma in the last five meetings, with both of those wins coming in Norman as the Wildcats have not defeated the Sooners in Manhattan since 1996.
- This will be the seventh-straight season K-State will face a ranked Oklahoma team and the third when the Sooners are ranked in the top 10. K-State is 2-4 against OU during that stretch with a win over the sixth-ranked Sooners in 2012 and another over No. 11 OU in 2014.

OKIE CATS

- Kansas State boasts seven players on its current roster from the state of Oklahoma, include two that have earned starts in the defensive backfield in **Cre Moore** (Broken Arrow) and **AJ Parker** (Bartlesville).
- Additionally, running back **Justin Silmon**, who is closing in on 1,000 career rushing yards, is a former walk-on from Tulsa (Union HS).

CONFERENCE CALL

- Saturday's matchup features a pair of the best programs since the Big 12 was formed in 1996 as K-State and Oklahoma are two of only three teams to notch at least 100 league wins.
- Oklahoma tops the list with 131 Big 12 wins over the last 22 years, while the Wildcats are third with 106.

- Additionally, K-State ranks third in the conference in winning percentage since the start of 2011 at .649 (37-20), trailing only Oklahoma (.789; 45-12) and Oklahoma State (.702; 40-17).
- During that stretch, the Wildcats are 21-8 (.724) at home in Big 12 play.

SUSTAINABLE SUCCESS

- Kansas State is in rare company in college football as the Wildcats rank in the top 20 in wins among FBS programs over the last 23 seasons.
- Since 1995, K-State has picked up 186 victories, which is tied for 19th in the nation with Tennessee.
- Among current Big 12 teams, only Oklahoma (3rd; 212), Texas (13th; 199) and TCU (15th; 191) rank higher.

THE HALL OF FAMER

- The architect of the "greatest turnaround in the history of college football," **Bill Snyder** was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2015.
- Snyder is just the fourth person in the history of college football to be inducted as an active coach.
- Snyder has compiled an amazing 205-108-1 (.656) record in 26 seasons at K-State as he is one of just six coaches to reach the 200-win mark and coach at only one school.

- Holding 166 more victories than any other coach in K-State history, Snyder ranks first in the FBS in wins among coaches at their current schools and second in total wins among active coaches.
- Additionally, Snyder has 119 conference wins to stand as one of four coaches with 100 Big 8/12 victories (Tom Osborne [153], Bob Stoops [121], Barry Switzer [100]).

TURNOVER TURNAROUND

- A year after finishing minus-3 in the turnover battle, K-State tied for fourth in the nation with a plus-13 turnover margin in 2016.
- It was the Wildcats' best national finish in turnover margin since ranking third in 2012, while it marked an 84-spot jump from a tie for 88th the year prior.
- K-State enters this week tied for 15th nationally in turnover margin at plus-6.
- The Wildcats have gained 11 turnovers – six fumbles and five interceptions – while only committing five.

DRAWING FIRST BLOOD

- Since 1990, K-State is 163-32 (.836) when scoring first.
- K-State finished the 2016 season with a 5-2 mark when scoring first and is 18-4 in that department over the last four seasons.
- Under **Bill Snyder**, K-State is 150-25 (.857) when scoring first, including a 3-1 mark this season.

QUICK OUT OF THE GATE

- Kansas State started games on the right side of the scoreboard in 2016, outscoring opponents 95-54 in the opening 15 minutes.
- That mark improved to 248-137 through the first half and 336-184 after three quarters.
- Through six games in 2017, K-State has outscored opponents 123-67 in the first half, including a 82-30 margin in the second quarter alone.

LEADING AT THE HALF

- K-State earned an 8-1 record in 2016 when taking a lead into halftime with its only blemish being a loss at West Virginia.
- Under **Bill Snyder**, the Wildcats are 175-10 (.948) when leading at halftime, including a 56-3 (.950) mark in Snyder's second tenure, which began in 2009.
- The Wildcats are 3-0 this season when leading at halftime and are riding a nine-game winning streak when leading at the break.

FILLING THE BILL

- Attendance at K-State games has been at an all-time high over the last five years as K-State has recorded 37-straight sellouts.
- K-State finished second in the nation in percentage of capacity filled in 2013, 2014 and 2015, and fourth in 2016 at 103.84-percent (more on page 45).
- Twenty-two of the largest 25 crowds in stadium history have come since 2013.

THESE CATS ARE SMART

- K-State has 10 players on its roster that have already obtained their undergraduate degrees, a figure that is tied for 14th in the nation.
- The list includes: **Brogan Barry** (DB), **Jesse Ertz** (QB), **Jayd Kirby** (LB), **Matthew McCrane** (PK), **Reid Najvar** (C), **Sean Newlan** (DB), **Drew Scott** (LS), **Dayton Valentine** (TE), **Nick Walsh** (P) and **Tanner Wood** (DE).
- The Wildcats have also been by far the best in the conference as they have 83 Academic All-Big 12 honorees over the last three years, which is 20 more than the team in second place.

CATS TOPS IN NON-OFFENSIVE TDs

- K-State is the nation's best in non-offensive touchdowns over the last 19 seasons as it has 109 since 1999, including **D.J. Reed's** punt return score in the season opener and two by **Kendall Adams** against Charlotte via a 30-yard interception return and a 46-yard fumble return.
- K-State's two defensive touchdowns currently rank 17th in the nation.
- Since 1990, the Wildcats are 60-17 when scoring on special teams and 20-1 when scoring on special teams and defense, including an 18-0 mark under **Bill Snyder**.
- The Cats have had at least five non-offensive touchdowns in five of the last six years and in 16 of the 18 seasons since 1999.

Of the 109 non-offensive TDs since 1999, 37 have been punt returns, 36 interception returns, 25 kickoff returns, 9 fumble returns and 2 missed/blocked field goal returns.

NON-OFFENSIVE TD RECORDS

- Under head coach **Bill Snyder**, K-State is 72-21 (.774) when scoring a non-offensive touchdown, while the Cats are 53-14 (.789) since 1999 in that department.
- Since Snyder returned to the sideline in 2009, K-State is 28-7 (.800) in this same category.

OFFENSIVE NOTES GROUND ATTACK

- K-State leaned heavily on its running game throughout 2016, particularly during the second half of the year.
- The Cats broke the school record in yards per carry (5.27) and ranked third in rushing yards per game (231.8).
- Dating back to last season, K-State has hit the 200-yard mark on the ground in 11 of its last 15 games, including each of the final seven contests of 2016.
- K-State also had four 300-yard games in 2016, the most by the Wildcats since 2003.
- This year, K-State rushed for 304 yards against Charlotte, another 201 yards at Vanderbilt and 225 yards against Baylor.
- K-State enters the weekend third in the conference in rushing offense.

AERIAL ASSAULT

- While the Cats are known to have a powerful rushing attack, the 2017 squad has some weapons through the air as the unit works to achieve balance.
- In the 2017 opener, **Jesse Ertz** threw for a career-high 333 yards and tied the school record with four passing touchdowns against UCA.
- His passer rating of 319.8 was a new school record and the highest in the nation in week one, while he also became the first player under **Bill Snyder** to throw three 50-plus yard touchdown passes in the same game.
- K-State enters this week ranked sixth nationally in yards per completion (16.19).

PROTECTING THE FOOTBALL

- Kansas State tied for fifth in the country last season in turnovers lost (12), while the Wildcats only threw five interceptions to rank fifth in the country.
- A year after tossing 13 picks, K-State's minus-8 interception differential from 2015 to 2016 ranked third nationally among Power 5 teams behind Maryland (minus-21) and Nebraska (minus-12).
- The Wildcats have only lost five turnovers this year, one of which came on a punt return, which is tied for ninth nationally and tops in the Big 12 entering play this week.

LONG DRIVES

- In the era of quick-strike offenses in college football, K-State remains a team that likes to possess the ball.
- Of K-State's 64 scoring drives in 2016, 39 were seven plays or longer, including 19 of 10 or more plays.
- Nineteen scoring drives a year ago lasted at least five minutes with a 17-play, 8:32 drive at Oklahoma being the longest.
- K-State had three scoring drives of 10 plays or more against Charlotte, but the Wildcats have been more of a quick-strike offense this year as nine of their 19 touchdown drives have been four plays or less.
- Against Central Arkansas, K-State tallied three touchdown drives of three plays or less.
- At Texas, the Wildcats covered long distances with touchdown drives of 97 and 75 yards – both of which came in seven plays or less.

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

- K-State has been one of the best red zone teams over the past few years as the Wildcats are the only team to finish in the top-15 nationally in red zone offense in 2014, 2015 and 2016.
- The Cats finished the 2016 campaign 10th in the nation by converting on 91.9-percent (57-of-62) of red zone trips.
- Since the beginning of 2014, K-State has converted on 186-of-203 red zone attempts (.922) with 135 touchdowns. Included in that stretch was a nation-leading scoring streak of 56-straight trips that was snapped in 2016.
- In their last 56 wins since 2011, the Cats are 258-for-282 (.915) in red zone chances with 190 touchdowns, while four of their non-scoring trips have come via kneel downs to close out victories.

IN ELITE COMPANY

- Quarterback **Jesse Ertz** is one of four signal callers in school history to throw for 2,000 yards and rush for 1,000 yards in a career, joining **Michael Bishop** (1997-98), **Eli Roberson** (2000-03) and **Collin Klein** (2009-12).

- Ertz, who has 1,399 career rushing yards, ranks third in school history in rushing yards among quarterbacks. He is also tied for third in career 100-yard rushing games by quarterbacks behind Klein (10) and Roberson (8).
- Ertz ranks third in school history among all players in career rushing yards per attempt at 5.46, only trailing running backs **Darren Sproles** (6.11; 2001-04) and **James Johnson** (5.55; 2006-07).

AIRING IT OUT

- Although he used his feet for a majority of 2016, **Jesse Ertz** has been out to prove that he can sling in 2017.
- In the season opener against UCA, Ertz broke the school record for single-game passing efficiency at 319.8, bettering the previous mark of 300.9 by **Allen Webb** against North Texas in 2005. Included in his total was four passing touchdowns, which tied the school record.
- The Mediapolis, Iowa, native is 14th in school history in career passing yards at 2,685.
- Additionally, Ertz is ninth in K-State history in career passing efficiency (129.49).
- Ertz enters play this week ranked second nationally in yards per completion (16.91) and seventh in yards per attempt (24.45).

SUNFLOWER STARTER

- Quarterback **Alex Delton** recorded his first-career start against TCU, setting career highs in attempts, completions, passing yards, long pass and rushing attempts.
- A product of Hays, Kansas, Delton became just the seventh Kansas native to start under center for **Bill Snyder** and the first to originally come to K-State as a scholarship player since **Dylan Meier** in 2004.

CLOSE TO 1,000

- Three Wildcats are closing in on hitting 1,000 career yards.
- Running back **Justin Silmon** has 894 career rushing yards as he is 106 yards shy of becoming the 29th player in school history to reach the 1,000-yard mark for a career.
- Receivers **Byron Pringle** and **Dominique Heath** have 885 and 830 career yards, respectively. They are looking to join a list of 30 other 1,000-yard career receivers.
- Pringle is trying to join a list of six other former community-college receivers to hit the 1,000-yard mark for a career at K-State. The last to accomplish the feat was **Brandon Banks**, who had 1,754 yards between 2008 and 2009.
- A product of Tampa, Florida, Pringle has made the most of his catches this year as his 25.4-yard average ranks third in the nation.

HE'S SCHOEN WHAT HE CAN DO

- A third-year member of the program who came to K-State as a walk-on, sophomore **Dalton Schoen** has been the Wildcats' most consistent receiver this year.
- The Overland Park, Kansas, native leads the team with 286 yards and three touchdowns on just 13 catches, good for a 22.0-yard average to rank eighth nationally.
- Of his 13 receptions, four have gone for at least 23 yards, including touchdown catches of 70 and 82 yards.
- His 70-yard touchdown came on his first-career catch against Central Arkansas, the longest by a Wildcat on their first-career catch since 2001.
- His best came thus far was at Texas when he caught five passes for 128 yards and two scores, featured by the 82-yard strike, which was the ninth-longest pass play in school history.

- His 128 yards were the fourth-most by a Wildcat underclassman in school history.
- He also needs just one more touchdown to tie for third in school history among sophomores.

DIMEL DOES IT ALL

- Although he plays fullback, **Winston Dimel** has turned into an offensive threat for the Wildcats.
- Dimel has 20 career rushing touchdowns, just three shy of entering K-State's top-10 list. He is one of only 15 players in school history with at least 20 rushing touchdowns.
- Additionally, he has 22 touchdowns overall in his career to sit four away from the top-10 in that category.
- The Manhattan product has averaged 20.5 yards on his 18 career receptions, tied for the fourth-highest mark in school history among players with 18 or more catches.
- Additionally, Dimel's 369 career receiving yards is tied for 13th in school history among running backs/fullbacks.

YOUNG TALENT

- Left tackle **Scott Frantz** has started all 19 career games, beginning with his redshirt freshman season of 2016.
- Frantz's 19 starts are the most by a Wildcat underclassman (Fr. or So.) left tackle since 1989, six more than **Barrett Brooks** (1992-93).
- Of the 351 total starts at left tackle since 1989, only 57 have been made by underclassmen (16.2-percent), but 33.3-percent of those are represented by Frantz.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

STOUT SCORING DEFENSE

- Kansas State enters the week allowing only 21.0 points per game, which is second in the Big 12.
- The Wildcats held each of their first four opponents under 21 points, marking the first time they have accomplished the feat in 15 years and just the sixth time since 1990.
- The other five times the Wildcats allowed 21 or less points in each of the first four games were 1994, 1996, 1998, 2000 and 2002.

LIMITING THE PASSING GAME

- The Cats enter the OU game fourth in the Big 12 in passing defense by allowing 238.2 yards per game.
- Additionally, K-State is third in the league in pass efficiency defense (121.2).
- Kansas State surrendered only 58 passing yards against Charlotte, the fewest since Nebraska could only muster 39 yards on Nov. 18, 2000.

TOUGH AGAINST THE RUN

- Kansas State was stout in rushing defense in 2016, ranking 11th nationally and leading the Big 12 by allowing only 115.0 yards per game.
- The Wildcats finished in the top 15 in the country in run defense for the first time since 2002. They did so by limiting opponents to less than 125 yards on eight occasions, including five times in Big 12 play.
- The Wildcats have surrendered less than 125 rushing yards in four of the last five games, including 98 yards to a TCU team that was averaging 200-plus rushing yards per game entering the contest.
- The 98 yards by TCU were the fewest the Wildcats surrendered to a ranked opponent since No. 20 Oklahoma State could only muster 49 yards in 2015.

PICKING THEM APART

- After recording only five interceptions in 2015, K-State reversed the trend last year with a Big 12-leading 16 picks, a mark that tied for 14th in the nation.
- K-State's plus-11 up-tick in interceptions from 2015 to 2016 was the highest turnaround among Power 5 teams.
- The Wildcats have notched at least one interception in 32 of the last 43 games and have totaled five this year.
- K-State also had three pick-sixes last year, including ones by current Wildcats **D.J. Reed** (Texas Tech) and **Duke Shelley** (Oklahoma State), and another this year by **Kendall Adams** (Charlotte).
- Reed snagged the team's first interception of 2017 against Central Arkansas and had one on the first play at Texas. He became the first Wildcat with an interception on the first play of the game since **Ty Zimmerman** did so against Missouri in 2011.

LBs STEPPING UP

- Although it is a group that is deep with players that shined on special teams in their careers, K-State did not return any starts at linebacker in 2016.
- The Wildcats were one of three teams in the nation – but the only one from a Power 5 school – to not return a single start at linebacker this year. The next closest among Power 5 schools was Florida, which returned 12 total starts.
- Although lacking experience, the linebackers have risen to the occasion as **Trent Tanking** leads the Wildcats, ranks seventh in the Big 12 and tied for third in conference-only games in tackles.
- The former walk-on from Holton, Kansas, is also averaging 6.0 solo stops per game to rank 10th in the nation.
- Fellow linebacker **Jayd Kirby** is second on the team and ranks 15th in the league with 42 tackles.

BATTING IT AWAY

- **D.J. Reed** is tied for sixth in the Big 12 with six pass breakups, which includes a pair of interceptions.
- A product of Fresno, California, Reed has totaled 25 career passes defended, the most by a Wildcat since **Randall Evans** had 35 from 2011-14.

ADAMS WITH A RARE FEAT

- **Kendall Adams** recorded a 30-yard interception return touchdown and a 46-yard fumble return touchdown against Charlotte, a feat that hadn't been accomplished by a Wildcat in nearly 18 years.
- Adams was the first K-State player with touchdowns of both varieties in the same game since **Dyshod Carter** did so against Missouri in 1999.
- Additionally, he is just the third player in Big 12 history to accomplish the feat, joining Carter and Texas Tech's Paul McClendon, who did so against North Texas in 2001.
- For his effort against the 49ers, Adams picked up Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors.

GEARY LEADS THE LINE

- A former in-state walk-on, **Will Geary** has recorded a team-best 36 career starts, which includes 31 of the last 32 games.
- The Topeka, Kansas, native is riding a streak of four-straight games with at least one tackle for loss, including a season-best 3.0 TFLs against Baylor.
- Geary has 6.5 TFLs this year to rank seventh, while 5.0 TFLs have come against Big 12 foes to tie for first in conference-only games.

/// WILDCATS IN THE NFL ///

With the NFL season in full swing, K-State has 12 players on either active rosters or practice squads. Of the 12 players, six are on offense and six are on defense. The longest-tenured former Wildcats include **Terence Newman** (15th year; Minnesota), **Darren Sproles** (13th year; Philadelphia) and **Jordy Nelson** (10th year; Green Bay).



K-State currently has four players from last year's squad on NFL rosters, including third-round draft pick by Cincinnati **Jordan Willis** and seventh-round pick by Minnesota **Elijah Lee**, who was signed to San Francisco's active following week one. Their selections extended K-State's Big 12-leading streak with at least one player selected in the NFL Draft to 24 straight years. Additionally, **Deante Burton** (Atlanta; practice squad) and **Charmeachelle Moore** (LA Chargers; injured reserve) were signed as rookie free agents following the draft.

Of the 12 former Wildcats on NFL roster, four have made Pro Bowl appearances, including specialists **Tyler Lockett** (Seattle) and Sproles in 2015. Newman and Nelson have also been named to the Pro Bowl during their careers.

- **Will Geary**, who ranks second on the team in career tackles with 141, ranks 14th in program history in career tackles among interior defensive linemen.
- Additionally, Geary has 22.5 career tackles for loss, which ranks sixth in school history among interior defensive linemen.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

SCORING IN THE THIRD PHASE

- Kansas State has been far and away the best team among FBS programs over the last decade when it comes to scoring via a kickoff or punt return, and thus ranked as the top collective special teams unit in the nation entering the 2017 season according to Phil Steele.
- The Wildcats have a combined 43 kickoff- and punt-return touchdowns since 2005, 15 more than any other FBS school over the last 13 seasons.

DEFENSE IN THE THIRD PHASE

- On the flip side, K-State has been just as consistent in terms of kickoff and punt coverage as the Cats have not allowed a kickoff-return touchdown in the last 56 games (LAST: vs. Louisiana, 9/7/13) or a punt-return score in 43 games (LAST: at Iowa State, 9/6/14).
- Kansas State finished the 2016 season in the top 25 nationally in both punt-return defense (17th; 4.14) and kickoff-return defense (23rd; 18.4).
- The Cats have yielded just 17.4 yards per kickoff return to rank second in the Big 12 and 18th in the country.

RETURNERS RANK HIGH

- K-State returners have routinely enjoyed success under head coach **Bill Snyder**, and 2016 was no different as both **Byron Pringle** and **Dominique Heath** ranked highly in the nation in the return categories.
- Pringle ranked seventh nationally with a 28.7-yard kickoff-return average en route to First Team All-Big 12 honors.
- Heath, an Honorable Mention All-Big 12 returner, finished the year tied for seventh nationally in punt-return scores.
- **D.J. Reed** is making his case for being the next great K-State returner as he raced 96 yards on the season-opening kickoff against UCA before going 62 yards for a score on a punt return later in the contest as he was named the Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Reed enters this week ranked 11th in the nation by averaging 14.3 yards per punt return.

KICKOFF-RETURN STREAKS

- Kansas State is currently riding a pair of streaks in terms of kickoff returns as the Wildcats have returned a kick for a touchdown in each of the last 12 seasons – the longest streak in the nation by five years.
- **Byron Pringle** extended the streak in 2016 when he returned a kickoff to paydirt 99 yards against Texas Tech.
- Since head coach **Bill Snyder**'s return in 2009, K-State has returned 17 kickoffs for touchdowns as opposed to only four in his first tenure, which lasted 17 years.

- For his effort last season, Pringle earned First Team All-Big 12 honors as a kick returner, marking the 11th-straight year a Wildcat returner has earned all-conference accolades. Additionally, a K-State kick returner has earned first team honors six times in the last eight years.

McCRANE IN THE RECORD BOOK

- **Matthew McCrane** will finish his career highly on many of K-State's career kicking lists.
- McCrane current ranks first in school history and fifth nationally by making 87.3-percent (48-of-55) of his career field goals.
- The two-time All-Big 12 place kicker ranks first in school history in career extra-point percentage (99.1-percent) and is in K-State's top-10 in career field goals made (2nd; 48) and extra points made (5th; 106).
- He also ranks sixth overall in school history but third among kickers with 250 career points scored.

CONNECTING FROM DEEP

- A product of Brownwood, Texas, **Matthew McCrane** has been one of the best in K-State history in long-distance field goals.
- By connecting from 51 yards against TCU, McCrane made his fifth-career field goal of 50 or more yards to tie with **Jeff Snodgrass** (2005-06) and **Martin Gramatica** (1994-95, 1997-98) for the school record.
- Additionally, it was McCrane's third 50-yard field goal this season to tie both Snodgrass (2006) and Gramatica (1997) for first in K-State history.
- Against Texas, McCrane drilled a career-long 54-yarder, which was tied for the eighth-longest field goal in school history, was the longest in the Big 12 this year and tied for the fifth-longest in the nation this season.

WALSH A DEPENDABLE PUNTER

- The Wildcats also have an experienced punter in **Nick Walsh**, as the 2015 All-Big 12 punter and two-time member of the Ray Guy Award watch list ranks fifth in school history in average (42.0), while he ranks sixth in yards (7,731) and attempts (184).
- His current season average of 43.0 ranks sixth in K-State history, while he is fourth in the Big 12 in average and second in Big 12-only games (46.4).
- Walsh's average is aided by a career-long 64-yarder against TCU, the longest by a Wildcat since **Mark Krause** booted a 67-yarder against Iowa State in 2013.

- Kansas State went on a 17-play touchdown drive in the first half, which lasted 8 minutes and 32 seconds... It was the Wildcats' longest drive in terms of plays and time since also going 17 plays in a 9-minute, 17-second touchdown drive last year against Baylor.
- The Wildcats went 2-for-2 in the red zone with one touchdown and one field goal... K-State is perfect on its last 53 attempts, which is the nation's longest active streak... Of those 53 attempts, the Wildcats have come away with 36 touchdowns... The last time K-State has not converted a red-zone trip into points was nearly a year ago — Oct. 17, 2015 — against Oklahoma.

• **Dominique Heath** tallied seven receptions for 101 yards and a touchdown... He set new career highs in receptions and yards... His previous highs were five receptions against Iowa State last year and 65 yards at Stanford earlier this year.

• Sophomore **Duke Shelley** recorded his first-career interception on a tipped pass in the third quarter... K-State's secondary now has four interceptions in 2015 after only one a year ago... It also marked the third-straight trip to Norman the Wildcats recorded an interception as **Danzel McDaniel** had a pick-six in 2014 after **Ty Zimmerman** had one in 2012.

K-STATE FALLS AT NO. 19/20 OKLAHOMA

NORMAN, Okla. — A high-powered Oklahoma offense proved to be too much for Kansas State, as the Wildcats fell 38-17 to the Sooners before 86,049 fans at Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. Oklahoma's victory marked the first win by a home team in the series since the Sooners did so in 2009.

K-State fell behind early, 14-0, in the first quarter and was never able to dig itself out. The Wildcats allowed Oklahoma to rack up 287 yards in the first half, including 200 through the air, as the Sooners averaged 8.7 yards per play and held a 24-10 lead at the break.

K-State was forced to replace starting quarterback **Jesse Ertz** just one play into the third quarter and wasn't able to recover behind backup **Joe Hubener**, who led the offense to just one score. The Big 12's top ranked defense surrendered 500 yards of offense for the second consecutive game, as **Baker Mayfield** threw for four touchdowns, including two to **Dede Westbrook** after intermission.

Offensively, it was a game of halves for K-State's quarterbacks. Ertz, a junior, had an efficient first half, completing 8-of-14 passes for 68 yards. Despite only playing two quarters, Ertz was K-State's leading rusher, going for 40 yards on seven carries and one touchdown. In the second half, Hubener took command through the air, completing 12-of-23 passes for 157 yards, including a 54-yard touchdown pass to sophomore receiver **Dominique Heath**.

The Wildcats' running back by committee effort was slowed mightily by Oklahoma's front seven. K-State managed only 110 yards on the ground. Senior **Charles Jones** ran it a team-leading eight times for 34 yards, while sophomore **Justin Silmon** rushed six times for 35 yards.

The receiving corps featured seven different Wildcats this week, led by Heath, who had a career day by hauling in seven of his nine targets for 101 yards and a touchdown. Senior **Deante Burton** caught four passes for 35 yards, while sophomore **Byron Pringle** grabbed three balls for 43 yards. Jones and redshirt freshman **Isaiah Zuber** also pitched in a pair of catches for 12 and 14 yards, respectively.

The Wildcats finished with 335 yards of total offense for the second consecutive week, with 225 coming through the passing attack. K-State ran 69 plays compared to OU's 65 and averaged 4.9 yards per play, while also winning the time of possession battle by nearly two minutes.

Defensively, K-State was spread out trying to corral Oklahoma's offensive weapons. Mayfield was 25-of-31 for 346 yards and four touchdowns on the day, throwing three alone to Westbrook. The Sooners gashed K-State for 510 yards of total offense, but were held to 138 yards on the ground. Sophomore running back **Joe Mixon** led the way out of the backfield for OU, carrying it 19 times for 88 yards.

Sophomore safety **Kendall Adams** paced all K-State defensive players with 11 total tackles, including seven solo. Junior linebacker **Elijah Lee** and senior safety **Dante Barnett** both followed Adams with 10 tackles apiece, while senior defensive end **Jordan Willis** secured nine tackles, including one for loss. Sophomore cornerback **Duke Shelley** forced the game's lone turnover, his first career interception, in the third quarter. The takeaway was the K-State defense's 10th of the season, pushing the team turnover margin to +7.

BILL SNYDER

Head Coach

26th Year - William Jewell '63

Precise. Intense. Tireless. Accomplished. Dedicated. Caring. 200-Game Winner. Hall of Famer. Kansas State head coach **Bill Snyder** is all of these and much more.

To understand the full picture of Snyder, it is necessary to acknowledge his values, sincerity and warmth, along with the concern he shows for the people around him — all qualities that solidify his reputation as an innovator and mentor in college athletics.

The architect of the “greatest turnaround in college football history” returned to the sidelines in 2009 with hopes of revitalizing a program that he once built, piece by piece, into a national force. And, after eight seasons back in charge, he has done just that — and then some.

Over the past eight years under Snyder, K-State has totaled 66 victories — an average of 8.25 wins per year — advanced to seven-straight bowl games, won a conference championship in 2012 and finished fourth or better in the ultra-competitive Big 12 Conference in four of the last six seasons. Additionally, he became just the 26th coach in the history of college football to reach 200 career wins and only the sixth to do so while coaching at the same school for his entire career with a victory over Kansas in 2016.

Turning around a program not only once, but twice, is one of the biggest reasons why Snyder became just the fourth person all-time to be elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as an active coach. The man who said, ‘No,’ to those who said it couldn’t be done in Manhattan, Kansas, was enshrined in the hall in December 2015.

Snyder’s squad in 2016 was picked to finish eighth in the Big 12 Conference race, and to him and his Wildcat team, that was just fine. All they did was finish 9-4, including a 6-1 mark over the final seven games. The stretch was capped by a victory over Texas A&M in the Texas Bowl, the program’s seventh-straight bowl game and 18th under the hall of fame coach. In fact, only Georgia Tech and USC joined K-State as teams that started 3-3 and finished with nine wins in 2016.

The 2016 squad was spearheaded by All-American defensive end **Jordan Willis**, who was the fifth player under Snyder’s watch earn Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year honors. Willis led six players named First Team All-Big 12 performers by the league’s coaches, the second most in the conference behind league-champion Oklahoma.

The Cats were put to the ultimate test in 2015 as virtually everyone outside of the Vanier Family Football Complex had concluded the season to be a failure in the middle of November. The difficulty of withstanding a large personnel turnover from the previous season was compounded by injuries at multiple positions early in the season, namely at quarterback and in the secondary. Following yet another rally that fell short at Texas Tech, the Wildcats were reeling, standing a 3-6 and suffering through a six-game losing streak.

With their backs firmly against the wall, the Wildcats trailed to Iowa State, 35-14, at halftime and saw a five-year bowl streak slipping away. However, Snyder’s resilient group fought back and scored 10 points over the final 42 seconds of the contest to earn a 38-35 win and kick start a stretch of three-straight wins to end the season and become bowl eligible for a sixth-straight campaign.

Following the win against Iowa State, K-State routed its in-state rival, Kansas, for a seventh-straight season and made another fourth-quarter comeback, this time against West Virginia, for a 24-23 win to earn another bowl berth. The in-season turnaround in 2015 was one of the best in school history, rivaled only by Snyder’s 2002 and 2013 squads. With the feat, K-State became just the sixth Power 5 team in the 12-game schedule era (2006) to stave off bowl elimination in at least three-straight games (2-6 or 3-6 record). Additionally, the Wildcats became just the third team since 1980 (joining 2011 Illinois and 2015 Indiana) to have a six-game losing streak yet finish the season with bowl eligibility.

Act Two of the renowned career started in 2009 when the Wildcats went 6-6 prior to a 7-5 campaign in 2010 and a berth in the inaugural Pinstripe Bowl. K-State’s climb back into the nation picture continued in 2011 as the Cats went 10-3, finished No. 8 in the BCS standings and earned their first Cotton Bowl invitation since 2001.

The bar was raised again in 2012 as Snyder led the Cats to their third conference championship in school history. Kansas State, which won its first 10 games of the season and finished the regular season at 11-1 with an 8-1 mark in Big 12 play, tied the school record for overall wins and conference victories while also ascending to No. 1 in the BCS rankings following its 10-0 start. Snyder went on to win the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award as well as top Big 12 coach honors for the second straight season following the Cats’ memorable 2012 season that culminated with a berth in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

Named the 32nd head football coach at K-State on Nov. 30, 1988, and again as the 34th on Nov. 24, 2008, Snyder has amassed a 205-108-1 (.656) record during his tenure with the Wildcats, including a 119-82-1 (.587) mark in Big 8/12 games. His 202 victories are nearly five times the man in second place on K-State’s all-time coaching victories list and tied for 22nd in FBS history, including a No. 1 ranking among active coaches at their current schools. Additionally, he is the 14th person in FBS history to be a head coach for at least 25 years at one school and never coach at another.

During his three-year hiatus, Snyder remained involved with the university and is currently a member of several halls of fame, while the long-time mentor is also involved in many organizations, and both of those lists are on page 58 of the 2016 K-State Football Media Guide.

Snyder, 77, received his B.A. from William Jewell in 1963. He earned his M.A. from Eastern New Mexico in 1965. As a player, he was a three-year letterwinner as a defensive back at William Jewell. Snyder and his wife, **Sharon**, have two sons (**Sean** and **Ross**) and three daughters (**Shannon**, **Meredith** and **Whitney**). They also have eight grandchildren, **Sydney**, **Katherine**, **Tate**, **Matthew**, **Alexis**, **Gavin**, **Kadin** and **Tylin**, and one great-grandson, **D.J.**

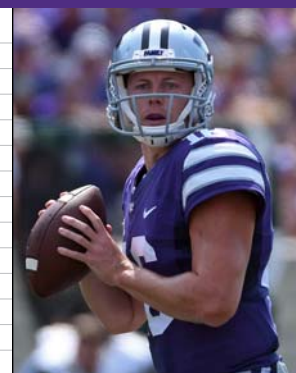

► Game Notes

• Jesse Ertz notched a new career high in passing yards, bettering his 207-yard output at Stanford in last year's season opener, while his four touchdown passes were double his previous career high of two last season against Missouri State.

• Ertz recorded an efficiency rating of 319.8, which broke the single-game school record... The previous record was 300.9 by Allen Webb against North Texas in 2005.

• Byron Pringle carded three catches for 121 yards and one touchdown... It marked his third-straight 100-yard receiving game as he became the first Wildcat with three-straight games with over 100 receiving yards since Tyler Lockett ended his career with five-straight such games in 2014.

• Isaiah Harris joined Pringle with a 100-yard receiving game as he notched 118 yards... It was the first time K-State had two 100-yard receivers since Tyler Lockett (164 yards) and Curry Sexton (104 yards) against UCLA in the 2015 Alamo Bowl following the 2014 season.

• D.J. Reed carded a 62-yard punt return touchdown in the second quarter... On UCA's next possession, Reed carded his fourth-career interception... It marked the first time a Wildcat had a punt-return touchdown and an interception in the same game since Terence Newman did so against Missouri in 2002.

• Not only did Dalton Schoen make his first-career start, but his first-career catch was a 70-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter.

CAPTAINS LEAD IN 55-19 WIN OVER UCA

MANHATTAN, Kan. — The K-State football captains led by example in the Wildcats' 55-19 season-opening win over Central Arkansas at Bill Snyder Family Stadium. Jesse Ertz set a K-State single-game record for passer rating (319.8). D.J. Reed picked off a pass and returned a punt for a touchdown, Trent Tanking led the defense in tackles and Dalton Risner helped anchor a 500-yard effort by the offense as K-State rolled to a win.

HOW IT HAPPENED

On the opening kickoff of the 2017 season, Reed set up the Wildcat offense on the Central Arkansas goalline with a 96-yard return. The Wildcat offense took control at the four-yard line and handed the ball to sophomore running back Alex Barnes who punched it in for the first score of the game.

Following a field goal for each team, Central Arkansas marched 75 yards to tie the contest at 10. Led by sophomore Carlos Blackman and a pesky option attack, the Bears rushed for 158 yards in the first half, including a 37-yard touchdown run to even the tally.

Up just one in the second quarter (17-16), K-State responded by scoring 21 unanswered points, including a pair of passing touchdowns Ertz, its senior quarterback who threw four in the game, and a 62-yard punt return for a score by Reed. Kansas State went into the locker room at the half with a 38-16 lead and never looked back.

In the second half, the Wildcats continued to add to the lead, as Ertz connected with sophomore Isaiah Harris on a 69-yard pass to extend the lead to 48-19. Ertz exited the game entering the fourth quarter, setting a new K-State record for passing efficiency in a game (319.8), previously set by Allen Webb in 2005 (300.87).

K-State's surge included scoring on five consecutive offensive possessions, outscoring Central Arkansas 45-9 after the first quarter.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Wildcats were led by Tanking, the senior linebacker, who recorded nine total tackles in the game. The K-State defense forced Central Arkansas into two turnovers — including an interception by Reed — both of which led to K-State touchdowns.

K-State racked up 519 total yards on offense, including 333 through the air. Highly efficient on offense, the team averaged 11.04 yards per play, and exhausted the Central Arkansas defense.

Game Notes

- By scoring 55 points for the second-consecutive week, the 2017 Wildcats became just the third team in school history to eclipse the 50-point barrier in the first two games of a season, joining the 1998 and 2012 teams.
- Five different Wildcats recorded a rushing touchdown, marking the first time since September 16, 2000, against Ball State, that five different Wildcats reached the end zone on the ground.
- Kendall Adams returned an interception 30 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter followed by a 46-yard fumble return touchdown in the second quarter... It was the first time a Wildcat had a pick-six and a fumble-return touchdown in the same game since Dyshod Carter did so against Missouri in 1999.
- A week after becoming the school's 21st career 2,000-yard passer, Jesse Ertz moved into 17th place in school history with 2,266 career passing yards... He also recorded 76 rushing yards rushing against Charlotte, moving into 23rd place in school history in career rushing yards at 1,174.
- With two field goals, Matthew McCrane has 40 career field goals as he moved into second place in school history... The record is 54 by Martin Gramatica (1994-95, 1997-98)... He also moved into eighth place in school history with 218 career points, passing Tyler Lockett (2011-14), who had 212.
- Isaiah Zuber carded team-highs of seven catches for 73 yards on Saturday, both career bests.

CATS POUNCE ON TAKEAWAYS, RUSH PAST 49ERS

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Kansas State jumped out to an early advantage behind the strength of the rushing attack and the opportune defensive play of Kendall Adams and never looked back, as the No. 19 Wildcats dropped the Charlotte 49ers, 55-7, at Bill Snyder Family Stadium. In the win, K-State nearly reach the 500-yard mark in total offense – including 304 yards on the ground – and scored 55 points for the second week in a row.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The No. 19 Wildcats (2-0) were led by a Wildcat defense that accounted for 14 points, as they were able to stifle the 49ers to just 92 total yards in the first half. The defense allowed a total of 58 passing yards in the game, and held the 49ers to 3.17 yards per play.

Offensively, K-State came out of the gates with an exuberant rushing attack, starting with back-to-back scoring drives through the ground. The 136 rushing yards in the first quarter established a tempo for the Wildcats as they were able to open up the offense later in the game, totaling 493 yards in the game. In all, five different Wildcats found the end zone on the ground including Alex Barnes, who led all players with 99 rushing yards.

OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE GAME

The rushing trio of Barnes, Jesse Ertz and Winston Dimel led a Wildcats' backfield that accounted for a total of 304 rushing yards in the game. Ertz' 35-yard TD scamper in the first quarter marked the longest rush from scrimmage in the game.

Through the air, Ertz closed the game 16-for-21 for 178 yards and tallied 13 rushes for 76 yards. Sophomore Isaiah Zuber led the charge in receiving, bringing in a career high seven catches for 73 yards.

DEFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE GAME

The offense wasn't the only side of the ball that got on the scoreboard. On the second Wildcat defensive possession of the game, Adams jumped a pass and took it to the house for 30 yards. In the second quarter, Adams was able to get into the end zone a second time, this time on a 46-yard fumble recovery. Adams' two touchdowns marked the first time a K-State player returned a fumble and an interception for a touchdown since Dyshod Carter vs. Missouri in 1999.

Senior Cre Moore nabbed his first career interception in the fourth quarter, wrangling a tipped pass and forcing the third K-State turnover in the game. Jayd Kirby paced the Wildcat defense with six total tackles in the game and one assisted tackle for loss. K-State did not record any sacks in the game.

NO. 18 K-STATE COMES UP SHORT AT VANDY

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Senior quarterback **Jesse Ertz** came up a yard short on fourth down with 52 seconds left at the Vanderbilt 12-yard line, as the Commodores held on for a 14-7 win on to hand the Wildcats their first loss of the season before 40,350 at Vanderbilt Stadium.

The loss spoiled the spirits of an estimated 17,000 K-State faithful that descended upon Nashville to watch the Wildcat take on the Commodores for the first time since 1984.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Following opening possession three and outs by both teams, Vanderbilt drove down the field behind the strength of their air attack, including a 38-yard pass from quarterback **Kyle Shurmur** to wideout **Jared Pinkney**. The big play setup a 2-yard touchdown pass for the Commodores, as the score marked the first of the game, and the first time K-State did not score first this season.

Despite trailing for the first time this season, K-State responded with a confident 13-play drive, led by Ertz. The offense marched down the field and converted a fourth-and-one that resulted in a 15-yard touchdown rush by Ertz. The next score would come 27 minutes later, in a decisive turn of events that would decide the game.

In the fourth quarter, both the Wildcats and Commodores would commit their first turnovers of the season, as the ball was turned over on three consecutive drives. Ertz threw his first two interceptions on subsequent K-State drives, with the latter resulting in a one-yard Shurmur rushing touchdown that proved to be the difference.

K-State would have one last chance in the closing minutes to even up the score, but Ertz left short on fourth and eight and Vanderbilt prevailed, 14-7.

DEFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE GAME

The K-State defense stood particularly strong on third down in the first half, holding the Commodores to convert 2 of 8 third downs, including a sack by **Will Geary**. Geary's sack marked his first of the season, and what looked to be a fumble recovery return for a touchdown by **Kendall Adams** before being overturned after review.

- K-State earned a victory to begin Big 12 play for the first time since a 32-28 victory at Iowa State in 2014... In the 22-year history of the Big 12, the Wildcats hold a 11-11 (.500) record in Big 12 openers... Kansas State is now 14-8 (.636) in Big 12 home openers.

- Jesse Ertz once again moved up both the career rushing and passing charts... With his 95 rushing yards, Ertz now has 1,395 career rushing yards to rank 19th in school history, including third among quarterbacks, the latter passing **Michael Bishop** (1,314; 1997-98)... He also threw for 119 yards to give him 2,461 in his career, moving from 16th to 15th in school history in career passing yards.

- Junior fullback **Winston Dimel** scored one touchdown... He now has 20 career rushing touchdowns, the 15th player in school history to record 20 rushing scores in a career... He is now four away from entering K-State's career top-10 list.

- **Reggie Walker** blocked a 44-yard Baylor field goal attempt in the second quarter... It was Walker's first-career blocked kick and the Wildcats' first blocked field goal since Marquel Bryant did so in the 2016 Liberty Bowl (after 2015 season) against Arkansas... Immediately preceding the blocked kick, senior defensive end **Davis Clark** recorded his first-career full sack.

- **Tanner Wood** registered a personal season-high six tackles, one for loss, and two pass breakups... The two pass breakups were a new career-high... His six tackles were his best effort since registering six at Baylor on Nov. 19, 2016.

CATS OPEN BIG 12 SLATE WITH WIN OVER BEARS

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Quarterback **Jesse Ertz** threw for a score and ran for another and place-kicker **Matthew McCrane** connected on all four field goal tries as K-State defeated the Baylor Bears, 33-20, in its Big 12 season opener at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

HOW IT HAPPENED

K-State received the opening kickoff and had a sense of urgency early, scoring on their first possession only 1:43 into the game, propelled by an **Alex Barnes** 38-yard run down the Baylor sideline. The Barnes rush led to a K-State touchdown on an acrobatic reception from sophomore **Isaiah Zuber**.

The only turnover for the Wildcats would come on a punt return, which provided Baylor the football in the red zone. With Baylor threatening, the K-State defense came in clutch with a sack on third down and a blocked 44-yard field goal on fourth down.

On the following Wildcat possession, K-State marched down the field in a six-play, 73-yard drive capped off by a 1-yard **Winston Dimel** touchdown rush. The Wildcats added a field goal to go into halftime with the lead, 20-3.

In the second half, Baylor running back **John Lovett** broke off a 74-yard rush against the Wildcat defense, bringing the score to 20-13. The Wildcat offense stalled on consecutive possessions before the defense recovered a fumble in Baylor territory. Ertz would get the offense rolling again with a 15-yard touchdown rush to push the lead to 27-13.

Baylor responded with a 70-yard touchdown pass to Denzel Mims to pull within a touchdown again (27-20) in the fourth quarter, but the Cats never relented.

Leading in the fourth quarter, the Wildcats would call upon McCrane to tack on two field goals, including a 49-yarder to make it a multi-possession game.

K-State accounted for 344 yards of total offense, 225 of which came on the ground.

- **Alex Delton** came into the game in the third quarter and immediately made an impact, rushing for a touchdown on his third play... He ended the game with 79 rushing yards, bettering his previous career high of 53 yards last year against Kansas... He was 2-of-5 passing for 30 yards... He surpassed his career passing yardage total of 11 yards on his first completion, a 23-yarder to **Dalton Schoen**.
- **Dalton Schoen** carded five receptions for 128 yards and two touchdowns... It was the first time a Wildcat had multiple touchdown receptions in a game since **Kody Cook** snagged two against Louisiana Tech in 2015... His first touchdown reception was an 82-yard strike in the second quarter, the ninth-longest pass play in school history and the longest in Schoen's career.
- **D.J. Reed** picked off a pass on the first offensive play of the game... It was Reed's fifth career interception, while he was the first Wildcat to record an interception on the first play of the game since **Ty Zimmerman** against Missouri in 2011.
- **Matthew McCrane** connected on a career-long 54-yard field goal to open the game's scoring... It was tied for the eighth-longest field goal in school history and was the longest since **Anthony Cantele** also made a 54-yarder in 2011.
- It was the fourth overtime game in K-State history, which is now 2-2 when going to overtime... It was the Wildcats' first overtime game since a triple-overtime win over Louisiana Tech in 2015... It marked the first overtime road game in school history

K-STATE OUTPACED BY TEXAS IN DOUBLE OT

AUSTIN, Texas – Running back Chris Warren III's 2-yard run in the second overtime lifted Texas to a 40-34 victory over Kansas State at Texas Memorial Stadium.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The K-State defense came prepared early as Texas quarterback Sam Ehlinger came out slinging on the first play from scrimmage of the game, but was intercepted by safety **D.J. Reed**. Reed was able to jump the deep Texas pass, and record the sole Wildcat takeaway of the game. Following the interception, the Wildcats were able to get into scoring position on their second offensive possession, as kicker **Matthew McCrane** drilled a 54-yard field goal to put K-State on the scoreboard first.

After holding the Longhorns on a fourth-down attempt, K-State was able to march the ball 97-yards down the field on the strength of an 82-yard touchdown pass from quarterback **Jesse Ertz** to wide out **Dalton Schoen**. Ertz connected with Schoen across the middle of the field, and Schoen was able to use his speed to outrun the Texas defenders.

The second quarter served as a shootout between the teams, as there were 35 points scored in the quarter. The Longhorns connected on a misdirection pass from Ehlinger to Warren, who was able to find open space on a wheel route, giving Texas the lead going into halftime, 21-17.

In the second half, Ertz left the game with an injury, and was replaced by sophomore **Alex Delton**. Delton added a rushing spark, that led to his second career rushing touchdown on a two-yard scat that found the end zone. The Wildcats would add a McCrane field goal on the subsequent possession.

Leading 27-24 with only minutes remaining, Texas was able to get into scoring position to knot the game at 27 behind a 34-yard field goal by Joshua Rowland.

With the game tied at 27, K-State was forced to punt with under a minute left. The Longhorns marched down the field and attempted a 45-yard field goal from the right hash mark, that sailed right of the uprights. The game was tied at 27 at the end of regulation.

In overtime, Texas received possession first and scored on their first play from scrimmage, on a strike from Ehlinger to Jerrod Heard. K-State responded with an eight-yard rush from Delton to force a second overtime at 34-34. The Longhorns would hold the Wildcats to a missed 53-yard field goal, and score a game-winning touchdown on the subsequent drive

• Alex Delton made his first-career start on Saturday, rushing for 39 yards on 19 carries, while throwing for 146 yards on 11-of-29 aim... He became the seventh Kansas native to start under center for Bill Snyder and the first to originally come to K-State as a scholarship player since Dylan Meier in 2004.

• AJ Parker earned his second-career start but first at nickelback this afternoon, carding a career-high eight tackles... He earned his first-career start in the Charlotte game at cornerback.

• Place kicker Matthew McCrane made 2-of-2 field goals today from distances of 38 and 51 yards... He now has five career field goals made of 50 or more yards to tie for the school record with Jeff Snodgrass (2005-06) and Martin Gramatica (1994-95, 1997-98)... Three of those 50-yarders have come this year to also tie the school record with Snodgrass (2006) and Gramatica (1997)... McCrane now has 250 career points as he moved into sixth place in school history overall.

• Senior linebacker Trent Tanking recorded a career-high 13 tackles on Saturday... His previous career high was 11 last week against Texas... It marked the third time this season he has reached double digits in tackles.

• Senior defensive end Tanner Wood ended the game with four tackles, one sack and a pass breakup... He now has four pass breakups this season, the most by a Wildcat defensive lineman since Ryan Mueller had six in 2013.

NO. 6 TCU TOPS CATS AFTER WEATHER DELAYS

MANHATTAN, Kan. — In a game that was delayed more than three hours due to lightning, spanning two separate delays, No. 6 TCU remained unbeaten behind the strength of 395 total yards on offense and topped K-State, 26-6, at Bill Snyder Family Stadium Saturday.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Following a three-hour delay prior to kickoff, the first two offensive possessions for the Wildcats resulted in punts, with the second possession setting TCU up in scoring position. The Horned Frogs took advantage of the field position, scoring on six rushing plays for 36 yards that was capped off by a Kenny Hill seven-yard touchdown scamper to put the first points on the board. The Horned Frogs added a field goal to end the first quarter with a 10-0 advantage.

K-State attempted an answer in the second quarter spurred by a forced fumble by the Wildcat defense. The fumble recovery by D.J. Reed would be the team's ended up as the lone takeaway of the game, but lead to a Matthew McCrane field goal. TCU would go into halftime with a 13-3 lead.

On the first possession of the second half, the Horned Frogs were able to march down the field in 4:59 on 13 plays, with a one-yard rush from Sewo Olonilua out of the Wildcat capping a 75-yard drive.

Following a second lightning delay with 12:49 in the fourth quarter, TCU expanded on their lead on a seven-play, 65-yard drive that was capped off with another rushing touchdown by Olonilua.

TCU out-gained the Wildcats, totaling 395 total yards in the game, including 297 through the air. K-State accounted for 216 total yards, and 10 first downs in the game. Neither team registered a touchdown through the passing attack.

BILL SNYDER FAMILY STADIUM

50TH YEAR – 1968-2017



Renamed in honor of legendary head football coach Bill Snyder by a proclamation of the Kansas Board of Regents on Nov. 16, 2005, Bill Snyder Family Stadium is hosting its 50th season of Wildcat football this fall.

Originally named KSU Stadium, the facility was built at a cost of \$1.6 million and financed from student fees, athletics gate receipts and contributions. The stadium opened its doors Sept. 21, 1968, with a 21-0 shutout of Colorado State. The original seating capacity was set at 35,000, and an expansion in the summer of 1970 added 4,000 permanent bleachers on the east side and 3,000 temporary bleachers on the west side.

Following the 1998 season, the addition of a deck and sky suites on the east side of the stadium increased capacity to more than 50,000. On Nov. 11, 2000, 53,811 fans witnessed Kansas State's 29-28 win over Nebraska. It remains the largest crowd ever to witness a sporting event in the state of Kansas.

Multi-million dollar upgrades to the Vanier Sports Complex were complete in 2006, including the installation of new video and message boards, including a 23' X 61' ProStar VideoPlus display in the south end zone in 2006.

Bill Snyder Family Stadium's most recent changes include a new playing surface - AstroTurf's Gameday Grass 3D infill system - and new restroom additions to the east side view level in 2011, a \$75 million project to construct the new West Stadium Center in 2013, while the most recent change is the new Vanier Football Complex, with full completion in time for the 2016 season.
