OU POSTGAME NOTES

GENERAL NOTES

- Oklahoma improved to 87-18-7 all-time against Oklahoma State, including 40-7-5 in Stillwater. It was the 112th matchup between the schools, tying OSU with Texas for the most games for OU against one opponent.
- OU's 87 wins against Oklahoma State are its most against one opponent and the second most in FBS history against one program.
- The Sooners improved to 15-1 against the Cowboys when both teams are ranked in the AP poll and 13-0 when OU is the higher ranked team.
- Oklahoma has won its last three games in Stillwater by a combined margin of 146-99.
- The Sooners have won 15 straight true road games, the longest active streak in the country and the second longest in program history. OU has also won 13 straight true road contests in Big 12 play, tying the conference mark set by Texas from Oct. 2003 to Oct. 2006.
- The Sooners registered 785 yards of offense, tied for the fourth most in school history and their second most since 1988.
- Oklahoma's 10.3 yards per play rank as the fourth-highest figure in program history.
- Tonight's 114 combined points represent the most in Bedlam history.
- With tonight's victory, Lincoln Riley became the fourth Oklahoma head coach (out of 22) to win at least eight games in his debut season, joining Jim Tatum (8 in 1946), Barry Switzer (10 in 1973) and Chuck Fairbanks (10 in 1967). Riley also joins Switzer and John Blake (1996) as the only coaches to beat Texas and Oklahoma State in his debut season.
- The Sooners have won their last 10 games in the month of November.
- Oklahoma is 23-9 when ESPN's College Gameday is on site, including 12-2 in true road matchups. OU has won all six times that Gameday has been at the Bedlam game.
- OU is 12-3 all-time as the No. 11 team in the AP poll with six straight wins and victories in 10 of the past 11 such contests.
- OU has won 21 of its last 22 Big 12 games dating back to the 2015 season. Its only loss came at the hands of Iowa State (ranked No. 14 this week) on Oct. 7.
- After tonight, OSU is now 13-2 in its last 15 games decided by 10 points or fewer since 2014.
- Baker Mayfield's 84-yard TD strike to Marquise Brown in the second quarter was the ninth-longest pass play in OU history and marked third time the Sooners have completed a pass of 80+ yards this season (most in nation), which sets a single-season school record. It also marked OU's fourth play of at least 80 yards this season, most in the country (all have resulted in touchdowns).
- Oklahoma has six interceptions on the season and has turned them into a total of 31 points (four touchdowns and a field goal). The lone interception that did not lead to points was Robert Barnes' pick on the final play of the game.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB BAKER MAYFIELD

- Set school records with 598 passing yards, previously held by Landry Jones (554 at West Virginia, 11/17/12), and in single-game total offense with 589, breaking his own school record of 572 (vs. Tulsa, 9/19/15).
 - Tied for sixth in single-game passing yards in Big 12 history and eighth in single-game total offense.
 - Recorded his second career 500-yard passing game and fourth career 400-yard passing game, all of which have come at OU.
 - Has thrown a touchdown pass in a school-record 35 consecutive games (every contest of his OU career). That's the second-longest streak in Big 12 history (Texas Tech's Graham Harrell had a streak of 36 from 2006-08). He's thrown at least two TD passes in a Big 12-record 22 straight contests (68 TDs to 13 interceptions during the stretch). It is tied for the second-longest streak nationally since at least 1996.
 - His 36 pass attempts tonight give him 1,025 for his Sooner career, passing Jason White (990) for third in Oklahoma history. His 1,365 career attempts surpass TCU's Trevone Boykin (1,356) for eighth in Big 12 history.
 - His 24 completions give him 936 for his collegiate career, passing Kansas' Todd Reesing (932) for sixth in Big 12 history.
 - His five TD passes give him 104 for his OU career and 117 for his Big 12 career to pass Texas' Colt McCoy (100) for third in conference history.

- Mayfield improved to 13-0 in true road games as a Sooner, completing 287-of-403 passes (71.2 percent) for 4,295 yards (330.4 per game) and 45 touchdowns against just eight interceptions (5.6-to-1 ratio) for a pass efficiency rating of 193.6. He has averaged 14.96 yards per completion and 10.7 yards per attempt. Mayfield has also rushed for 10 scores in those outings.
- Mayfield is 11-0 in Big 12 road games at OU. He's completed 241-of-329 passes (73.3 percent) for 3,722 yards (338.4 per game) and 39 touchdowns against just six interceptions (6.5-to-1 ratio) for a pass efficiency rating of 203.8. He has averaged 15.4 yards per completion and 11.3 yards per attempt. Mayfield has also rushed for nine scores in those outings.
- Has three career games with at least six touchdowns responsible for; Saturday was his first with 5 TD passes and a TD run in the same contest.
- Threw for 387 yards and three touchdowns and added a rushing score in the first half. The 387 yards set a school record for passing yards in a half, breaking Sam Bradford's mark of 350 against North Texas in 2007 (also first half).
- Mayfield's 198 yards in the first quarter rank as the second most in OU history for an opening quarter behind Sam Bradford's 202 against TCU in 2008.

WR MARQUISE BROWN

- Set a school record with 265 receiving yards on a career-high nine receptions, breaking the mark of 232 set by Dede Westbrook last season against Texas. Brown's receiving total also ranks ninth in single-game efforts in Big 12 history.
- His 178 yards in the first half tied a school record for most receiving yards in a half (Juaquin Iglesias in first half vs. Kansas in 2008 on 10 catches).
- Had a career-high two touchdowns.

RB RODNEY ANDERSON

- Led OU with 111 rushing yards and a touchdown and registered his third consecutive 100-yard game.
- Added his second career receiving touchdown on a 43-yard score.

TE MARK ANDREWS

- Recorded his third career 100-yard receiving game (tied for 10th most in OU history) with three receptions for 102 yards.

WR JEFF BADET

- Caught his third touchdown pass of the season on OU's second scoring drive of the first half.

FB DIMITRI FLOWERS

- Hauled in his 12th career receiving touchdown and fourth of the season, a 49-yarder, on Oklahoma's first scoring drive of the game.

WR CEEDEE LAMB

- His three receptions give him 33 on the season to pass Curtis Fagan (32) for seventh all-time for OU freshmen.

RB TREY SERMON

- Tallied 81 rushing yards, including 62 on the final OU drive, and sealed the victory with his fourth rushing TD of the year, a 53-yard run in the fourth quarter.

DB ROBERT BARNES

- Picked off his first career pass on the final play of the game.

DB WILL JOHNSON

- Registered his first career interception.

DL KENNETH MANN

- Credited with his second forced fumble of the season.

CB TRE NORWOOD

- Led the team with a career-high seven tackles and two pass breakups; he entered the contest with just four tackles and one PBU on the season.

LB OGBONNIA OKORONKWO

- His sack gives him 21.0 for his career to match Jonathan Jackson for seventh in OU history.
- Has recorded at least 1.0 tackle for loss in every game this season.
- Logged his first career fumble recovery.

CB JORDAN THOMAS

- His two pass breakups give him 29 for his career, moving him into sixth place all-time in OU history.

K/P AUSTIN SEIBERT

- His 14 points tonight give him 308 for his career to move him into ninth in OU history.
 - Tied a season-long field goal of 36 yards in the third quarter.
