OU POSTGAME NOTES

GENERAL NOTES

- Oklahoma improved to 13-5 all-time against TCU, including a 5-4 mark in Norman. Since the Horned Frogs joined the Big 12 in 2012, OU is 5-1 in the series.
- OU has won 22 of its last 23 Big 12 games dating back to the 2015 season. Its only loss came at the hands of Iowa State (ranked No. 24 in the AP Top 25 this week) on Oct. 7.
- With the win against TCU, Lincoln Riley becomes the third Oklahoma head coach (out of 22) to win at least nine games in his debut season, joining Barry Switzer (10 in 1973) and Chuck Fairbanks (10 in 1967).
- The Sooners have won their last 11 games in the month of November.
- Oklahoma won its eighth straight game against an AP-ranked opponent. According to ESPN Stats & Info, that's the second-longest active streak in the FBS behind Clemson (9).
- OU is 23-4-1 (.839) all-time as the No. 5 team in the AP Poll. The Sooners have won four straight games, and 11 of their last 12, when ranked fifth. They are 13-1-1 at home as the No. 5 team with wins in each of their last seven such games.
- Oklahoma is 55-32-2 in AP top-10 matchups, including 11-5 at home.
- Oklahoma's 38 points in the first half tied a season high, set last week against Oklahoma State.
- TCU entered the contest allowing just 13.9 points per game and had given up just 24 total points over the last four contests. OU scored 17 points in the first quarter and 38 in the first half. The 38 points were the most allowed in a game by TCU since OU's 52-46 win last season (a span of 17 games).
- TCU was also allowing a nation-best 69.7 yards per game entering the contest and had not given up a rushing TD over the last five games, but Oklahoma ran for 96 yards and two scores on 15 carries (6.4 average) in the first half. OU finished the game with 200 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 41 carries.
- Three OU freshman defensive backs made their first career starts (S Robert Barnes and CBs Tre Brown and Tre Norwood).
- Attendance was 88,308, the largest crowd in Gaylor Family - Oklahoma Memorial Stadium and the 13th largest to ever see the Sooners play. It marked OU's 115th straight sellout, or every game since the start of the 1999 season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB BAKER MAYFIELD

- Completed 18-of-27 passes for 333 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions, and ran for 50 yards on 11 carries.
- Recorded his 14th game at Oklahoma with at least 3 TD passes and no interceptions.
- Has thrown a touchdown pass in a school-record 36 consecutive games (every contest of his OU career) to tie Texas Tech's Graham Harrell for the longest streak in Big 12 history. Mayfield has also thrown at least two TD passes in a Big 12-record 23 straight contests (71 TDs to 13 interceptions during the span).
- Has 31 TD passes on the season, which is the ninth highest total in OU single-season history. Also has 119 for his career to move ahead of Hawaii's Timmy Chang (117) for ninth in FBS history.
- Has 13,539 career passing yards to move ahead of Texas' Colt McCoy (13,253) for third in Big 12 history, and passed McCoy, Troy's Corey Robinson (13,477) and N.C. State's Philip Rivers (13,484) to rank 11th in FBS history.
- Has 14,542 career yards of total offense, passing Nevada's Colin Kaepernick (14,210) and Boise State's Kellen Moore (14,534) for 10th in FBS history.
- Tonight's win tied Mayfield with Jameile Holieway for third in Oklahoma history with 31 career wins.

RB RODNEY ANDERSON

- Ran 23 times for 151 yards and two touchdowns and caught a personal best five passes for a career-high 139 yards and two more scores.
 - His 290 all-purpose yards were a career high and rank 11th best in school history.
 - Became the third player in OU history to record 100 rushing yards and 100 receiving yards in the same game. The others to do it were Joe Mixon (263 rushing yards, 114 receiving yards vs. Texas Tech in 2016) and Steve Sewell (153 rushing, 142 receiving vs. Kansas State in 1984).
 - Became the second player in school history to have two rushing touchdowns and two receiving touchdowns in the same half, joining DeMarco Murray, who did it against Kansas State in 2008.
 - Became the sixth player in school history to score four touchdowns in one half, joining Blake Bell (4 rushing in first half vs. Texas, 2012), Murray (2 rushing, 2 receiving in first half vs. Kansas State, 2008), Murray (4 rushing in first half vs. North Texas, 2007), Earl Johnson (4 rushing in second half vs. Kansas, 1986), Billy Sims (4 rushing in first half vs. Oklahoma State, 1978) and Steve Owens (4 rushing in first half vs. Nebraska, 1968).

- Recorded a career-long 46-yard reception in the first quarter and finished the first half with 117 receiving yards, the third-most ever in a half by an OU running back.

TE MARK ANDREWS

- Caught four passes for 44 yards; now ranks 19th overall in OU history (fourth among tight ends) with 1,552 career receiving yards.
- His 4 receptions tie Stephen Alexander (43 in 1995) for fourth in OU single-season history by a tight end.

WR MYKEL JONES

- Made his first career start and finished with three receptions for 23 yards.

WR CEEDEE LAMB

- His 53 yards give him 644 receiving yards this season, which surpasses Sterling Shepard (621) for the third-most by a freshman in program history.
- Had a career-long 17-yard punt return in the first quarter.

S ROBERT BARNES

- Made his first career start and finished with a career-high four tackles.

CB TRE BROWN

- Made his first career start and finished with three tackles and a pass breakup.

DT NEVILLE GALLIMORE

- Returned from a two-game absence and recorded five tackles.

DT DU'VONTA LAMPKIN

- Recorded his first career sack in the second quarter and matched a career high with four tackles.

CB TRE NORWOOD

- Made his first career start and tied a career high with two pass breakups.

LB OGBONNIA OKORONKWO

- Made five tackles with 2.0 for loss. He has recorded at least 1.0 tackle for loss in every game this season and at least 2.0 in five contests.

DT MARQUISE OVERTON

- Led the team by matching a career high with six tackles.

S CHANSE SYLVIE

- Five tackles were a career high.

K/P AUSTIN SEIBERT

- His eight points tonight give him 316, surpassing Tim Duncan (313) for seventh in OU history.
 - Moved ahead of R.D. Lashar (196) for second in program history with 199 career extra points made.
 - Made a career-long 49-yard field goal in the first quarter (previous long was 46 yards); it was his eighth consecutive make. It was also the longest field goal for the Sooners since Michael Hunnicutt made a 53-yard attempt against Kansas State in 2011.
-
